Can you believe all the trials and tears?



Showing Potential

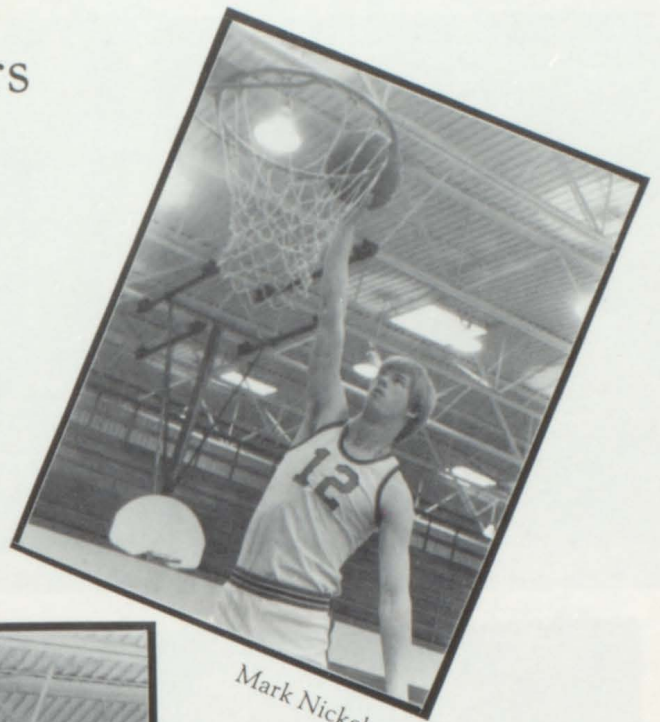

The Season Was GREAT!!!

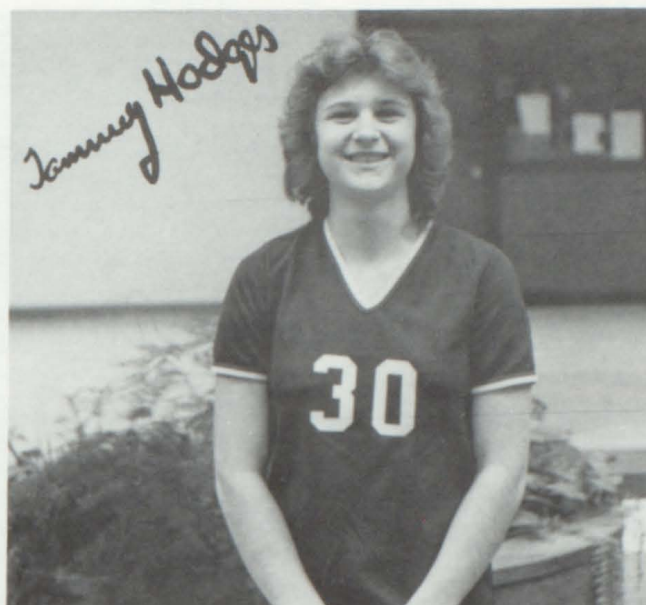

Mr. Rau summed up the year with one word ...GREAT!!!!



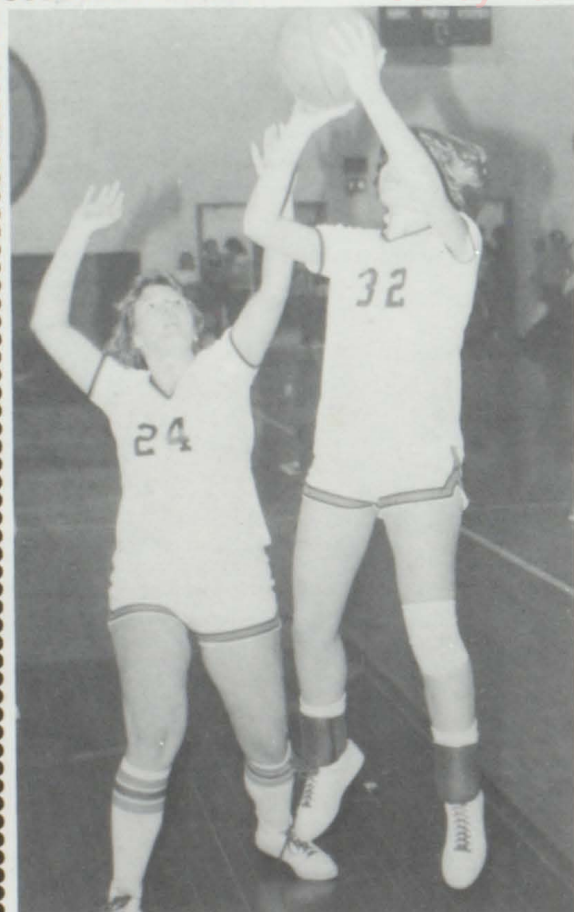

Rod Crum opened the tournament with a 9-7 victory in the first round. But the second round proved to be a tough match for Crum. "All the matches were really even," Coach Newby commented, "This match was especially close." Crum lost the match by one point, 3-2, after a hard fight.

On Saturday morning the 167 lb. Crum proved he was ready to go again by winning the first round of the consolation.

However in the second round of consolation competition Crum had another tough and close fight on his hands, losing the match 5-3. So, Crum ended up 2-2 at the state tournament and 8-4 on the season.

Brad Smith, wrestling at 145 lb., took an undefeated

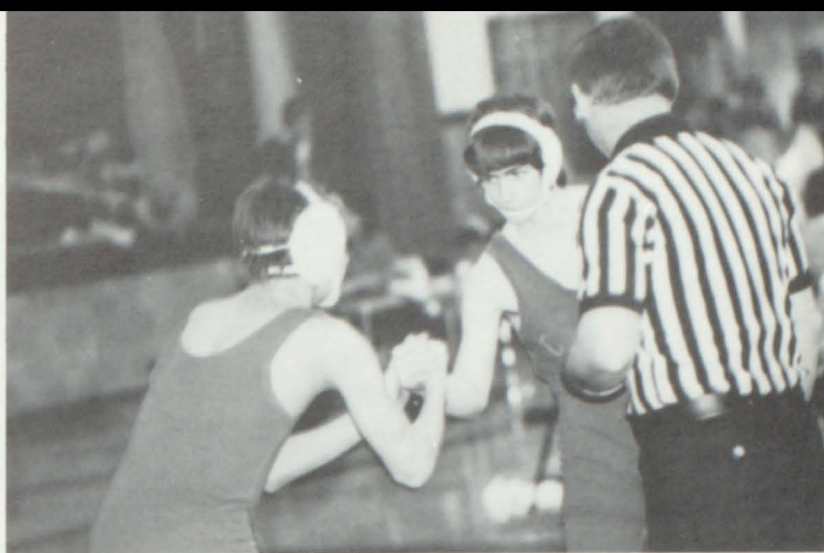
season record of 22-0 with him to the state meet.

Smith continued his winning streak, Friday, during the first two rounds of state tournament action. He won his first match by pinning his man in the second period. He then added another win to his record with a 17-7 victory in the second round.

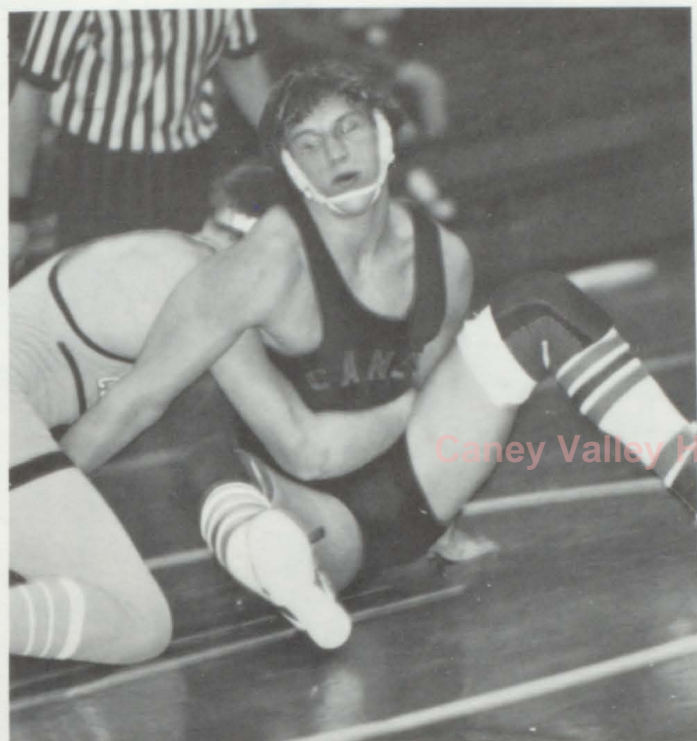
Saturday, Smith won the semi-final match of his division, pinning his opponent who eventually placed fourth in state competition. In the finals of the tournament, Smith was one step away from a state championship, and undefeated season. He was behind in the first period of the finals match, but came back to tie in the second making the score 6-6. He then went in the third and final period when he escaped a take-down. It was 7-6, but with 53 seconds left Smith's opponent made a two-point move and won the match by one point.

Smith has an outstanding season with a 25-1 record and brought back to CVHS a Reserve Championship in Kansas 3-A Wrestling.

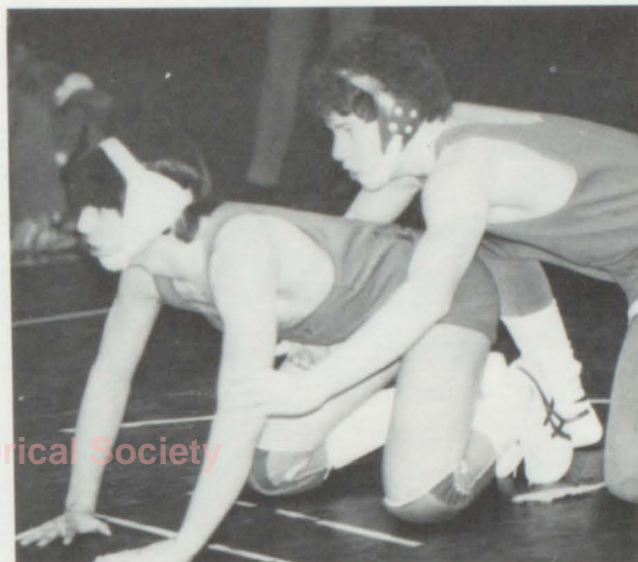

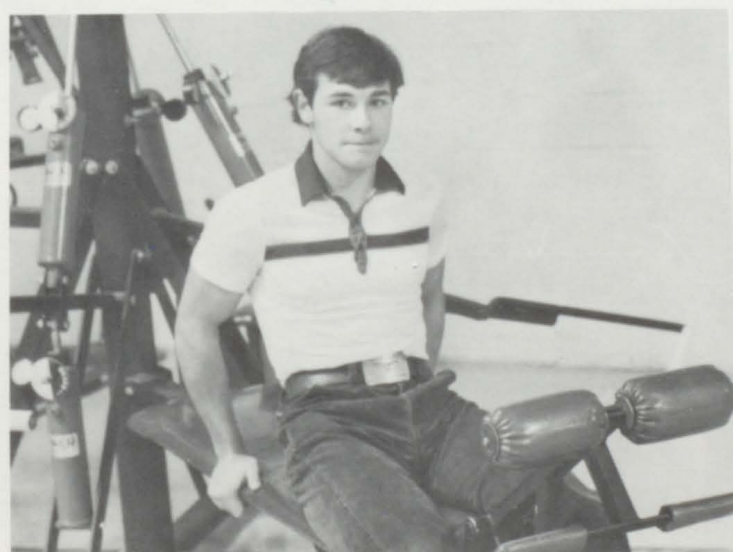



4. He knows the game is for the players and lets them have the spotlight.

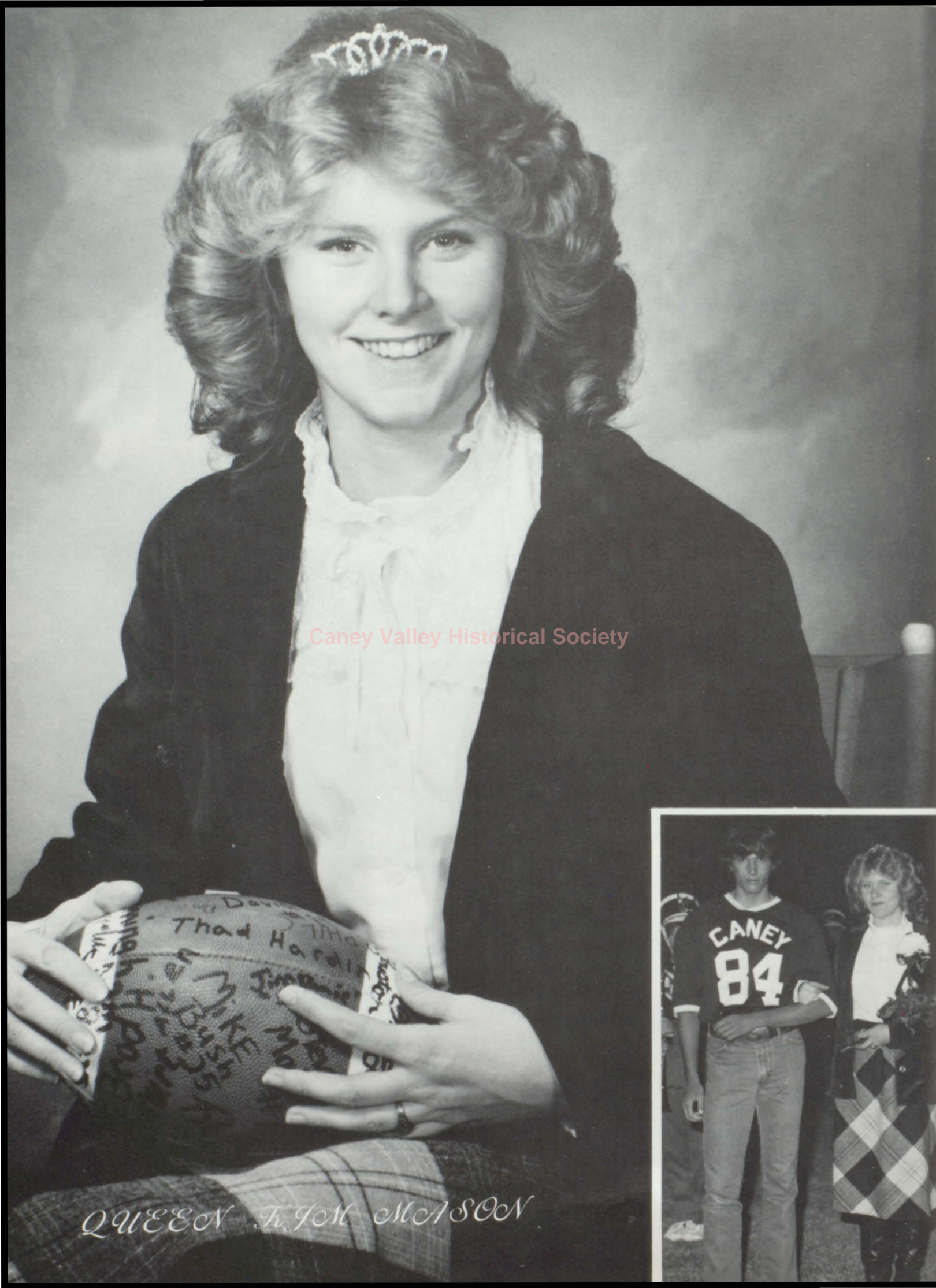

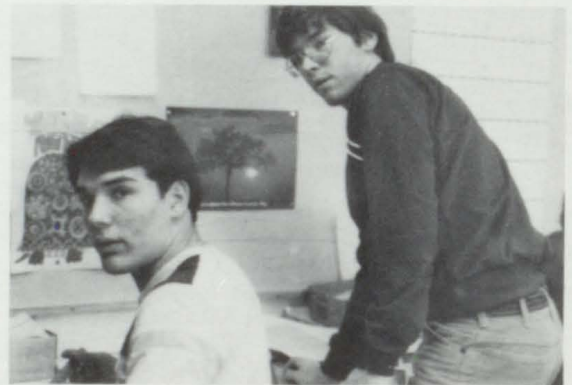

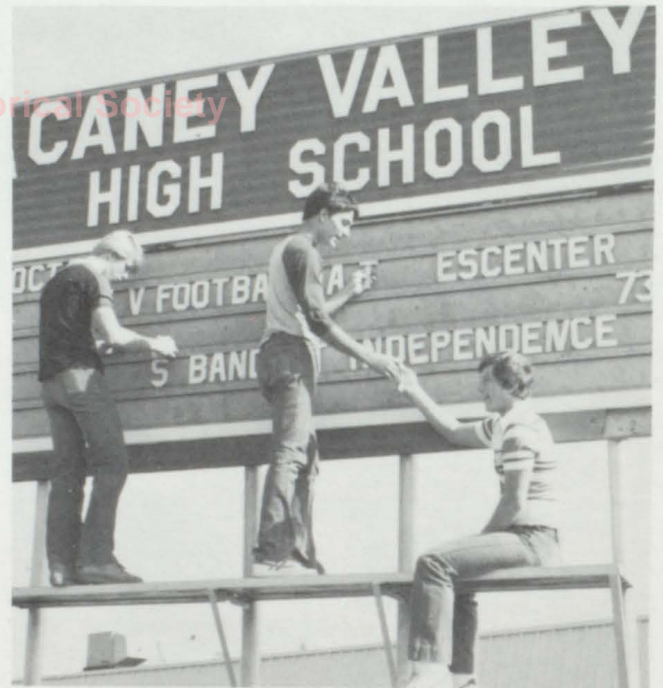

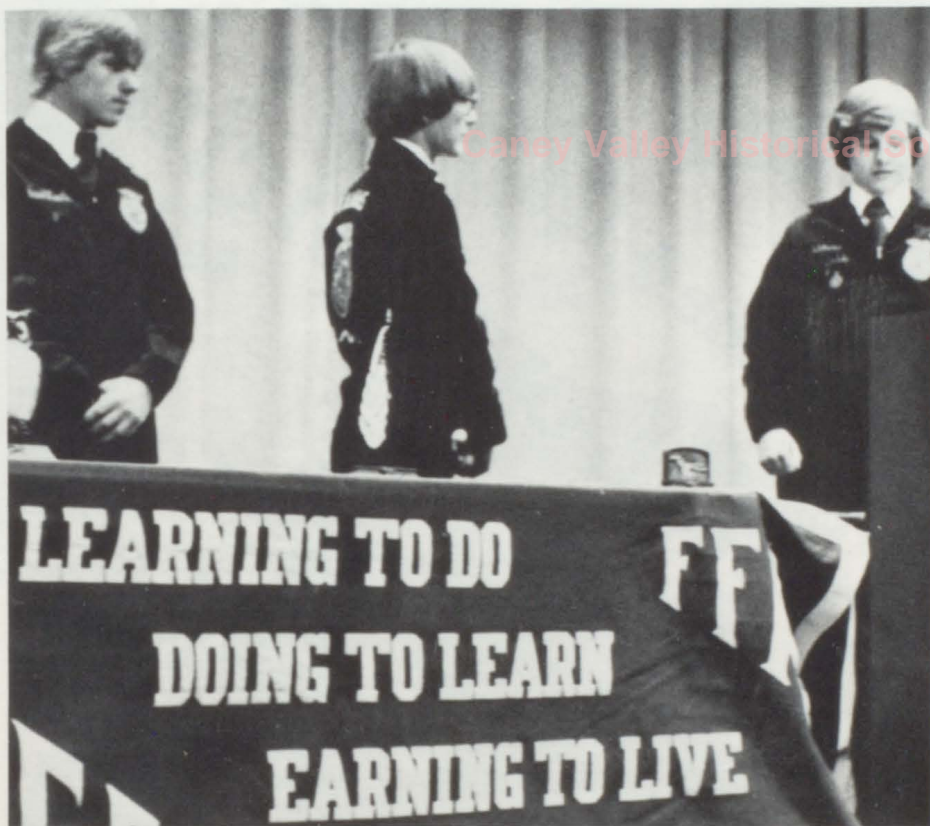

The Caney Future Farmers of America participated and competed in many different programs and contests on the local, state and national levels this year.

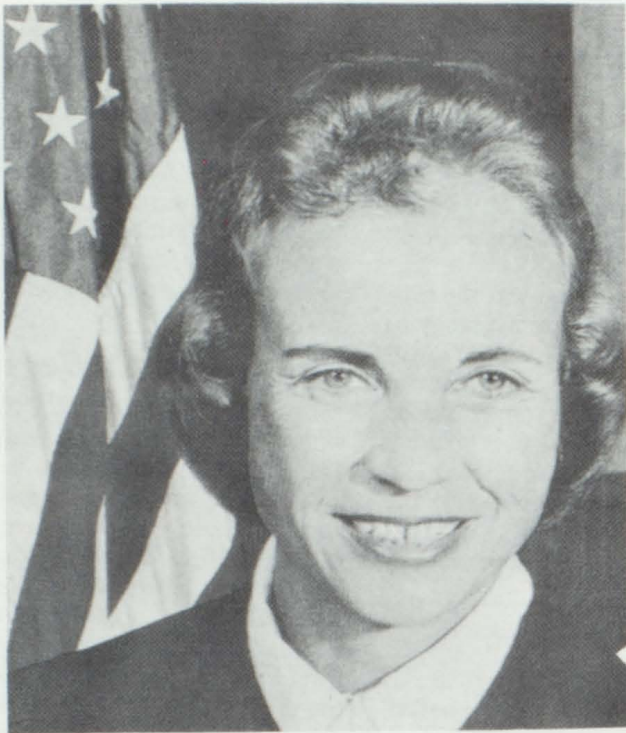
The 41-member club was active with numerous community projects such as building a bleachers for the Caney Recreation Department and repairing gates and fences at the Caney Saddle Club.

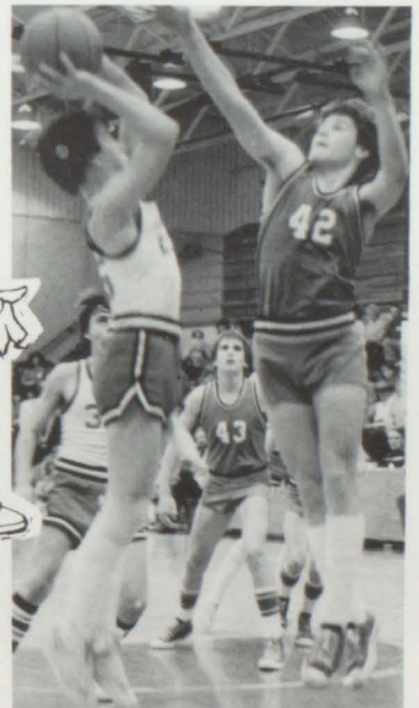

While attending CVHS Inkeri participated in art and was a candidate for the football homecoming.

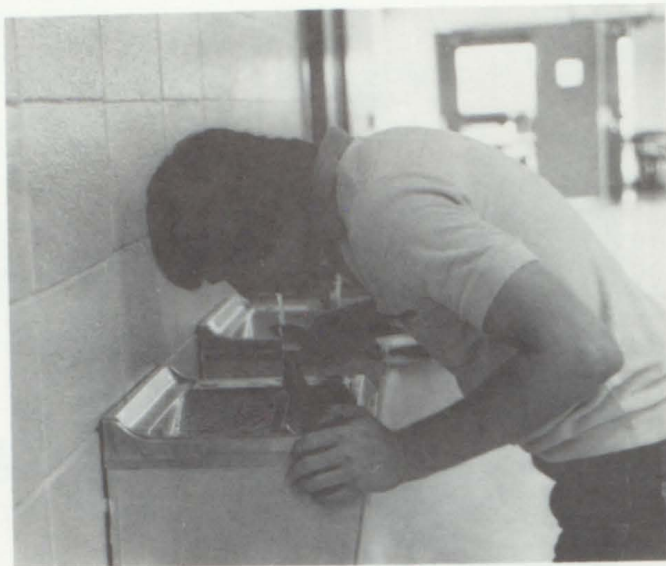
