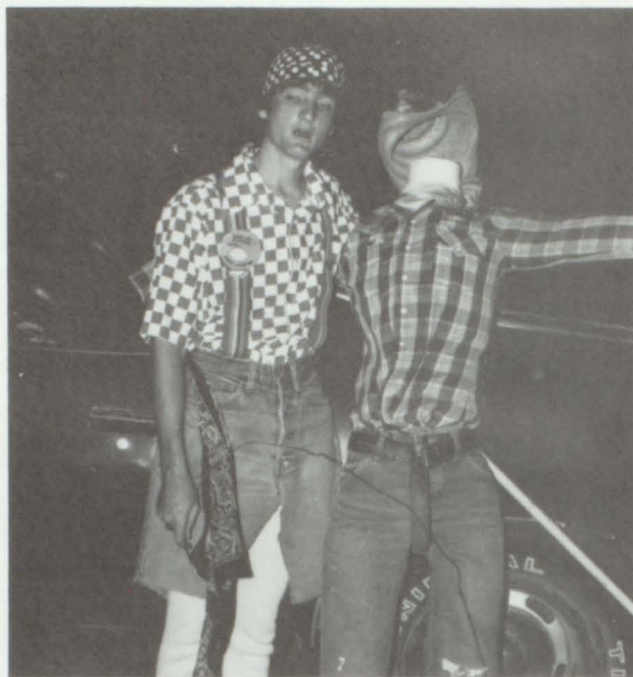

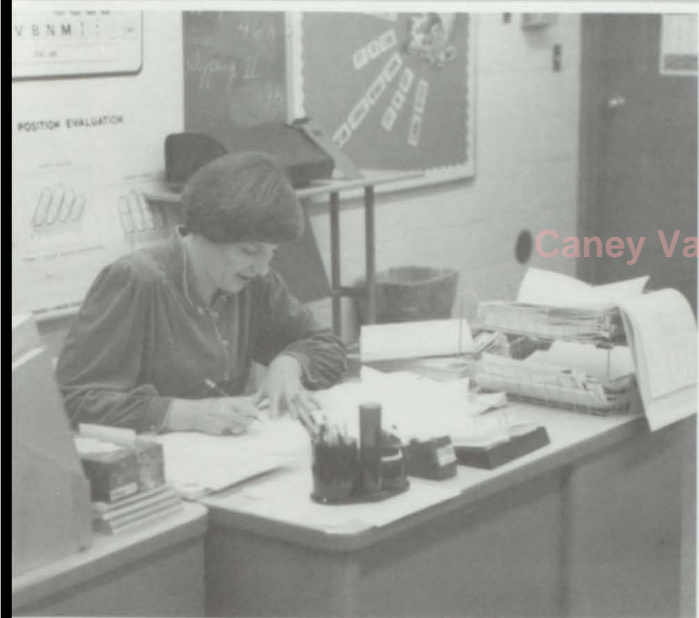
A job in her future? Only time will tell

Some of the rallies are also held at the football stadium following junior high games.

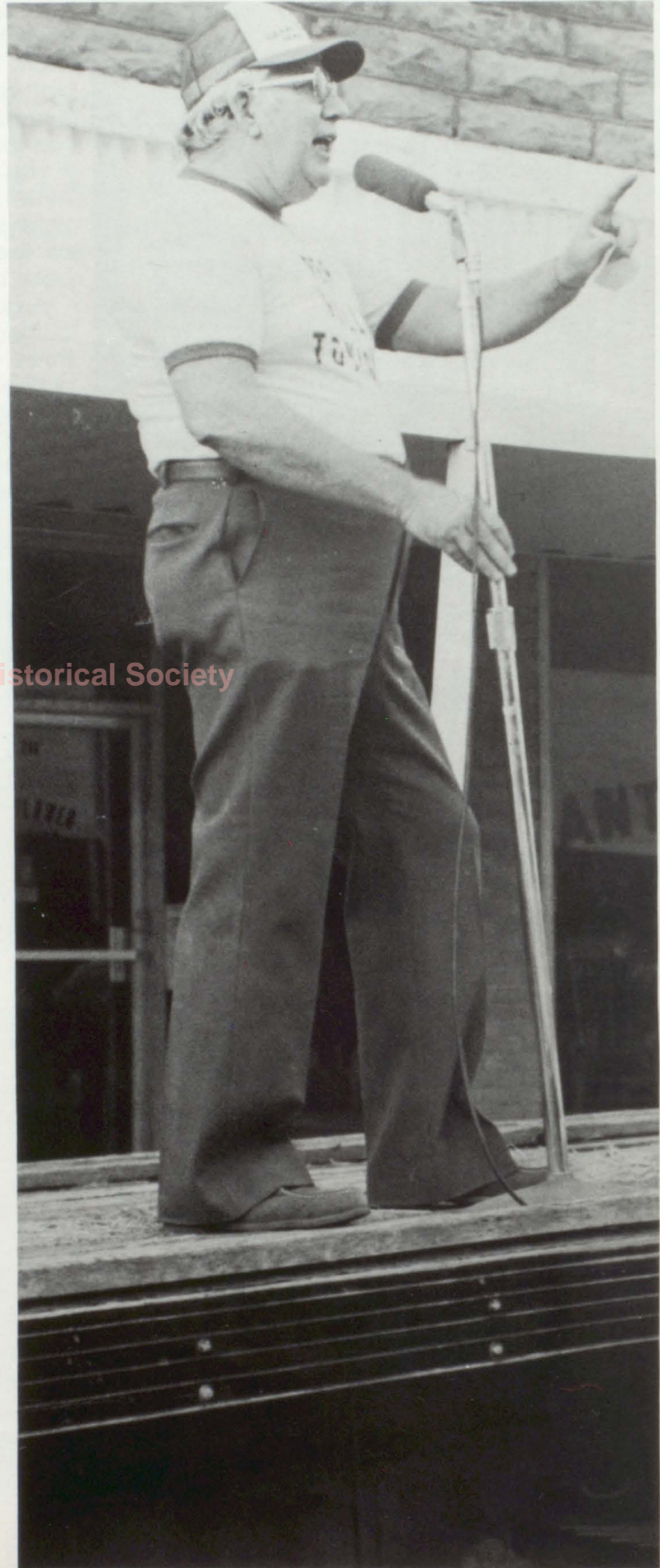

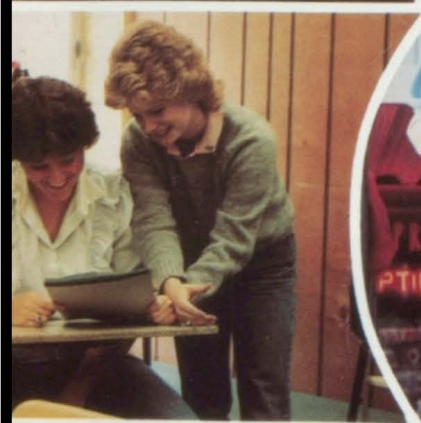
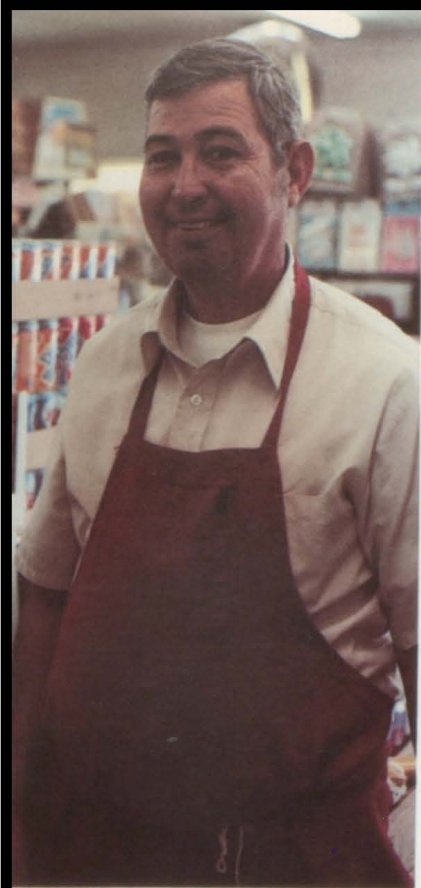

It's a time of backwards fun, a time of crazy clothes and crazy dances. That's the Morp (prom spelled backwards) put on annually by the Art Club.

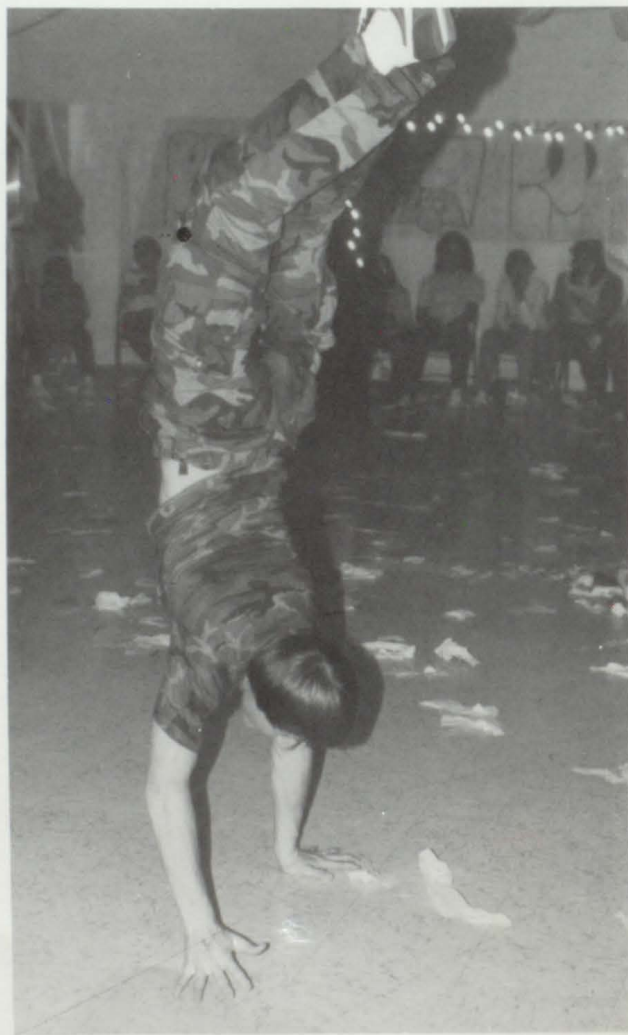

The annual bon fire held the Thursday before the game was rained out, but the student body gathered in the gym for a pep assembly.

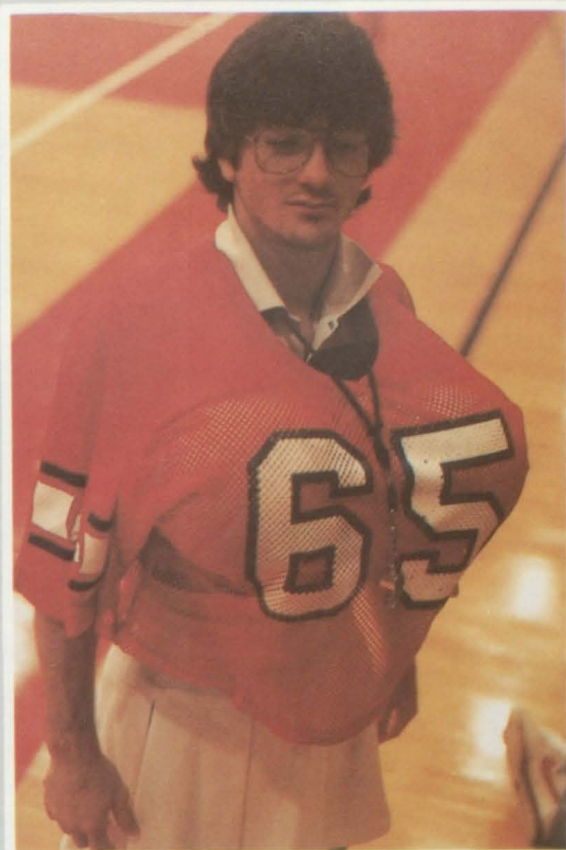
Spirit Week was sponsored by the Senior High cheerleaders and their sponsor, Mrs. Patty Wheeler.

Advanced Biology ...work and fun

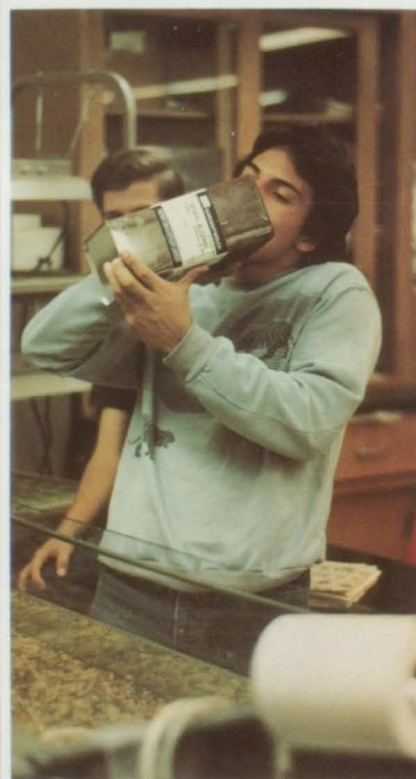

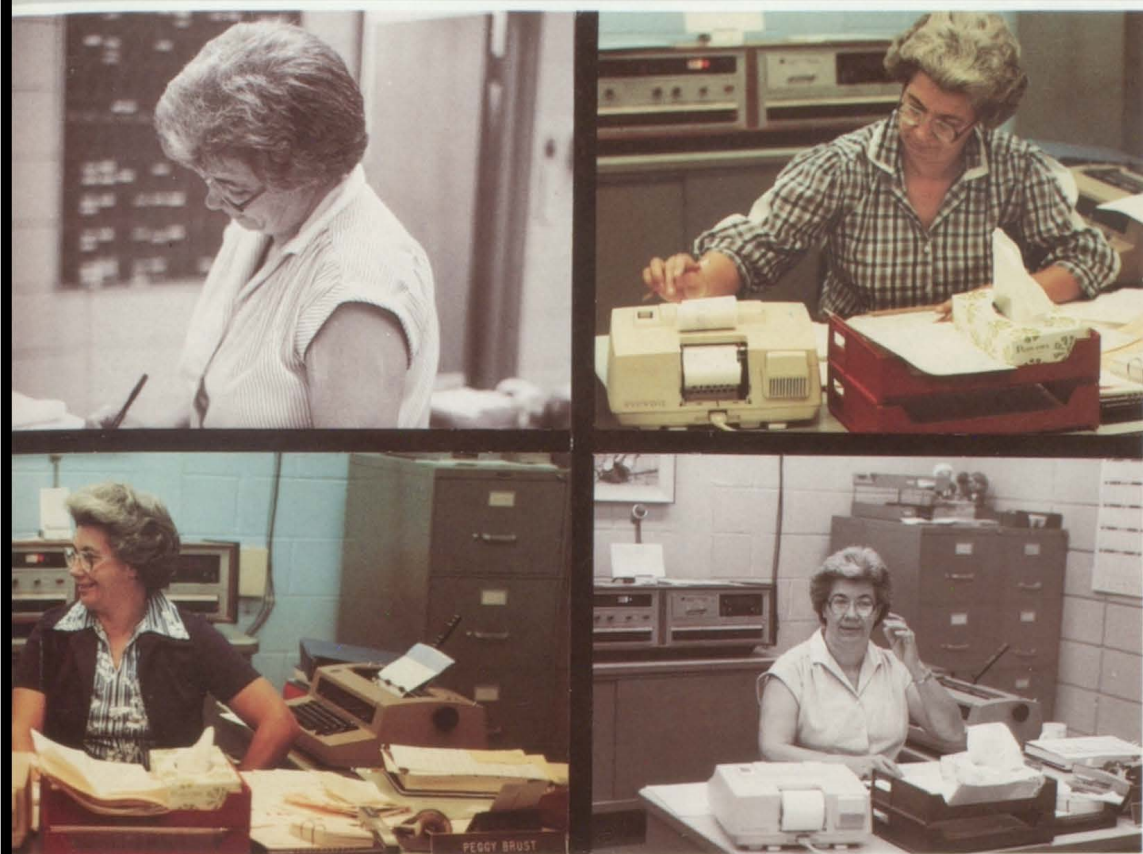
The Advanced Biology class is noted for dissecting cats every year, and this year, like always, they will be attempting this feat during the second semester.

A short history of a great class

8th Grade—The class grew this year and had 66 members. It was led by Jeff Russell, President; Scott Hockett, vice-president; Doris DePriest, secretary; Beth White, treasurer; Steven Russell, stuco. Ronnie Wade wore a diaper and carried a bottle on "Baby Day."

9th Grade—Ruth Spellins was a high salesperson for FBLa, and there were 21 Freshmen in FHA. Class officers: Starla Wren, president; Debra van Manen, vice-president; Anne Wiley, secretary; Debbie Mattocks, treasurer, and Jeff Russell, stuco. The Freshman class was the largest in the school with 74 members.

10th Grade—The class went down in membership this year and had only 56 members. Class officers were Steven Russell, president; Jeff Russell, vice-president; Anne Wiley, secretary;

Jamie Riley, treasurer, and Gayle Howard, stuco. John Barnes and Amy Carey were candidates for the Snowball. Rodney Lay, Jr. and the Rockaways performed at the Barnwarmer. There were 24 Sophomores in FHA.

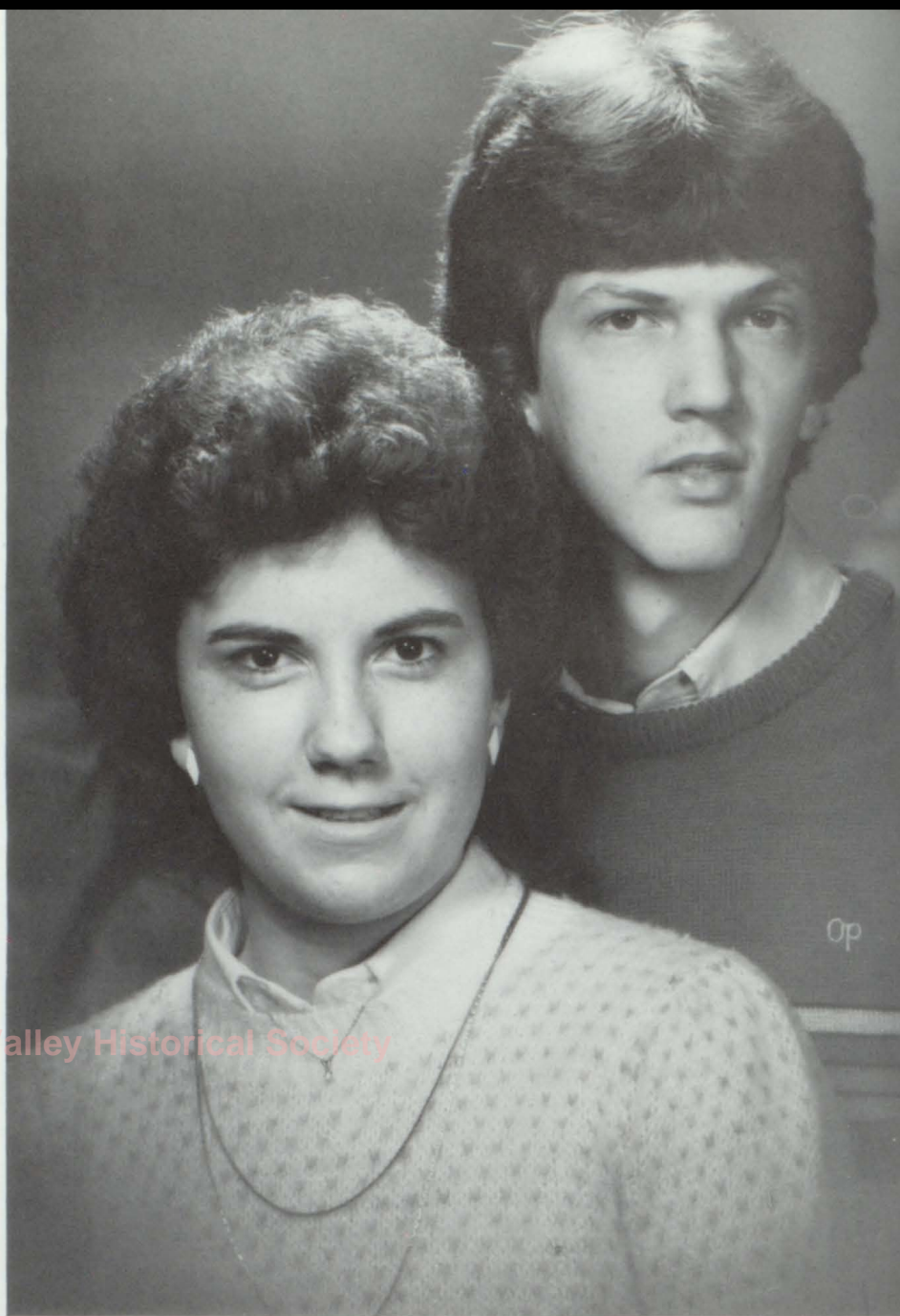

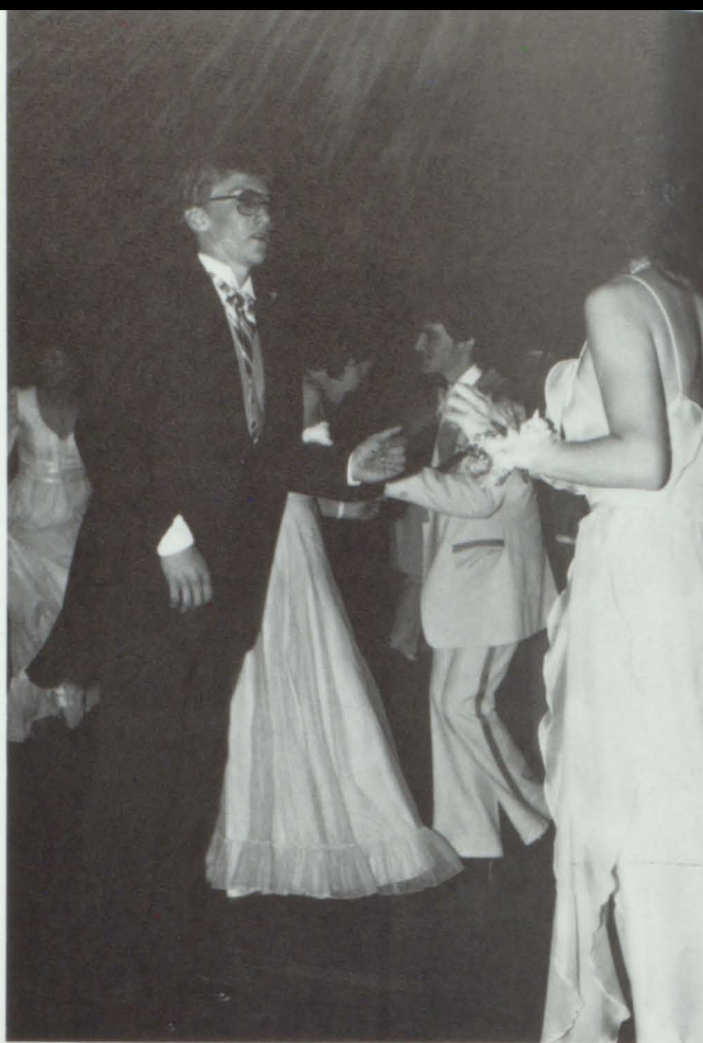

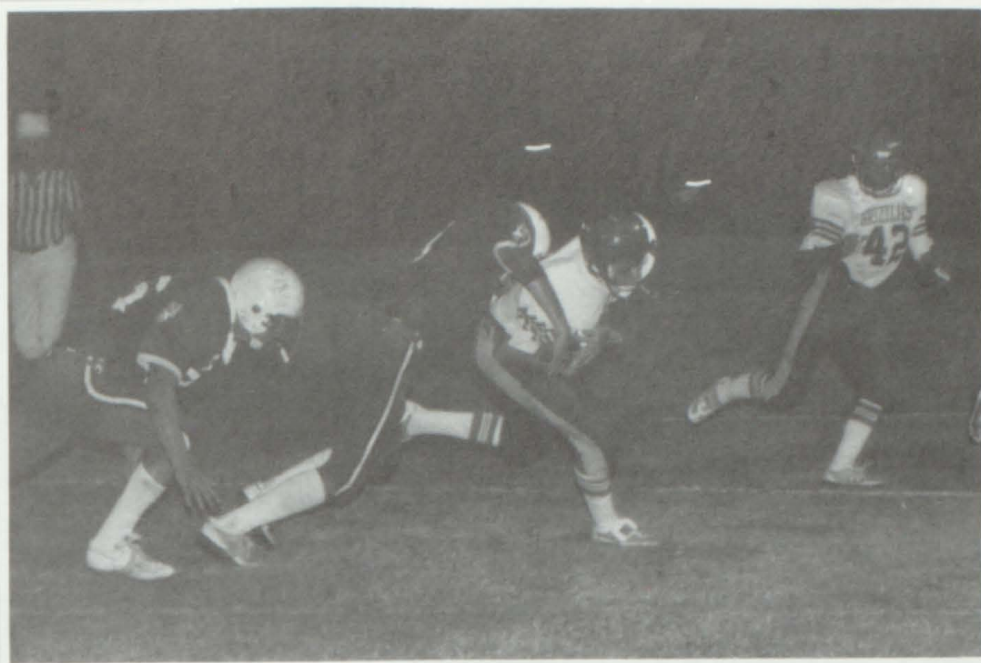

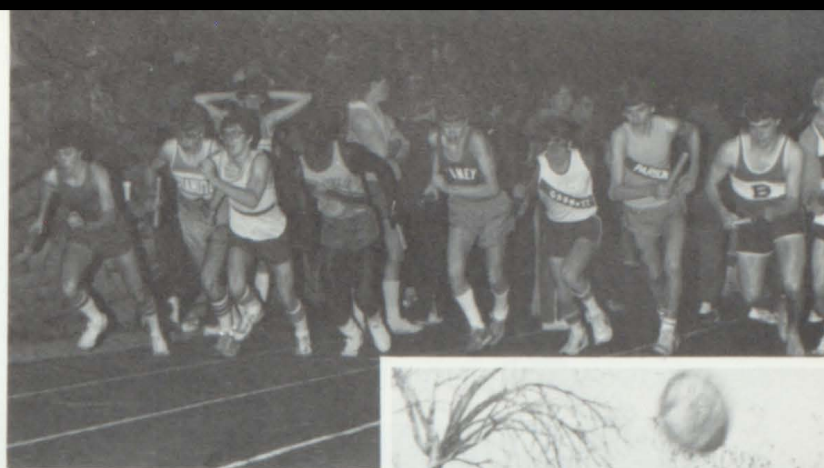

Future plans for the staff include working with the speech and drama classes to produce a weekly radio show on KGGF, a station in Coffeyville.

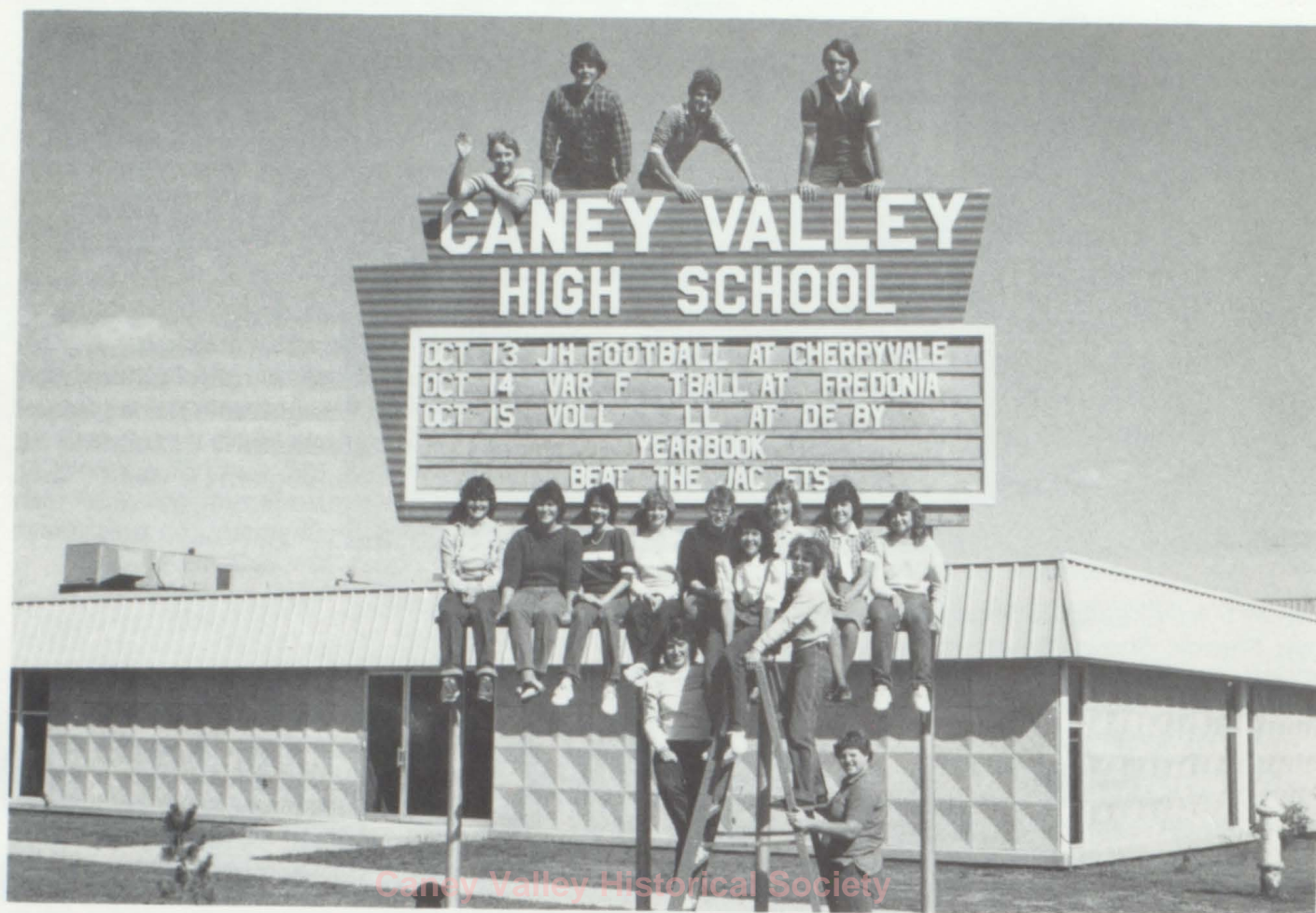

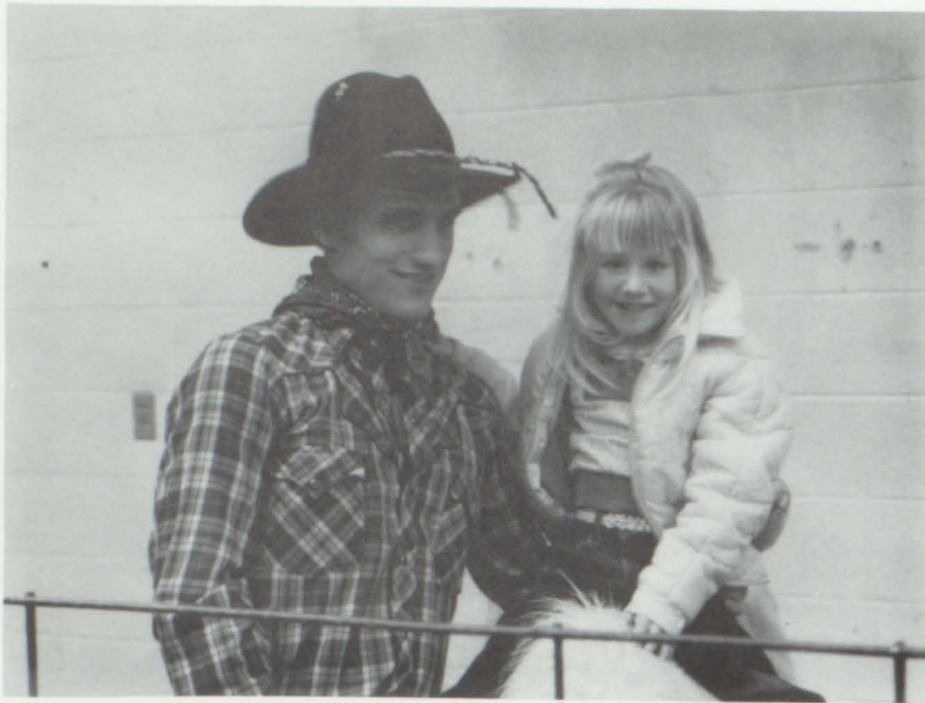

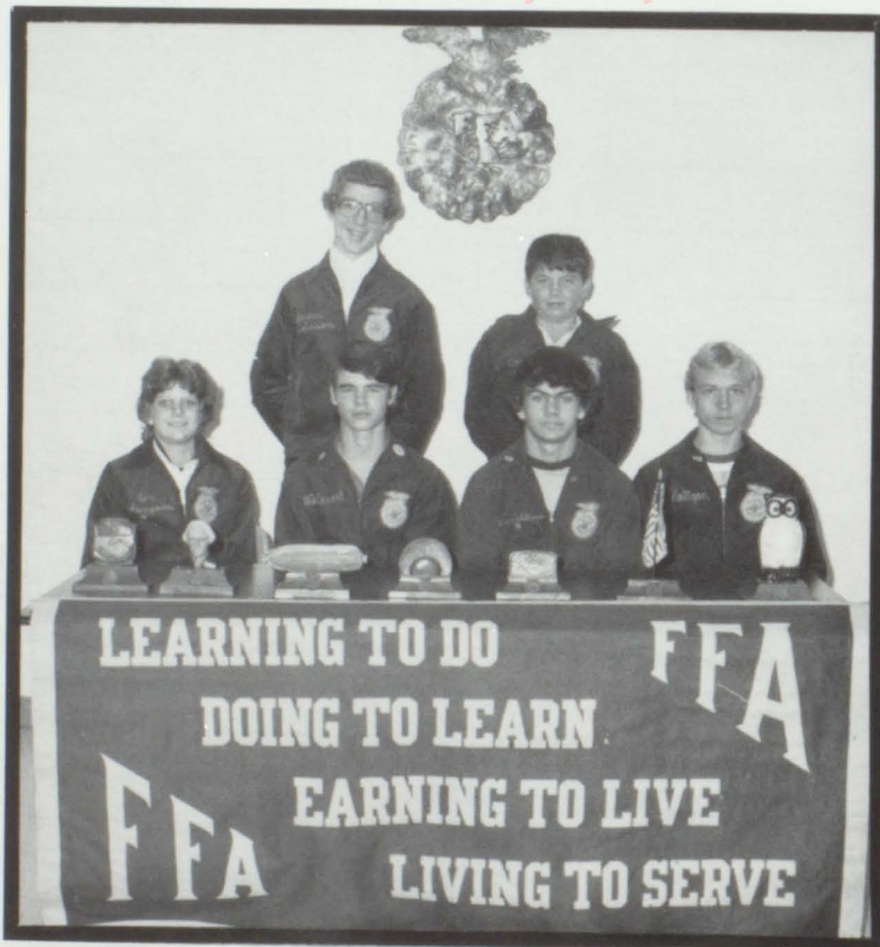

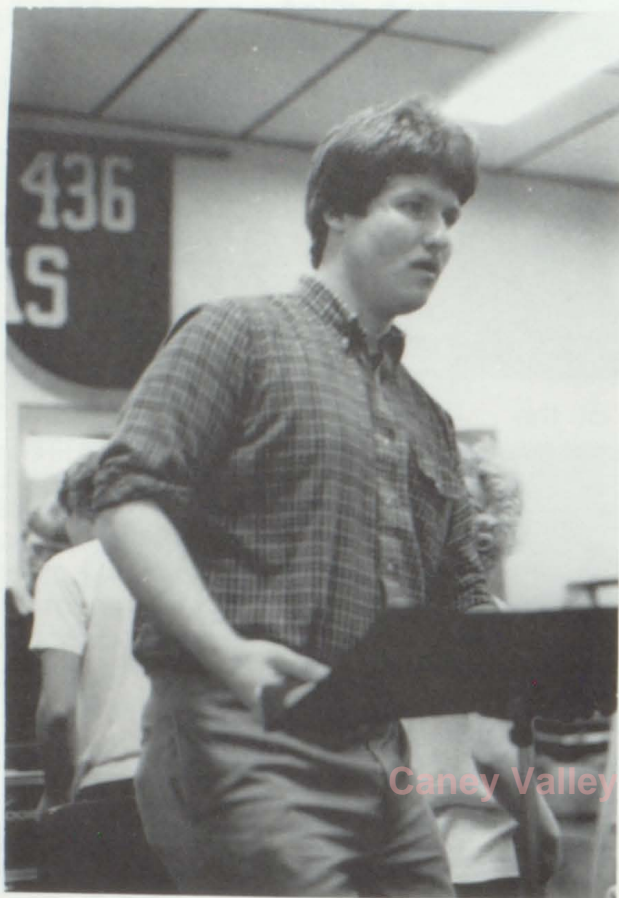

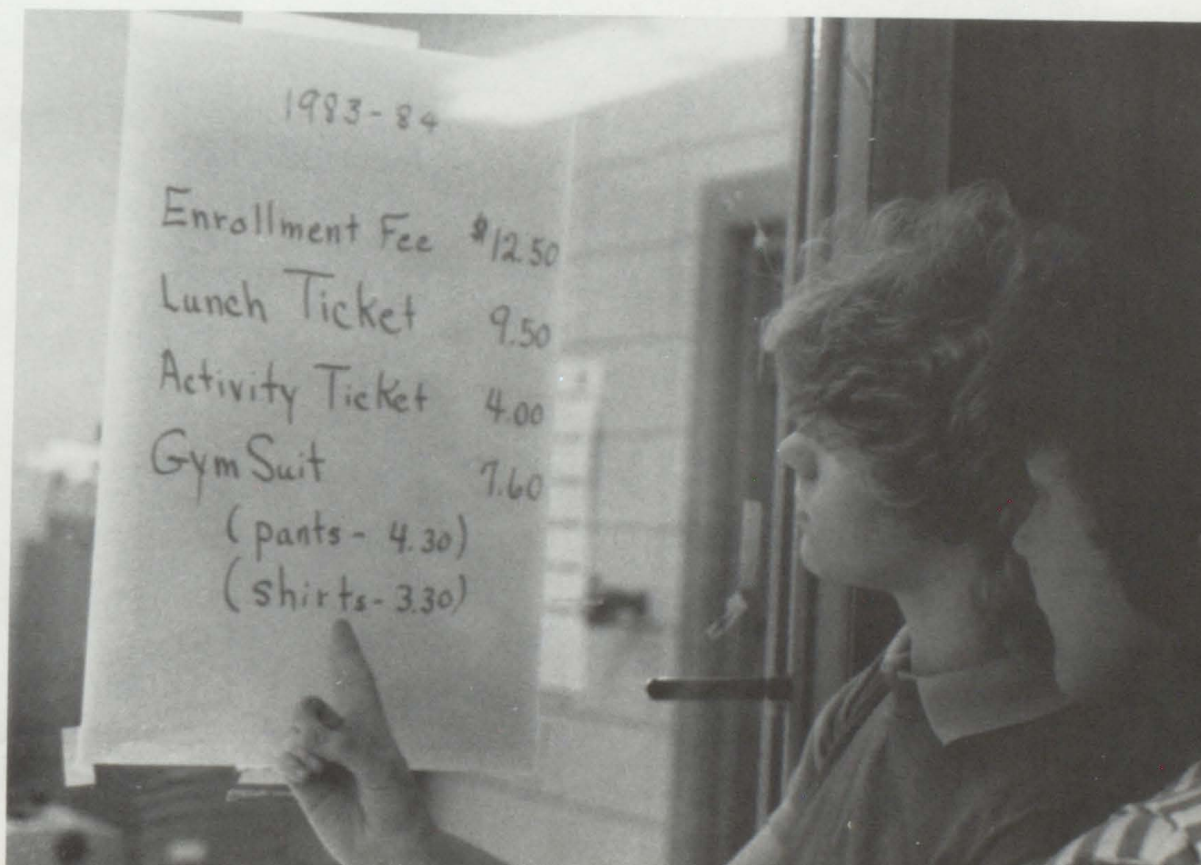


The cost of being a student

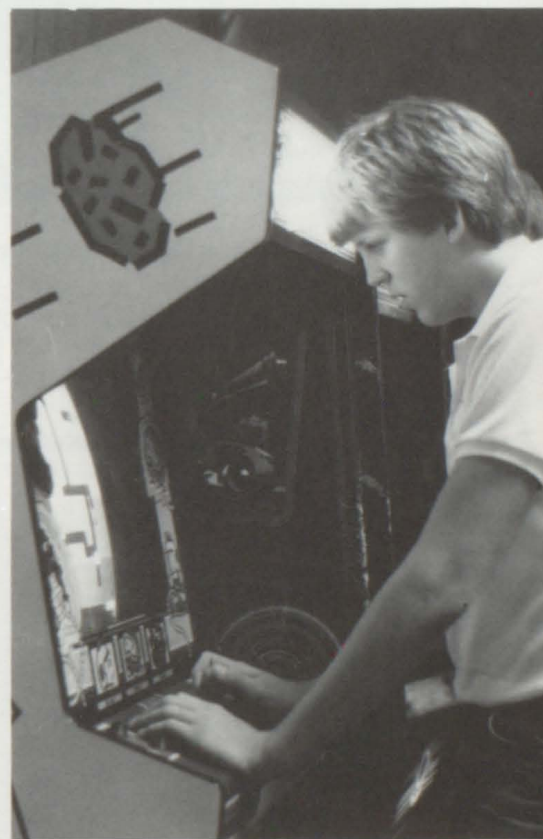

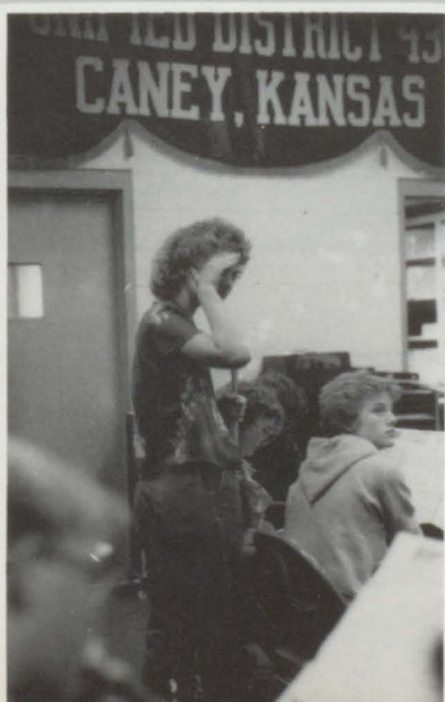

Big enrollment in junior high classes

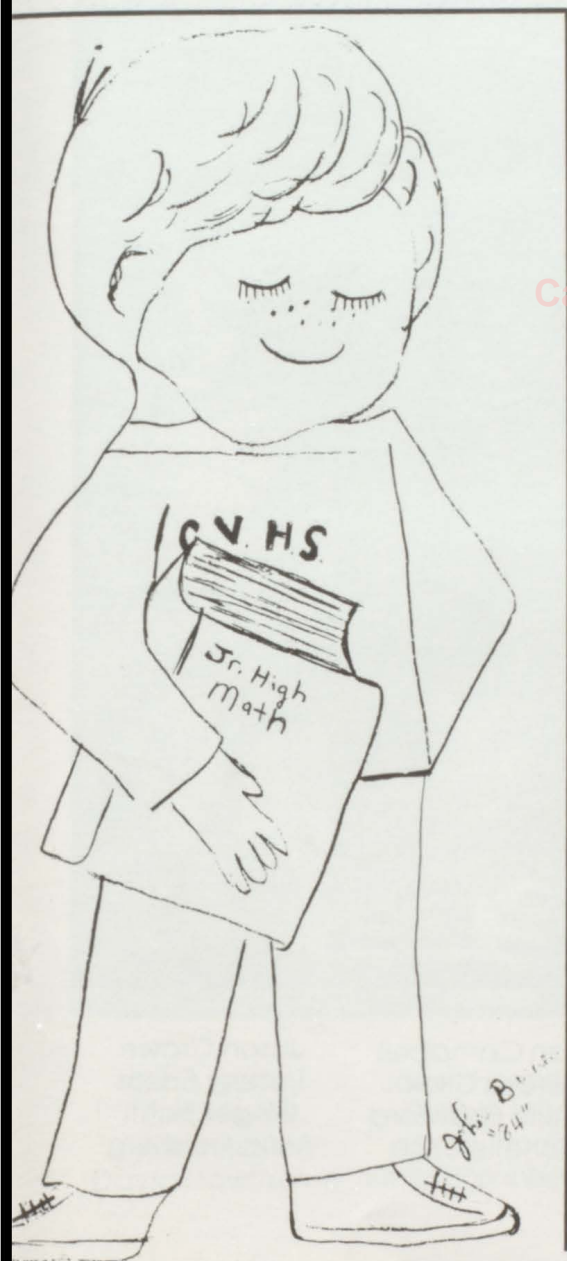

He attended Edna Grade School, LCHS at Altamont, one year at Coffeyville Community College, one year at Labette County Community College in Parsons and two years at Emporia State.

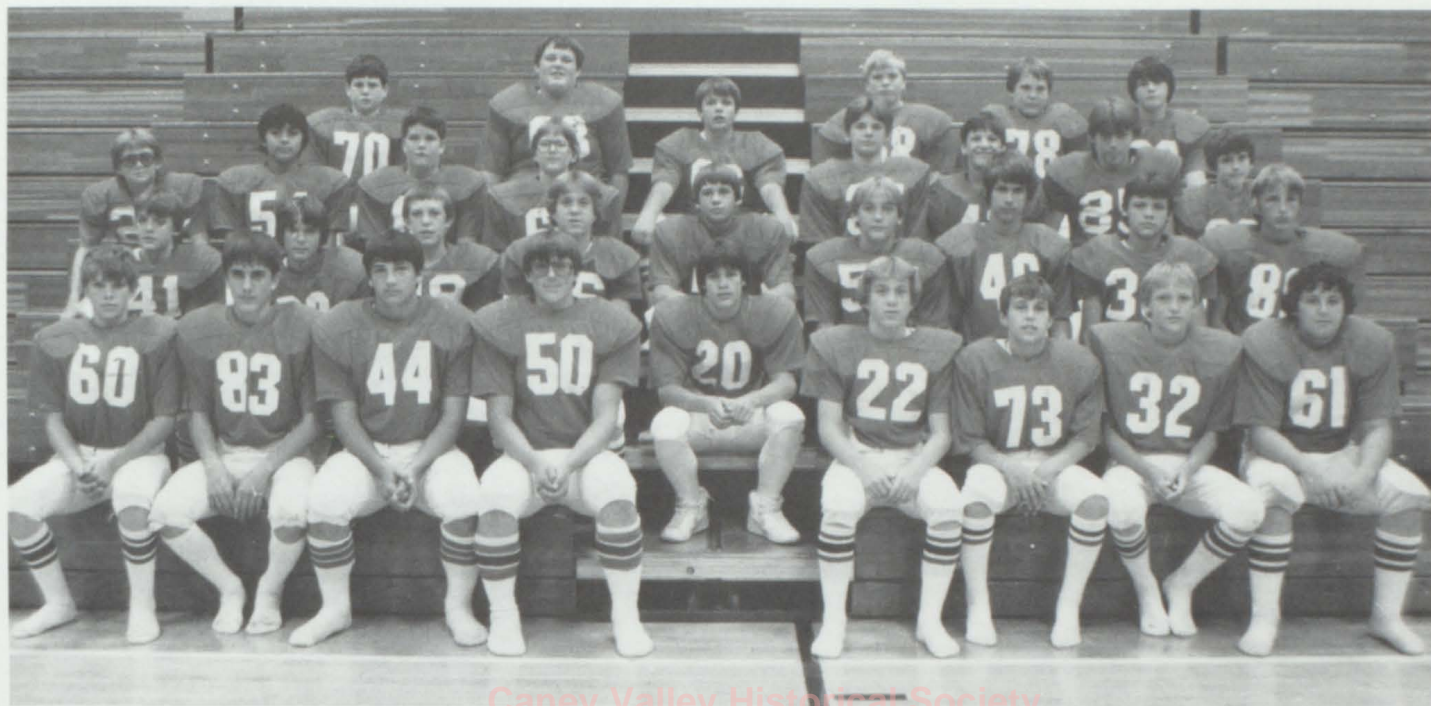

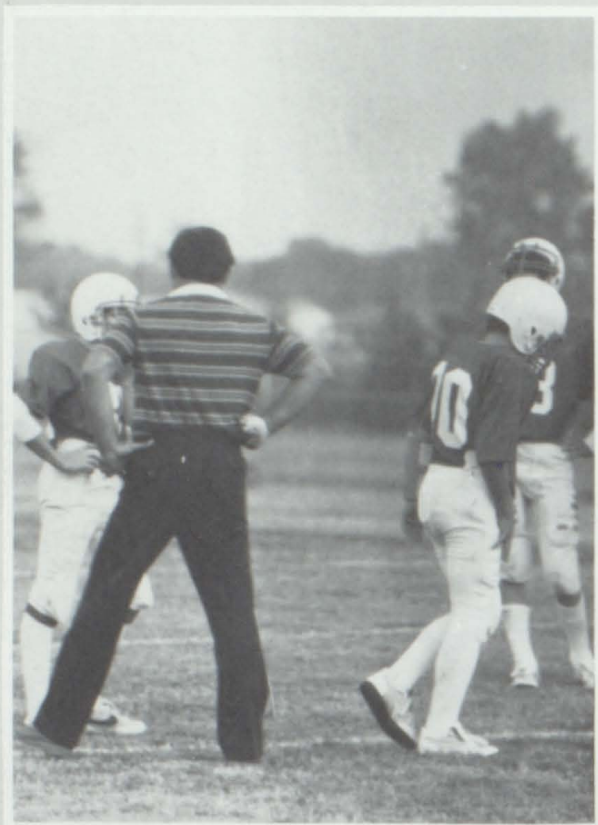

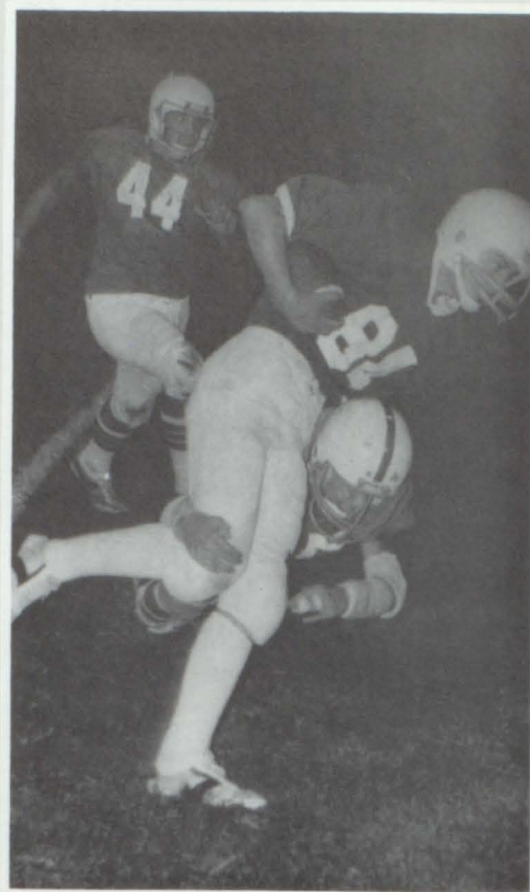

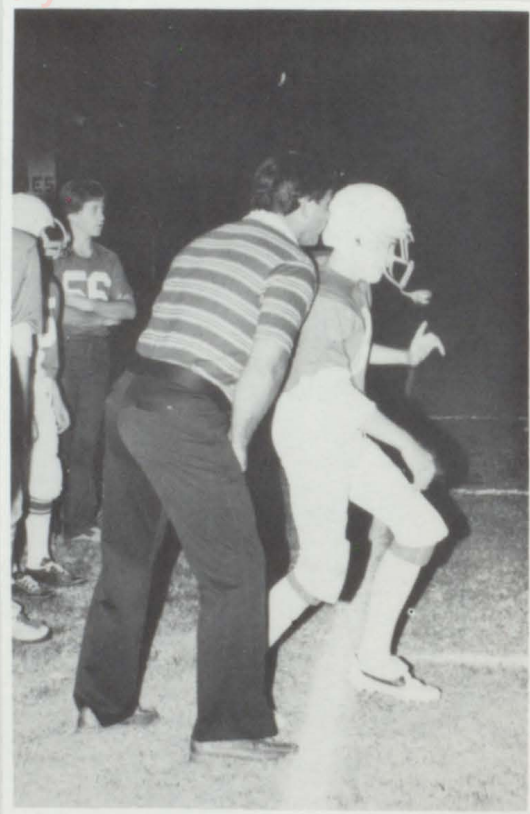

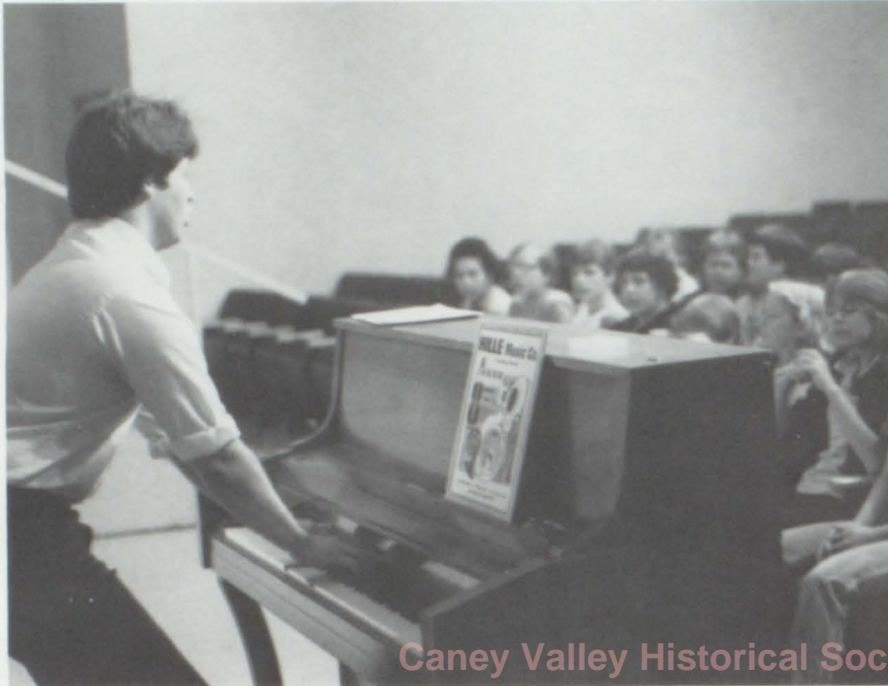
