Dear Breeding Bird Survey Cooperator:

As I write this letter, it is snowing and we have just had two days of strong (and cold) Northwest winds. Despite these wintry conditions, it is time to start thinking about the Breeding Bird Survey for 1975.

Last year the BBS managed to do quite well despite gasoline problems. The total number of routes submitted was only 40 fewer than in 1973--only about a 2 percent decrease. There are still a few scattered routes which we know were run but haven't come in, as well as a few others of uncertain outcome. Hopefully gasoline will be available throughout June and we can do better than last year. Several of our State coordinators are already "whipping the troops together" and Northern California is completely "booked" at this point.
