LETTERS FROM "OUR BOYS."

FROM JAS. W. HANBERY.

FRANCE, July 8, 1918.

President W. A. Brandenburg, Pittsburg, Kan.

DEAR SIR AND FRIEND: It is now 9 p. m. and it is still good and light. I am sitting out in a woods writing this letter while the big French 75's are sending over into German territory the hot steel. Jerry replies frequently and we feel like "counting our beads," but we have escaped so far. How any person can ever undergo some of the hell over here and live through, I can't understand. Nothing seems to be beyond human endurance over here. I see old women working in the fields, doing work harder than most men in the United States. For an example: An old lady came up the road the other day (she was 84, I believe), carrying a huge load of alfalfa, freshly cut. Now, you know, President, alfalfa hay, when green, is not especially light, to say the least. Well, to aid the old woman I offered my manly assistance. You recall that physical weakness was never one of my attributes. Anyway, that old woman came very near proving she was more of a woman than I was a man. I got to my destination just the same.

I have seen all troops in action here, but the Americans are the cockiest bunch on the fighting line you ever saw. They have an enviable reputation. It is the greatest heritage in the world to be an American. To die for one's country is as great a service as it was during the days of Leonidas.

France is wonderful. I love the country, and the honest-to-God people. They are simply wonderful. There are a lot of things of importance that can only be found out by coming over.

Mrs. Hanbery is visiting in Ohio. She is a wonderful wife and I hated to be separated from her. I hear from her every day, however.

Give my regards to all. This may reach you after I have been reported missing, but I am feeling glorious to-day, and anxious to go over the top.

I have been made a company commander and have the best company in the regiment.

Say, but I am learning more history over here than one could learn out of books in years. It is a glorious game. To all patriots I bid them welcome.
