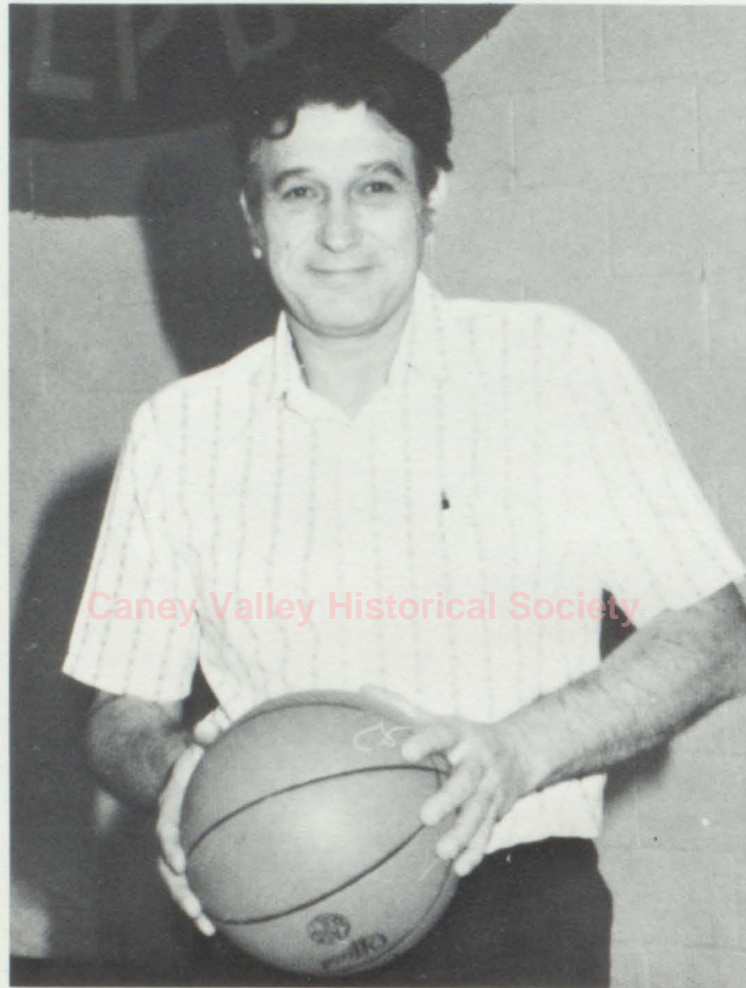

Mr. Donald Burchfield

. . . Devoted To The Student



The Kane-Kan staff dedicates the 1977 yearbook to Mr. Donald Burchfield. Mr. Burchfield or "Buck" as many people knew him, was a teacher at Caney Valley High School from 1968 to his death on January 21, 1977.

A warm and loyal friend to students, teachers and school patrons, Mr. Burchfield taught drivers' education and drafting and coached Junior High Basketball and golf. Many successful golfers owe their development to Mr. Burchfield's dedication to good sportsmanship as well as to golfing ability. As a driver education teacher, his undisturbed attitude and patience inspired confidence in even the most nervous driver. By putting to use his exceptional talent and knowledge of the integration of athletics into the school curriculum, he succeeded in keeping the interest of the student or athlete uppermost.

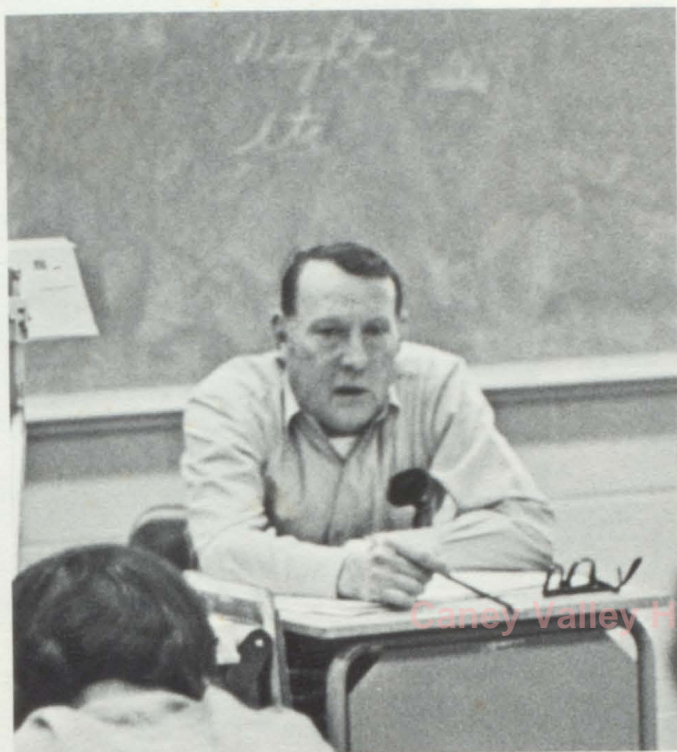
A friendly outlook and cheerful smile, along with his inevitable coffee cup, made students feel at ease in Mr. Burchfield's company. He was always willing to listen to whatever a student wanted to discuss.

Slow to anger, despite much provocation, Mr. Burchfield's even temperament exhibited itself in concern and compassion for the student. His sense of humor was memorable in that it often rose to the occasion. Showing consideration for fellow teachers and students alike, he was able to communicate well in all situations.

... An Inspiration



"Teddy Nelson was one heck of a teacher; he could keep anyone's attention even through an earthquake," said one of his students, when asked what he thought of Mr. Nelson's classes.

Twenty years service in the U. S. Army, obtaining the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, culminated in Mr. Nelson's becoming a US government teacher. During his service career, he traveled overseas to Korea, China, and Europe. He also saw action in World War II in Hawaii and in the Korean War. Wanting to share his experiences and interests in government and psychology, he decided to retire from military service and return to school to obtain a degree in teaching. Many interesting experiences filled his army life and these he often shared in the classroom.

His background as a native of northeast Oklahoma enabled Mr. Nelson to enrich his lectures with his memories of the area, especially during the depression era. Fair in all situations, Mr. Nelson's subject knowledge, variety of presentation, and practical adaptation of subject matter enabled even normally disinterested students to excel.

After teaching seventh and eighth grades at Wayside and coaching the "Nelson's Raiders's", Mr. Nelson began teaching at Caney when Wayside consolidated into U. S. D. #436. To Caney High students, he taught government and psychology. With his interest in government and concern for students, Mr. Nelson also became the sponsor of the Student Council where he was able to put into practice the government skills he taught. We will always remember that he was our very special friend as well as a teacher.

Mr. Ted Nelson's teaching abilities were rare and unique in a way that made him very special in the hearts of his students. He offered much more than just textbook material, he offered a lifetime of experience and knowledge to anyone willing to accept the challenge.

Pat Cunningham was crowned queen and escorted to the float made of three shades of blue with silver letters spelling DREAM ON.

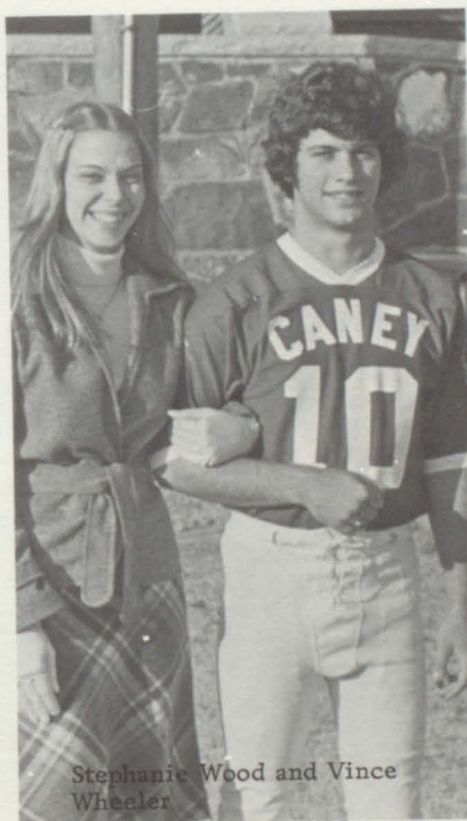

Caney High's Bullpups enjoyed another successful season as they fought to a 9-2 record and a berth of second in the district playoffs.

Preseason practice started off on a bad note as senior starting quarterback Vince Wheeler tore ligaments in his left knee during the second intrasquad scrimmage of the year and had to undergo surgery which put him out of action for the season. Freshman Danny Frye took over the controls and helped lead the Pups to their first victory against Yates Center, 20-0.

Caney played their second game at Southeast of Cherokee and won again 14-0. In the first home game of the season the Bullpups beat Neodesha 16-12 on a last second touchdown pass from Danny Frye to Steve Ross. In the fourth game of the season Caney defeated Fredonia, the Tri-Valley League Champs, on the Yellowjackets home field 16-6. In this game Defensive Coach Randy Westfahl's "stack" defense held Fredonia to almost nothing after the first quarter.

Humbolt was the next opponent, and Caney spoiled the Cub's homecoming with a 31-7 trouncing. A week later at home, Caney downed the Cherryvale Chargers 18-14. The low point of the season came the following week when the Bullpups lost to archrival Sedan on a muddy Bluedevil field, 10-0. However, the next week Caney came bouncing back to drill Eureka 65-6 in the last home game of the season. The Bullpups finished their regular season 8-1 and qualified for the State Playoffs by pounding Chilocco Indian School 45-0 on the Indians home soil.

In the first round of state competition, Caney squeaked by Douglass 20-16 at Douglass. Caney's season came to an end a week later as they lost to powerful Belle Plaine at Belle Plaine. The Bullpups lost that contest 27-8 as two or three Caney players were forced to the bench during the second half with injuries.

Coach Ron Childress' first year at the head coaching job proved very successful. He was aided by three other first year assistant coaches. They were Randy Westfahl, Dennis Fox, and Mike Wilson. The Bullpups graduate 14 seniors which will be sorely missed. Among these 14 are such standouts as Kenny Brown, who ran for over 2,500 yards in his career, and Fullback Mark Robbins, who cleared the way for Brown while at the same time running for 1,000 career yards. Guy "Muc" McClure led the team in tackles as he hit with reckless abandon during his three years as a Bullpup starter. The rest of the senior class is pictured here with these three. All 14 of them gave their own contribution to this year's winning effort.

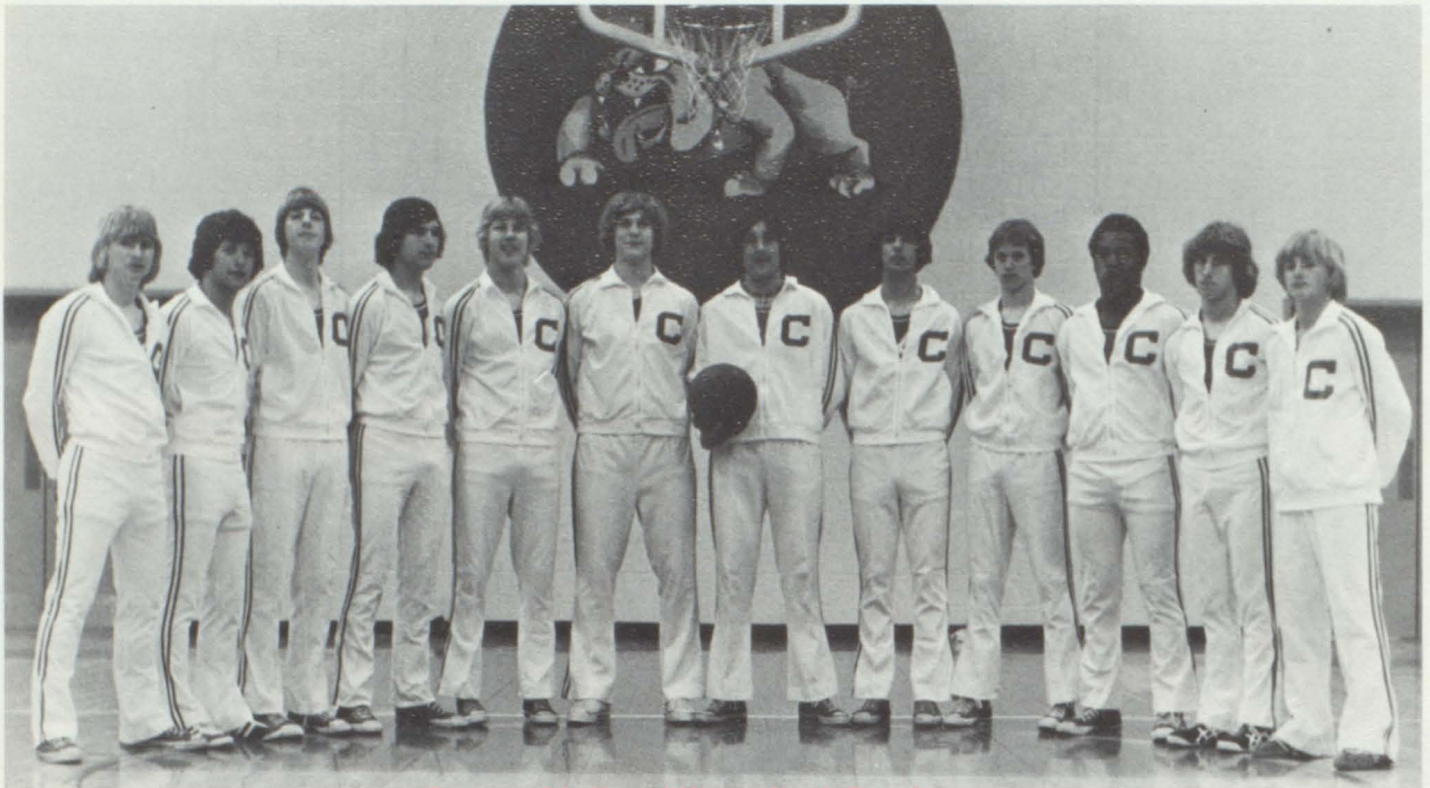

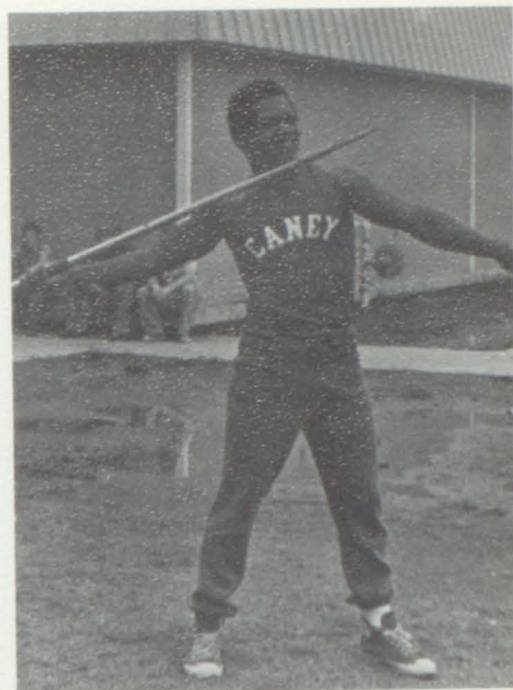

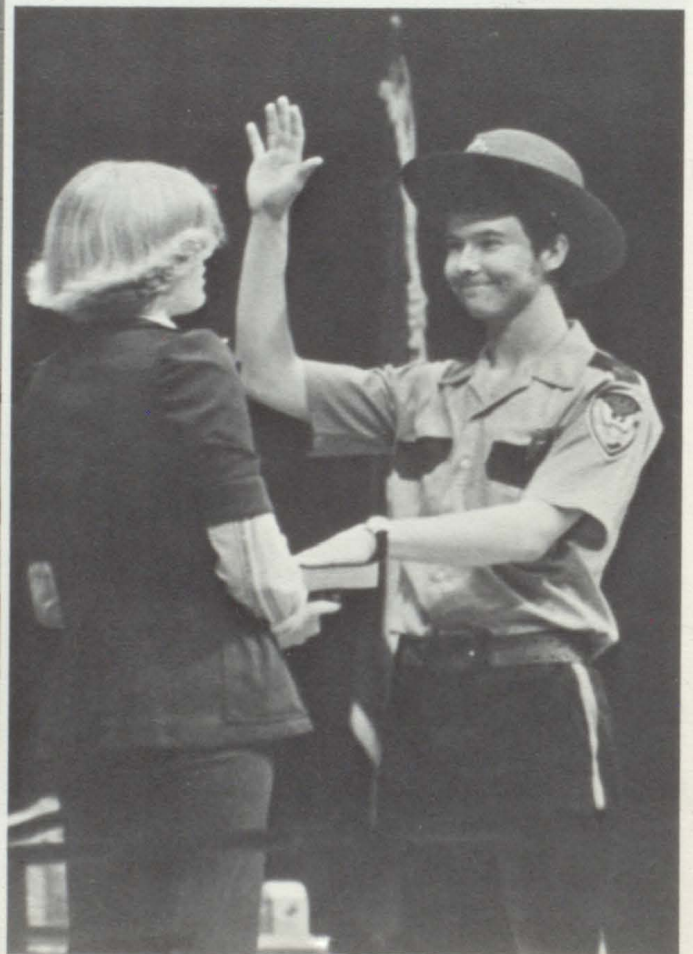

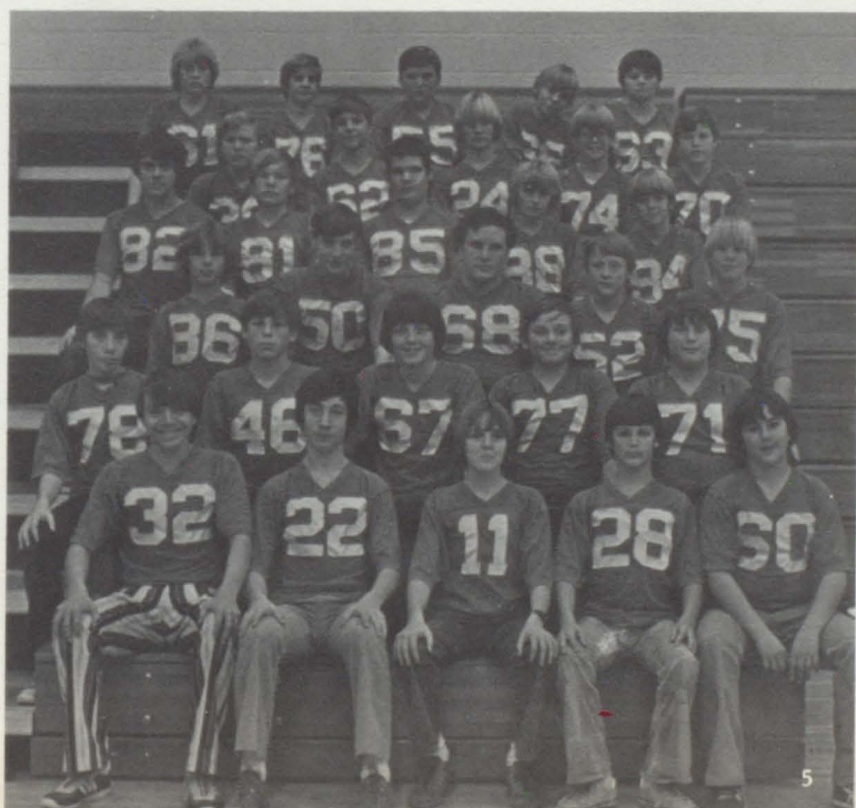

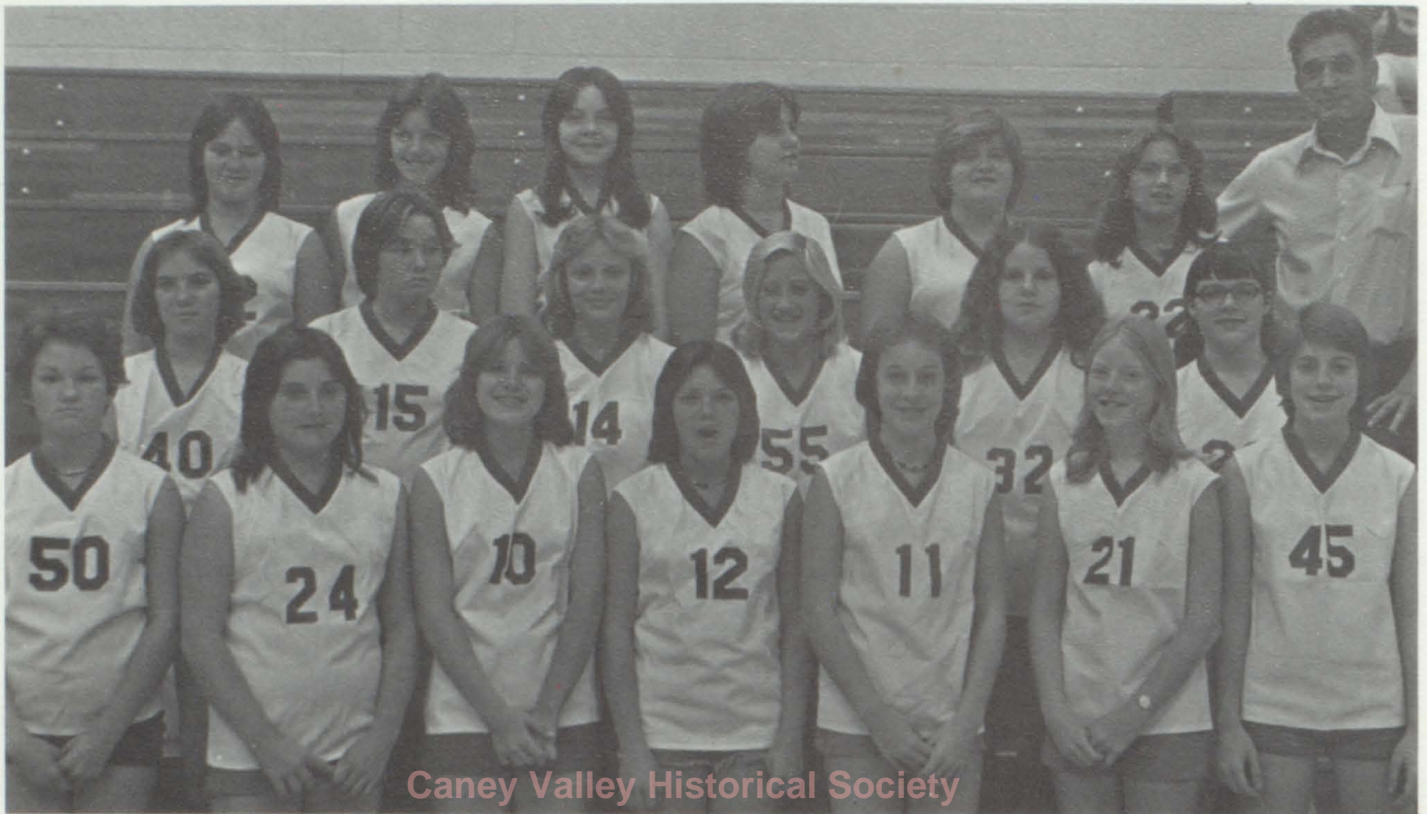

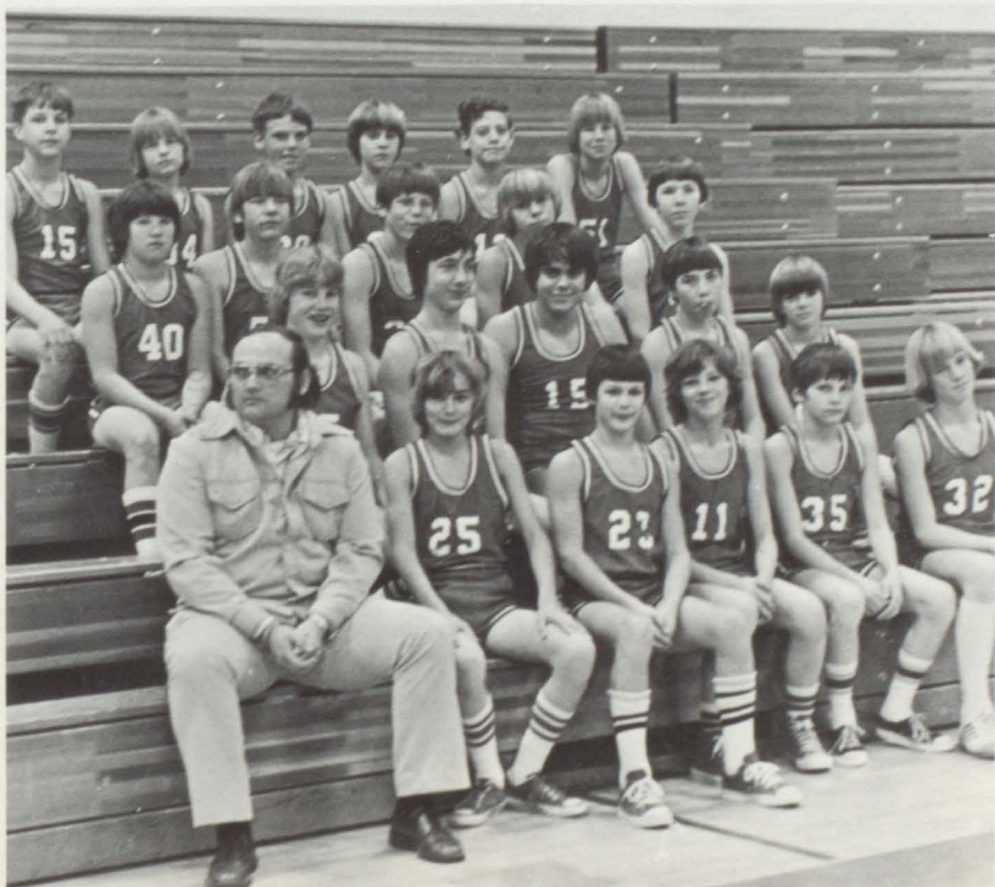
