Dear Brother;-

I wrote you some time ago but have not heard from you. I also had a letter from Mother saying that she had not heard from you for a good while so you had better write her.

I am now in Minn. have been here for about a month. I will not make the trip to the coast owing to arrangements with the Appeal to make a series of subscription meetings in Conn. and Mass. in Oct. I will probably go to the third Dist in Kans. for Sept. where they hope to elect Brewer to Congress tho' I don't think there is much show of doing so, but it will likely be very close. I will be home the last of Aug. if I go to Kans. for a few days.

The folks wrote that the dry weather had put the corn all out of business. They thrashed and had 130 bu of wheat.

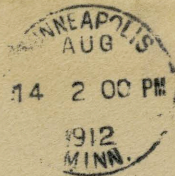
