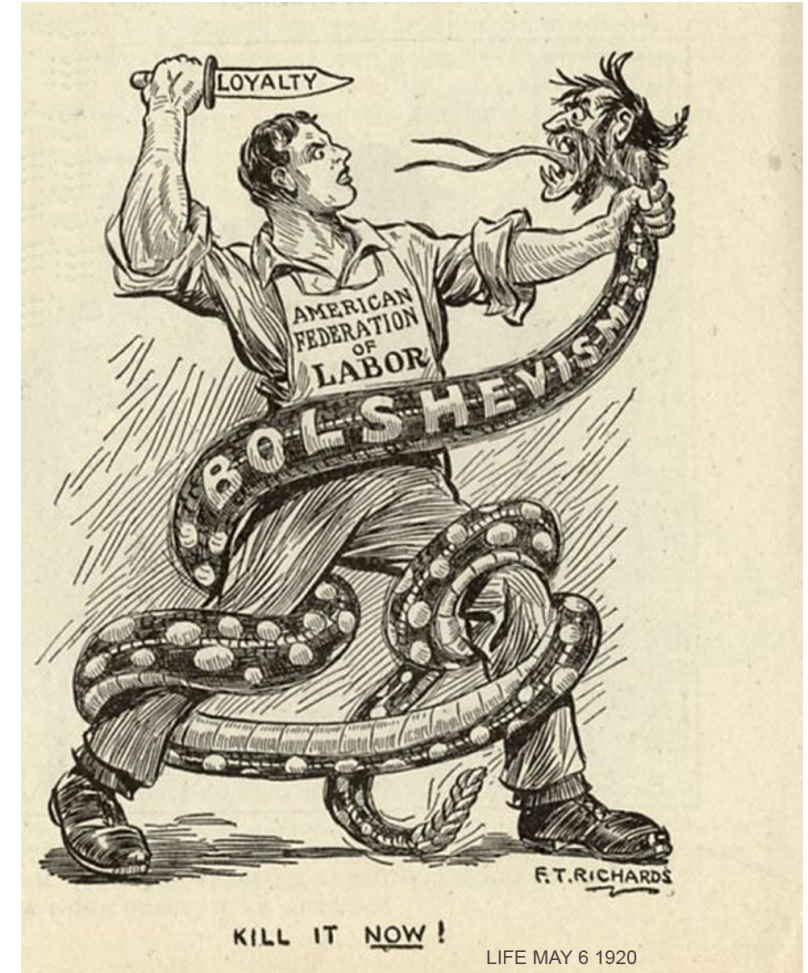
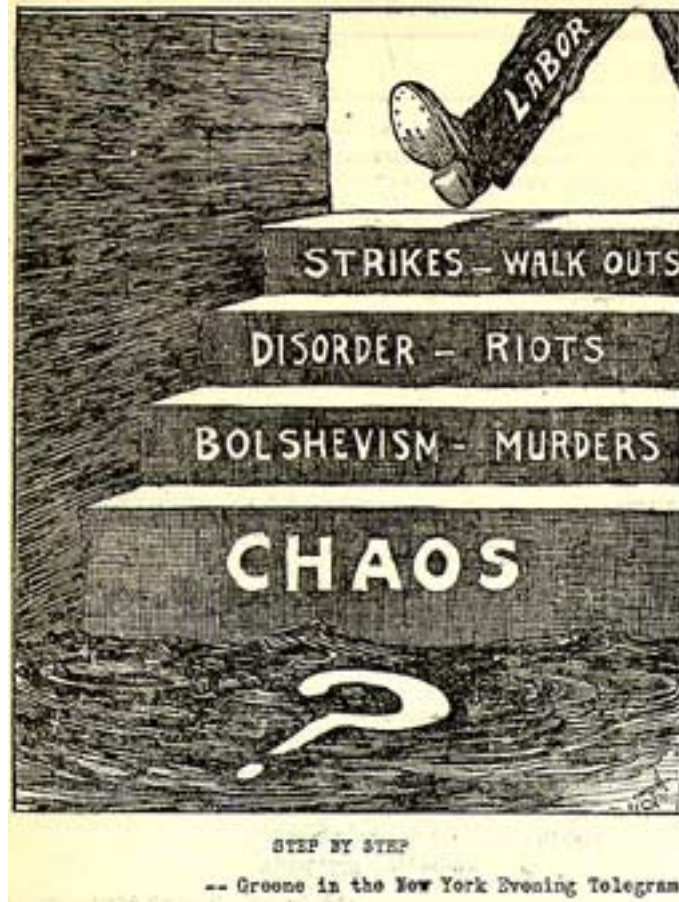
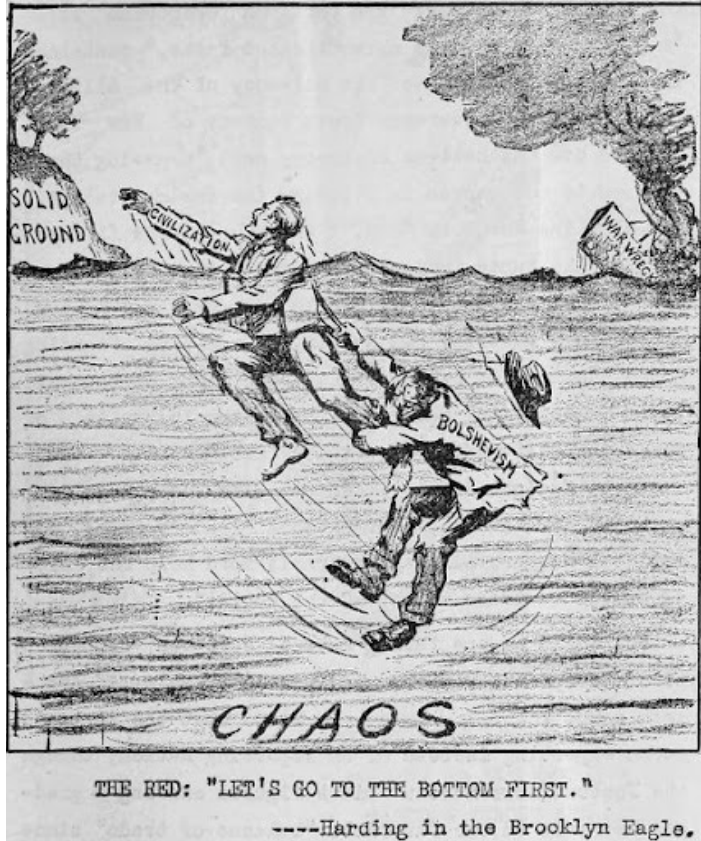

Key Points

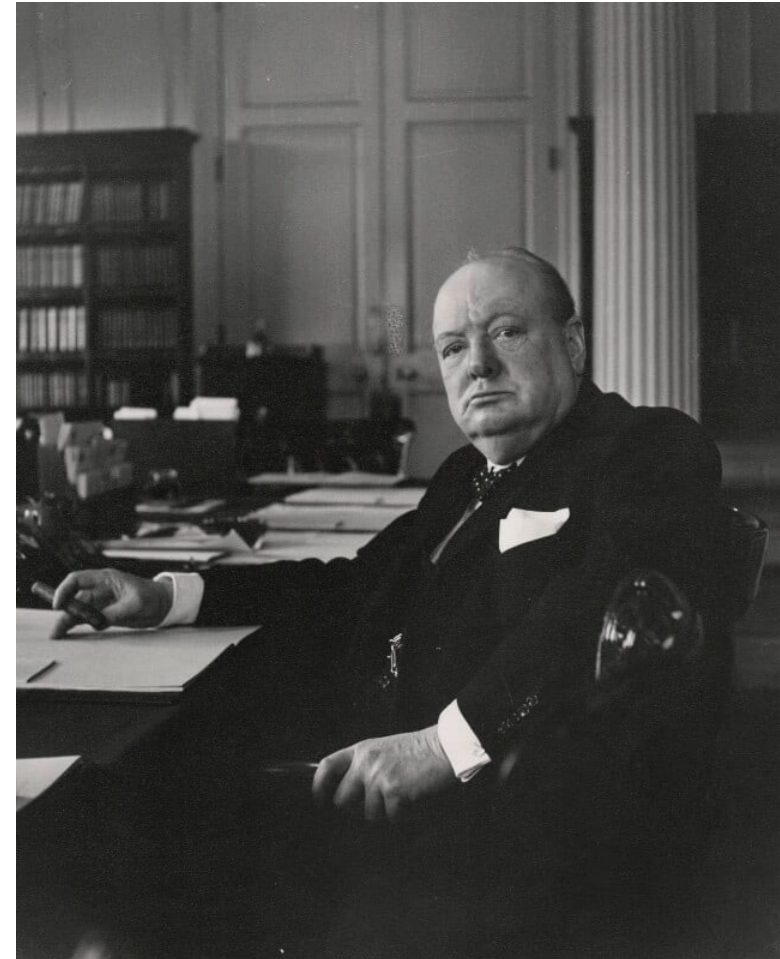
- United States takes restrictive measures against Socialism and Communism in the early twentieth century.
