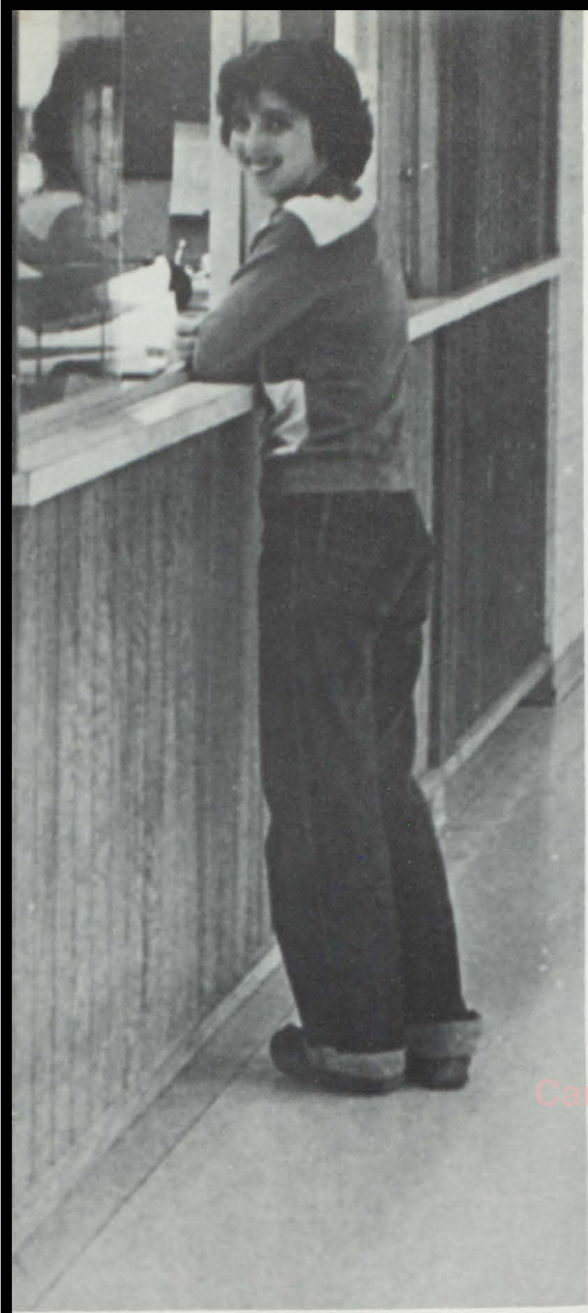

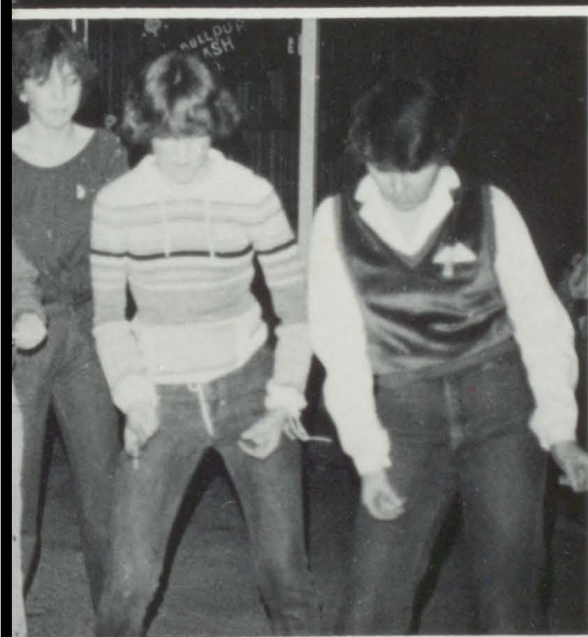

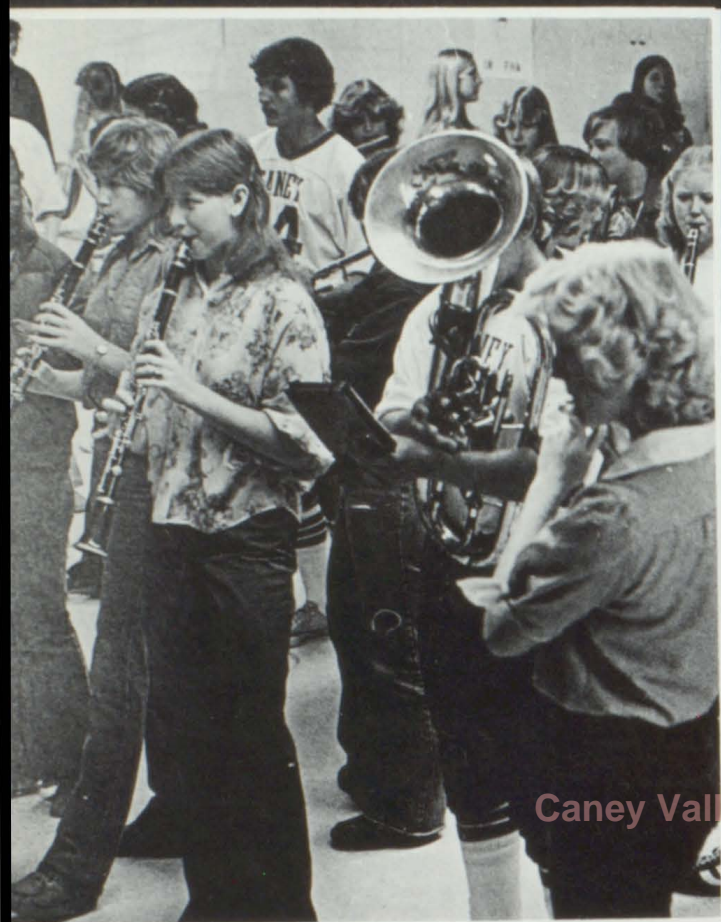

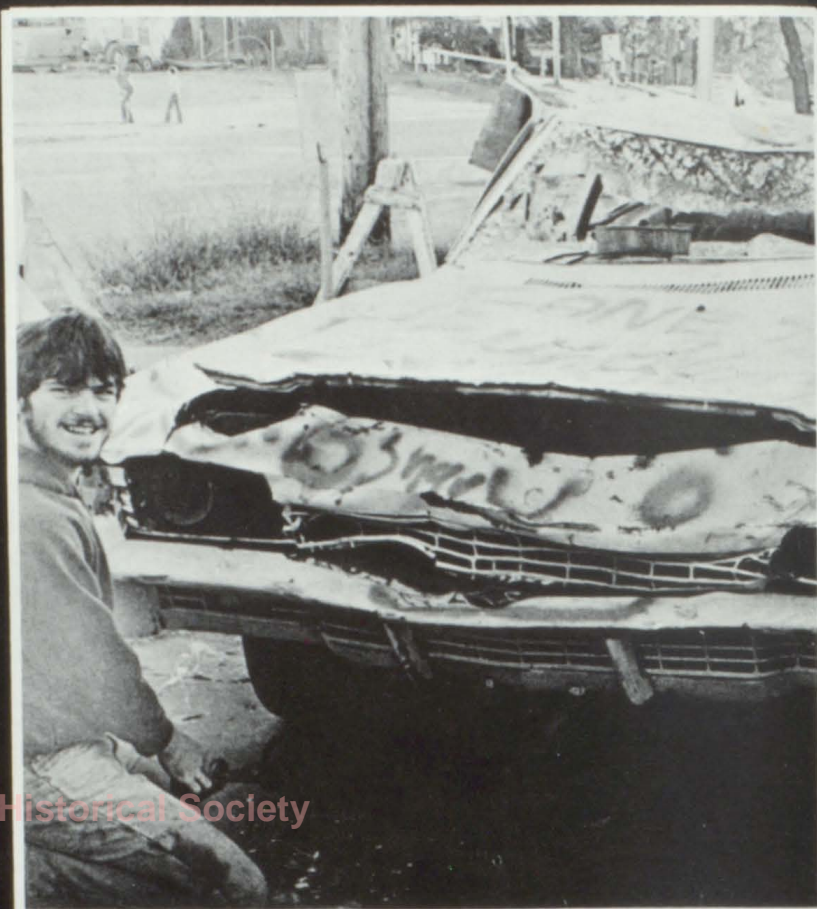

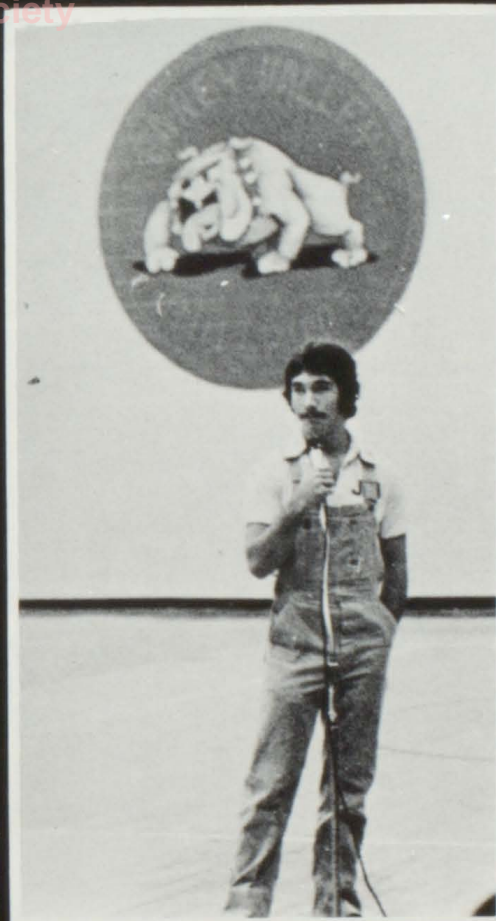

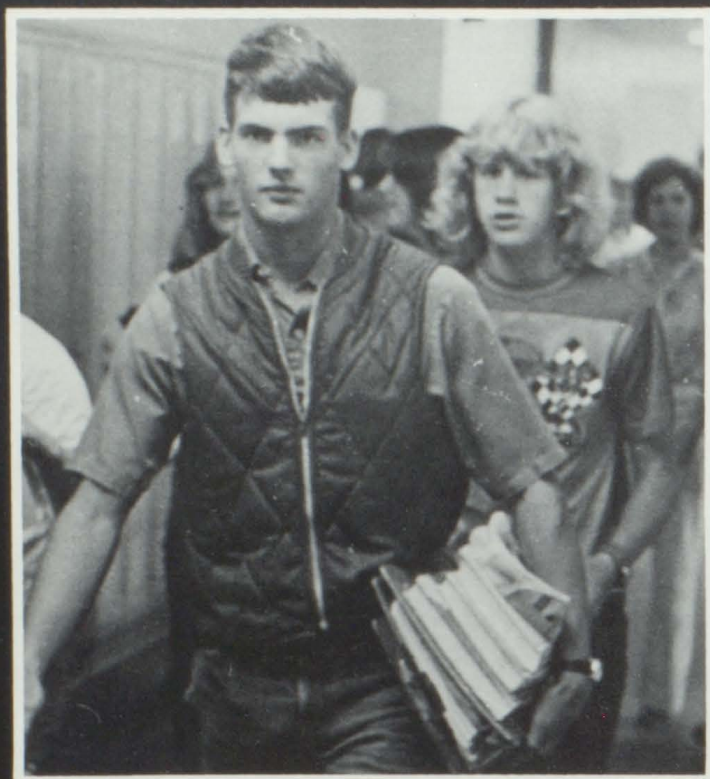

A Time To Remember . . .





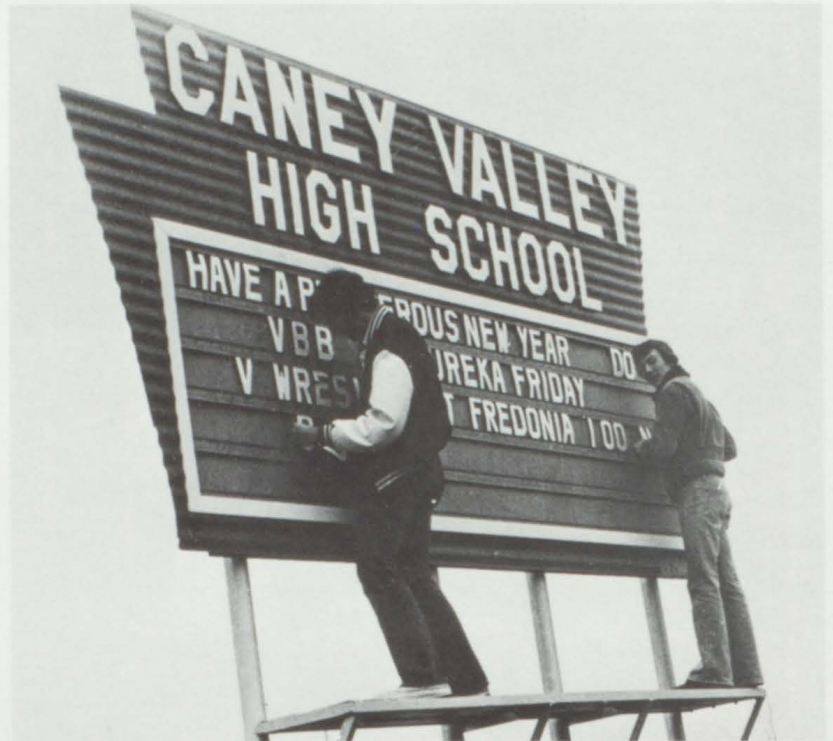

Stuco carries the responsibility of scheduling school dances, activities, and money raising projects for the other organizations. Ms. Zimmerman, English instructor, was the sponsor.

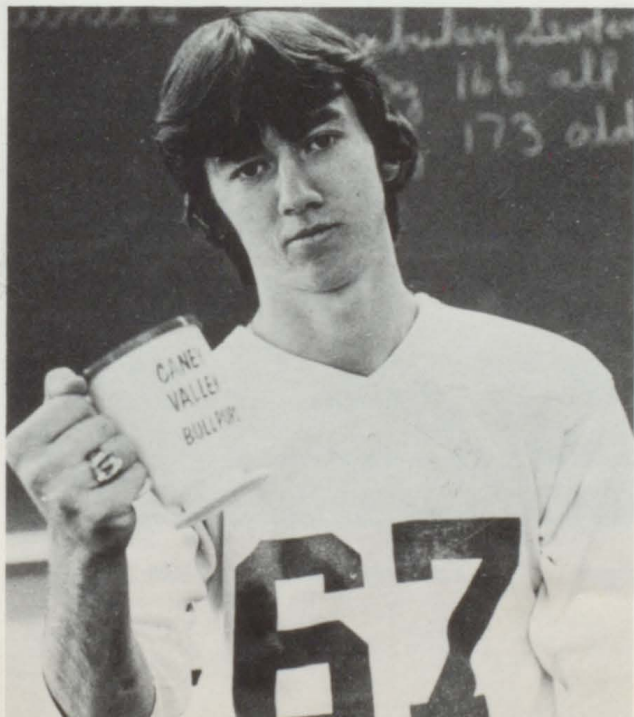

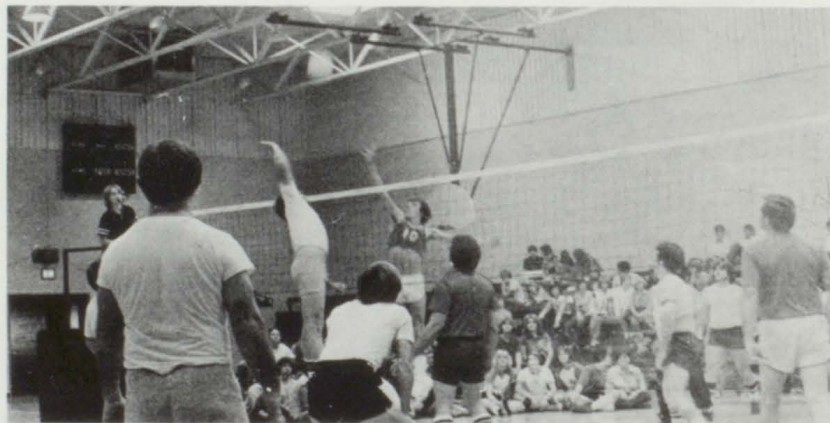

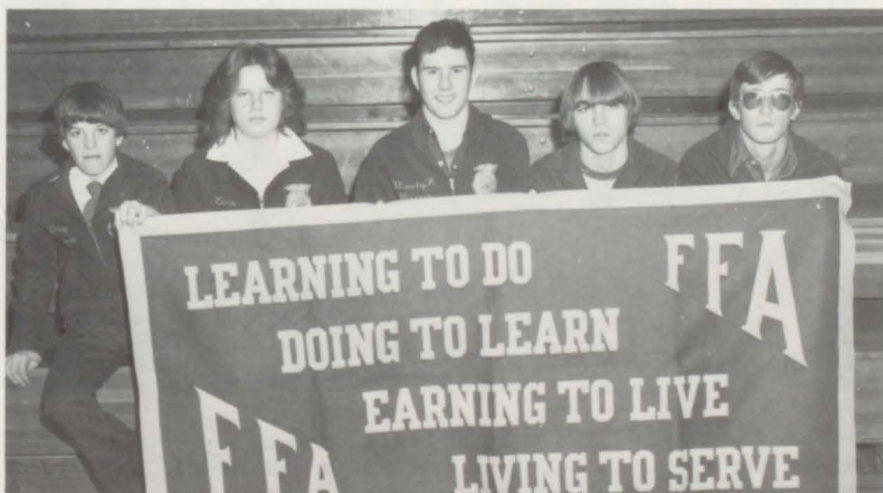

The major activity of the year was hosting the District Election in which 14 chapters brought 210 members to CVHS on February 6 to elect District J-West officers.

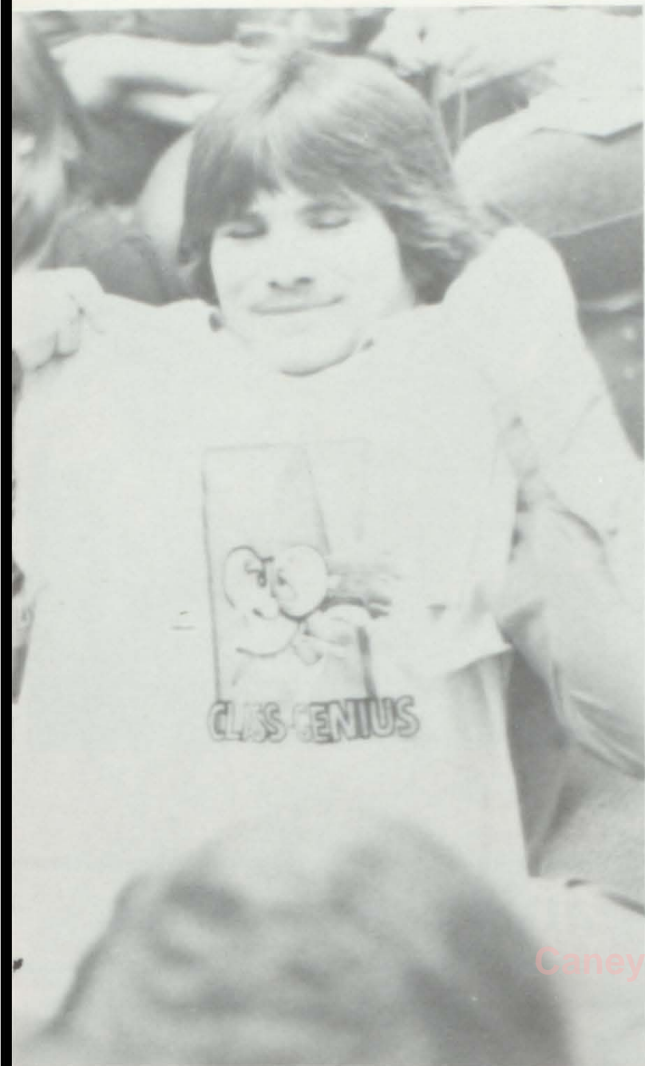

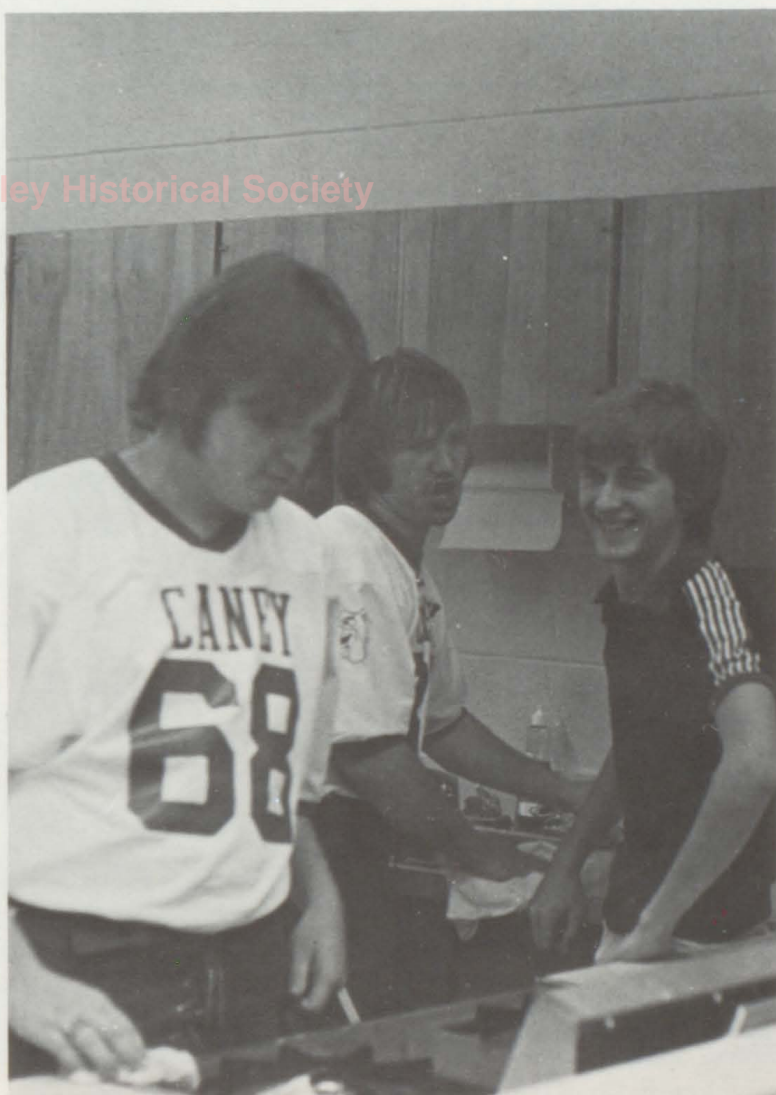

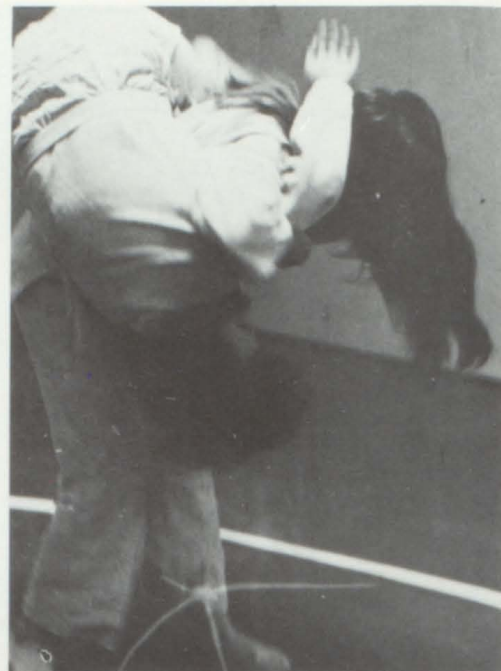

In April the band traveled to Pittsburg to compete in the Annual Band Contest. There also were some duets and trios that competed.

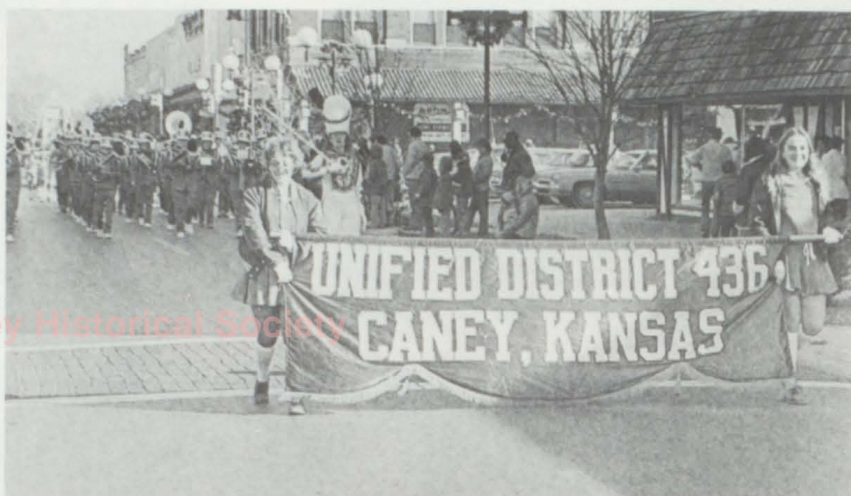

The drill team performed at

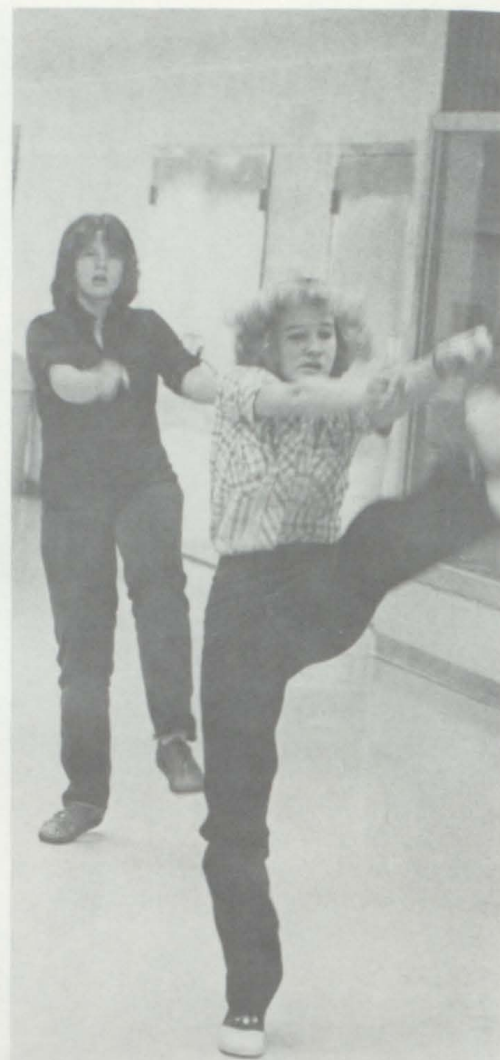
the home football and basketball games at halftime. Marsha Fall-leaf and Lisa McDaniel sponsored the drill team and helped them with choreography.

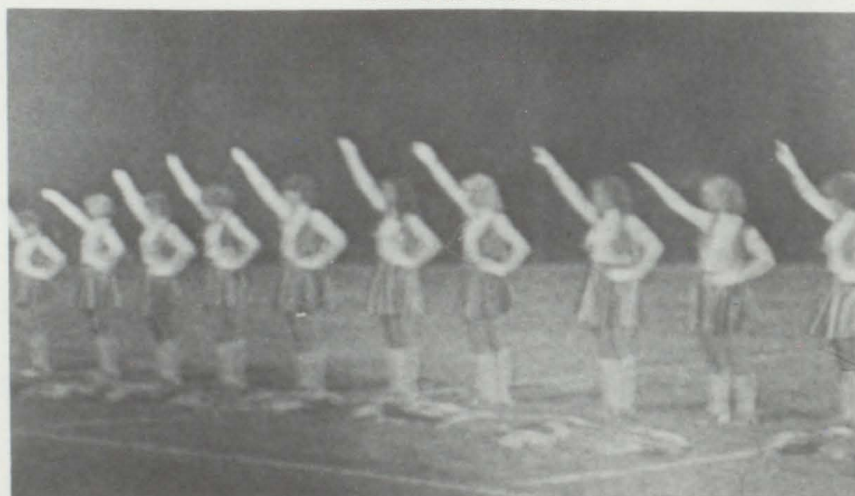

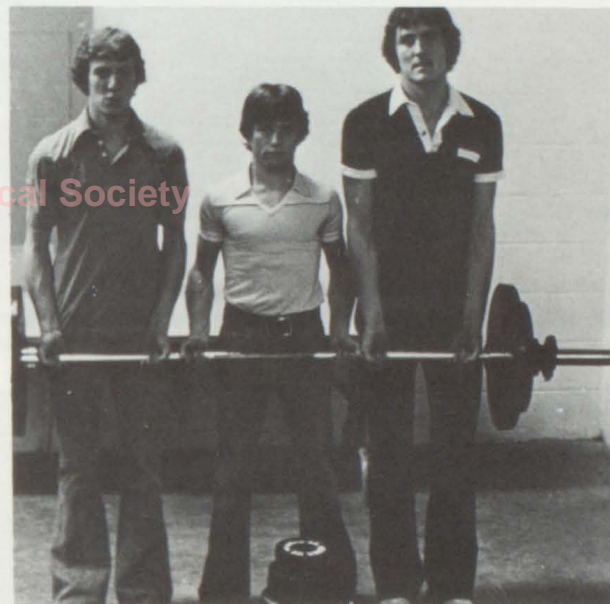

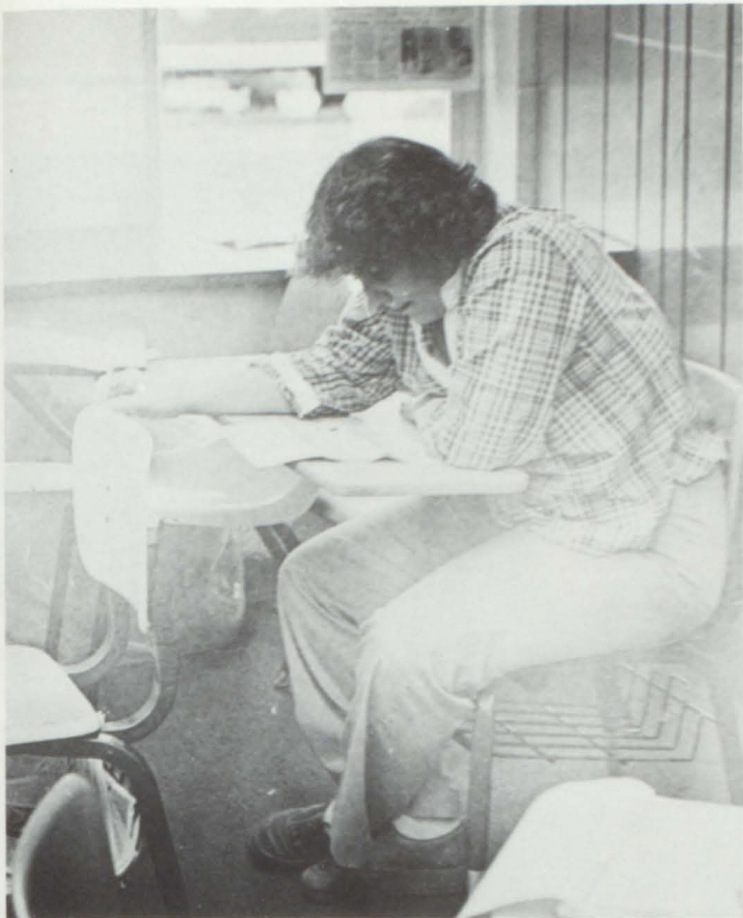

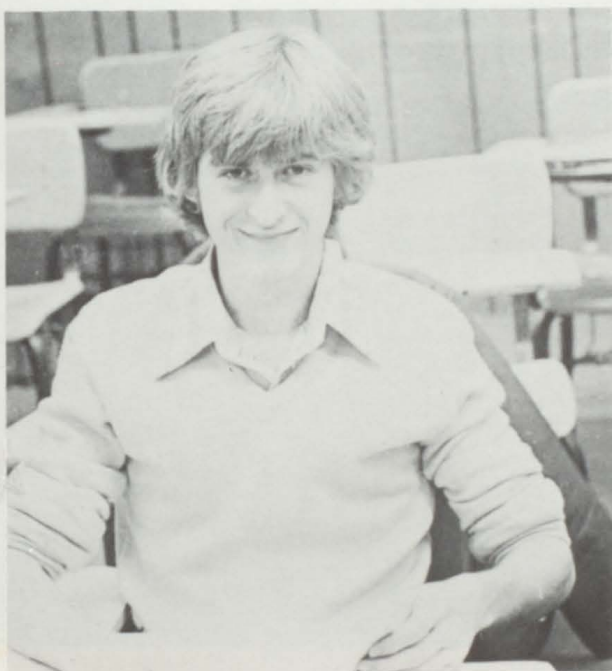

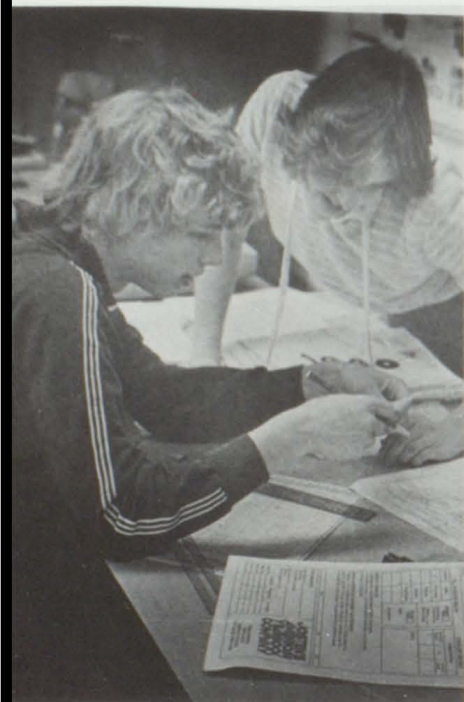

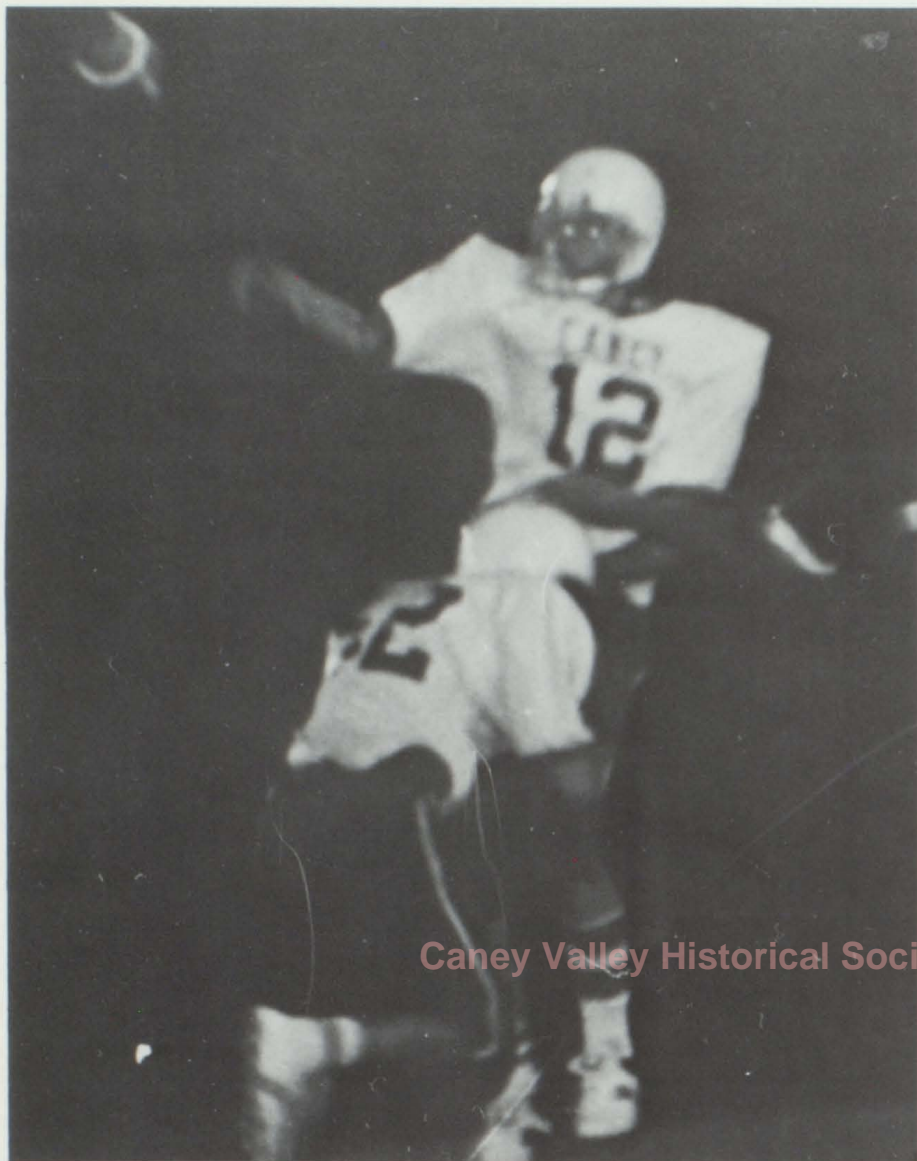
Caney Vs. Belle Plaine 18-21

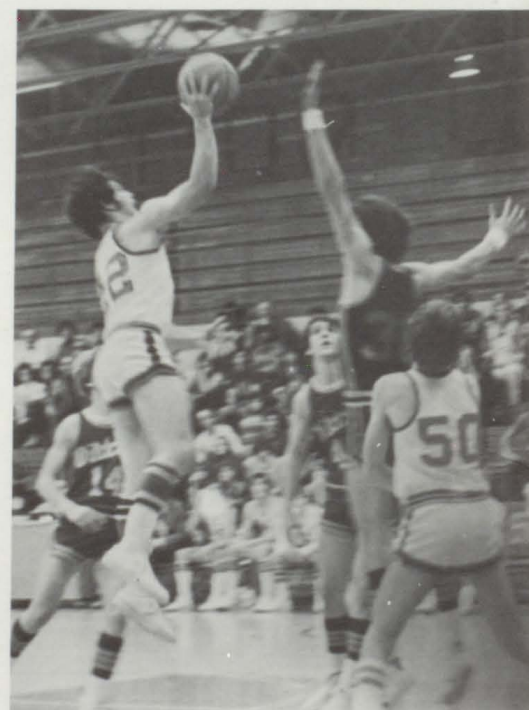

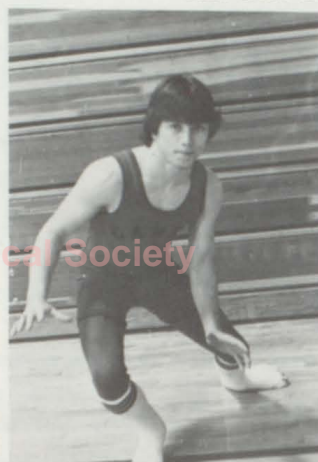

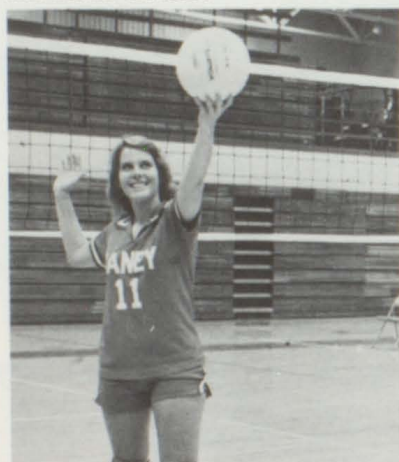

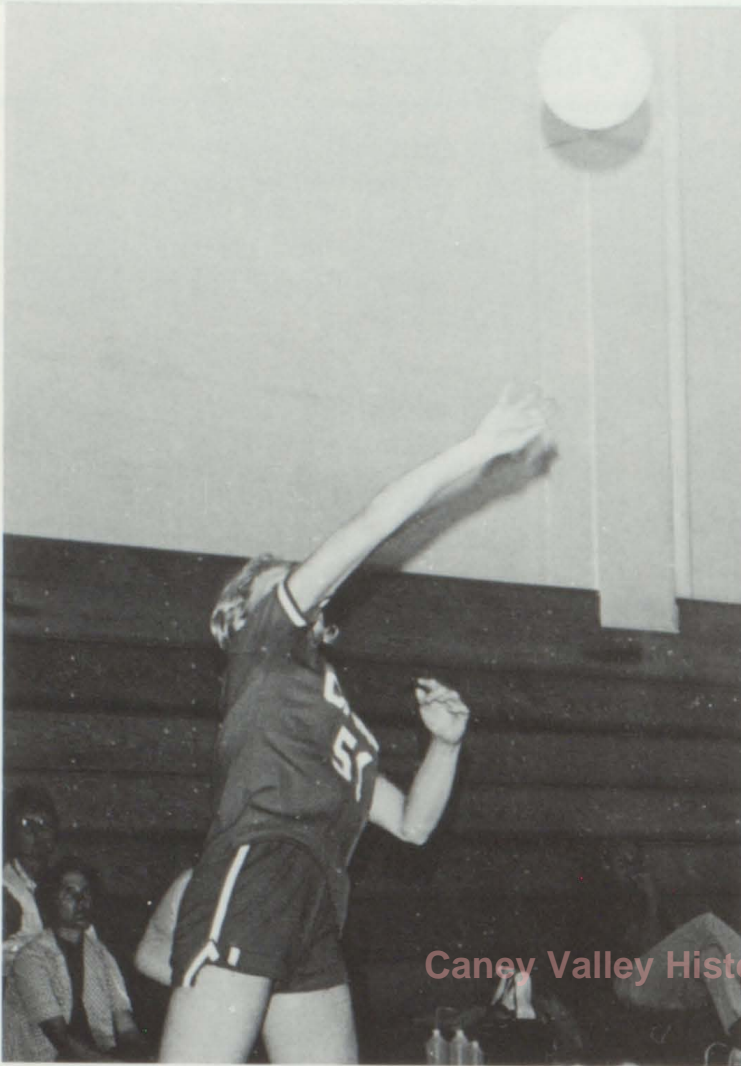



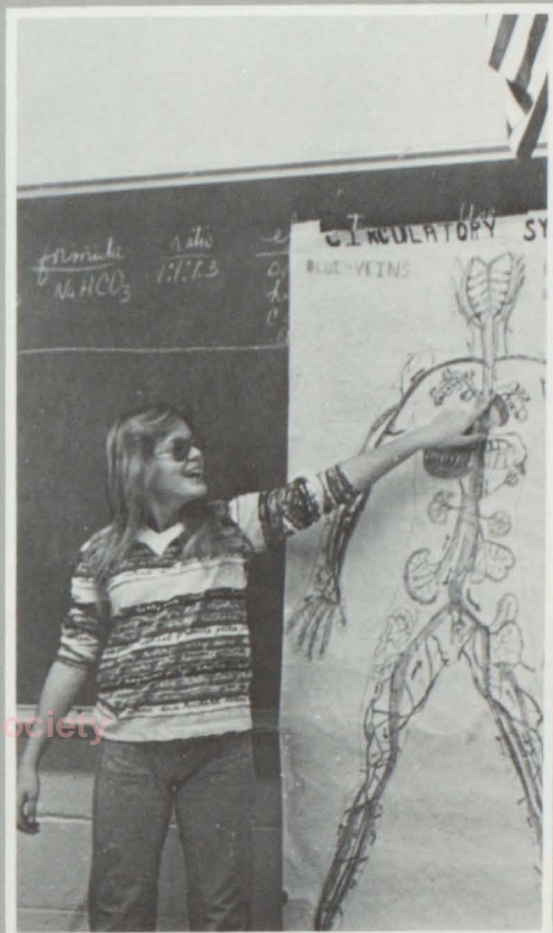

As a money raising project the girls sold Bullpup pins and profited \$50 on the sales. The six jr. high cheerleaders attended the

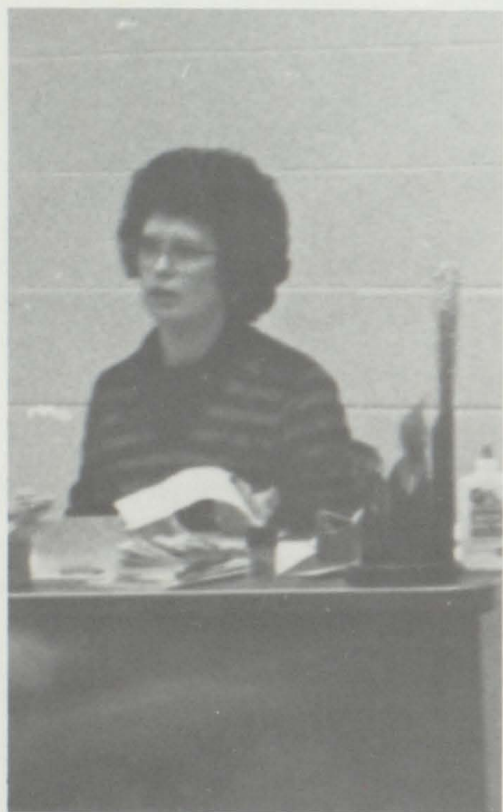

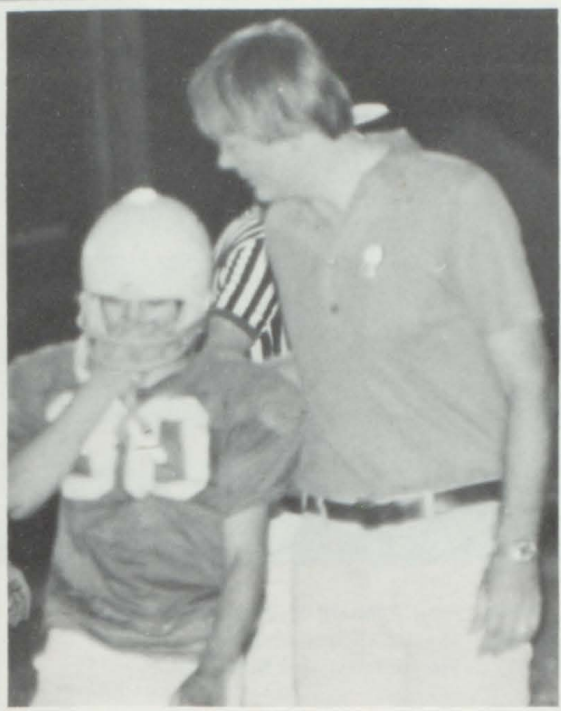

The real problems were abroad, though, when on Nov 1979, 50 Americans were captured in the American Embassy in Iran. The Russian invasion in Afghanistan created American unrest and the threat of the draft became more pressing. Women were also the target of draft registration of the long struggle with the Equal Rights Amendment.

These problems at home sparked a patriotic urge at CVHS. Beginning on Feb. 20 the student said the flag salute every morning during the first hour. David Tremain led the flag salute over the intercom. Students and faculty alike felt this was an admirable on behalf of the Caney students.
