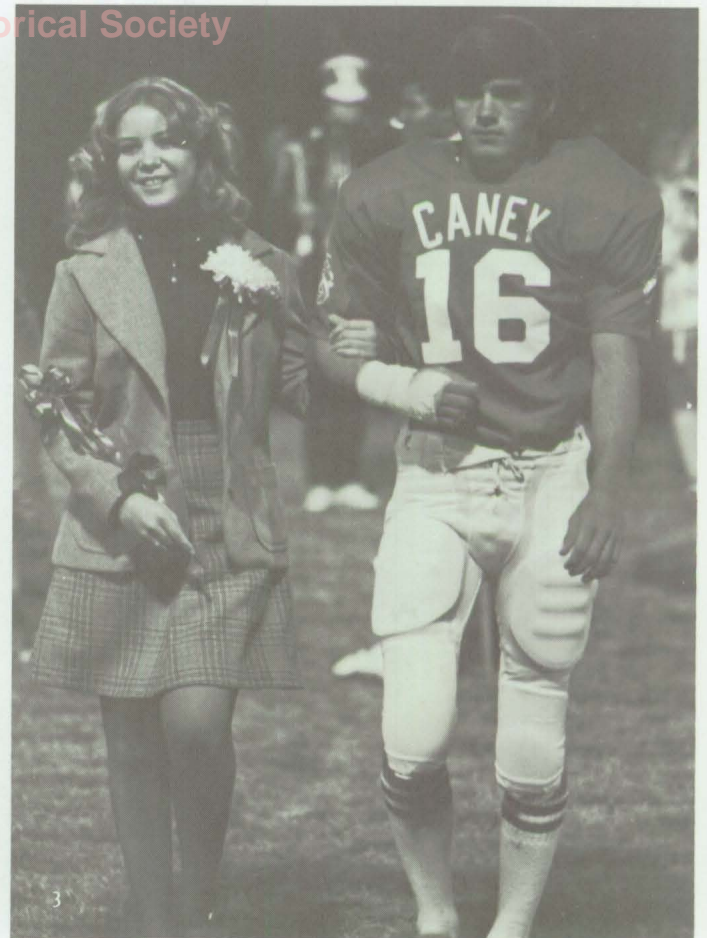


Beth crowned queen to theme 'Feelings'

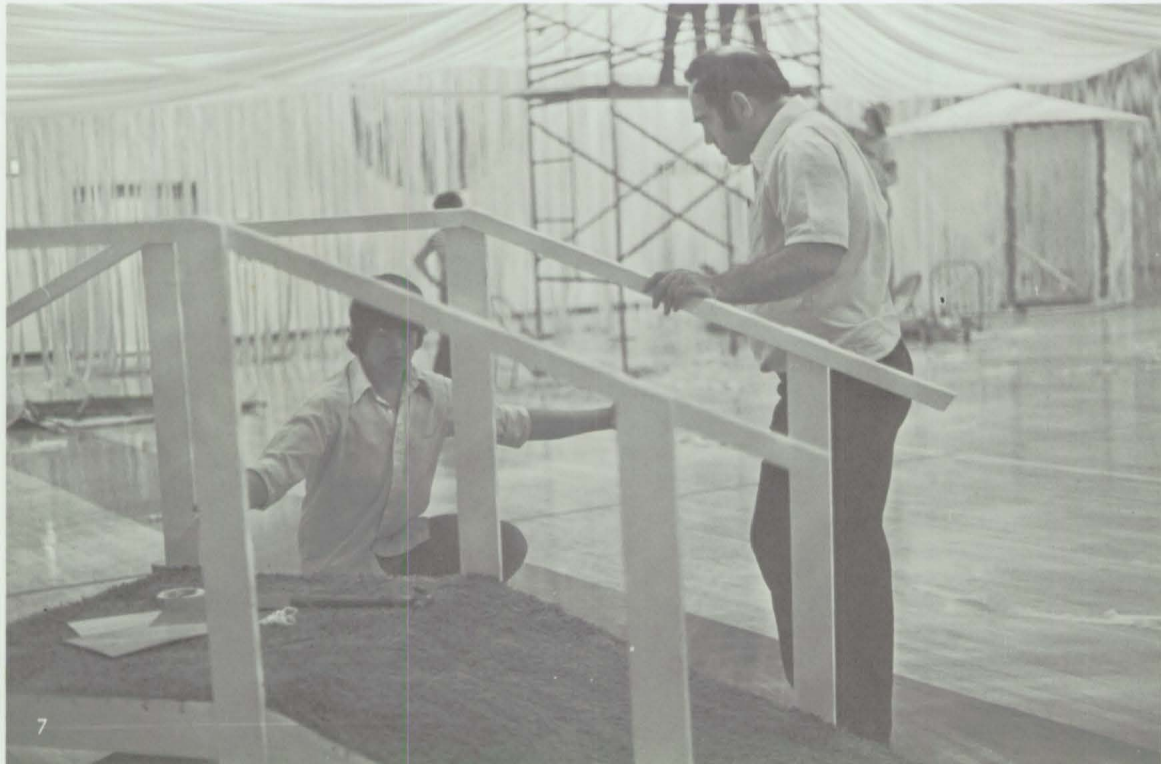

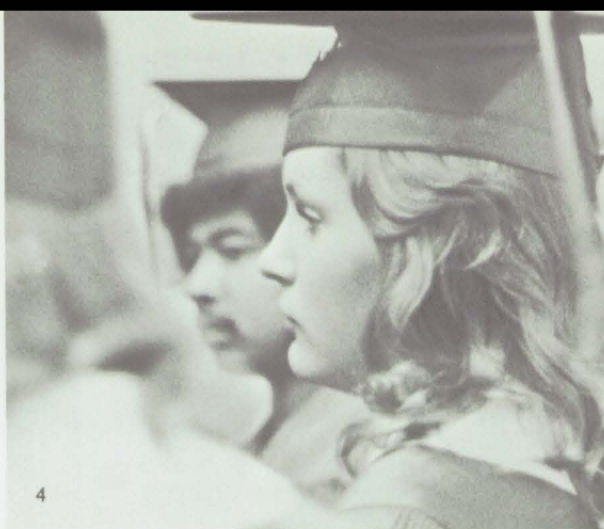

Caney Valley High School's varsity football squad began the 1975 season rated number one in class 2A competition, but ended it with a 6-2 record.

Caney won its first two games at home against the Yates Center Wildcats and the Southeast of Cherokee Lancers. The Bullpups began their '75 season with a 40-0 thumping of Yates Center. Kenny Brown rushed for 168 yards on 20 carries and scored 3 touchdowns. Caney's second game resulted in their beating Southeast of Cherokee 34-6. Caney's defense held the Lancers to -18 yards rushing and only 64 yards in total offense.

The next three games for Caney were away at Neodesha, Altamont and West Elk. Caney pulled it out of the fire in the last two-and-a-half minutes to defeat the Neodesha Bluestreaks 18-13. Caney lead in every statistic except scoring until, with 2 minutes and 19 seconds on the clock and Caney trailing 13-12, Junior quarterback Vince Wheeler found tight-end Junior Ross open on Caney's 39 yard line, and 3 plays later Kenny Brown went off-tackle to wrap up the game. The Bullpups came from behind to defeat the Altamont Grizzlies 7-6 to spoil the Altamont homecoming. The game was costly for Caney, though, with 210 lb. lineman Henry Brown put out for the season with a knee injury.

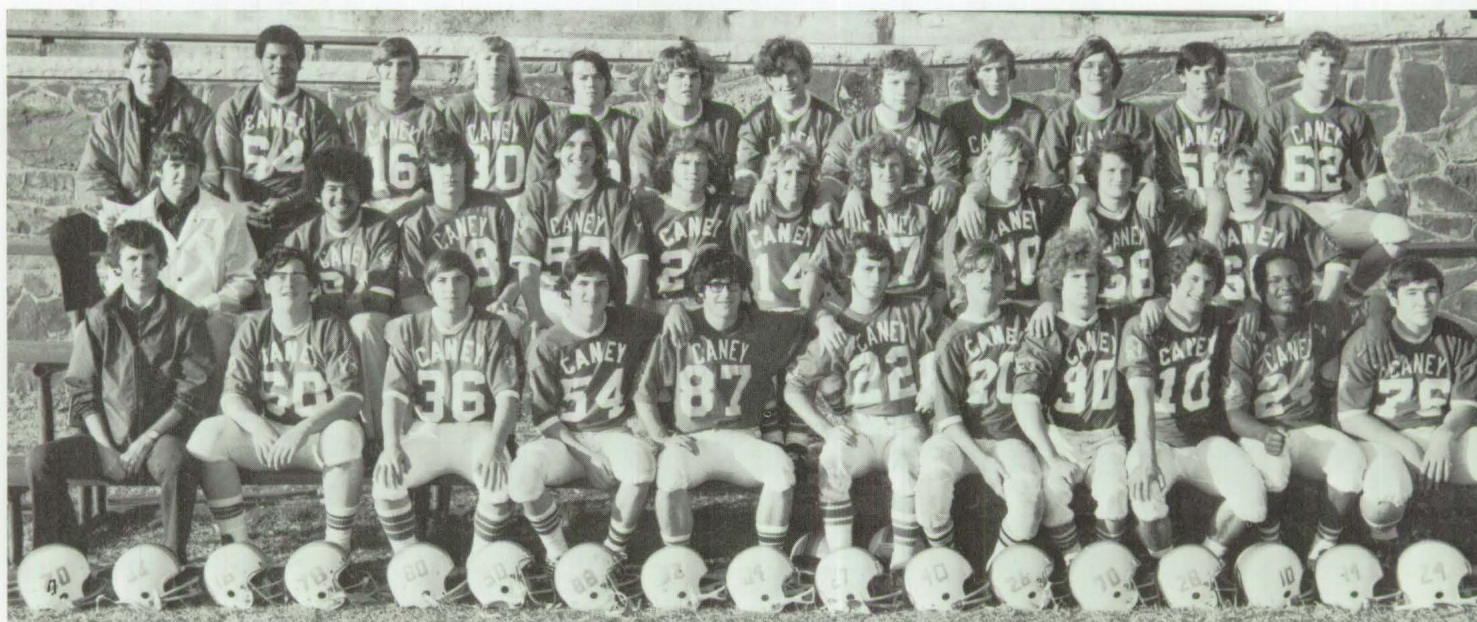
In Caney's final away game for the season

the Bullpups were surprised by the fired up West Elk Patriots who broke Caney's four-game winning streak. Caney was severely handicapped with seven starters either injured or ill in that game. The 19-0 loss knocked Caney from its No. 1 state ranking to honorable mention.

Caney played its last three games at home against the Bartlesville College High Junior Varsity, arch-rival Sedan, and the Chilocco Indians. Win number five came easy for the Bullpups with a 31-6 whipping of the College High Wildcats at Caney's homecoming. Held to a 7-0 half-time score, the Bullpups came back in the second half to reel off 24 points. The star play of the game was a 98-yard kickoff return by Senior Jim Boles to open the second half.

The Bullpups lost a heart-breaker to Sedan 14-7 at Caney. The Pups scored after a fumble recovery on the Sedan 6 yard line by David Lovelace in the first quarter. The Devils won the game in the last few seconds with a desperation pass with only 2 seconds left on the clock.

Caney finished its season with a 42-0 victory over the Chilocco Indians at Caney. The game was never in doubt, as the Bullpup offense rolled 446 total yards and the defense held the Indians to a total of 68 yards.

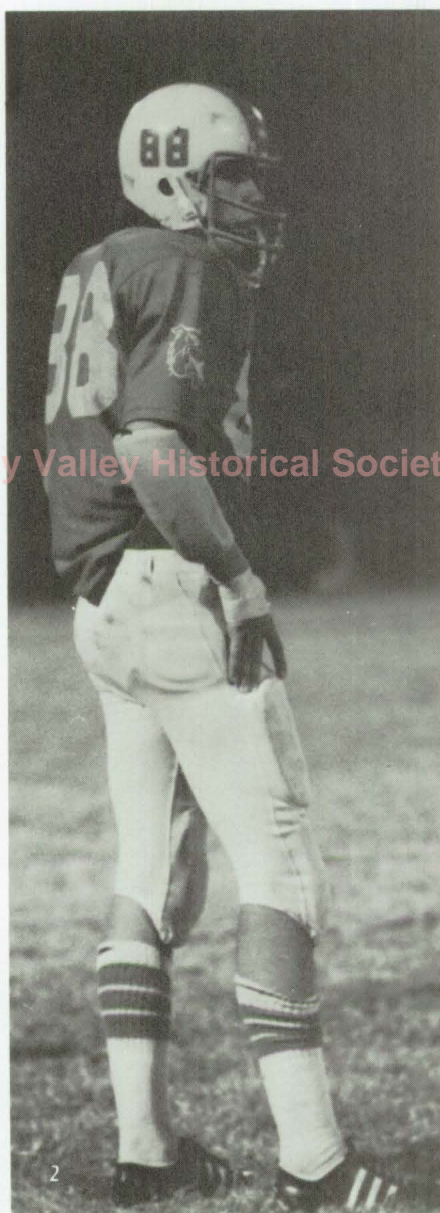

3. Joe Potts (Kojak): Was a three year starter at line-

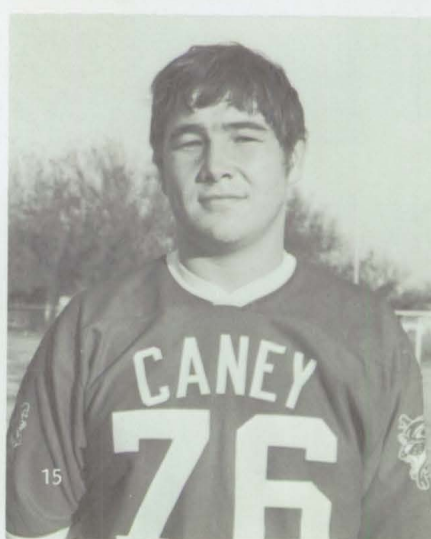
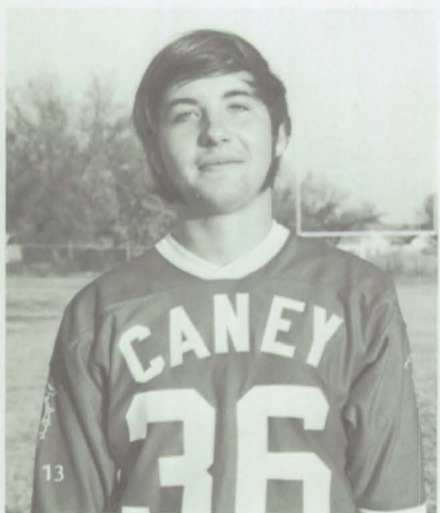
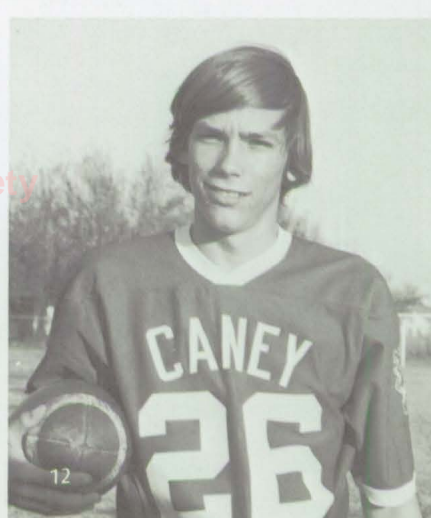

7. Junior Ross (Bunior): Third member of the defensive front. He was one of the top offensive receivers ever to play for Caney. Provided good leadership during games.
8. Henry Brown (Hank): Fourth member of the defensive front. Two year starter there, also a fine offensive blocker.

9. Rick Finney (R.D.): Was an outstanding hitter, did an excellent job at playing center field on defense.
10. Linzle Stephens (Cheap Shot): Provided back-up personnel by being able to play several positions.
11. Mike Pouncil (Puditory): Exceptional kicking ability, which helped the team gain good field position.
12. Mark Hodges (Hodg): Another player that's there when you need him, willing to do anything.
13. Kenny Tremain (Speed): He did his share to fire up the team at several spirited practices.
14. David Lovelace (Lace): Transfer student who was the fifth member of one of the best defensive fronts in the school's history.

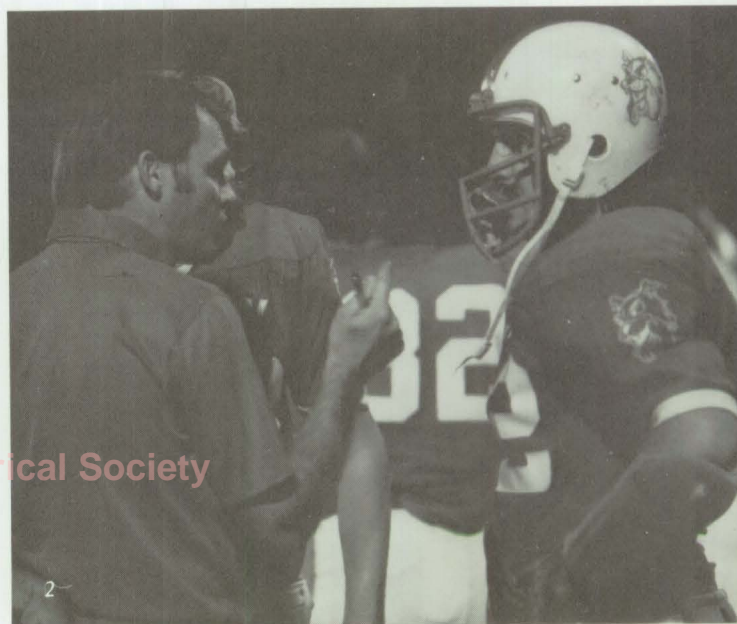

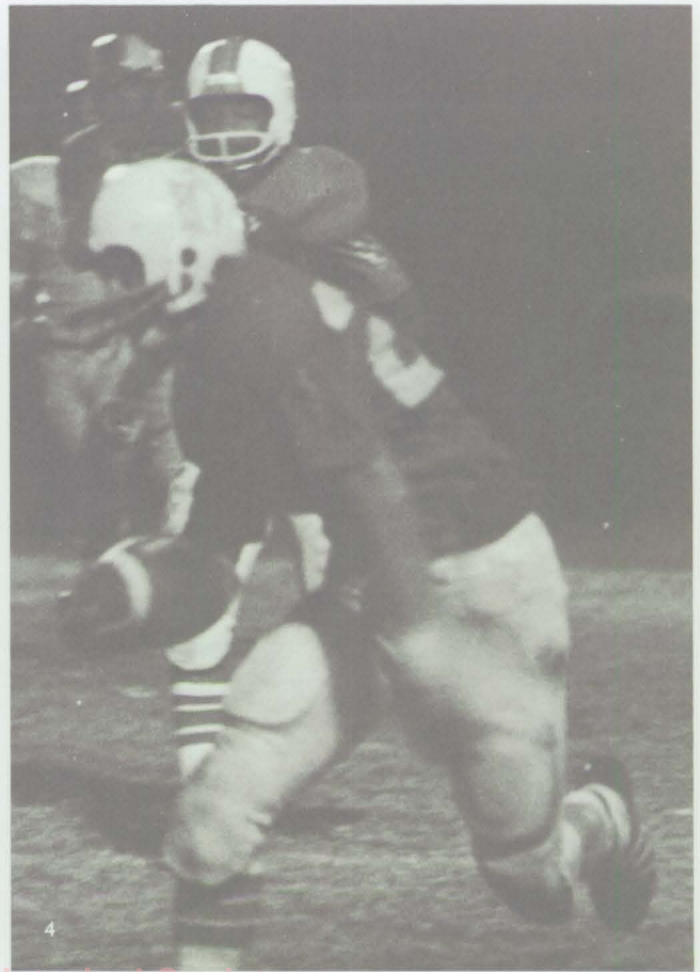
Several Bullpups received recognition for outstanding play, with Kenny Brown highlighting the end of the season by surpassing the 1,000 yard mark.

Five players who received honors from Touchdown Magazine on defense were Tom Harvey, Bryan Naccarato, and Joe Potts, and on offense Mick Leonard and Jim Boles. All-Area and All-State teams included Junior Ross as first team All-State at tight end. David Lovelace was named first team All-Area and second team All-State at tackle position. Aaron Rau received honorable mention for the All-Area team, and was chosen for the second team All-State. Henry Brown received first team All-Area and honorable mention All-State. Kenny Brown was second team All-Area.

The varsity squad was composed of two seniors, seven juniors, including five returning letterwomen, and one sophomore.

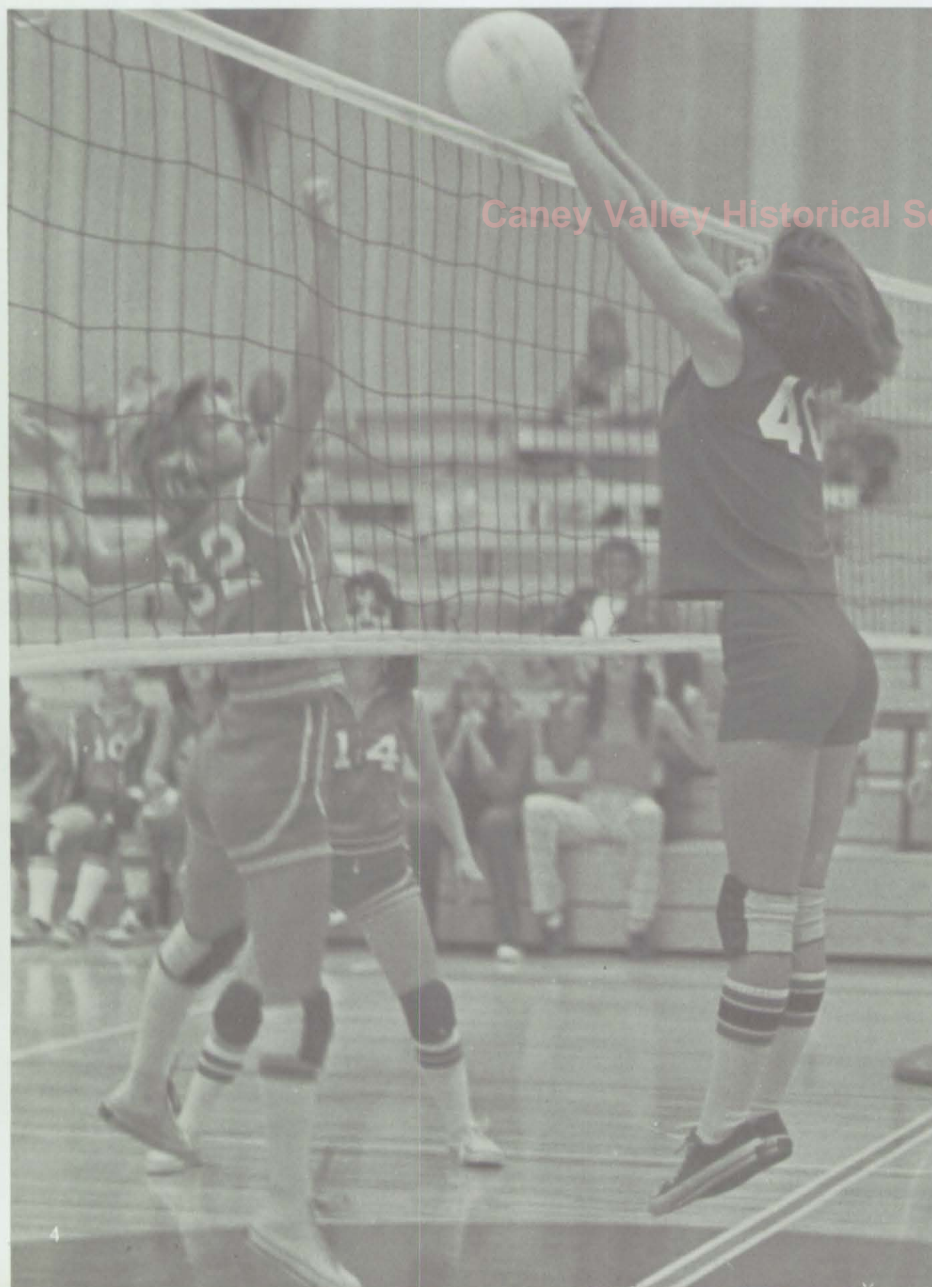
At the end of the season statistics revealed the top three scorers to be Rosalie Deal with 37 points, Lisa Moreland with 35 and Donna Kincaid with 33.

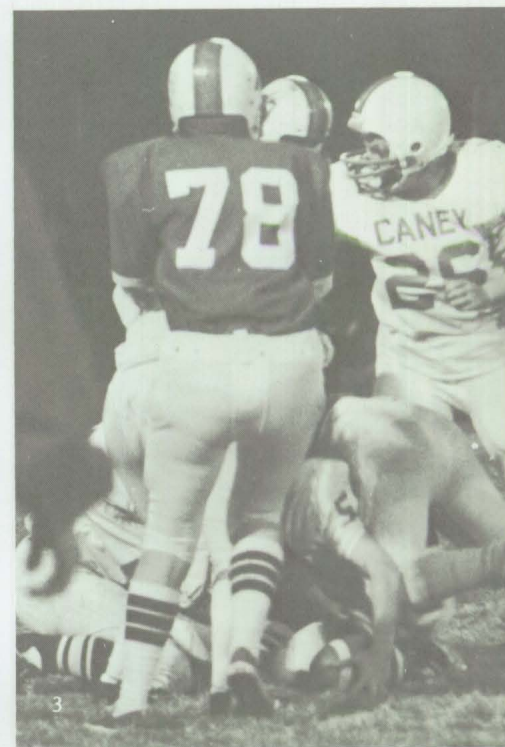

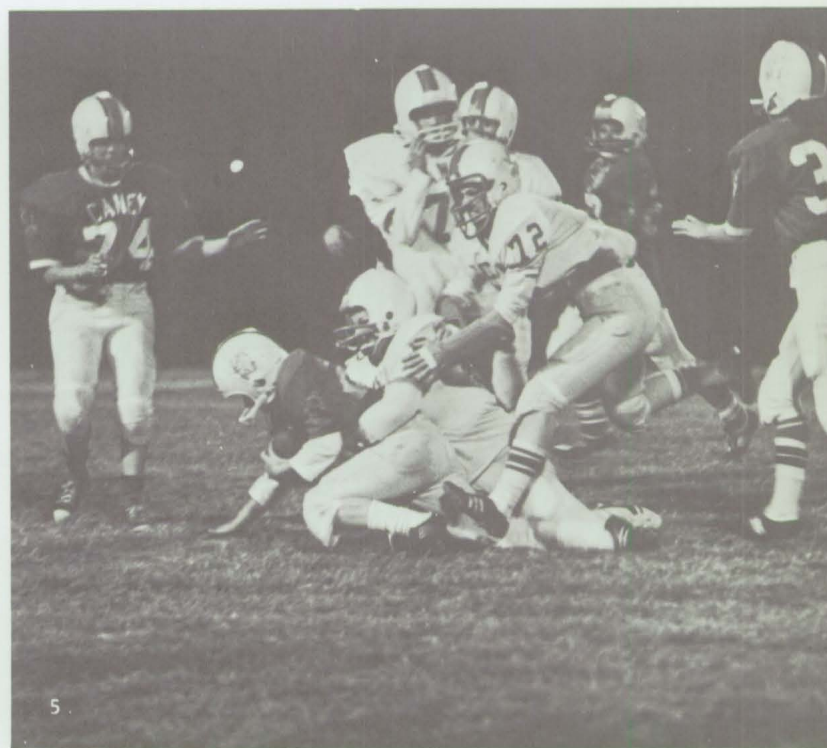

Cagers tally 7-13 record for season

With a 7-13 record for the season, Caney Valley High School completed its first losing season in three years. After losing four of five starters from last year, Caney's inexperienced squad had a rebuilding year under the coaching of Toby Moreland.

Caney began the 1975-76 season with a 61-39 victory over Fredonia at the Sedan double-header, but lost the second game of the double-header 56-39 to Neodesha. The Bullpups then upset highly ranked Oswego, 47-46, on the Indians' home court. Caney then followed that up with a 59-40 victory over Chetopa, but lost the last game before the Christmas break to Central of Burden 65-60.

Caney lost the opening game of 1976 to St. Paul, 62-51. The West Elk Patriots then pounced on the Bullpups with a 73-59 victory at Severy. Caney had no better luck with the Dewey Bulldoggers, losing 72-42.

The Bullpups hosted arch-rival Sedan who took home a 57-50 win. Traveling across the state line once more, Dewey defeated Caney again, this time to the tune of 86-58.

Caney won its next game, the fifth game

of the Caney-hosted Kan-Okla Classic, 83-62 over Cedarvale. The Bullpups lost their next game to Neodesha 59-40, and their consolation game to Sedan 62-38. Neodesha defeated West Elk in overtime, 49-45, for the tournament championship.

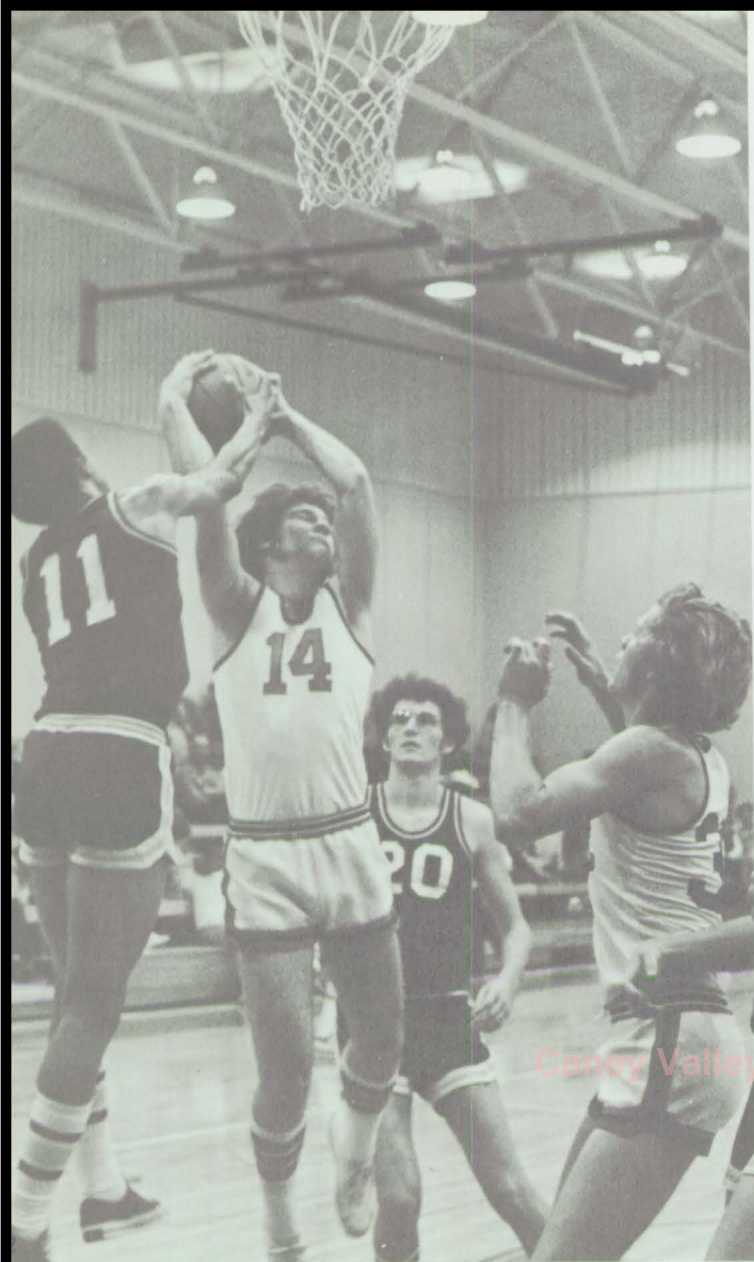
Caney lost a heartbreaker in the homecoming game, 59-60, in double-overtime to the West Elk Patriots. The Pups came back after that to win their next game, 57-49, over Chetopa.

Caney then suffered another one-point loss in their second game with the Oswego Indians, 47-46.

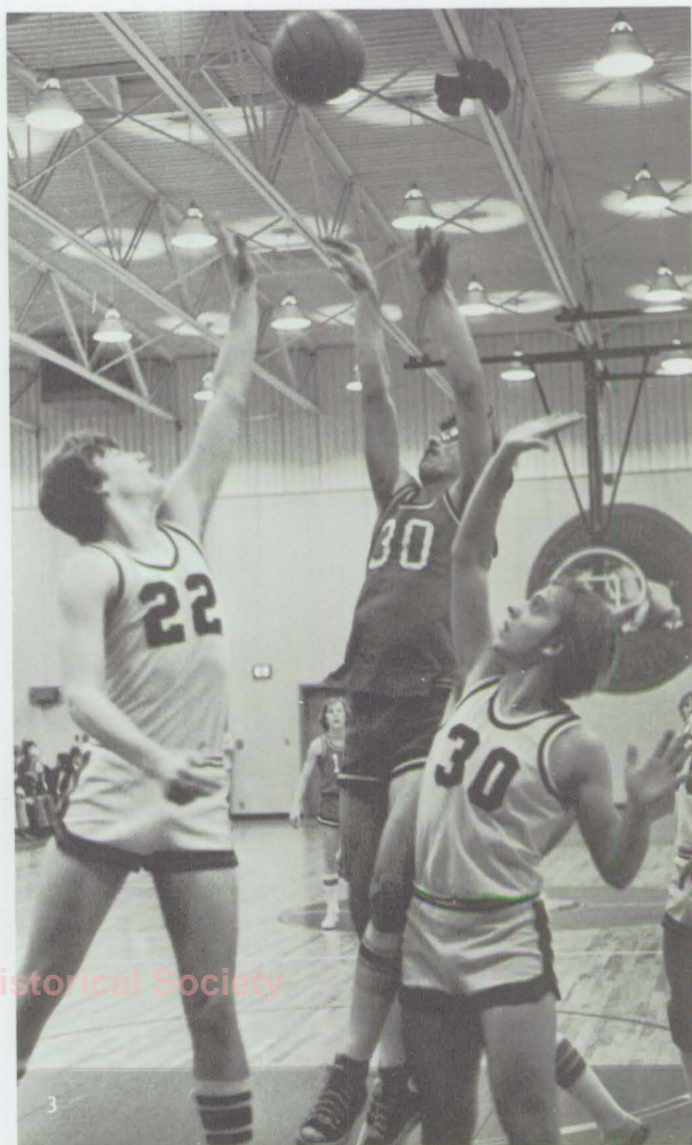
Continuing their see-saw won-loss record with a victory over the Chilocco Indians, 78-60, the Pups lost the final regular season game to arch-rival Sedan, 55-40, and finished out the season with a loss in the regional tournament to Neodesha, 42-29.

Junior Ross became the first person in CVHS history to score 1,000 career points, finishing with 1,162 points. He was also named to the second string All-Area team by the Coffeyville Journal which included all schools in Southeast Kansas.

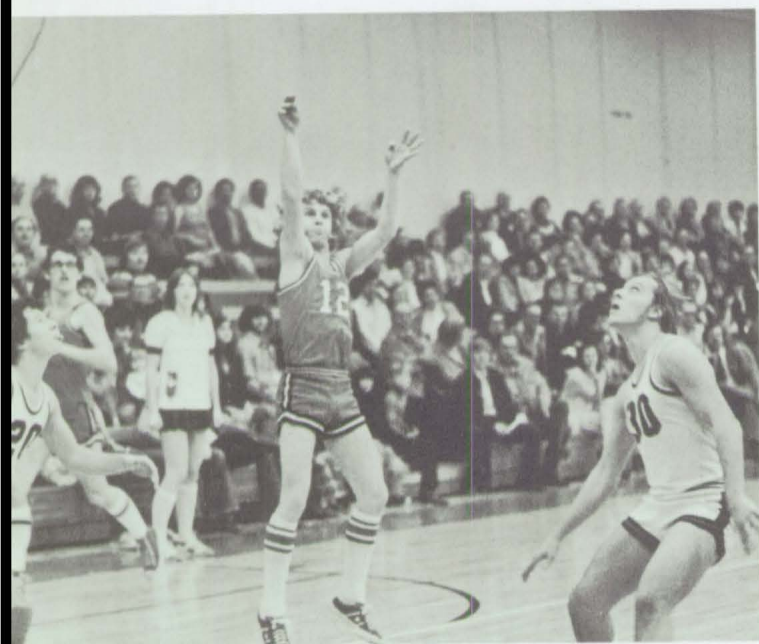




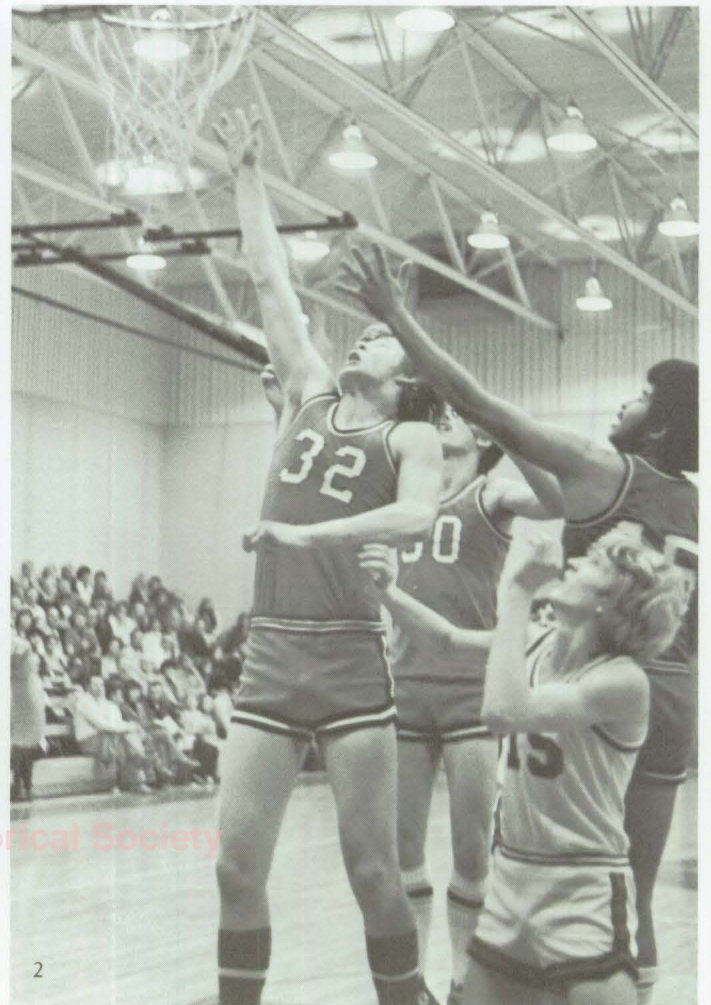

Making the most points this year was Pam Cunningham with 143, followed by Kim Murphy with 114 points.

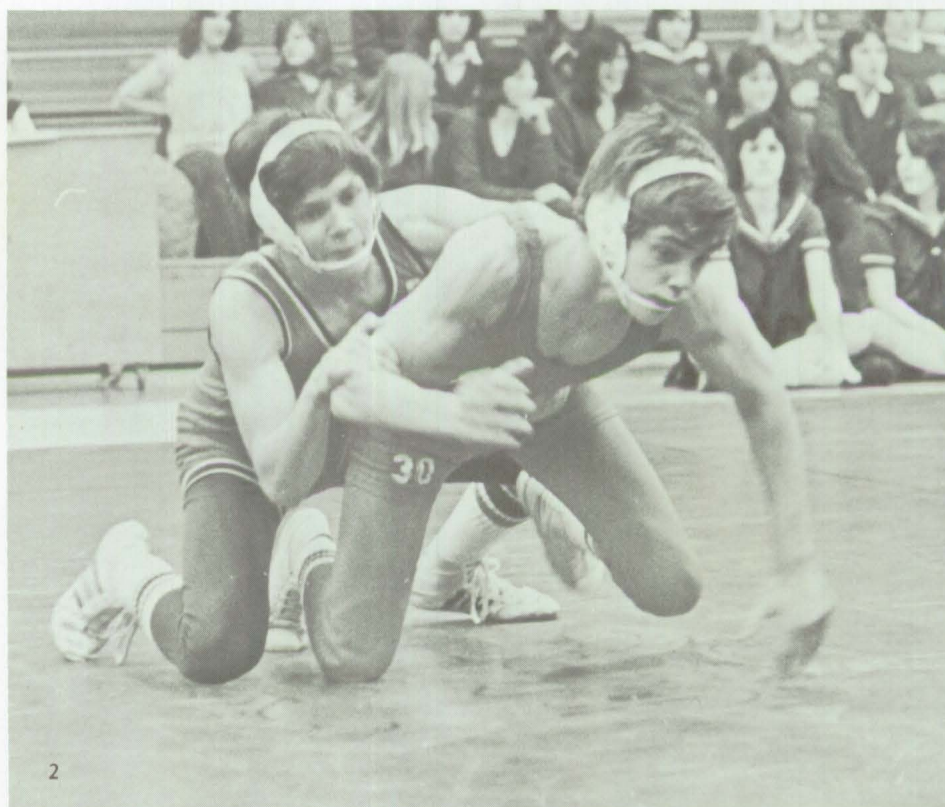

Caney Valley High School's wrestling squad began their 1975-76 season by soundly defeating their first three duel opponents, Burden, Eureka and Burden again, by scores of 61-12, 44-21 and 48-12. Between the first Burden and Eureka matches, the Bullpups took tenth place at the 14-team Kan-Okla Classic Tournament Dec. 12-13. Tim Rogers took the only Caney medal with a third place at 105 lbs.

After Christmas break, the Bullpup grapplers lost two team members, at 167 lbs. and 185 lbs., which proved to be very critical. This resulted in forfeits at 167 lbs, 185 lbs. and heavyweight which added up to 18 unearned points against the Pups in every match. Because of this and other problems, Caney lost its next two matches to Eureka, 48-21, and Baxter Springs, 36-27.

Caney's next match was the Fredonia Triple-Duel Tournament on Jan. 17 where Caney defeated Eureka, 45-24; lost to Fredonia, 48-8; and lost to Parsons, 20-18. The Bullpups brought home five medals with 119-lb. Mike Robbins, and 126-lb. Ed Powell, taking first, and 98-lb. Tim Rogers, 105-lb. Tom Rogers and 115-lb. Bryan Naccarato receiving second.

This was followed on Jan. 26 by the Tri-Valley League Tournament where Robbins, Powell and Naccarato all placed first. Caney, without the aid of Tim Rogers and Dickie Rolls, who were overweight, and Senior Tom Rogers who was out for the rest of the season with the mumps, forfeited 36 points to Eureka

who defeated the Pups 36-24 and to Fredonia who won 48-9.

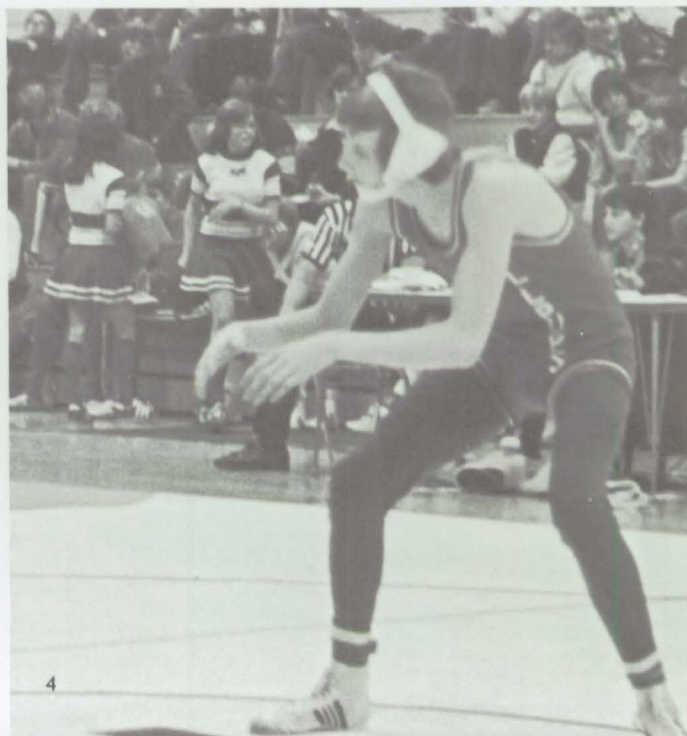
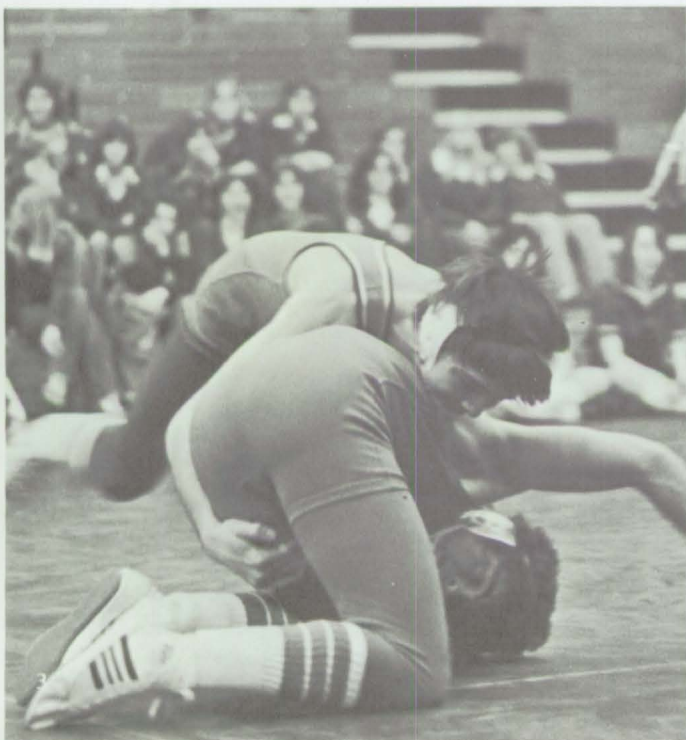
Five days later, Jan. 31 the Pups traveled to Altamont to another Triple-Duel Tournament. Caney brought home four medals, one first by Powell at 126, and three seconds by Scott Miller at 105, Rolls at 112, and Naccarato at 167. Caney, again without the aid of Tim Rogers and also Robbins, was defeated in all three matches, by Altamont, 44-9; Garnett, 48-20; and Baxter Springs, 42-19.

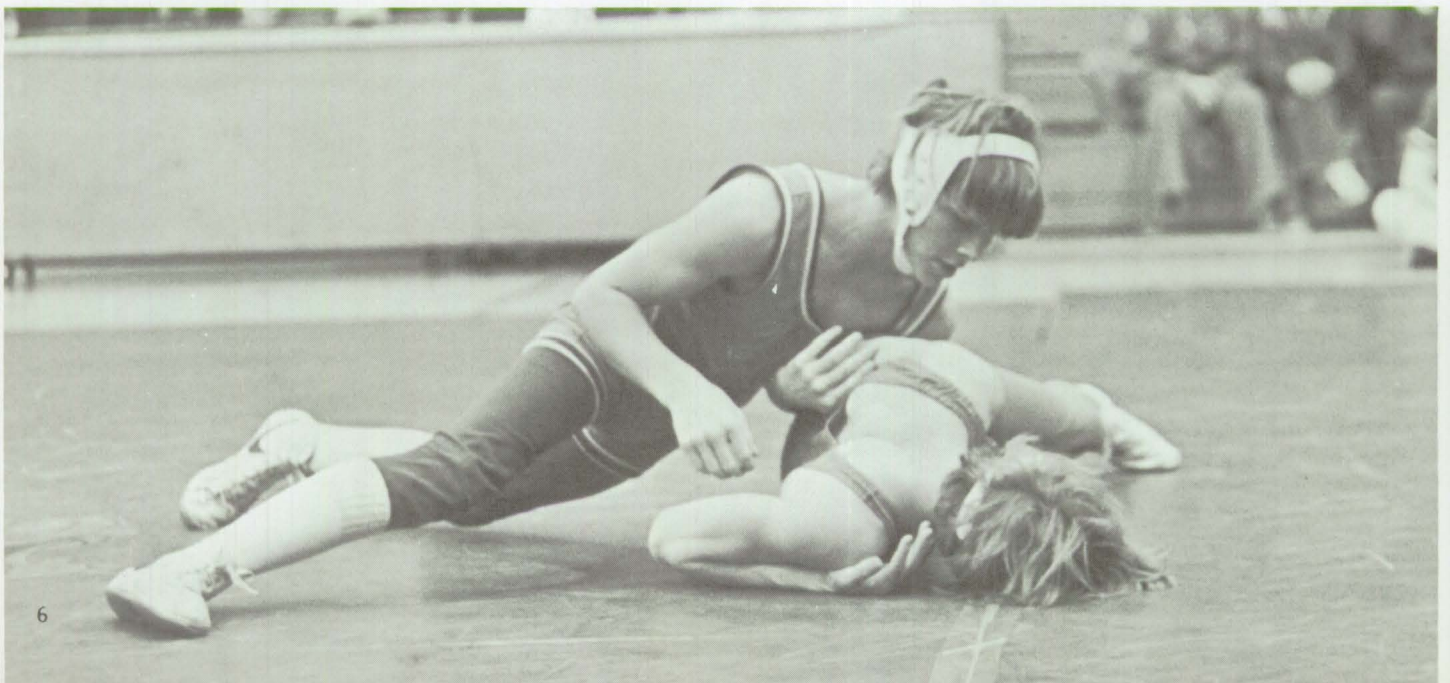
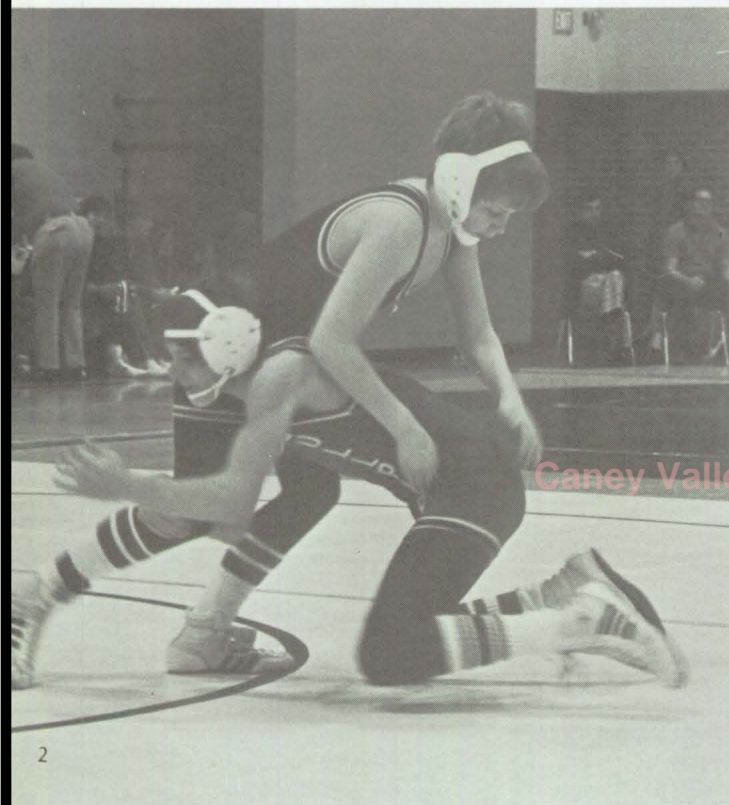
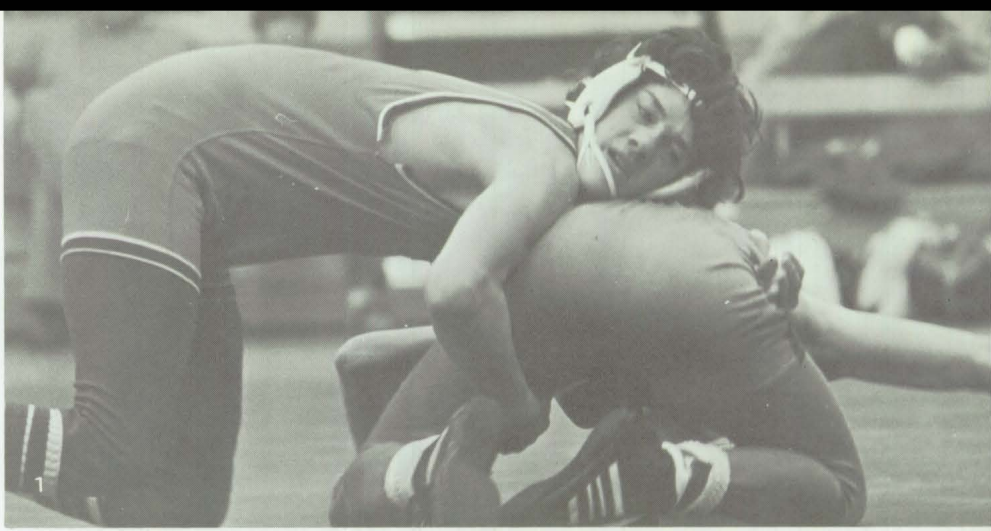
Caney's last regular season match was against Independence. The Pups again felt the sting of forfeits to the tune of 24 points. Caney won six of eight matches wrestled but lost 33-21.

The Pups were able to show their strength at the Regional Tournament held at Douglass Feb. 6-7. Caney had three wrestlers qualify for the State Tournament with 167-lb. Naccarato winning the Regional Championship and 98-lb. Tim Rogers and 126-lb. Powell taking thirds. Caney placed seventh out of 16 teams.

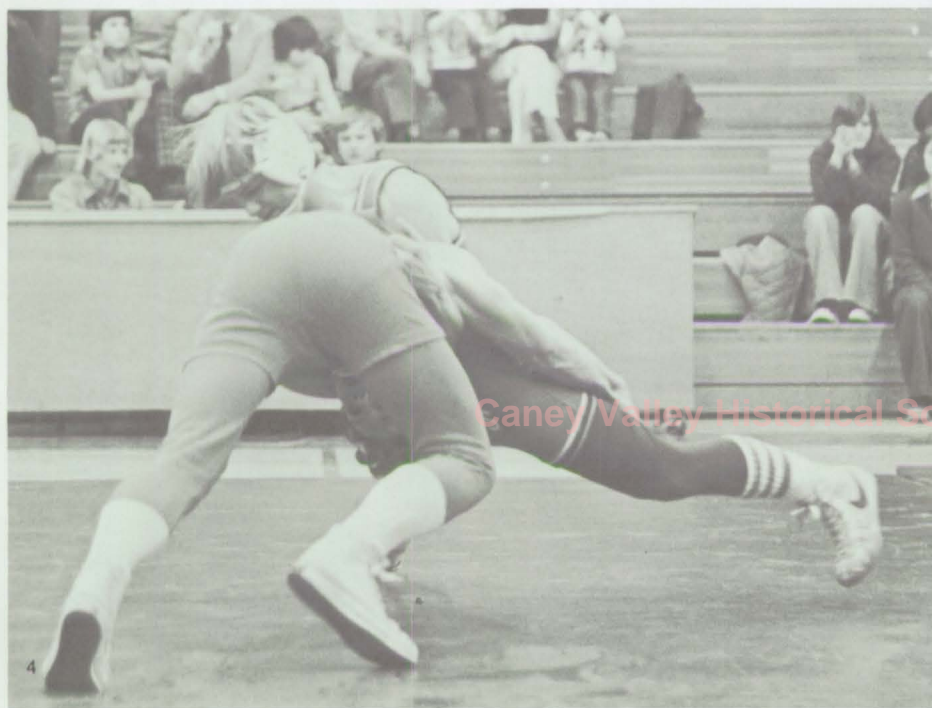
Tim Rogers then qualified for the Grand State Tournament by placing forth at the State Tournament held in Goodland. Naccarato and Powell were both eliminated early at State but had good showings. Rogers was eliminated in the first round of Grand State held at Hays.

Over the season the Caney grapplers brought home 18 medals and won 62 matches actually wrestled to their opponents' 22 victories. Coach Ross VanderHamm was in his second year as head coach for the Bullpups and his assistant was Rick Budden.

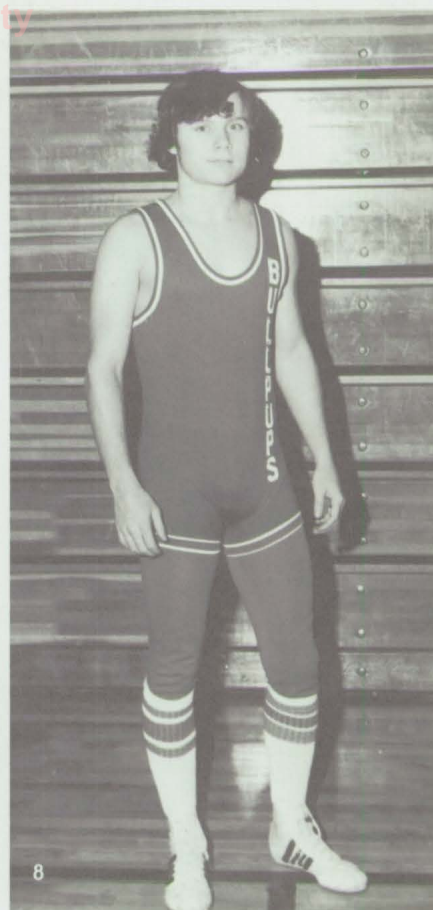
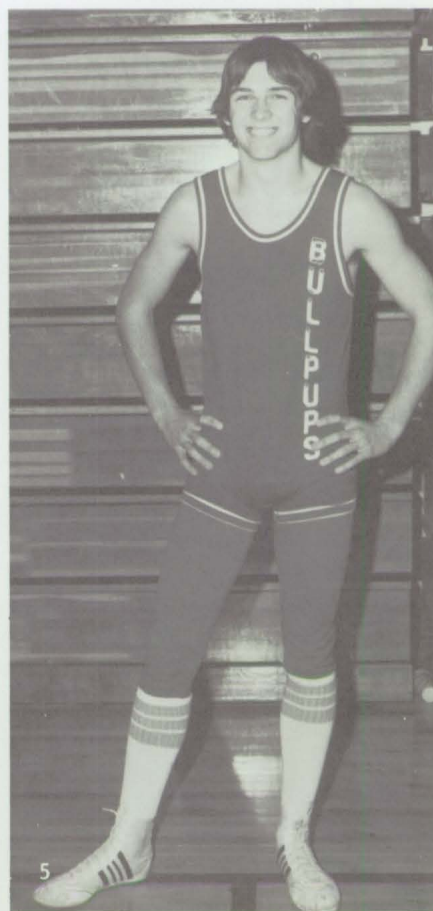
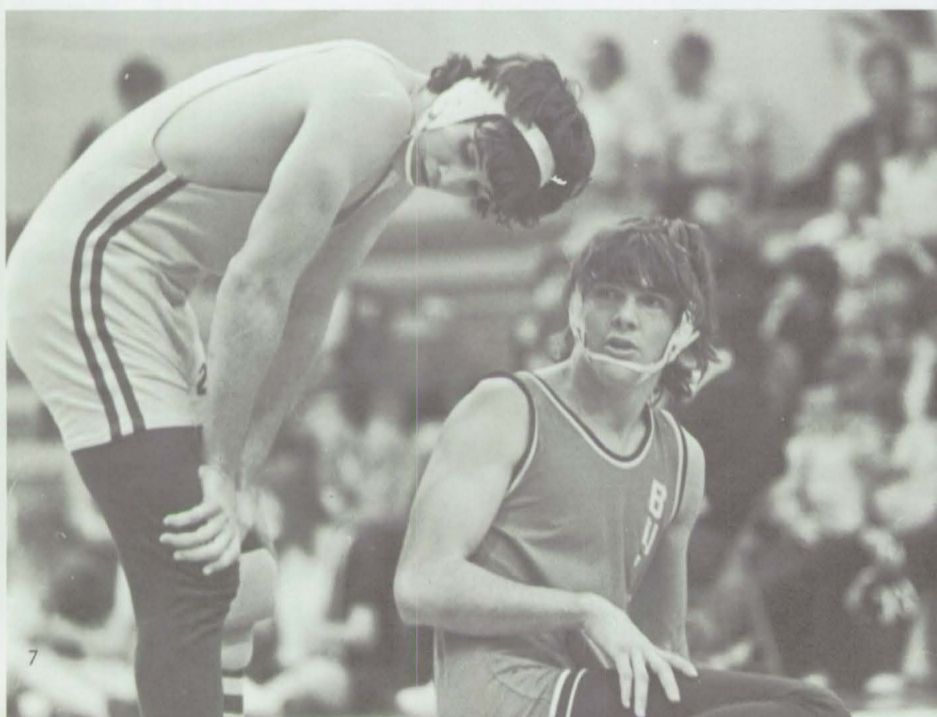




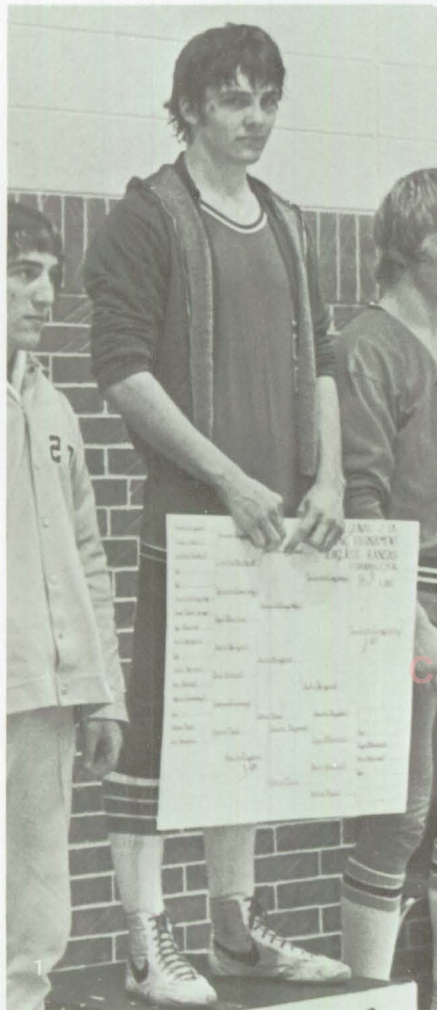

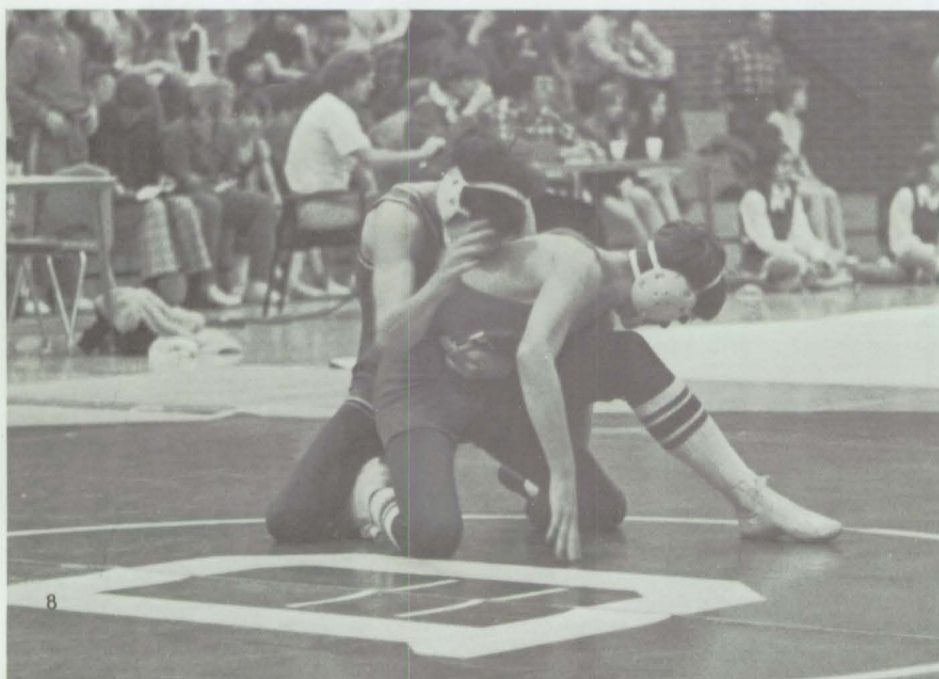

Seniors on the squad were Joe Potts, Bryan Naccarato, Aaron Rau and Henry Brown.

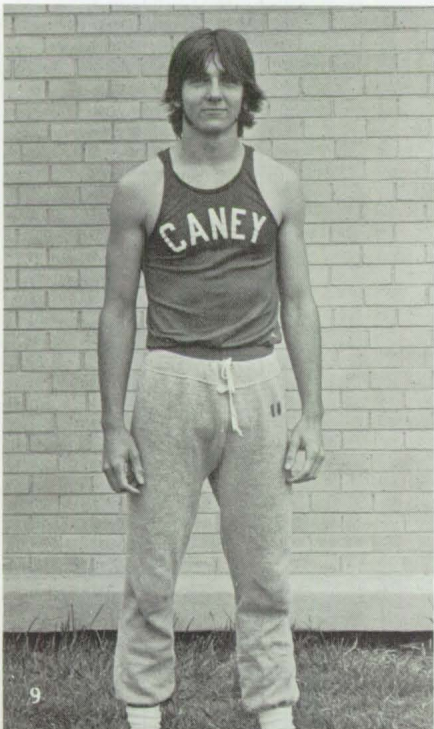
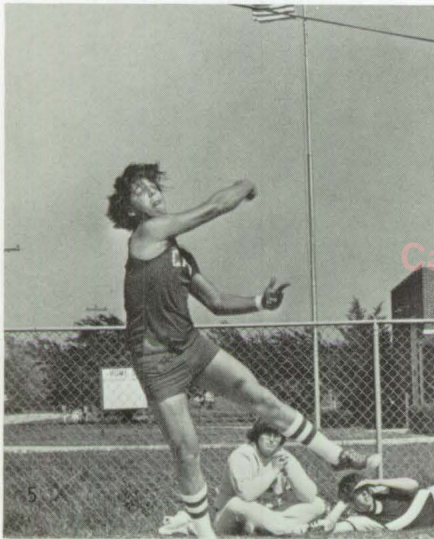
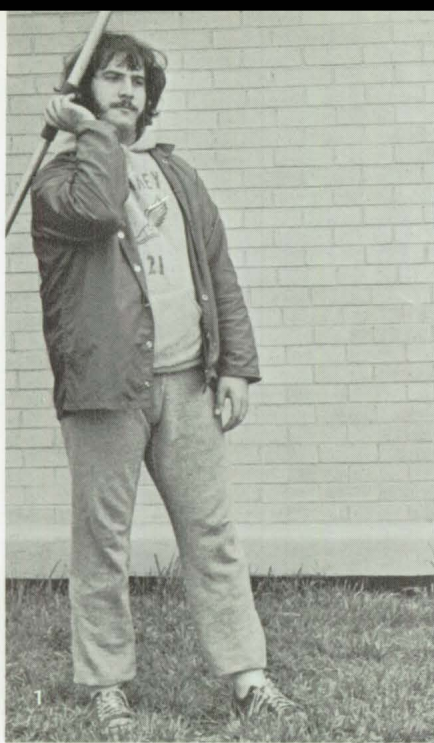




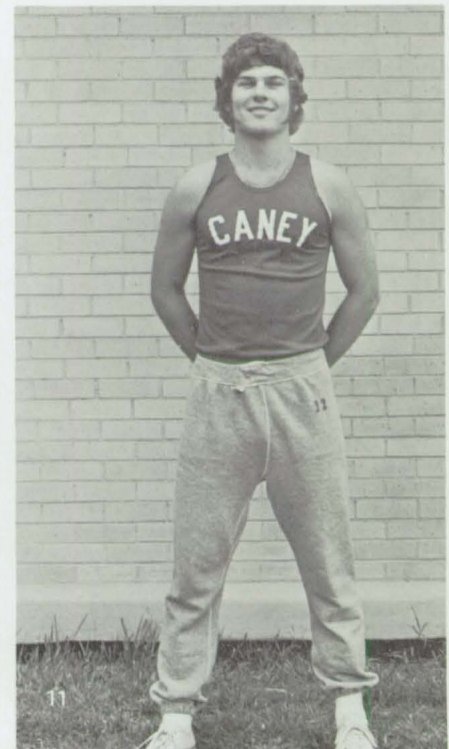
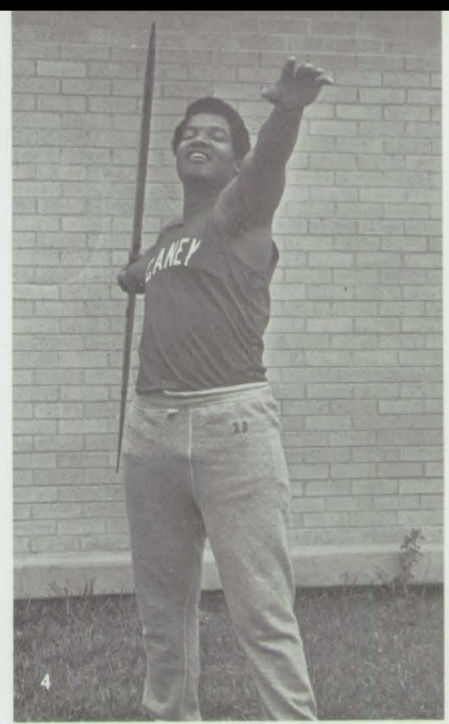

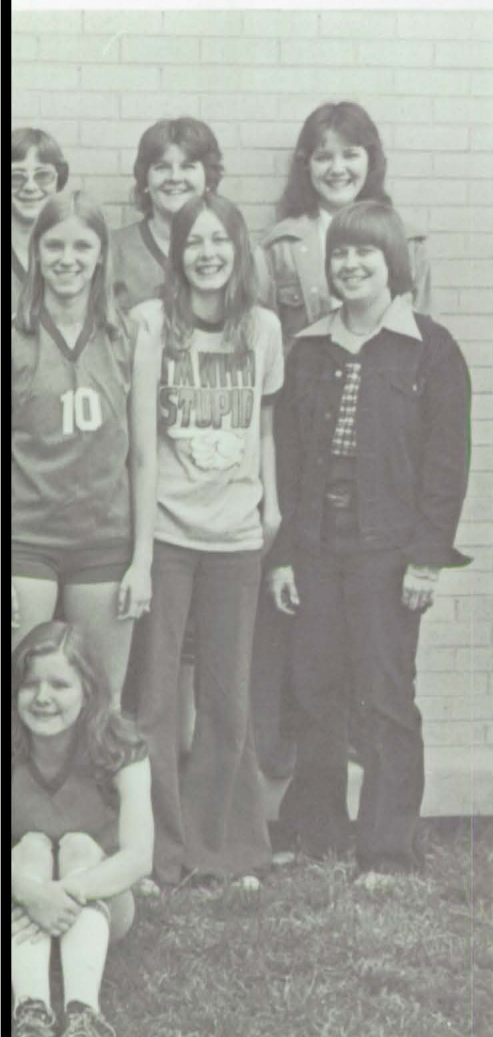
Girls' team earns points

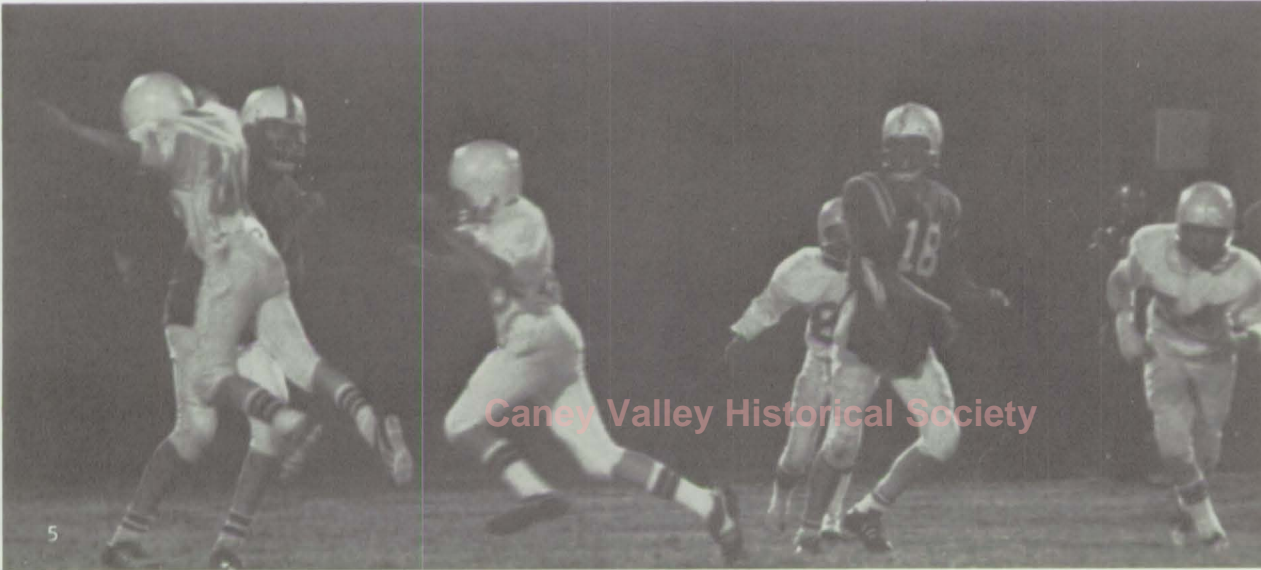
Junior high team boasts strong season



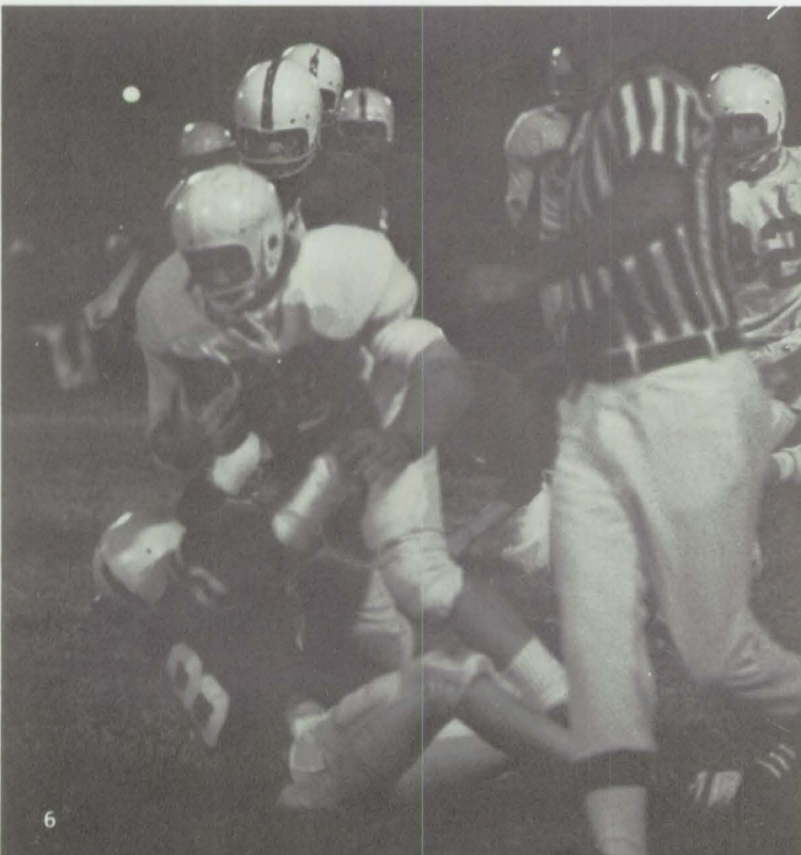
The Junior High football team had a tremendous season, posting a 5-1 mark.

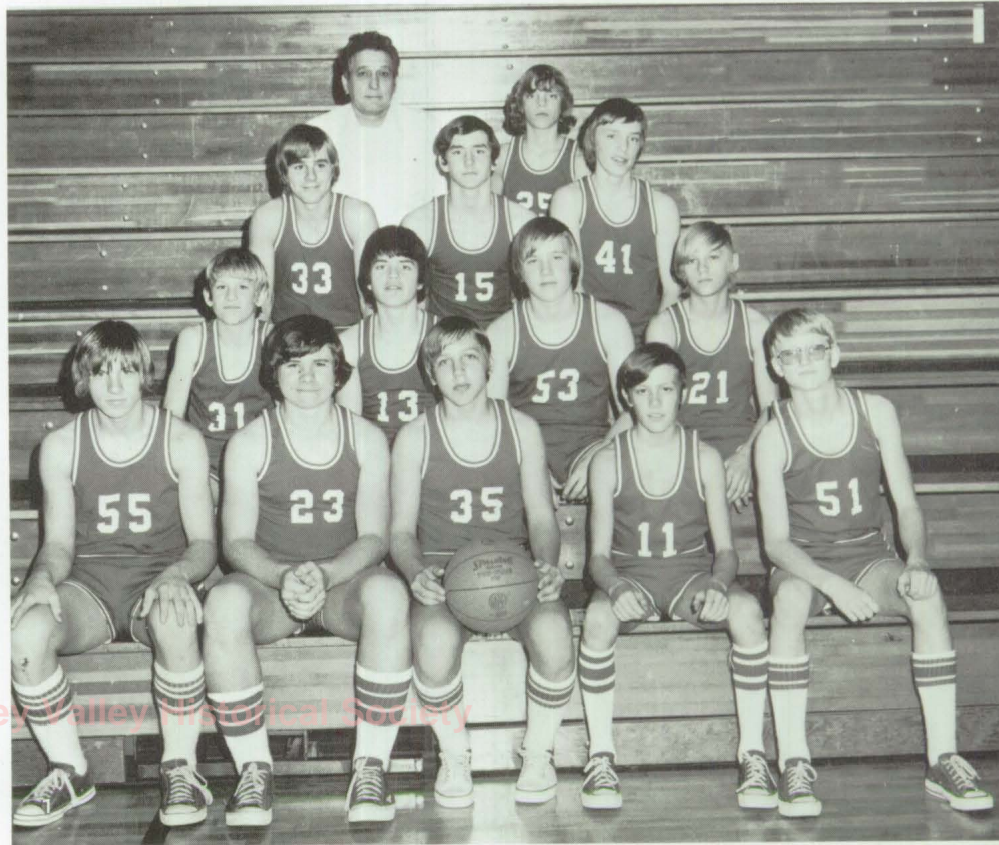

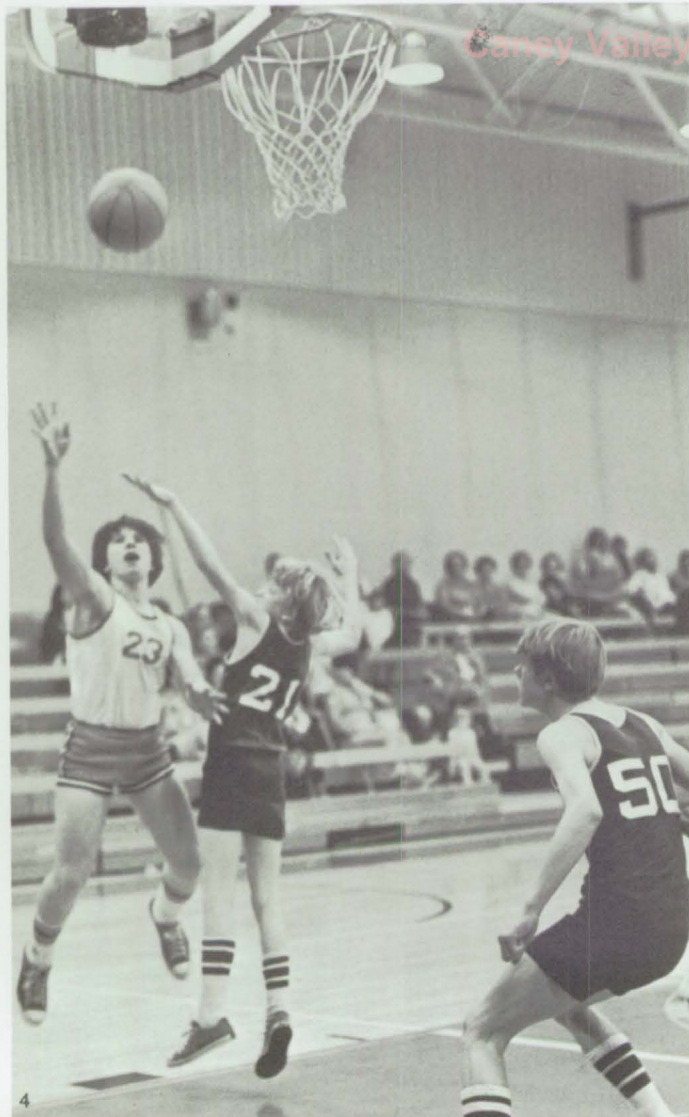

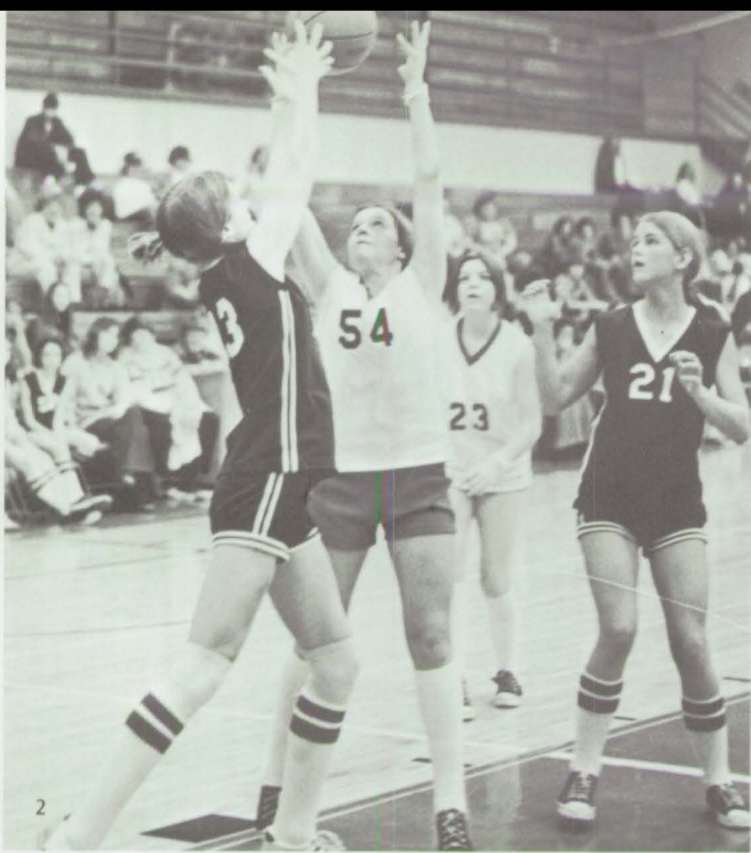


The seventh grade girls' basketball team, under the coaching of Mr. Ron Feldt, had an even 4-4 season.

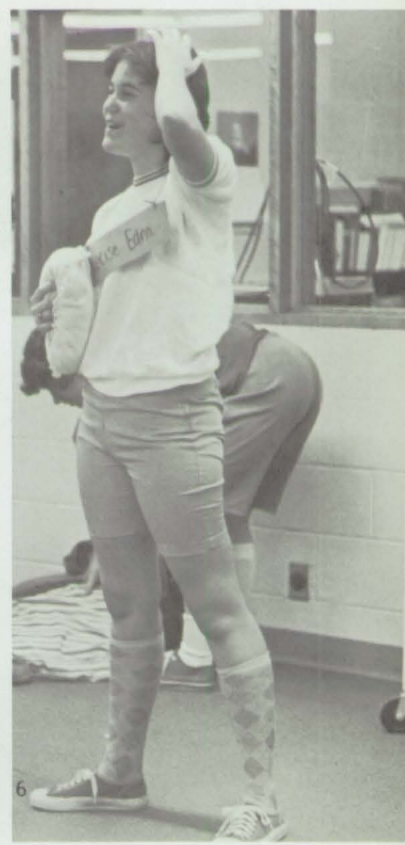


Board meetings, conferences, assemblies and helpful services were some of the many activities performed by the Senior Kayettes during this year.

Other Caney students who participated in the state meeting included Rosalie Deal, who as voting delegate helped select the na-

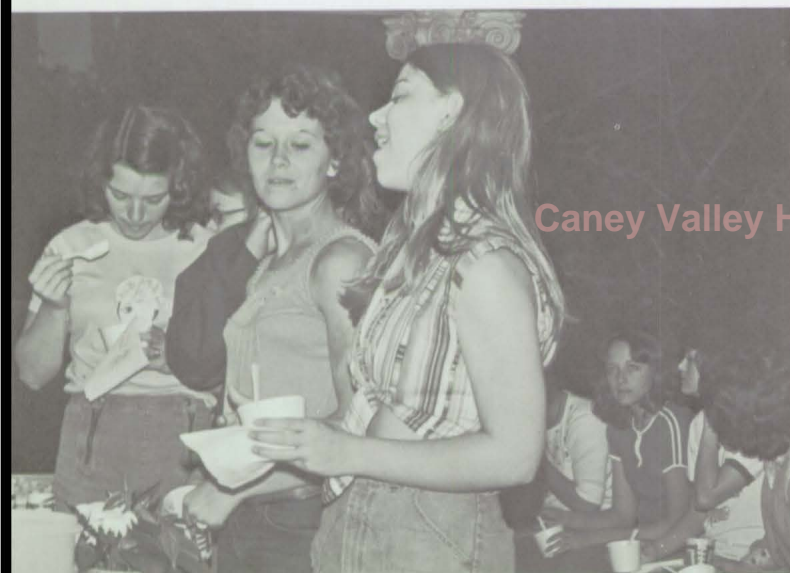

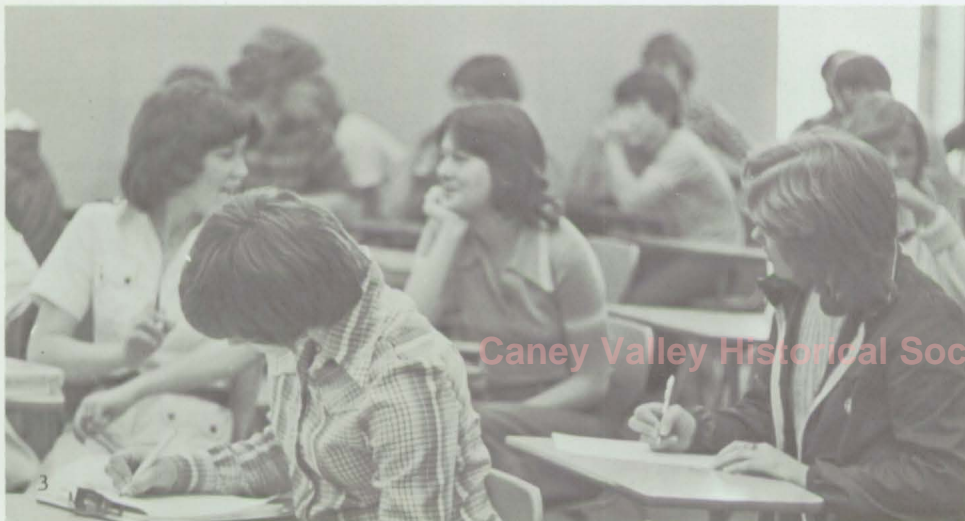
Representing the students of Caney Valley High School, the Student Council sponsored many activities during the year.

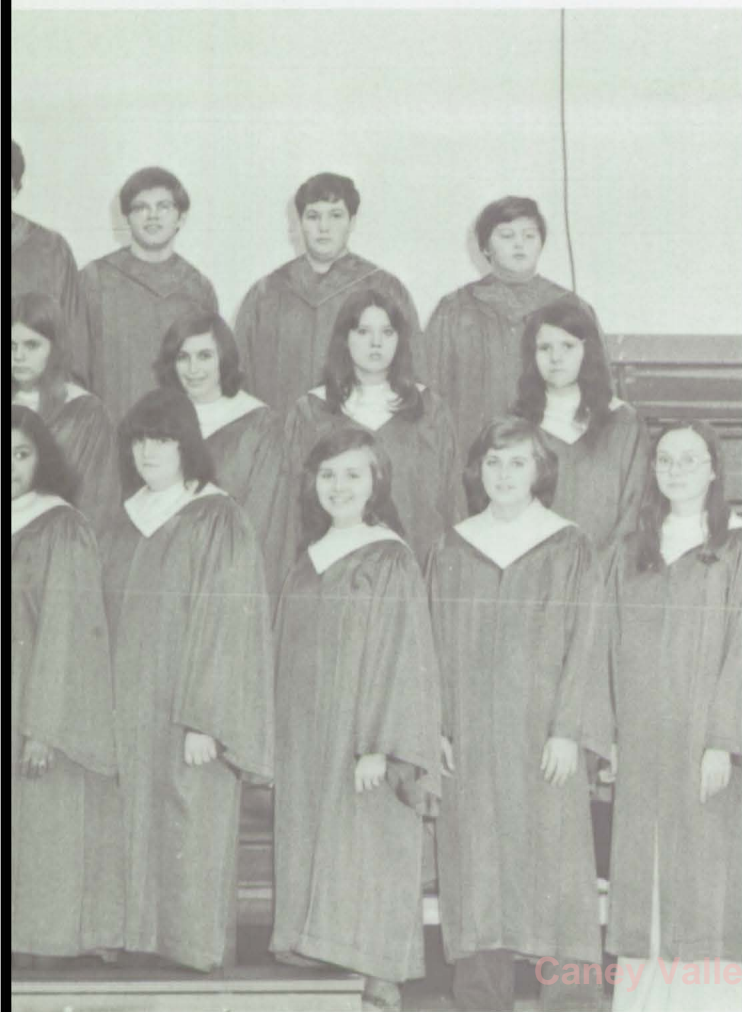

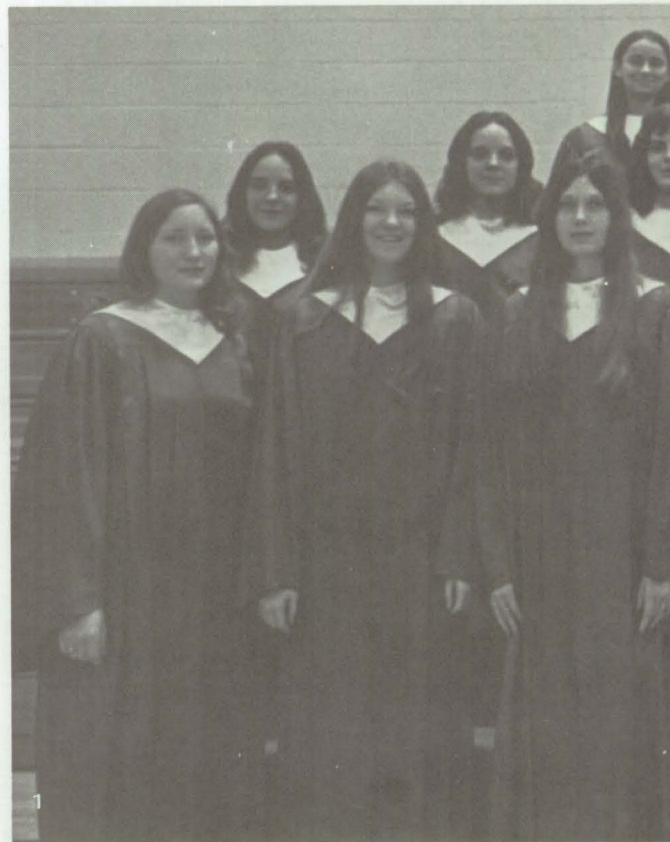


Choruses participate in school concerts

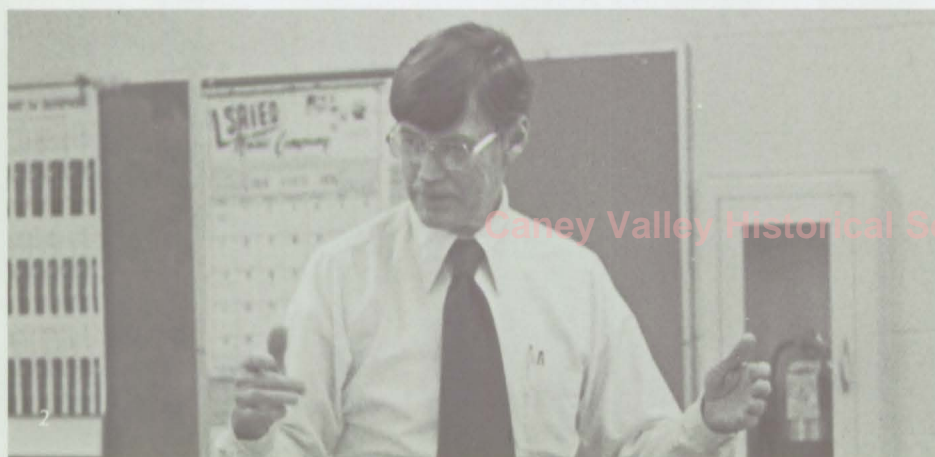

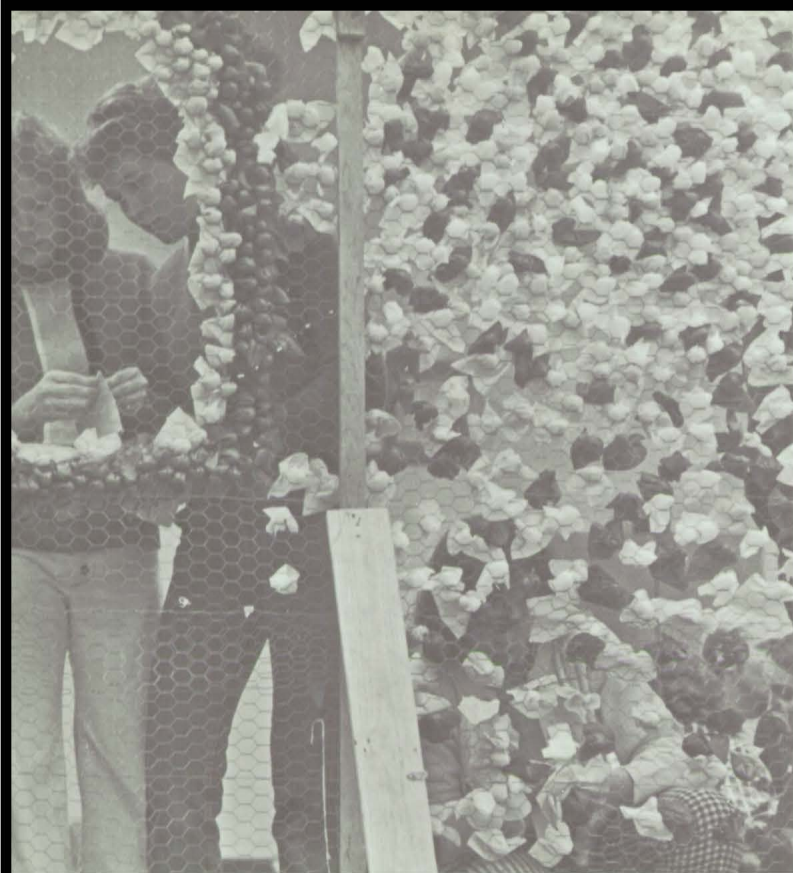

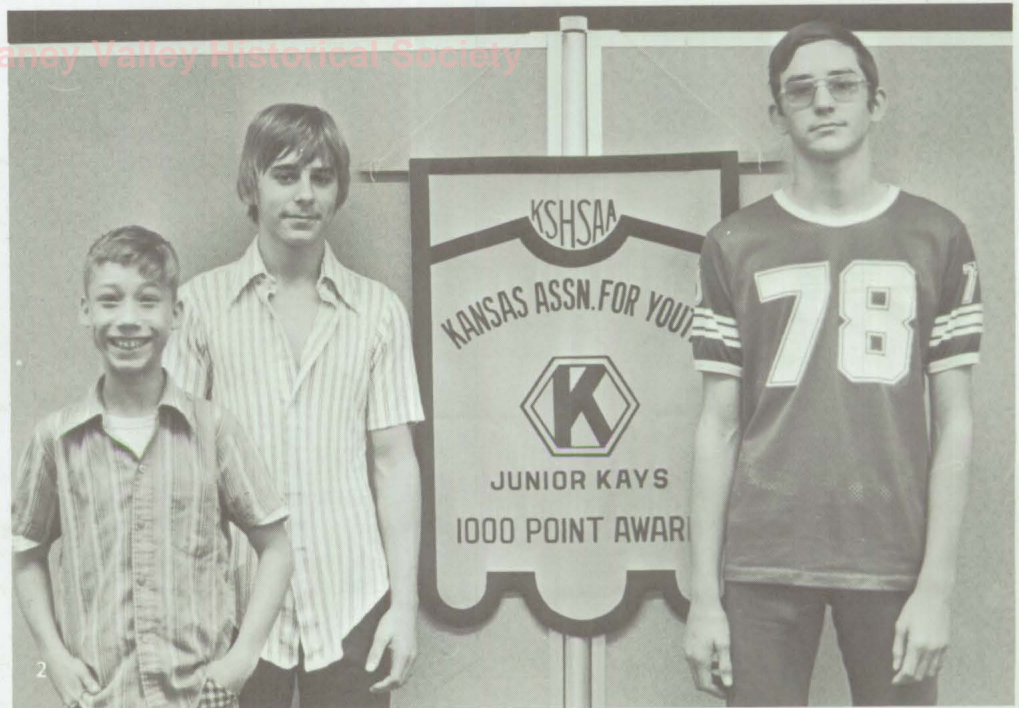


Junior Kays earn 2,000-point award

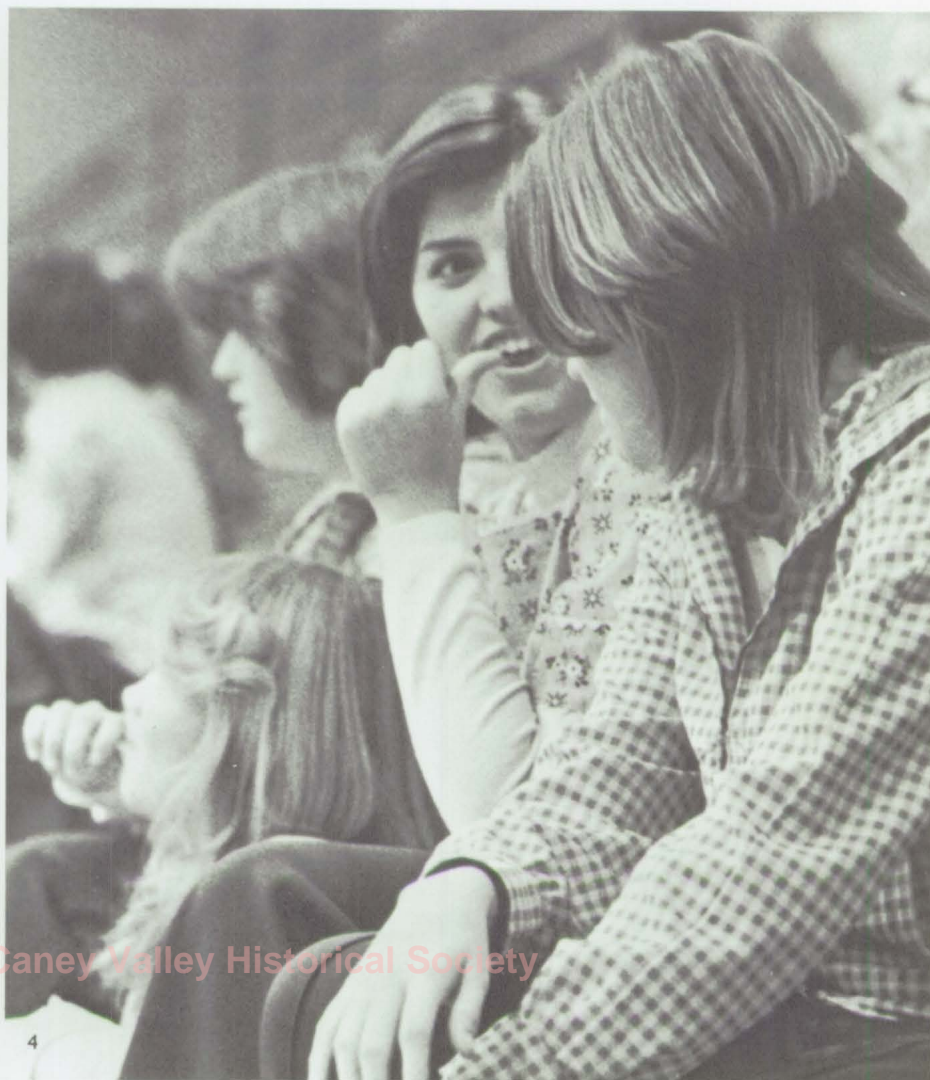

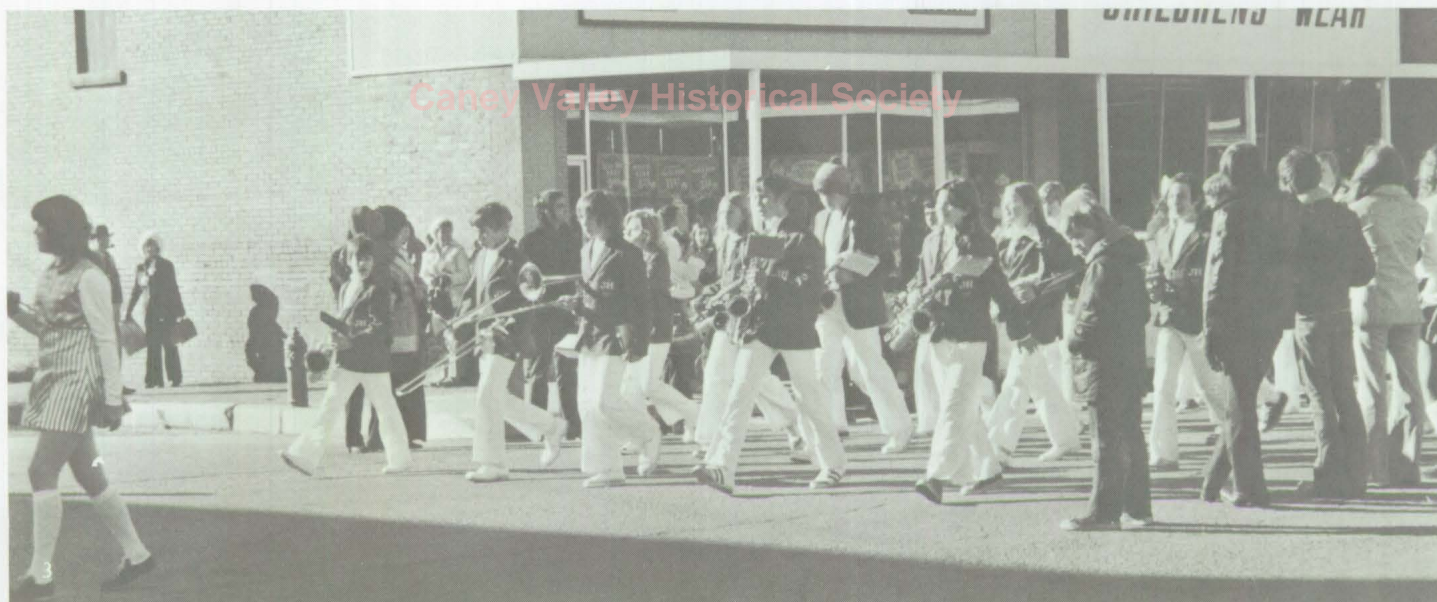


Junior high students develop singing skills

Science, Math Departments take awards at contests

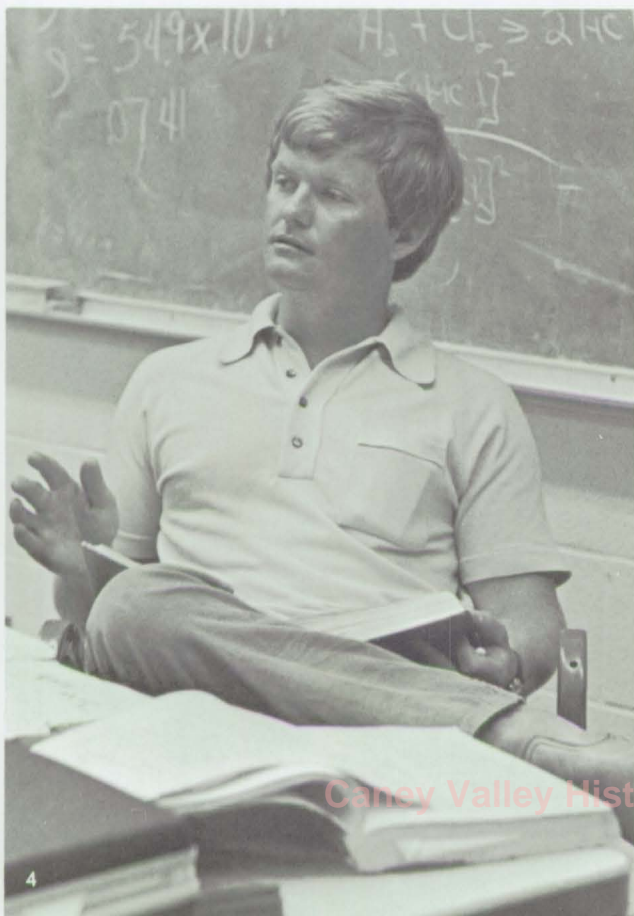

In the Speech Department students participated in debate and forensics contests, some placing in state contests.

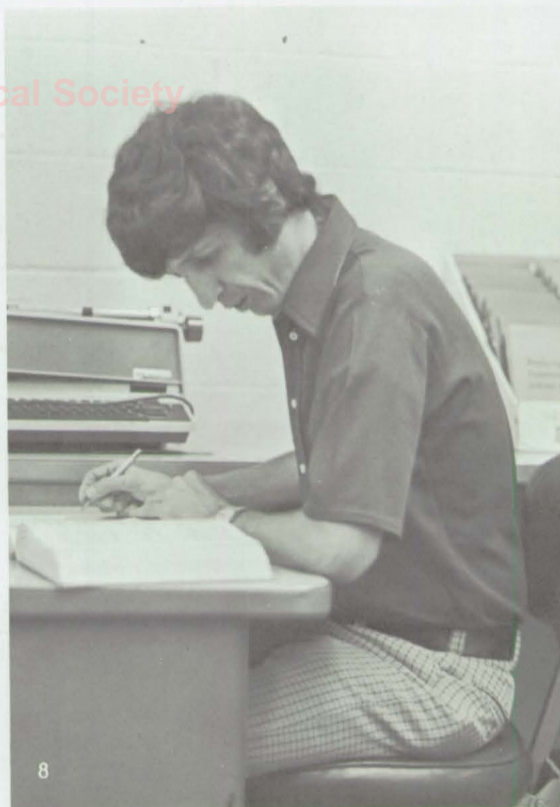
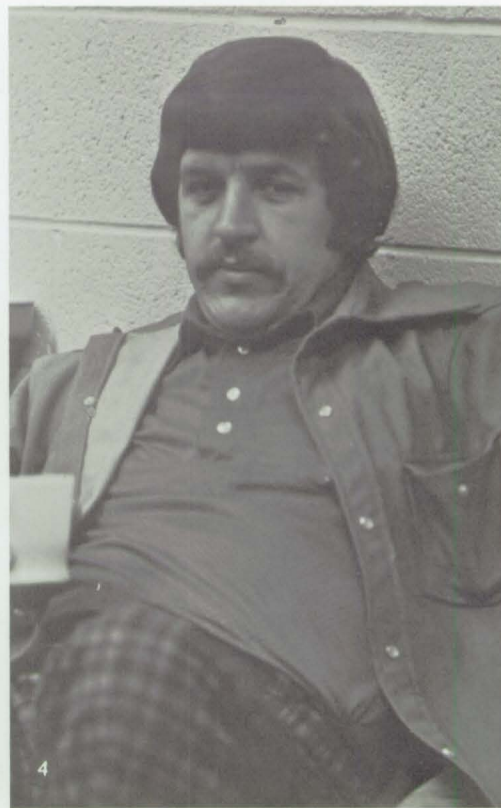
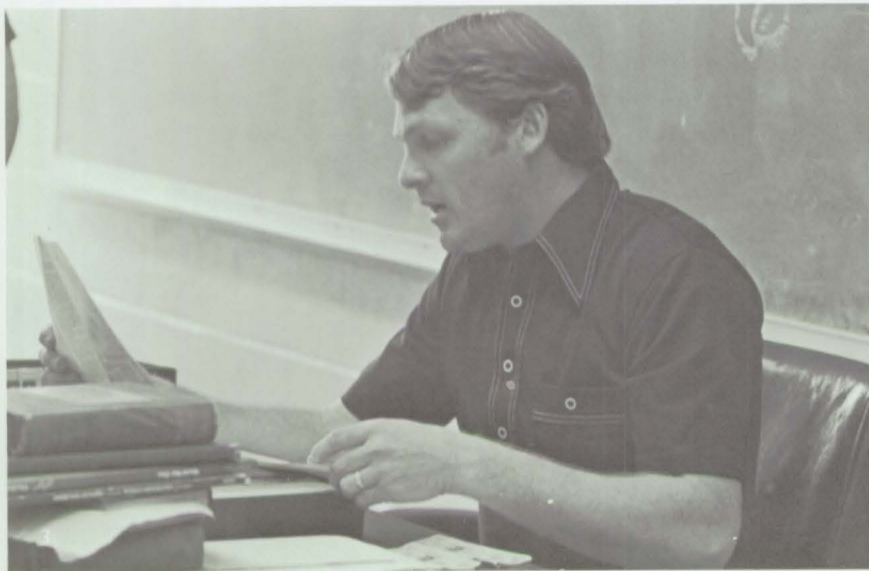
Foreign languages taught were Spanish and French. These students caught a glimpse of foreign cultures as they studied the languages of other countries.

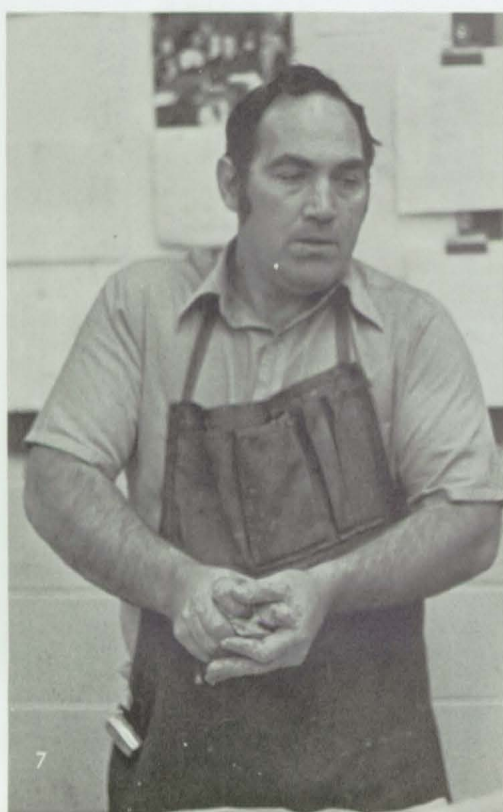

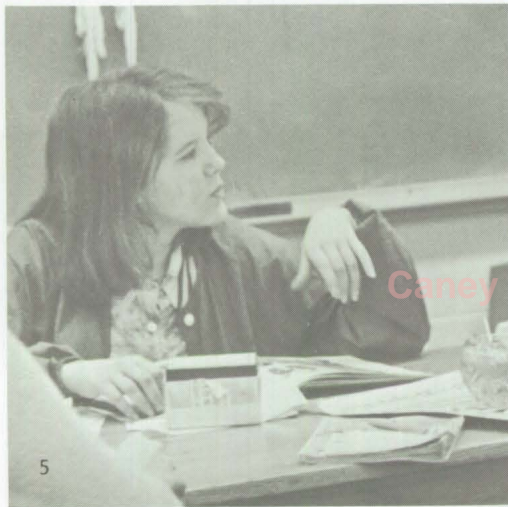


Debate, forensics teams keep busy schedule

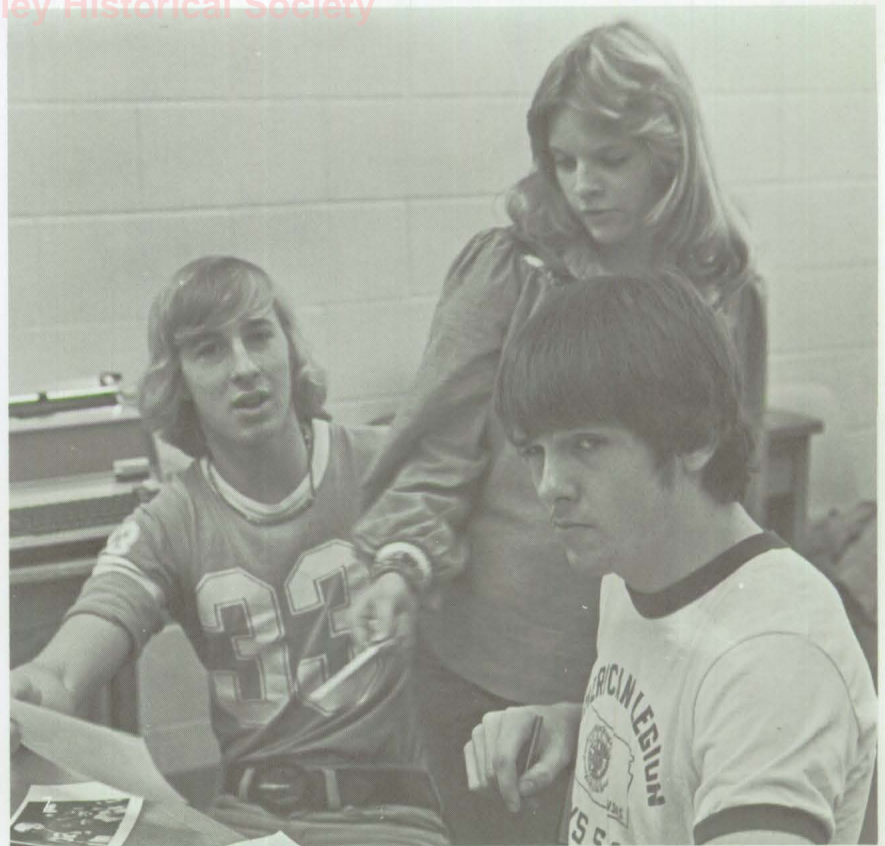

One of the highlights of the year for several members of the publications staffs was competing in the regional Kansas Scholastic

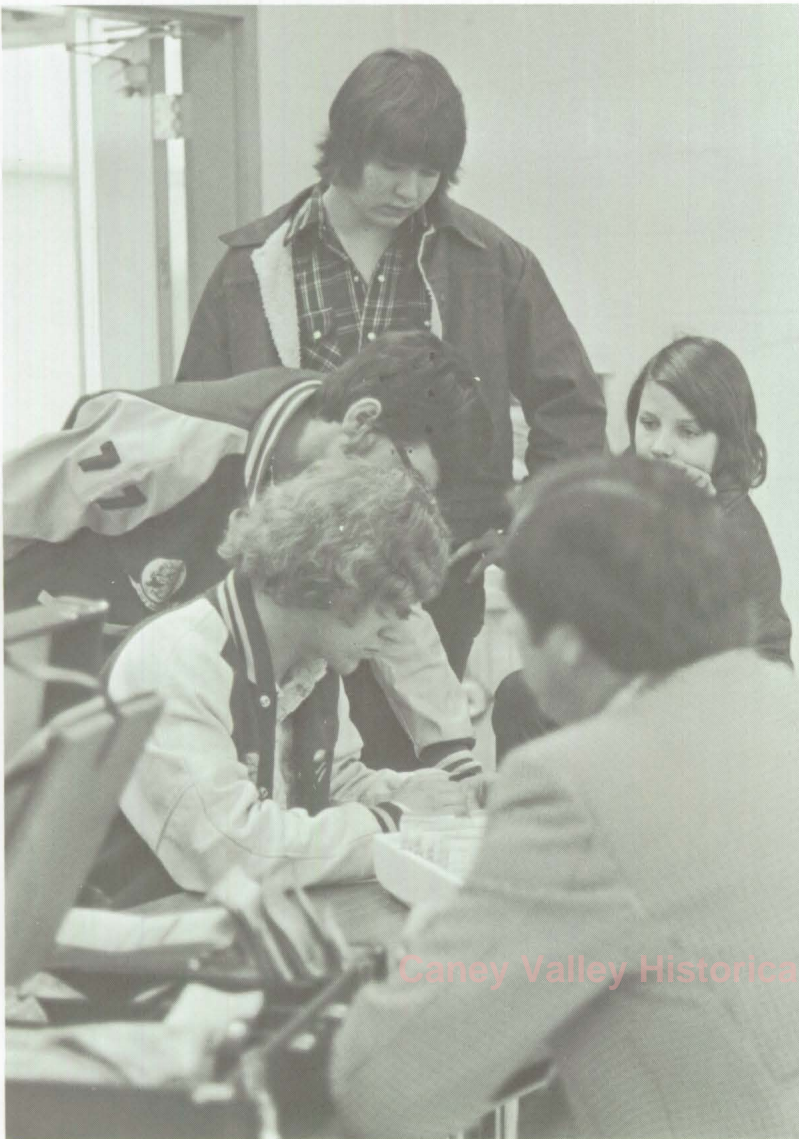

To become a teacher it takes more than just a degree from a college--it takes a very special person who can reach out and open up the minds of students so that the students' curiosity is stirred. "Teacher" is a title that is worn 365 days a year, 24 hours a day. When one wears the title he becomes responsible for the formation of ideas of the students in his classroom.

Mr. Ted Nelson has earned the right to be called a first-class teacher. For over 15 years Mr. Nelson has been one of the most inspiring teachers that ever stood before a classroom full of students, and, with the end of the 1975-76 school year, he has retired from the teaching profession. Mr. Nelson started teaching government and psychology at Caney Valley High School when Wayside and Caney unified in 1967. His first teaching assignment was at Wayside, where he taught seventh and eighth grades and coached.

Students have always found Mr. Nelson's classes interesting because of the personalized touch he gives by telling stories taken from the 20 years he served in the Army. These first-hand experiences enable students to relate to the history and government of our country in a memorable, there-

fore highly educational, way.

During his service career, Mr. Nelson obtained the rank of lieutenant colonel and traveled overseas to Korea, China and Europe. He also saw action in World War II and in the Korean conflict.

Born and raised in Oklahoma, Mr. Nelson can also describe from personal experience this part of the country and what it was like during the Depression. After retiring from the Army, Mr. Nelson attended Cameron Junior College in Lawton, Okla., and then completed requirements for a bachelor's degree at Northeastern State College in Tahlequah, Okla., in order to become a teacher. He also had done graduate work at Emporia State and Pittsburg State Colleges in Kansas.

Mr. Nelson and his wife, whom he describes as "wonderful," now live in Caney. Mr. and Mrs. Nelson raised two daughters and a son, all of whom are now married, and are now the proud grandparents of a grandson and a granddaughter.

Mr. Nelson is a very special person as well as a truly dedicated educator and his students will never forget the enjoyable, yet educational, hours they spent in his classes.

As a CVHS freshman, Steve was involved in many activities. These included the golf team, the CVHS marching band, the stage band and the city bowling league.

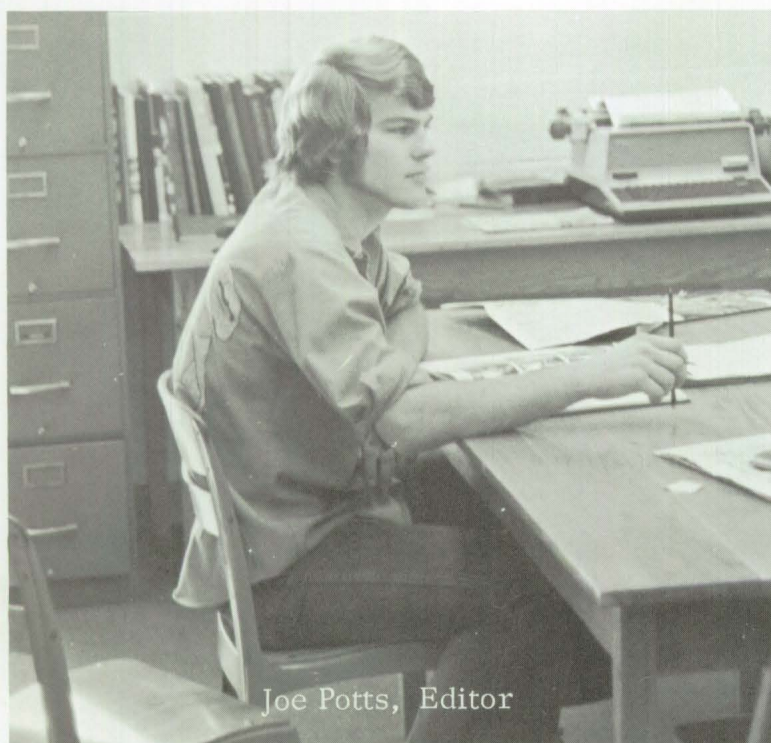
An estimated 350 persons attended Steve's funeral April 19 at the First Christian Church. One wing of the church was

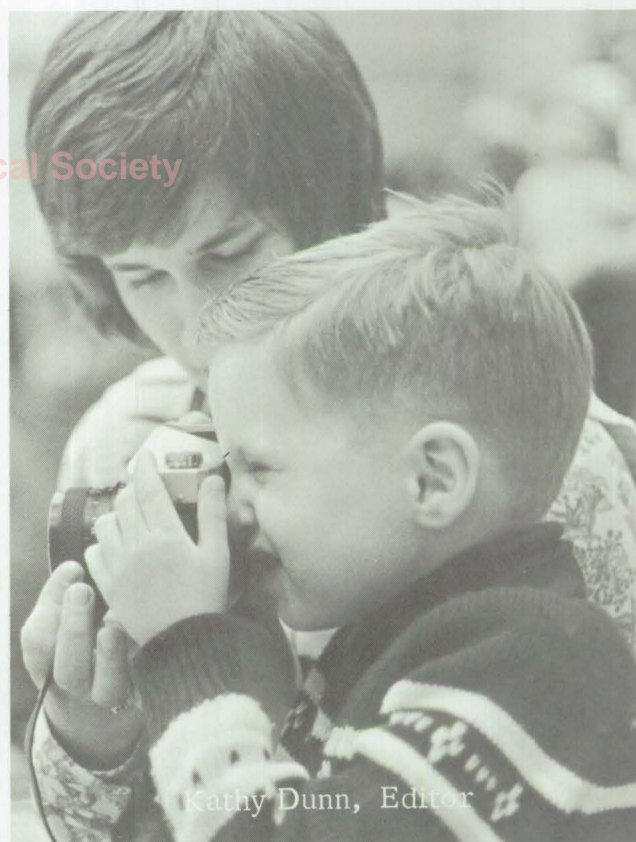
