


















## Bullpups Play Spoiler In Tri-Valley League

1978 was a year of rebuilding for the Caney football squad, but it was a good year. Although the Pups didn't have a super season and finished with a record of 9-0, they still had a winning season of 5-4. The record may show little, but the Pups deserve a lot of admiration. After a disappointing start the Pups made a tremendous comeback by winning their last three ballgames, two of which were against TVL contenders Cherryvale and Yates Center


Caney's Bullpups had a lot to learn before the season opened as they gained a new coach, and a good one at that, in Don Dewey. Dewey, with his fiery speeches and his enthusiastic antics, spirited the Pups through the joy of victories as well as the heart-breaking losses.

Assisted by Mike Wilson, Moss Davis, and Bob Williams, Coach Dewey disciplined the offensive and defensive units to work as one instead of separate individuals.

Because of the well-disciplined teamwork, many of the Bullpup players received honors for their outstanding performances. Junior quaterback, Danny Frye, led the league in passing by completing 89 of 176 passes for 1084 yards to make honorable mention. Senior Randy Nitz, who led the league in receptions with 29 for 418 yards, received all-league honors at splitend. Junior Steve Lindsey received honorable mention at split-end with 376 yards on 29 receptions. Senior Jim Henderson and Junior Jeff Blakemore received honorable mention at the linebacker position. Senior Keith Lovelace, who led Caney with 38 tackles, made honorable mention at defensive lineman position. Junior Ralph Hill received honorable mention all-league at tight end.

Three of these players received even higher honors for their accomplishments. Nitz received All-State Honors at split-end, while Frye and Lovelace gained honorable mention at their respective positions.

The Bullpups learned a lot in what may have seemed a short time, but they took it all in stride. Led by seniors Jim Henderson, Randy Nitz, and Keith Lovelace they showed their extreme ability to change and still come out strong and with PRIDE!

Caney's 78-79 Basketball Team was expected to be one of the high school powers in the TVL (Tri-Valley League), but it was not destined to be. The Bullpups just didn't seem able to play to their full potential the entire game, thus ending the season with a disappointing record of 6-14.

Coach Mike Wilson, along with assistant coach, Don Dewey, saw the young Bullpup team control the first three quarters of most of their games, only to turnover

the ball continually and lose the ballgame.


Caney was not without its' bright points though. Senior Keith Lovelace, who was named All Tri- Valley League, led the Bullpups in shooting from the field by hitting 136-217 shots for a 63% average.

The 6'5' center led the Bullpups in rebounds, also, with 215. Quickness and sharp outside shooting were provided by Junior Mike Deal, who was 31% from the field and 60% from the line, and Senior Randy Nitz who was 31% from the field and 55% from the line. The height and rebounding were manned by Senior Keith Lovelace, Junior Danny Frye, who hit 42% from the field and 66% from the line, as did Chris McGinnis, who his 44% from the field and shot 52% from the line. Both McGinnis and Nitz received honorable mention in the TVL.


The Bullpup roundballers found a very frustrating year, but they have no reason to hang their heads. They played as best as they could, and no one can ask


Coach Bob Williams' 1979 Varsity Wrestlers faced very stiff competition this year, but they did have some bright spots.



#### Girls Set, Spike, And Bump Way To Tournament Victory








#### Too Much Heaven
