This edition of the Kane-Kan is dedicated to him.

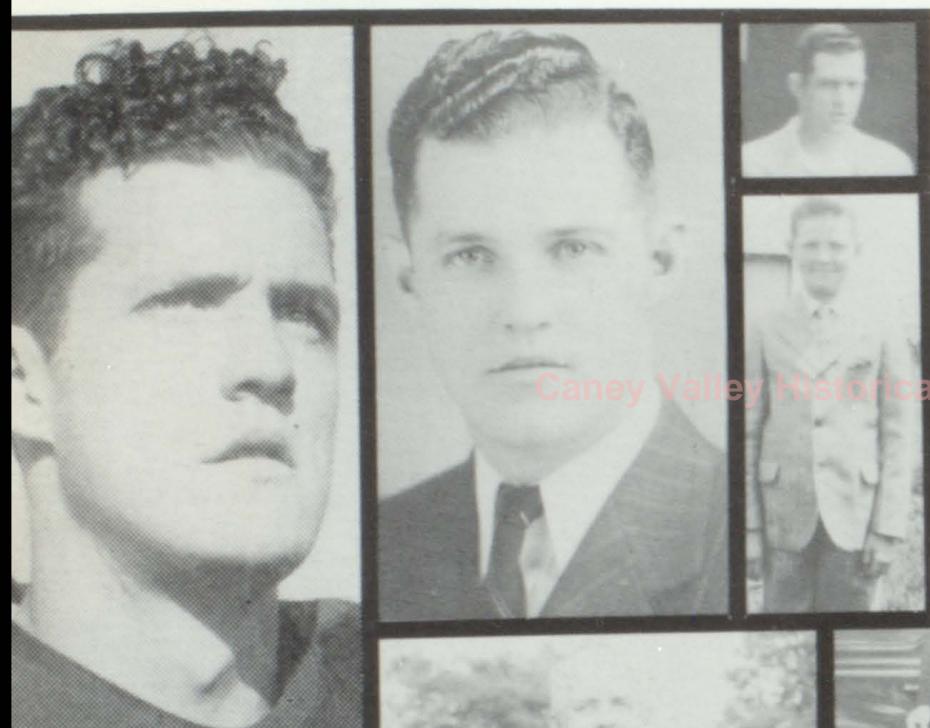

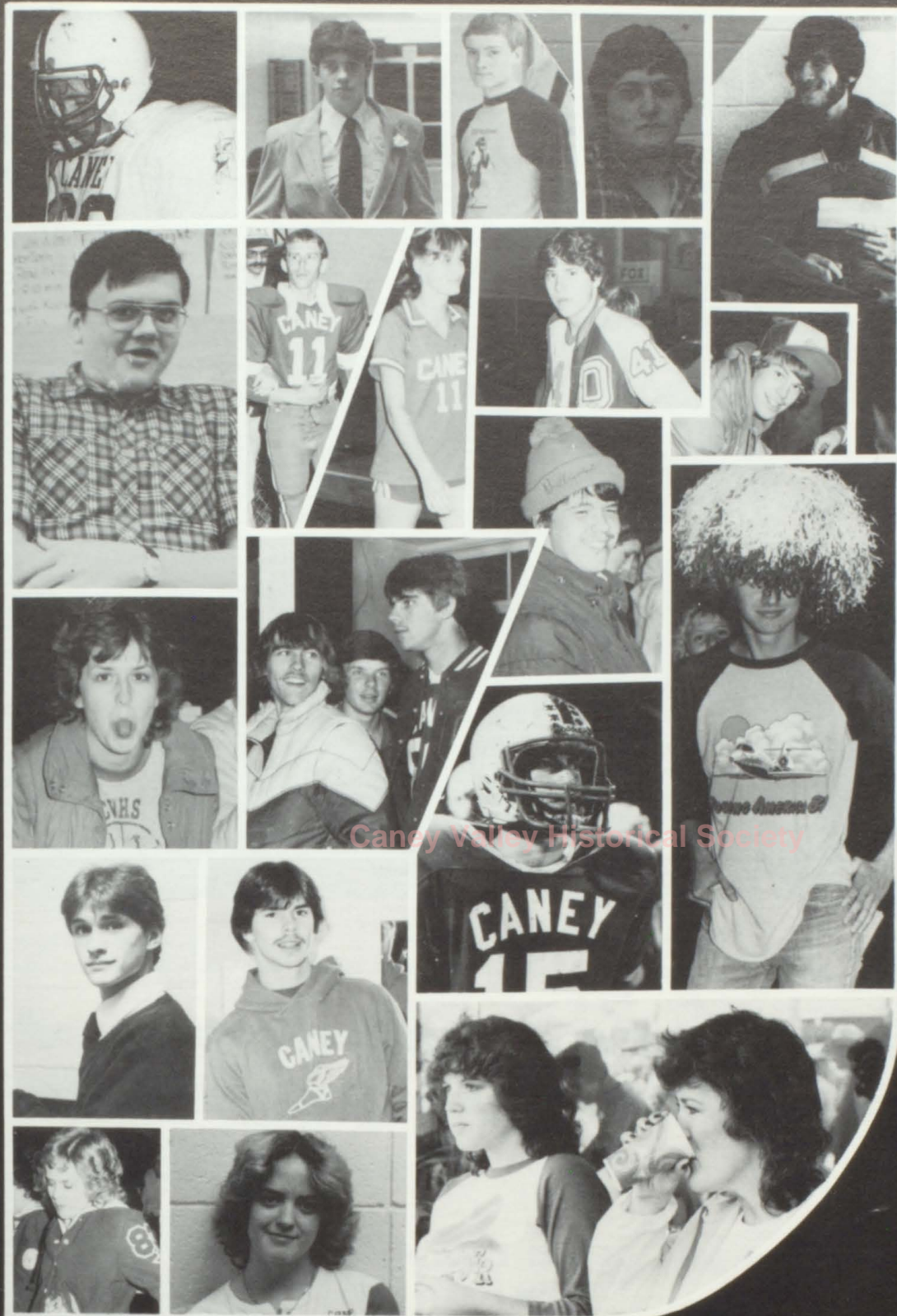

Senior sponsors saw class of '83 through high school years

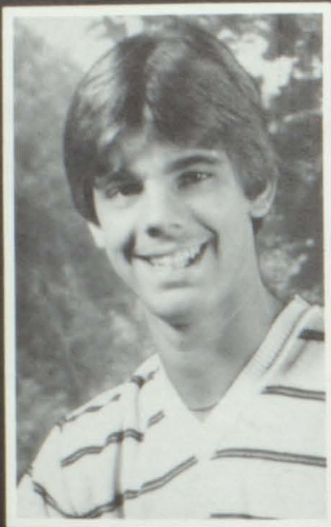
through junior high and up to the prom, they now share the honor with us...

What do CVHS students think of school?

Students, at the first of the school year, had an opportunity to answer a confidential student questionnaire as part of the North Central Association's evaluation.

Here are some of the more interesting questions and answers:

—How satisfied are you with your academic achievement in school?

Twenty-one chose dissatisfied, 72 said somewhat dissatisfied, 160 were satisfied, and 15 were thoroughly satisfied.

—If you could be remembered at CVHS for one particular accomplishment, which would you prefer?

Forty-four said outstanding student leader; 127 said outstanding athlete; 88 said outstanding academic record, and 45 said most popular student.

Students were asked to list two things "most liked" about the school. "People" and "building facilities" headed the list.

Two things most disliked were the tardy policy and the closed lunch hour.

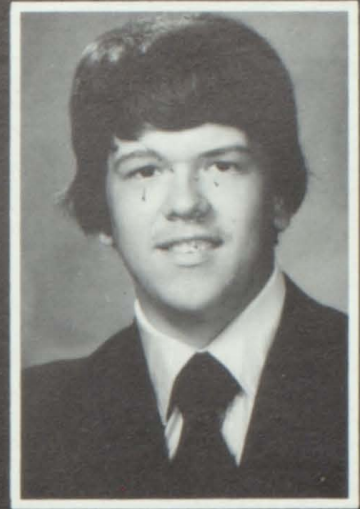

Seniors Tim James and Gary Baker are in their second year of a machinists' class. Travis Shrock, Junior, is taking his first year of the same course.

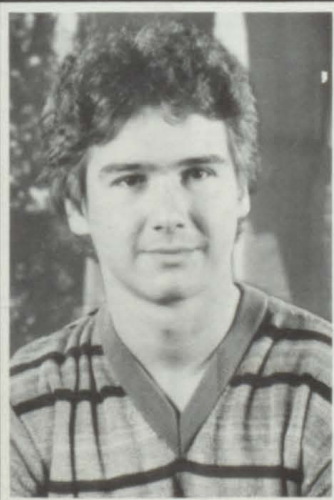
Tom Webber and Monty Magner are in their first year of welding, and Curtis Stewart is in his first year of electrical maintenance.

A food will be tried two or three times before it is decided whether to leave it or drop it from the menu. If a food is tried and nobody likes it or there is a lot of waste, it is dropped.

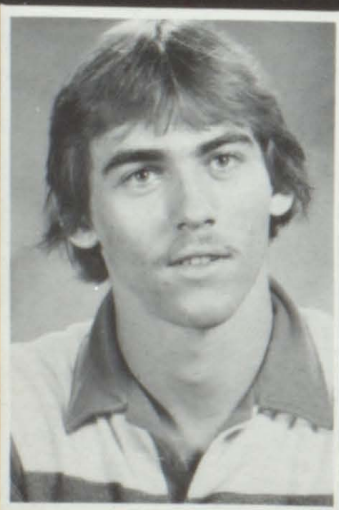

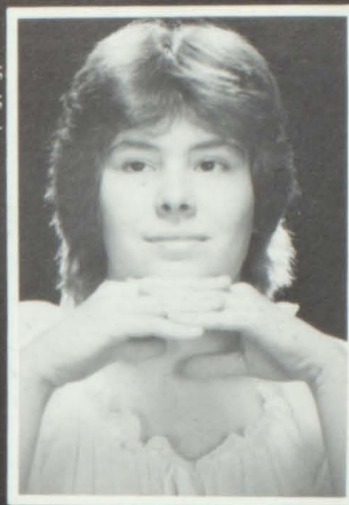

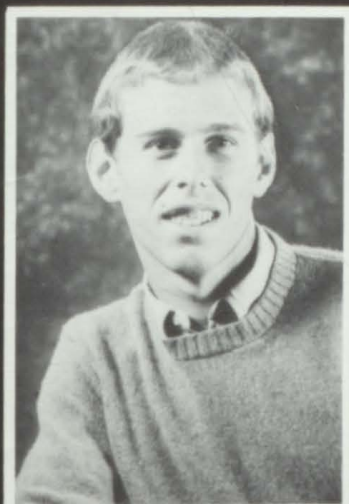


English classes get new texts; 'better format'

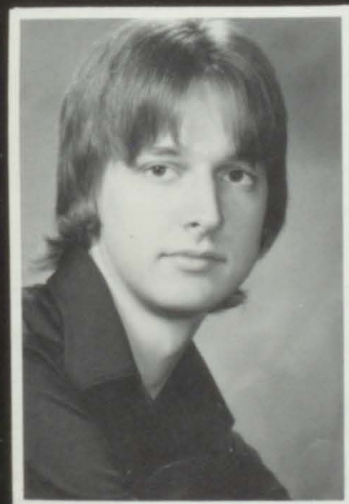

The Junior Kayettes received the 1,000 point award for the fourth time, making ten consecutive years of earning an award.

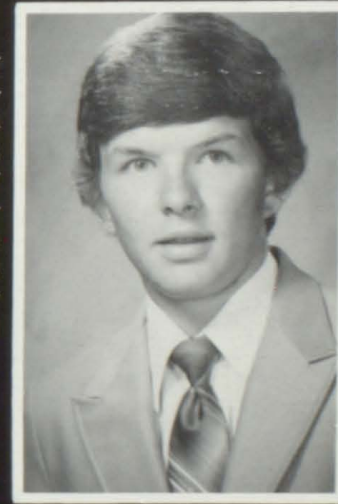

New tardy system...does it work?

(Senior Tommy Nelson, second semester editor of The Bullpup Observer, comments editorially on the tardy system.)

Do students like the new tardy system and the way it works?

Most say no. They feel it is unfair, too strict. Even though most students don't like it, it is improving our amount of tardies.

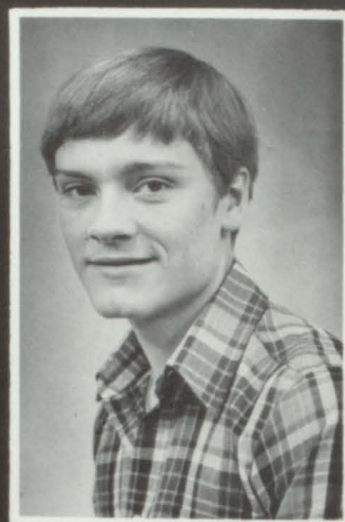
Even on your first tardy, you have to stay after school. For the first tardy, you stay 20 minutes after school, and you don't stay in the room with your teacher. You stay in detention hall with Mr. Heady in his room. If you don't show up, your time gets doubled every time you're not there.

Most kids are getting to class on time. The rule has cut tardies more than half over last year. In '81-'82, in the first week in October, there were 79 tardies. In '82-'83, during that same week, there was a total of 19 tardies, which is a improvements.

But there are people who say they don't have enough time to get to class. Four minutes is enough time, in my opinion, to get to class, if people don't mess around too much. There is some time to goof off, but not much. I do goof off between classes, and I do make it to class on them. I feel the tardy policy is working out very well and is improving our tardy record.

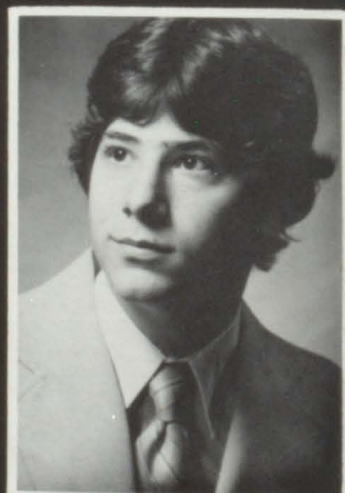

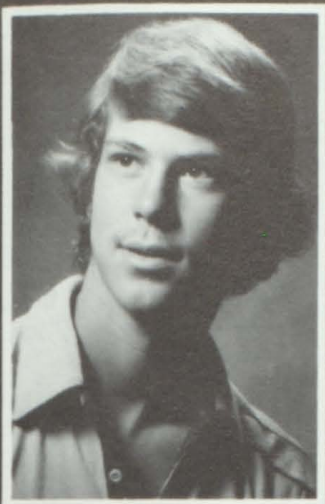

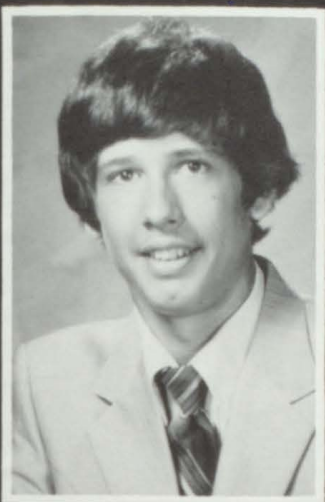

Mr. Allen represents District 3, Group B, which includes Caney, Eureka, Fredonia, Neodesha, and Yates Center schools.

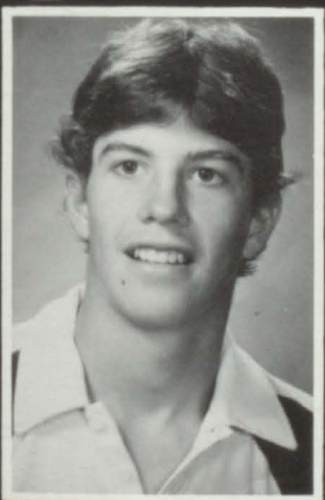
He is the first from Caney to serve on the board. "I'm honored that I was chosen, and I look forward to serving," Mr. Allen said.

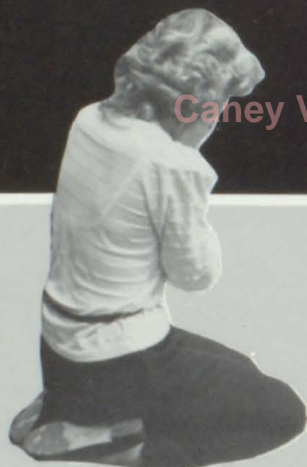

In wrestling, Chuck Metcalf took 3rd at the Tri-Valley tournament. Pam Bale and Steve Mattocks were candidates for the Snowball dance. A play, "Bull in A China Shop," had been presented on May 1 and 2.

10th GRADE—The class was losing membership; 54 were enrolled. Officers: Starla Marshall, Pam Grayum, Sherri Bishop, Steve Mattocks, Debbie Fields. Starla Marshall and Tommy Nelson were crowned Snowball king and queen. (The theme was "Could I Have This Dance"). In basketball the record was 1-17. Tim Hardin was 3rd in regionals in wrestling. The football team had shown a respectable 4-5 record, good enough to finish 4th place in the league.

11 GRADE—Enrollment was dropping! There were 47 enrolled in the class. Class rings were ordered. Officers: Sherri Bishop, David Reitz, Steve Mattocks, Gina Mayfield, Starla Marshall. The Junior-Senior Prom theme was "Fantasy Island". The football team had a 3-9 record, and the basketball team had a 9-11 record. Pam Grayum and Mike Bush were nominated for Junior class candidates for the Snowball. Debbie Fields, Debbie Soderboom, Starla Marshall were nominated for Barnwarmer queen, and the honor went to Debbie Fields. Twelve out of 47 Seniors were in FHA. Monte Lilburn was band drum major, and Pam Bale was head cheerleader. Three of the class were members of Stuco. The first musical to be presented in Caney High in years was given April 2. "You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown" featured Shelley Hubbard, Stacy Smith, Linda Cockes, Scott Oppgard (a Freshman), Mike Bush, and Jeff Russell (a Sophomore).

12 GRADE—The year started off with excitement and a little disbelief that it was our final year in high school. We ended up with 44 Seniors. The year '83 was filled with busy days and busy nights. The basketball team had a 6-11 record, and the football team had a 1-8 record. The forensics-drama department qualified seven people for the state forensics meet on May 7. Senior keys and announcements were ordered in August. The first dramatic production of the year was "Our Town," and the year's musical was "Something's Afoot". Graduation was set for Sunday, May 22, 1983. Suddenly it was ended as quickly as it had begun. The class would like to thank our sponsors, Karen Schultheiss, Nancy McMullen, Willis Williams, Sandra Huff, Ken Wheeler, and Joan Paine, and the rest of the faculty and administration for pushing us and giving us the strength and the ability to go on to graduation. 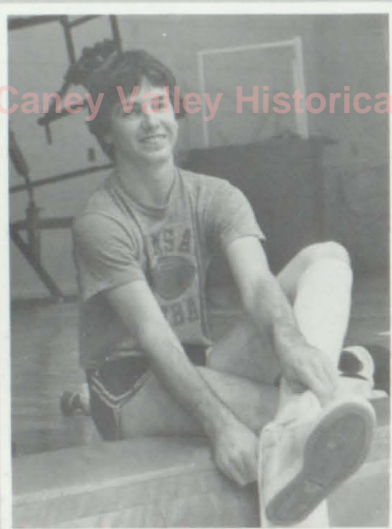

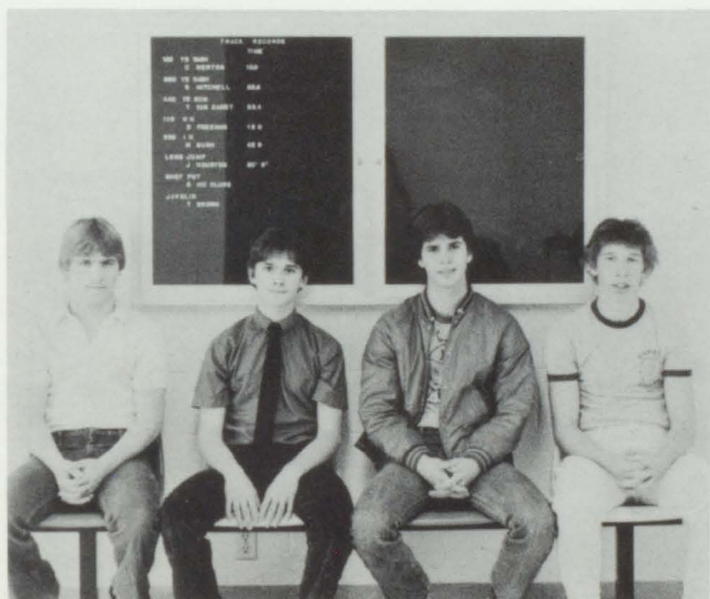

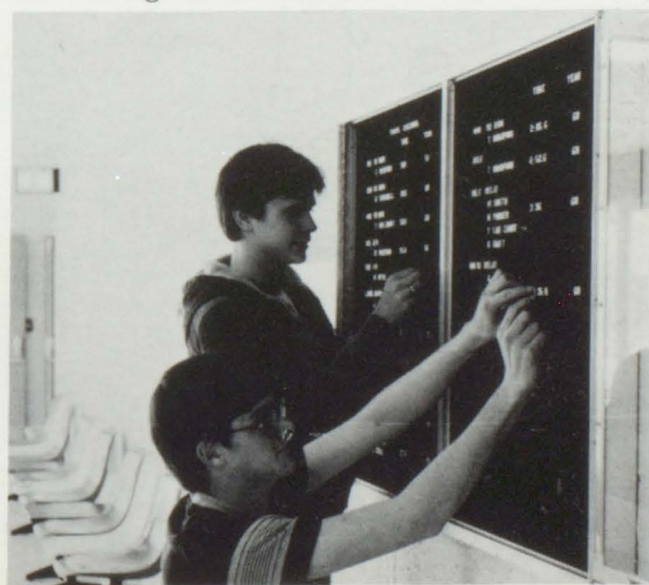

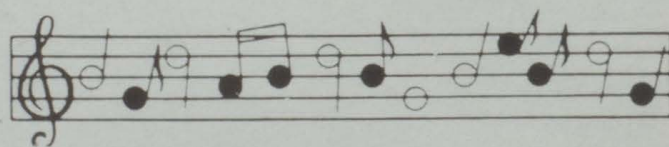

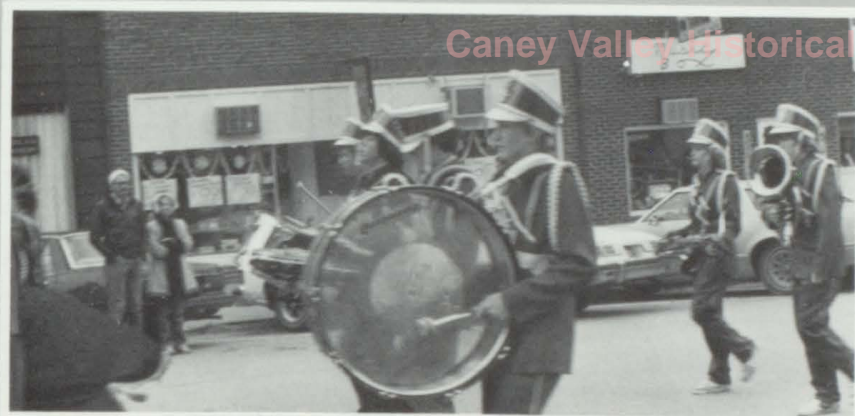

Miss Nancy McMullen is sponsor of the Senior High Kayettes.

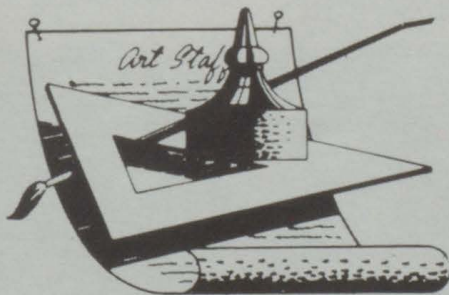

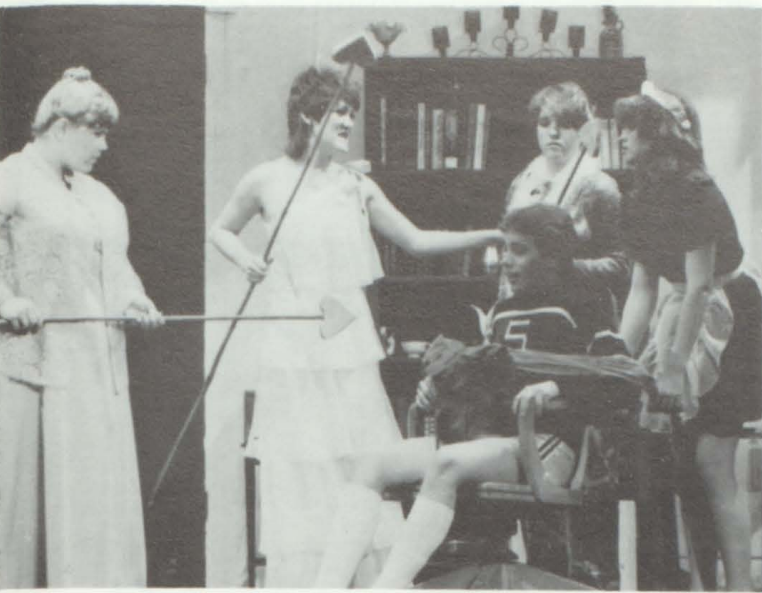

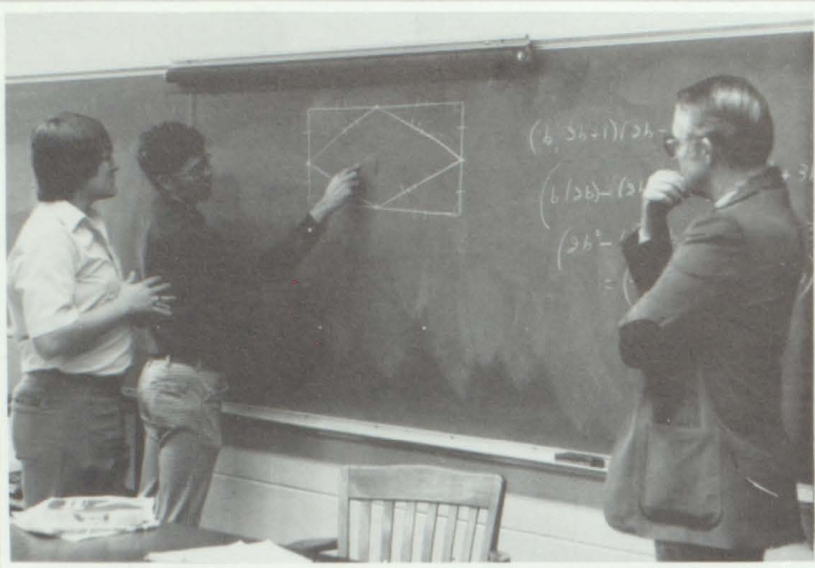

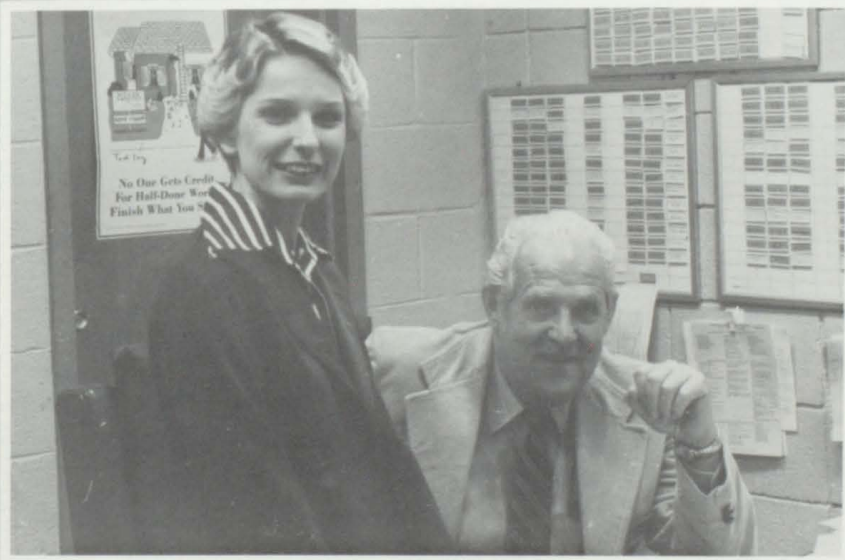

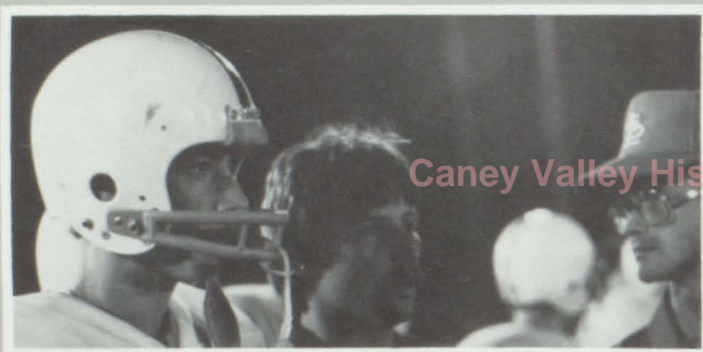

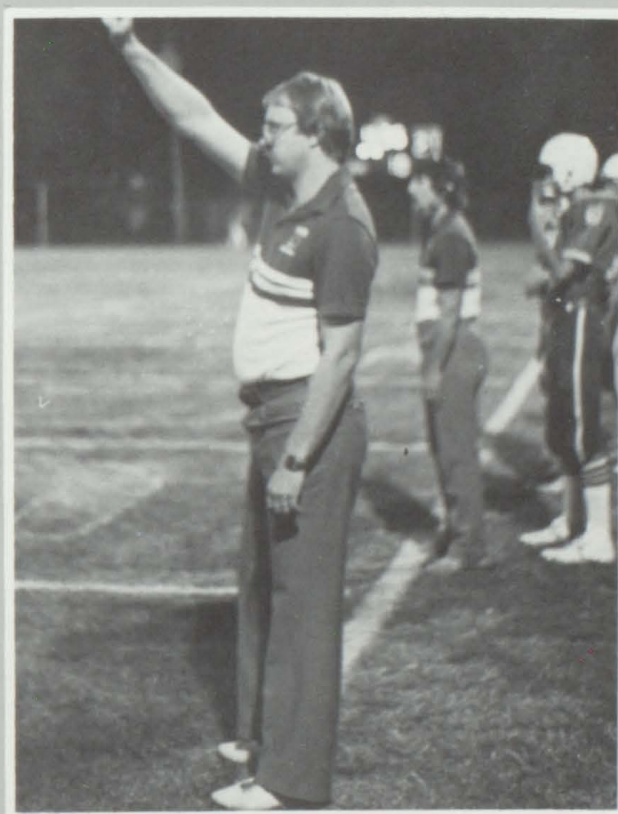

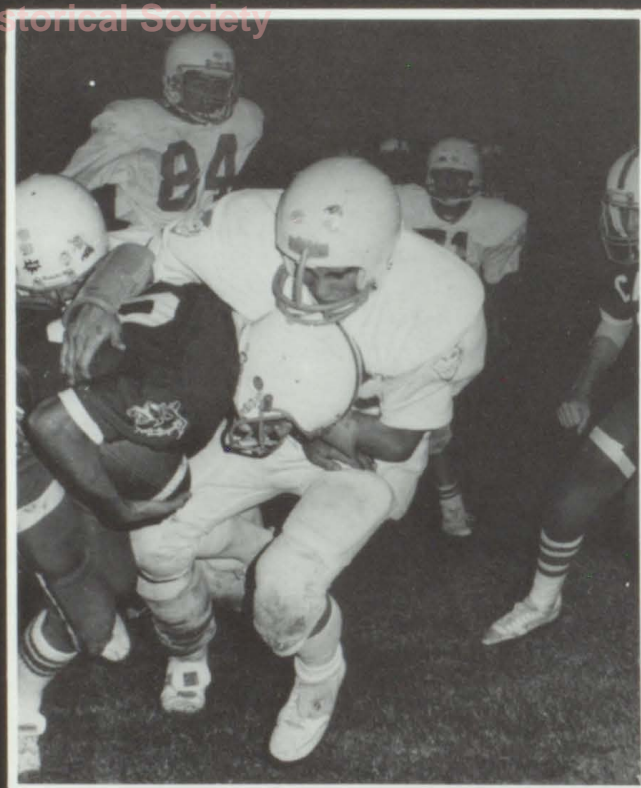

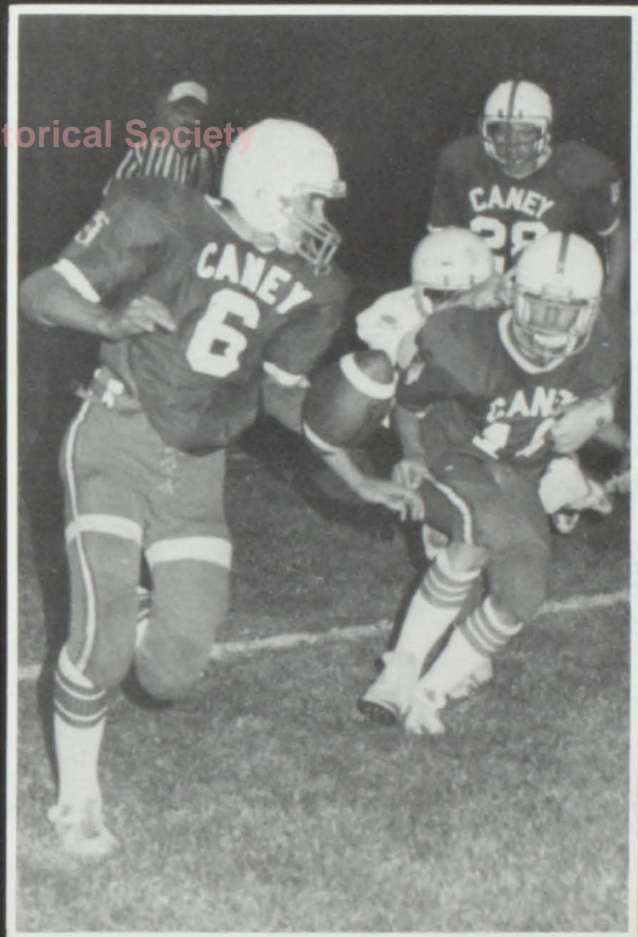

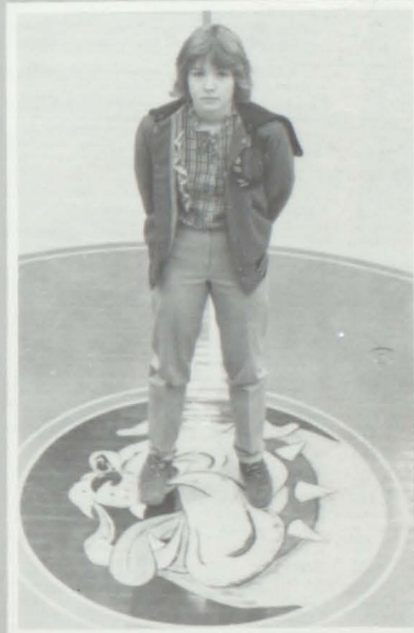

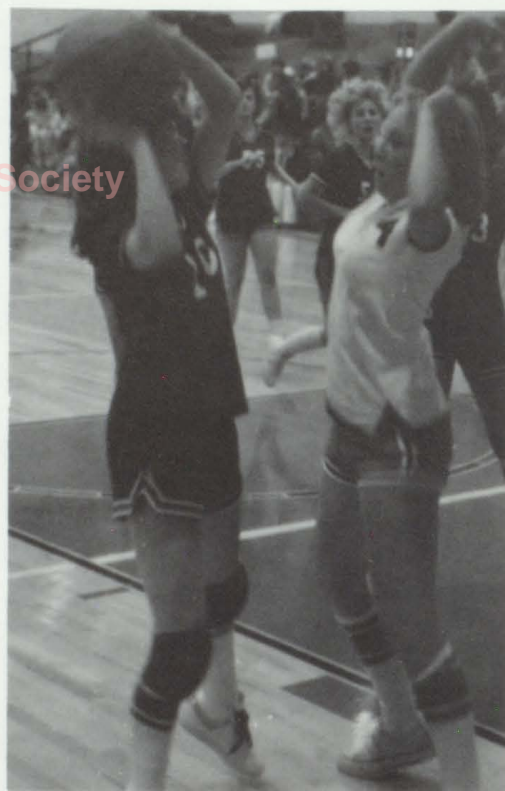

'83 is a year of progress for CVHS wrestling program

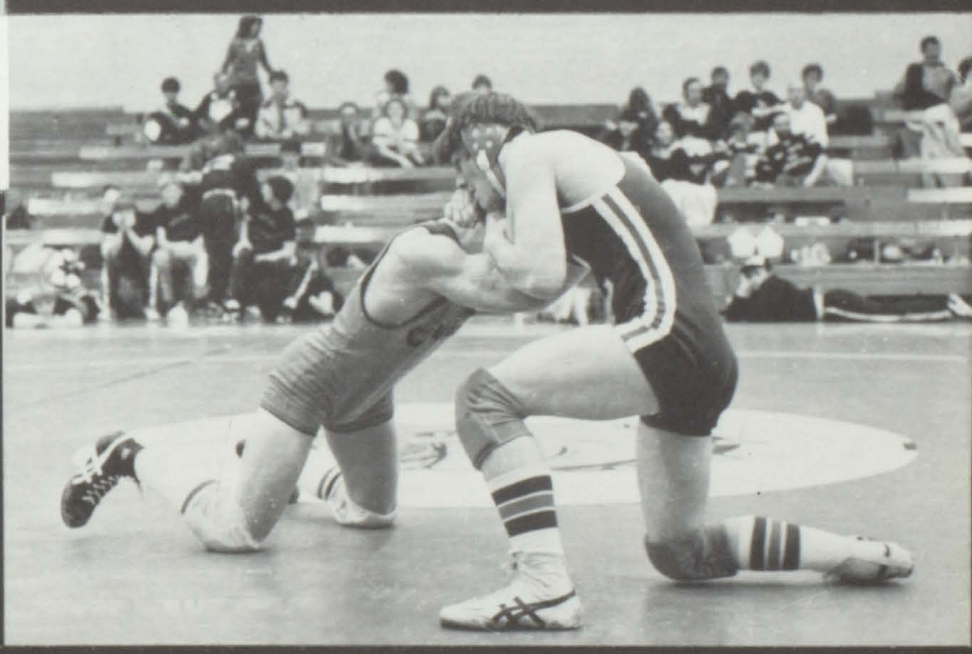

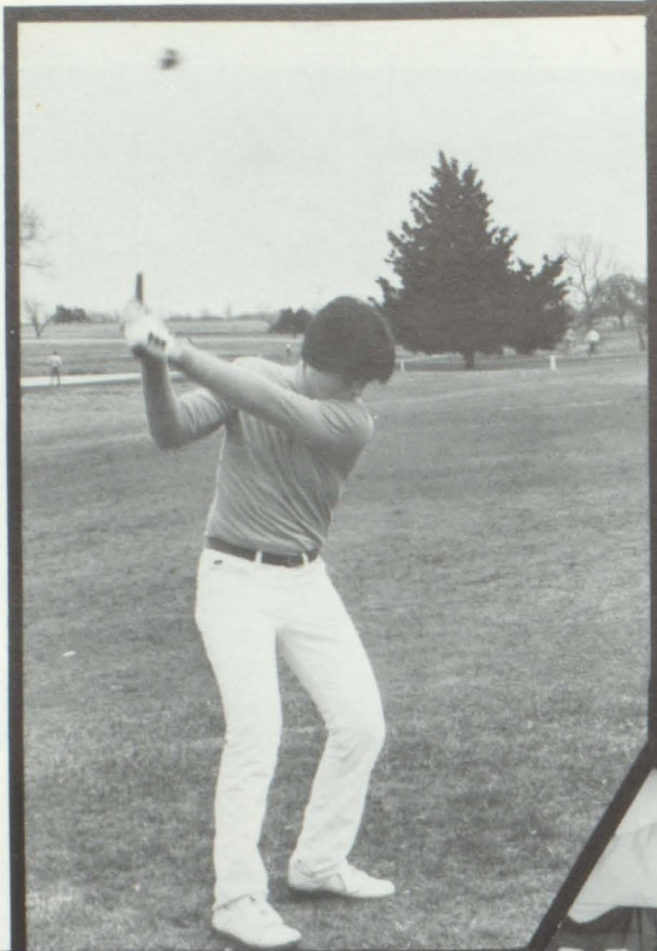

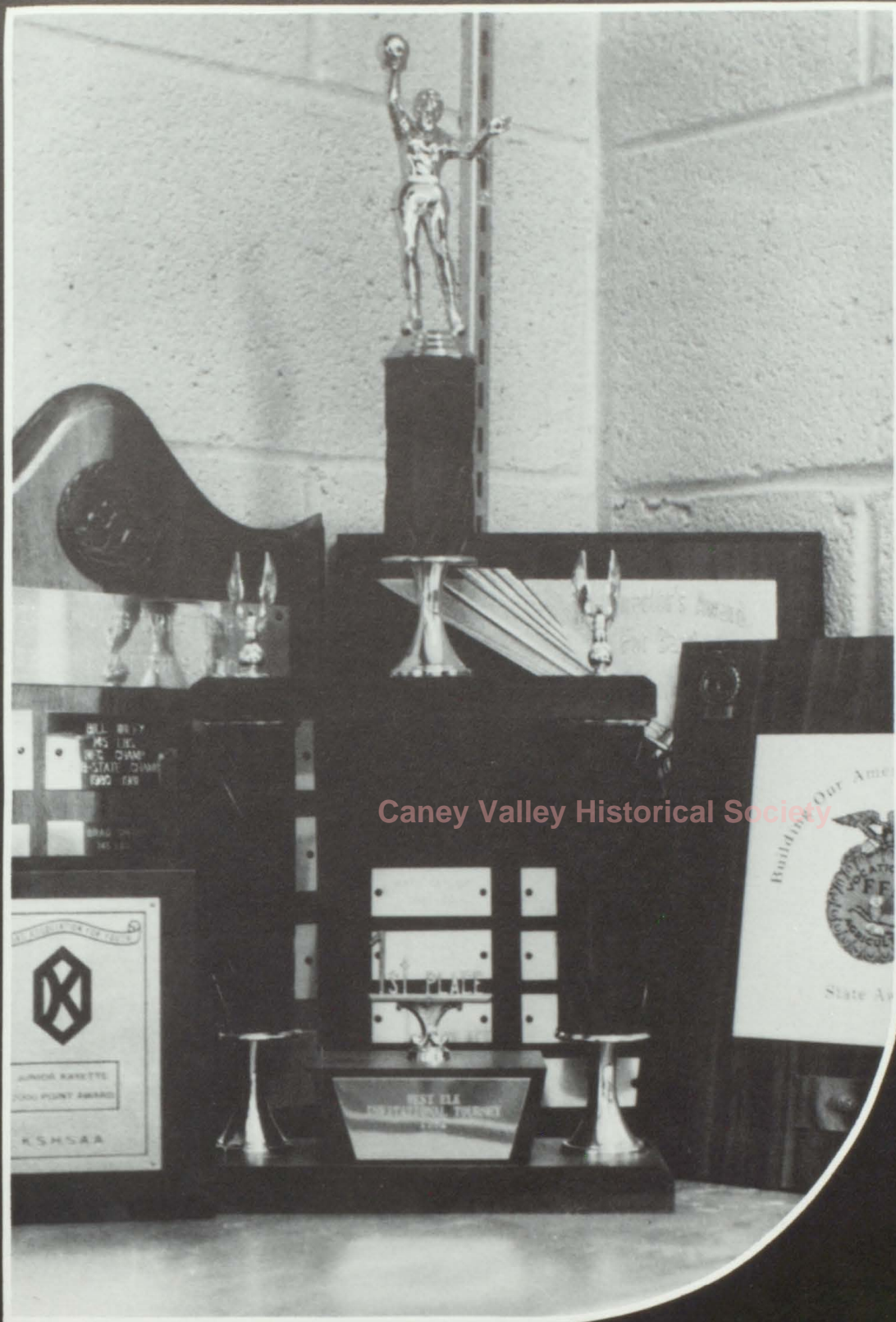

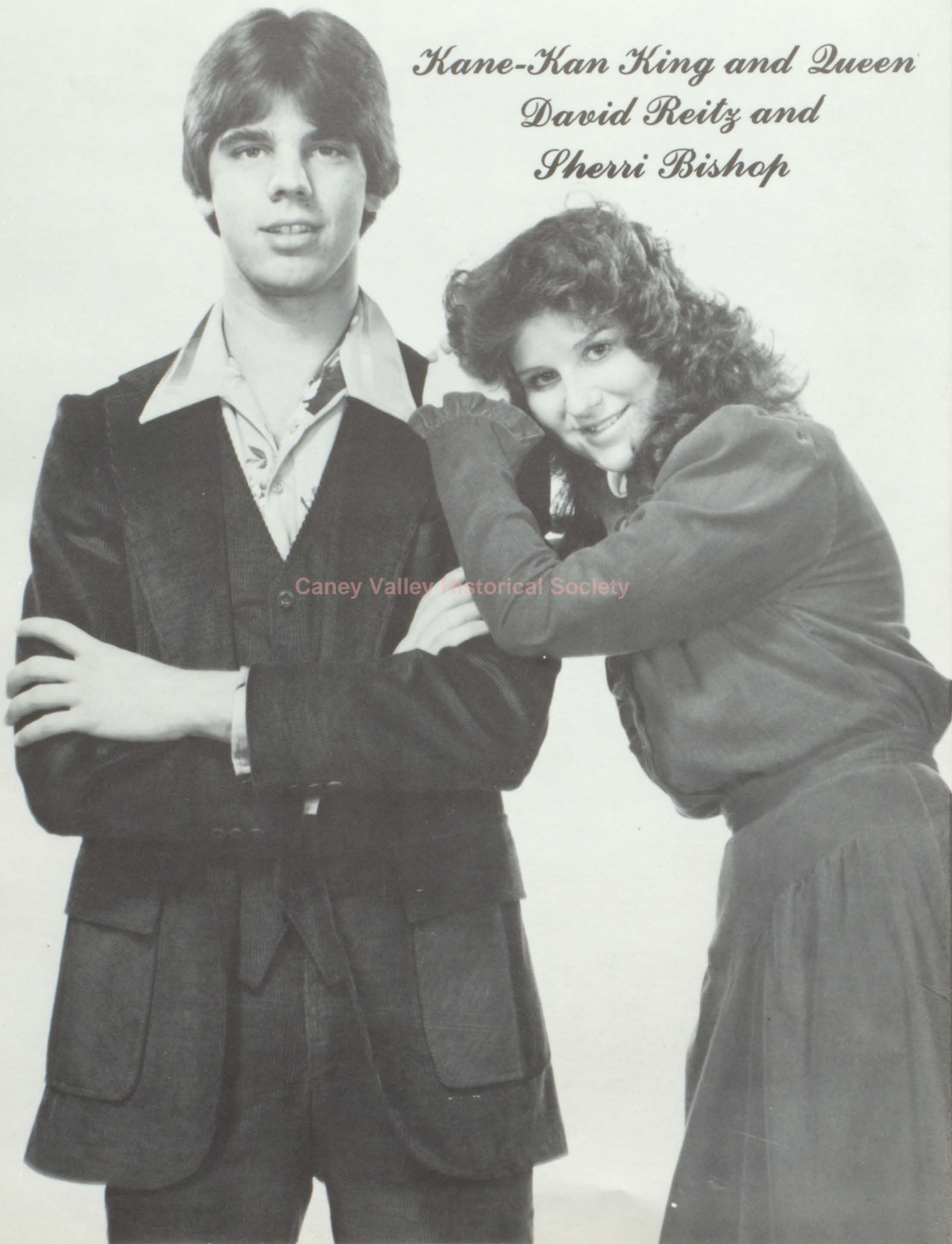

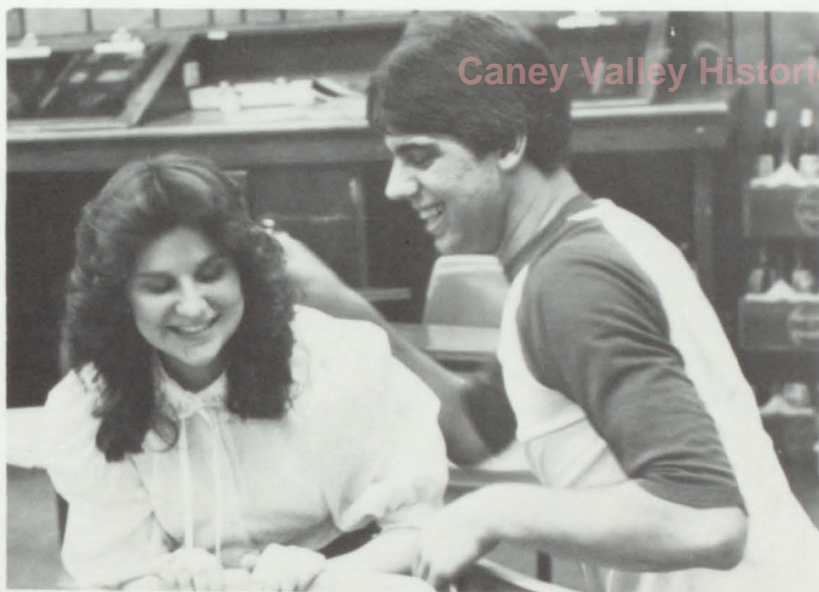

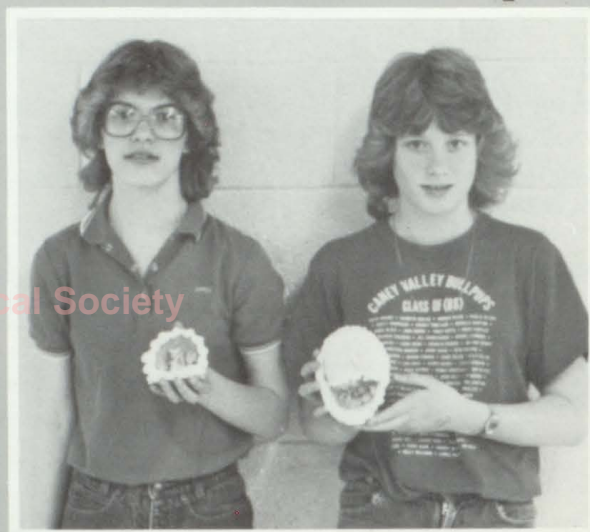

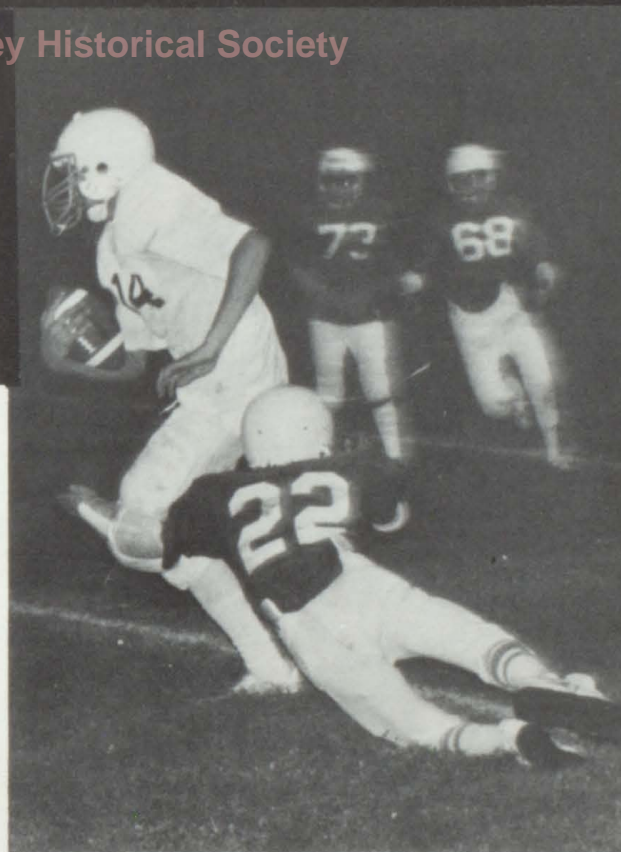

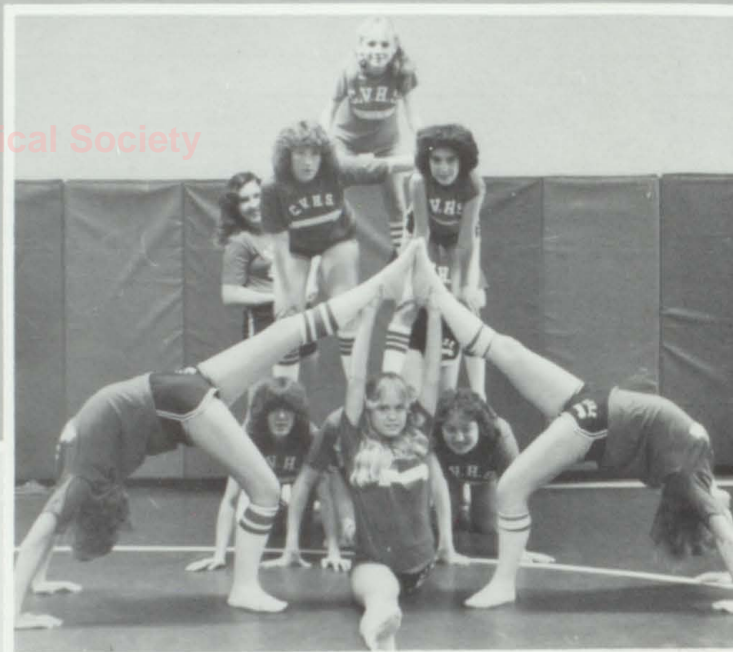

STUDENT COUNCIL HOSTS GONG SHOW

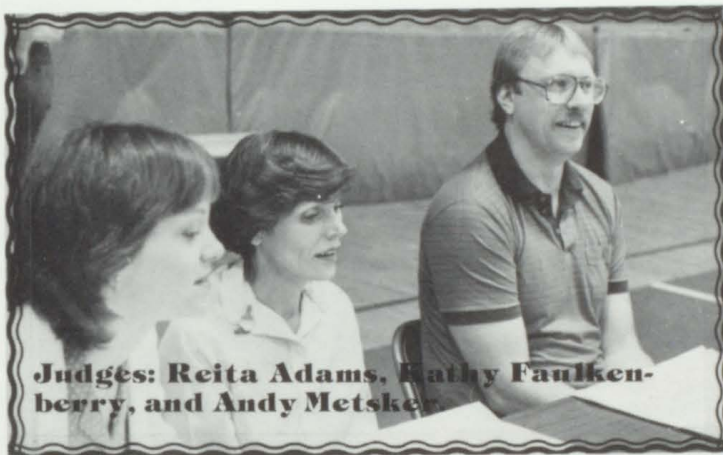
