

The winning streak was stopped the next week, however, as the Pups lost to their arch rival, Sedan, 28-14. Tur-






The Junior Varsity football team underwent another season this year by winning only one game.










The Bullpup Observer Staff was small this year but it managed to put out a high-quality issue every month.




