William Aaron Brandenburg. October 10, 1869 -- October 29, 1940. Bachelor's and master's degrees from Drake University. Honorary doctorate of laws in 1925 from Monmouth College.

Frances Merrill Brandenburg. Bachelor's degree from PSU in 1921 and master's degree from University of Iowa in 1932. Teacher in Oroville, California. Fatally injured in automobile accident near Taft, California, in 1939 where he was a science instructor in the junior college.

Harold Penfield Brandenburg. Bachelor's degree from PSU in 1924 and master's degree from PSU in 1932. Vice-principal at the Cherokee County Community High School, later Columbus High School, in Columbus, Kansas. Retired before 1986. Deceased sometime after 1991.

Helen Dorothy Brandenburg. Mrs. E. L. Carney of Gallup, New Mexico. Bachelor's degree from PSU in 1929. Homemaker. 1 son.

William A. Brandenburg, Jr. Bachelor's degree from PSU in 1930 and master's degree from PSU in

1932. Teacher in Tulsa, Oklahoma before earning his PhD in history at the University of Colorado in
1946. Later dean of faculty at William Woods College in Fulton, Missouri. 1 daughter. Deceased before
1986.
