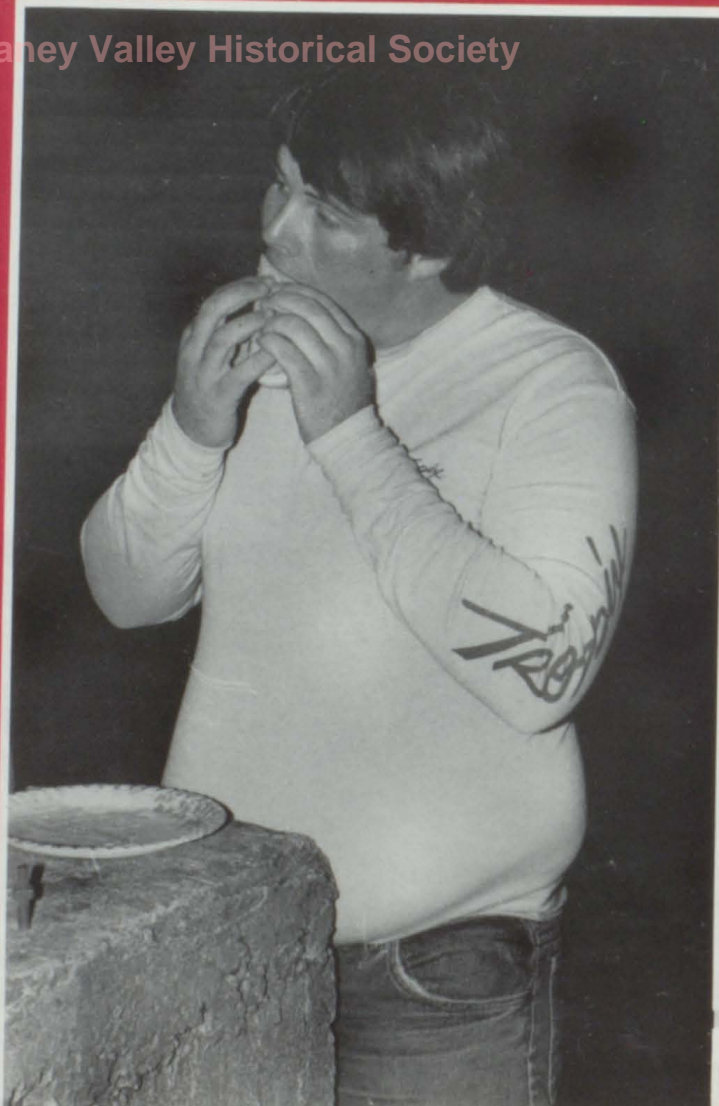

and anticipation of who we might be.

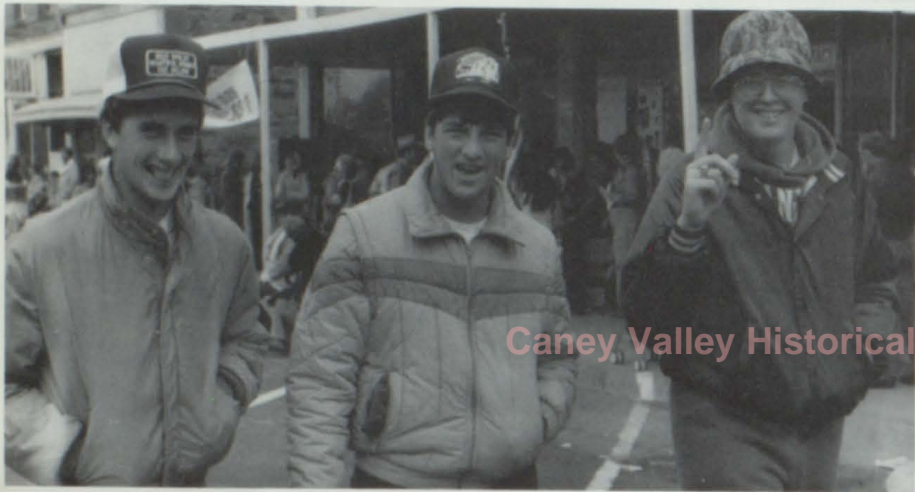

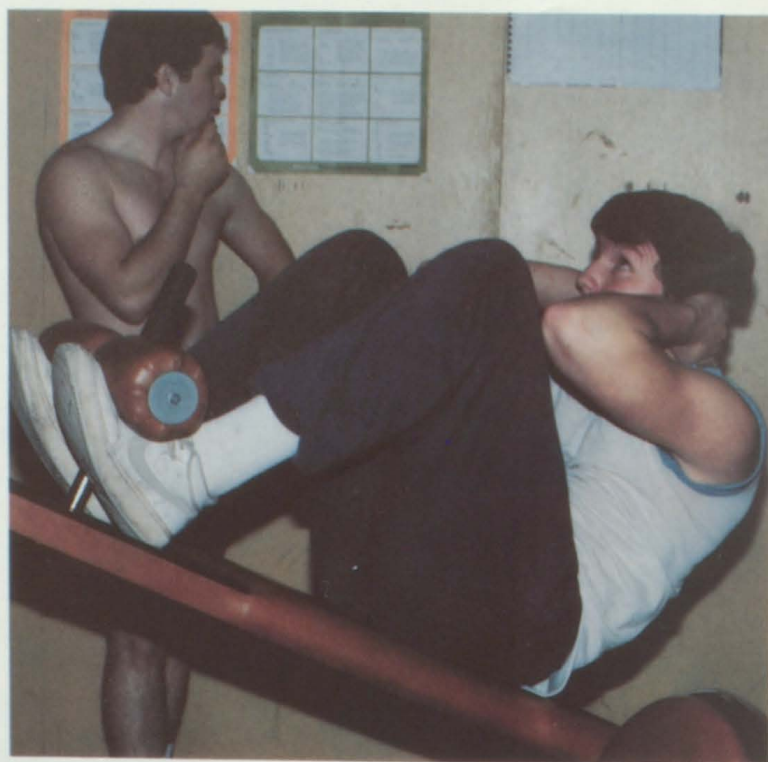

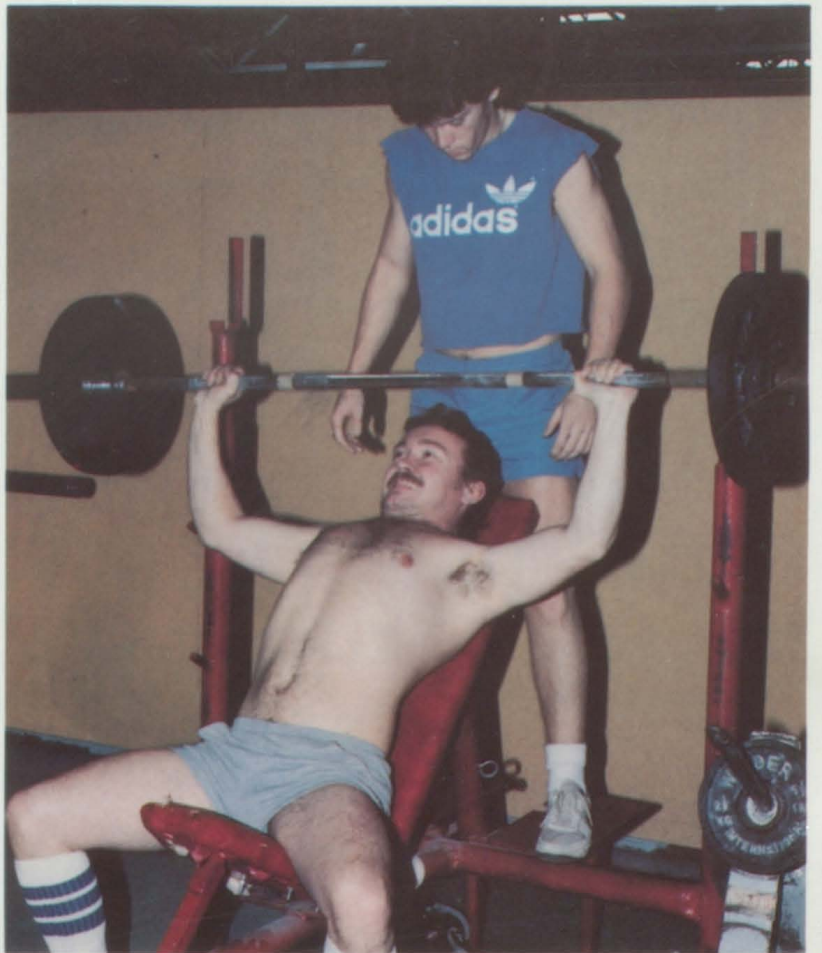

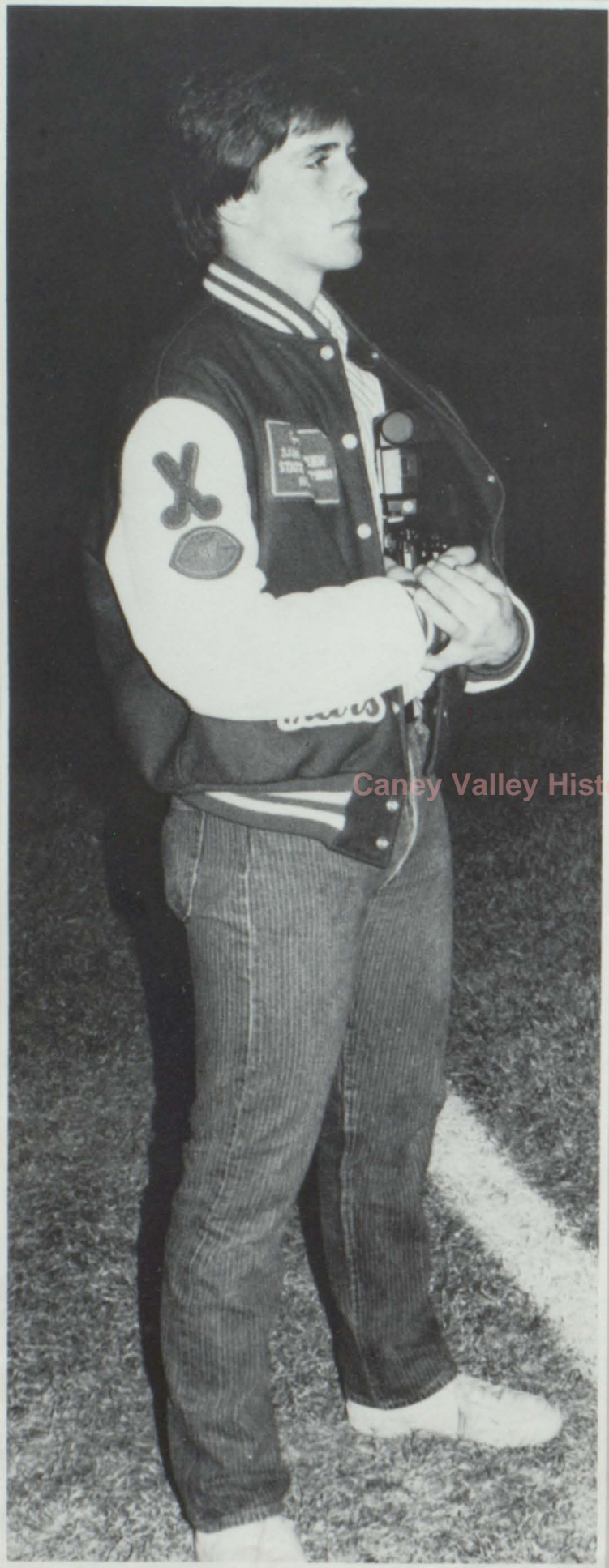

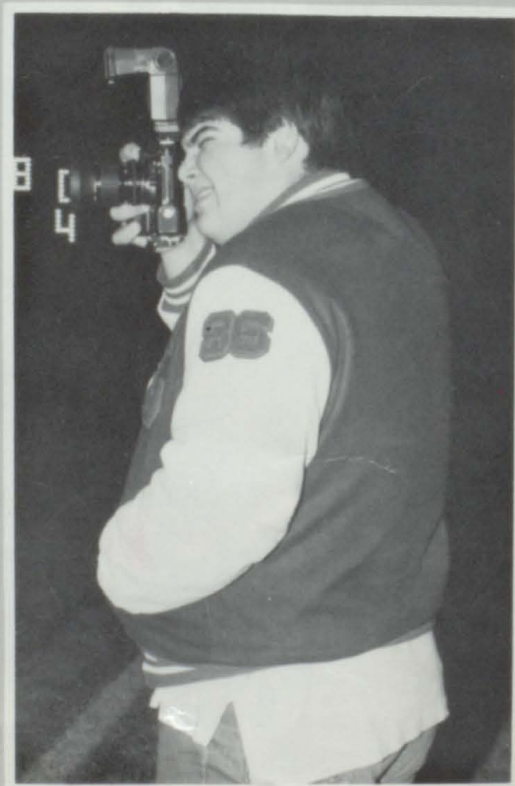

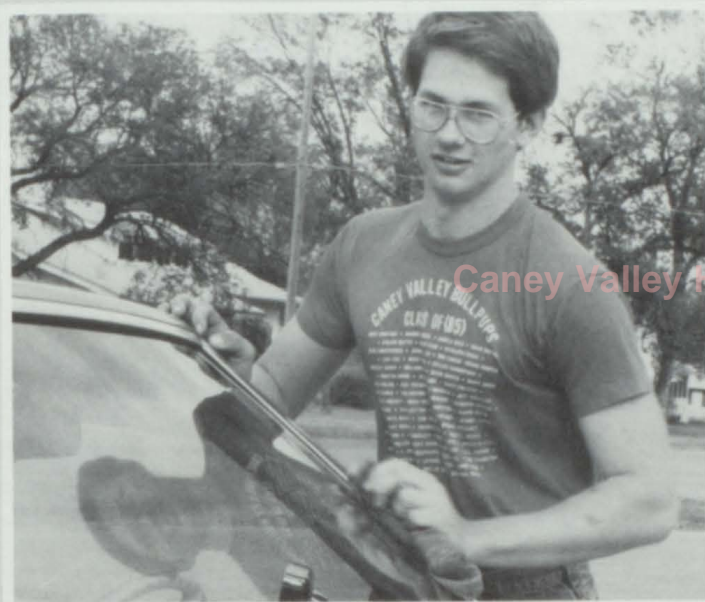

It's a lot of hard work

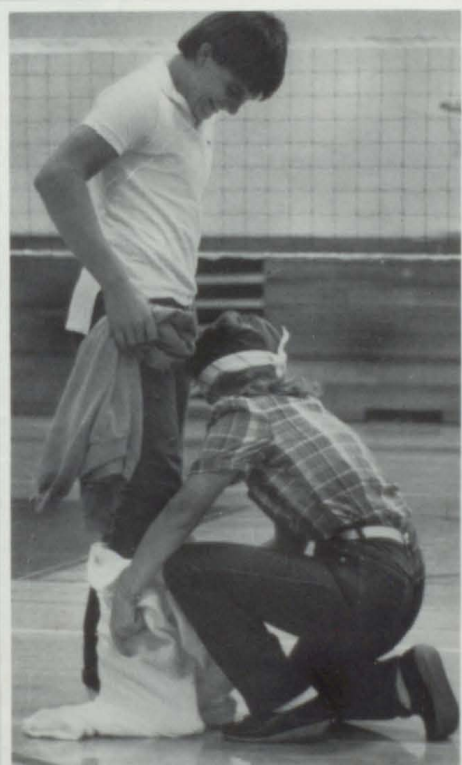

This is the unheralded story of forgotten cheerleaders, the one that is seldom written. We'll begin with what the girls go through to become cheerleaders. They must practice several weeks in advance of tryouts which come every spring, just before school is out. To try out, they perform in front of the student body and an outside organization.

When they have been selected, they have their first meeting to select their outfits. They make their decisions and prepare an outline to present to their mothers. If outfits have to be made, they find an individual who can possibly make most of the clothing articles so they can be made nearly alike. The material is ordered after measuring for the right amount, along with the other uniforms, so they will be in by the end of June. This gives them the month of July to make the outfits by the time cheerleading camp is held in early August. During the summer, until time for cheerleading camp, the girls practice every other day at 6 a.m. or in the late evening. Outfits for camp are chosen and bought. Shoes are acquired. The girls keep practicing after camp until school starts so they can use what they learned at camp.

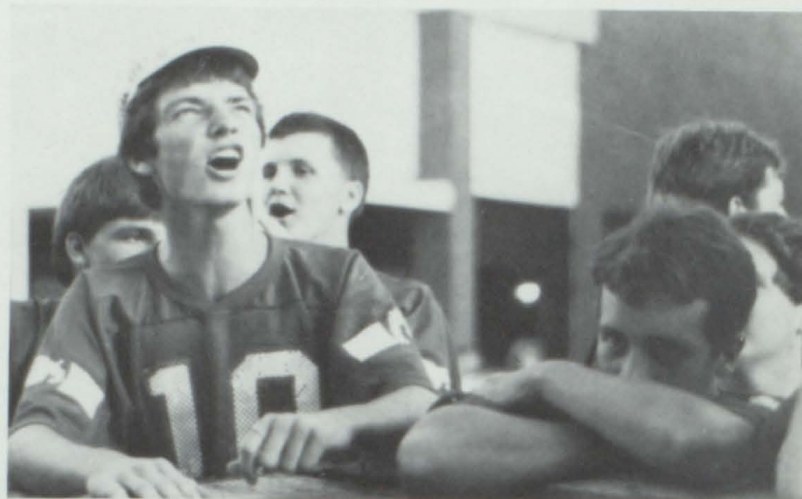
After school starts, cheerleaders are required to participate at varsity, most junior varsity, some Freshman football games, and at volleyball games, depending on where the teams play. During and before basketball season, the girls split their time between basketball games and wrestling meets. When the basketball season is really underway, they are busy cheering as many as three nights a week at girls' and boys' varsity games, JV games, and some Freshman games.

At almost all home games, the girls bake cakes and sell tickets for them to make money for the football coronation program, football parents' night, basketball coronation, and basketball parents' night.

They have fund raisers to help defray the cost of outfits. If they start early with the right merchandise, they can earn quite a bit of money. They work hard and most are dedicated to the point of really enjoying the cheerleaders' demanding responsibilities.

Then the cycle starts over again. To some it may mean a scholarship at a college, and to others, some wonderful high school memories.

Refreshments were furnished by the FFA and FHA, and they consisted of punch, cake, mints, and peanuts.



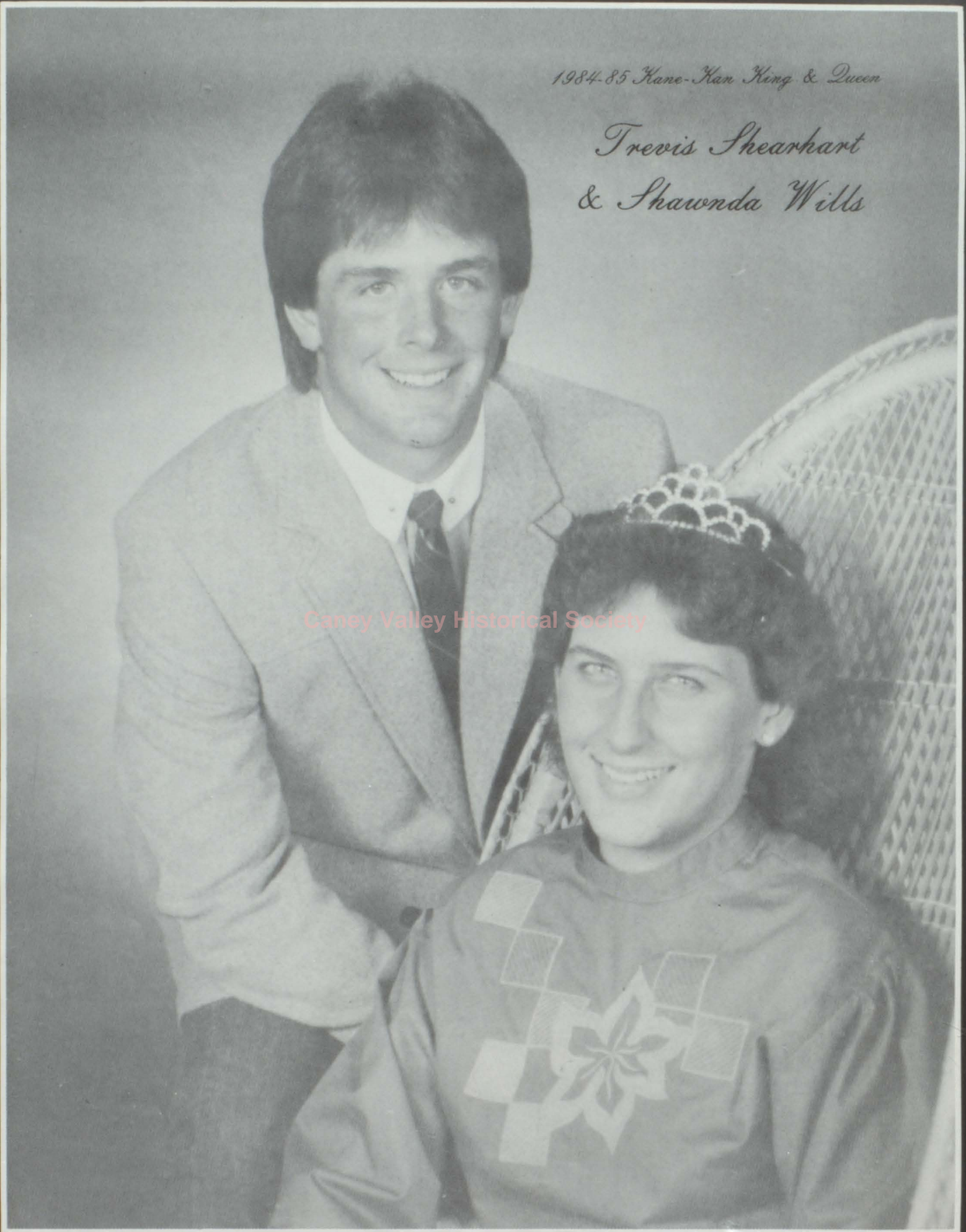

News of the famine spread all over the world, and many groups, as well as individuals, contributed aid to Africans in their time of need.

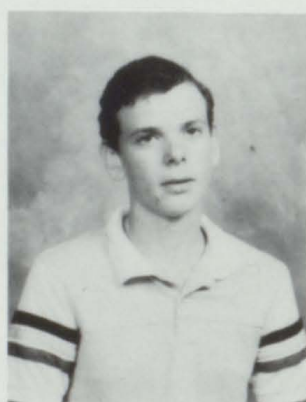
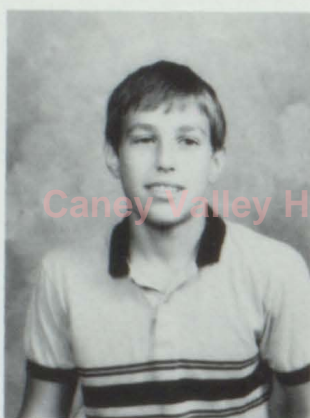
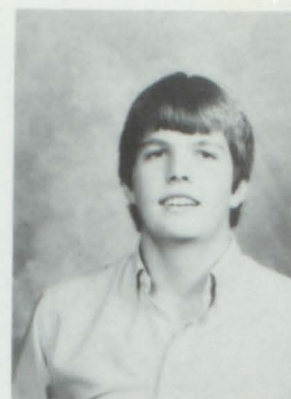
Lionel Richie and Michael Jackson wrote the words to "We Are The World," and 43 recording artists, with producer Quincy Jones, recorded the song.

THE RECORD

Caney 22, LCHS 18

The Caney Valley High School football squad repeated history by overcoming LCHS of Altamont in their season opener Friday, September 7. The Bullpups won, 22-18, in a game played at Altamont. "We played excitingly the majority of the game," said head coach Kent Newby.

Caney and Altamont didn't do well last year and were trying to get their seasons off to a good start. Altamont had one victory last year, and Caney had two.

Caney 24, Arma 3

The Caney Bullpups rebounded from their loss to Eureka a week earlier with a convincing 24-3 victory over Northeast of Arma on Friday, September 28. The game was played at Arma.

Caney kept it hot in the third quarter, scoring on a Rank to Hardin 23-yarder and a 2-yard run by Jim Keene to close out the scoring. In the final period, just about all the Pups saw action. The victory upped the Bullpups' record to 2-2.

Caney 14, Blackwell 43

The Caney Bullpups played a good third quarter, but it wasn't enough as the Blackwell, Okla., Maroons defeated the Pups 43-14 on September 14 on the Caney gridiron. The first half was almost all Blackwell as the Maroons scored on their first play from scrimmage. They scored again in the first quarter and another TD in the second to make the half-time score 21-0.

Caney 8, Sedan 22

Coming on strong with a halfback pass, the Sedan Blue Devils downed the Caney Bullpups 22-8 Friday, October 20, at Sedan.

Caney went to Sedan with the intention of ruining their homecoming, but Les Davis was ready and hit Caney with the halfback pass. One halfback pass led directly to a touchdown, and another sustained a scoring on third down.

Caney coach Kent Newby was upset with his team's inability to defend against the play. Caney only scored once in the game after Sedan lost its third fumble of the game at its own 42-yard line.

Caney 12, Eureka 19

Caney, playing very well the first half but slowing down the second half, lost to the Eureka Tornadoes 19-12 Friday, September 21, in a game played at Caney.

A call-back ended any hopes of a win for Caney late in the fourth quarter when Rank threw at 55-yard bomb to David Keene that took the Pups to the Eureka 3-yard line, only to be called back for a holding penalty.

Caney outgained Eureka 154 to 126 yards in total offense but was hampered by inconsistent play from its offensive line.

The weekend of October 12-14 will go down as one of the most upsetting weekends in football history. OU and Texas tied in the Cotton Bowl. K-State beat KU 24-7, and the Caney Bullpups were stung 60-6 by the No. one 4-A team in the state, the Fredonia Yellow-jackets.

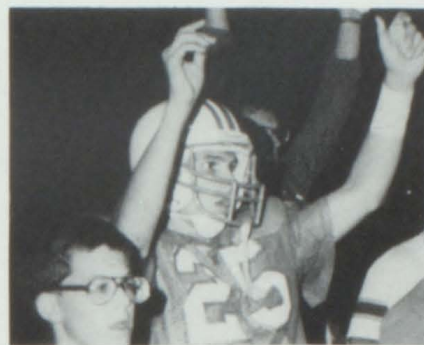
In the first half Caney scored only once with a Jeff Rank to Chris Brust pass. The conversion play was no good, making the score 6-0 at the half.

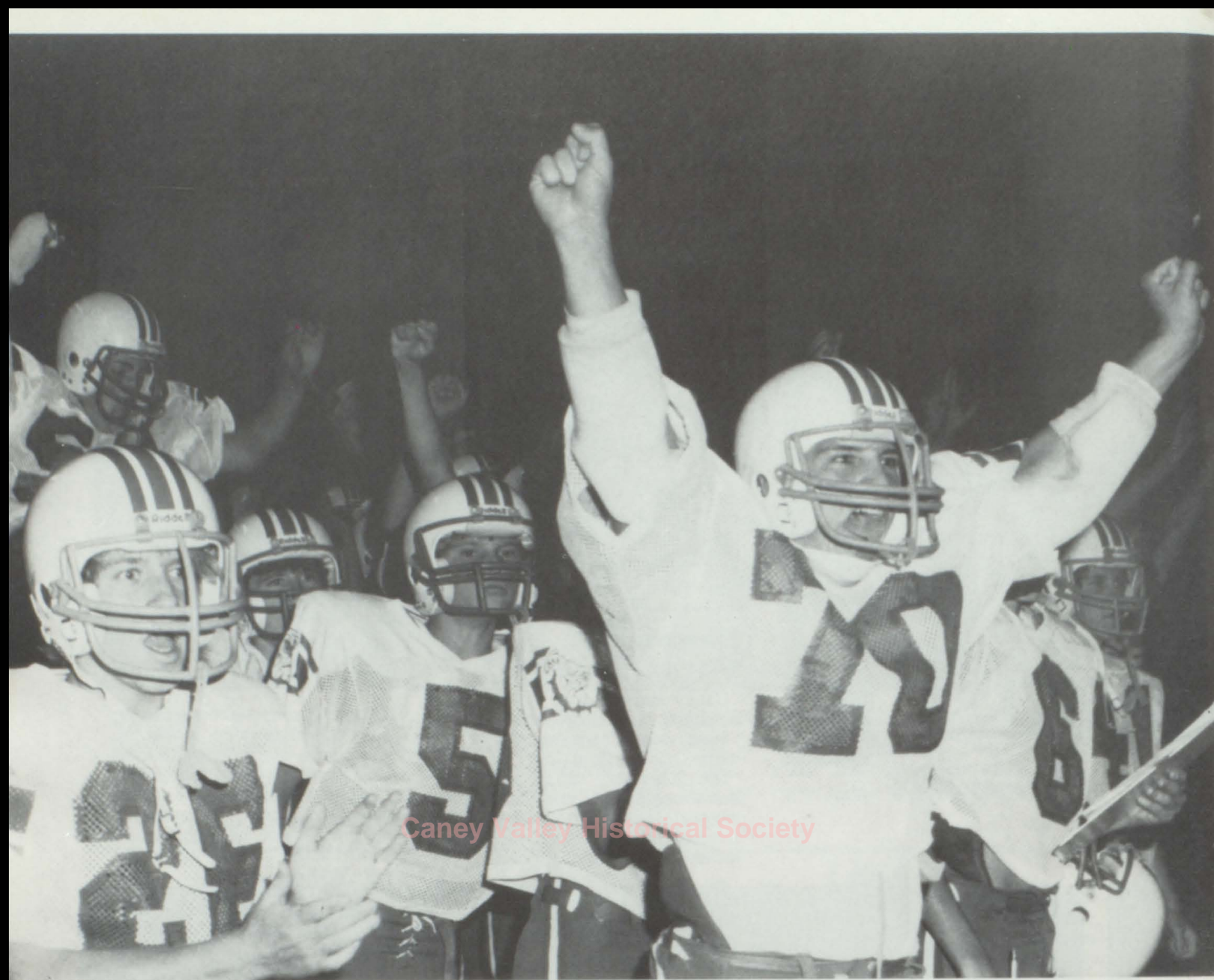

It was the lack of blood, sweat and tears that caused these losses and will serve as reminders to the oncoming Caney teams to pay the price to win.

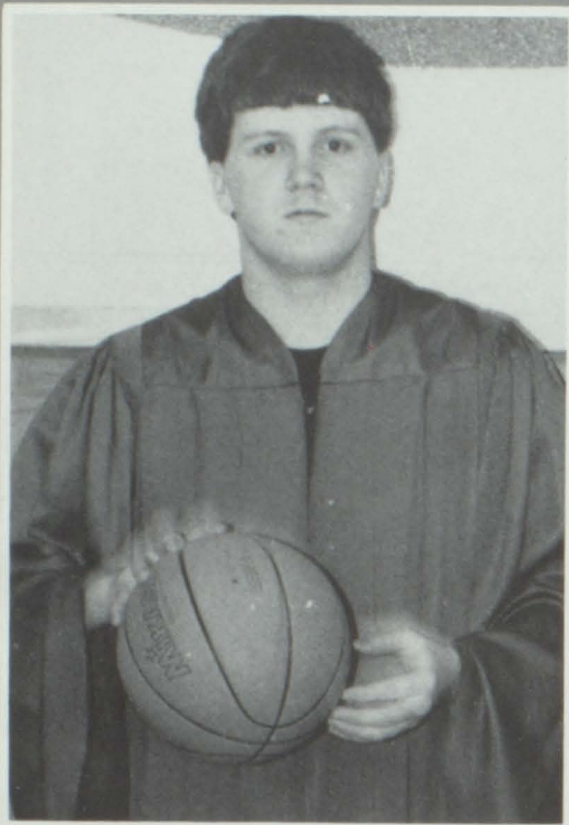

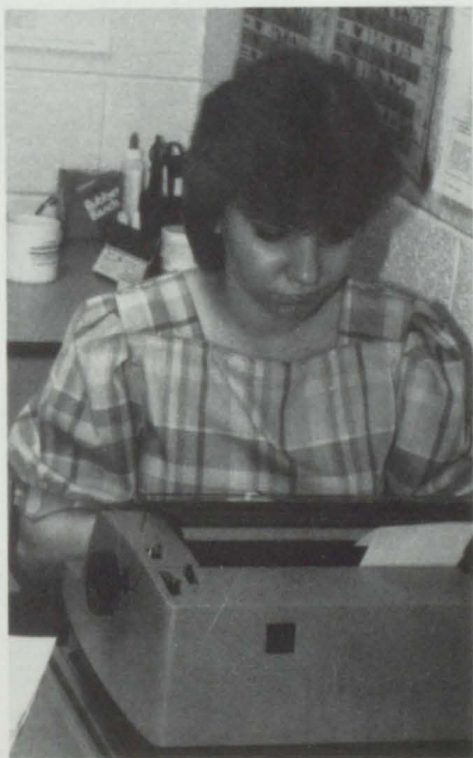

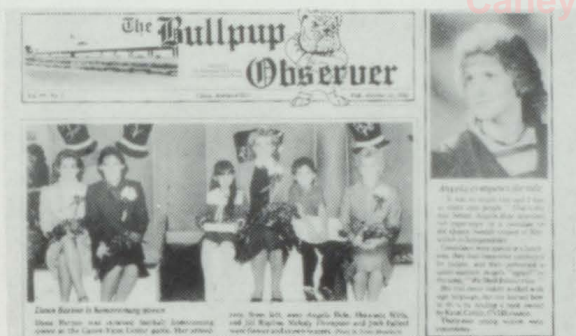

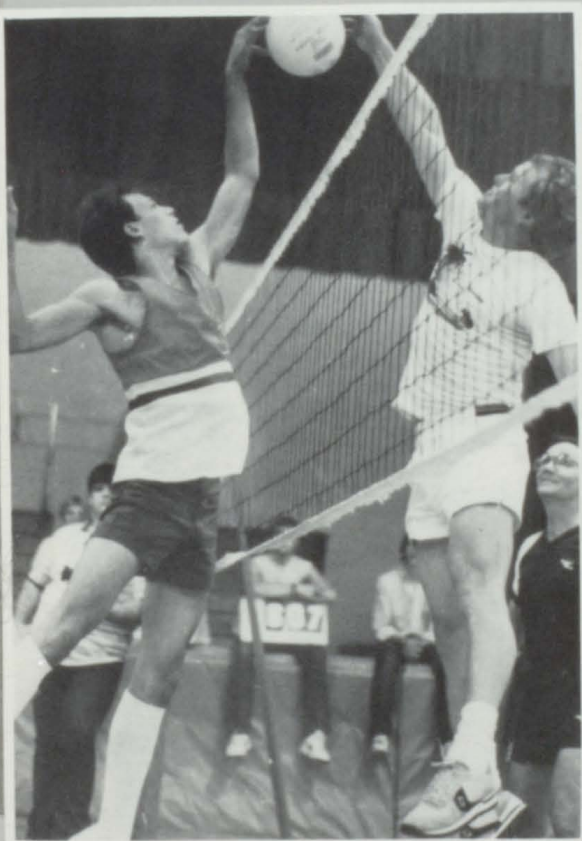

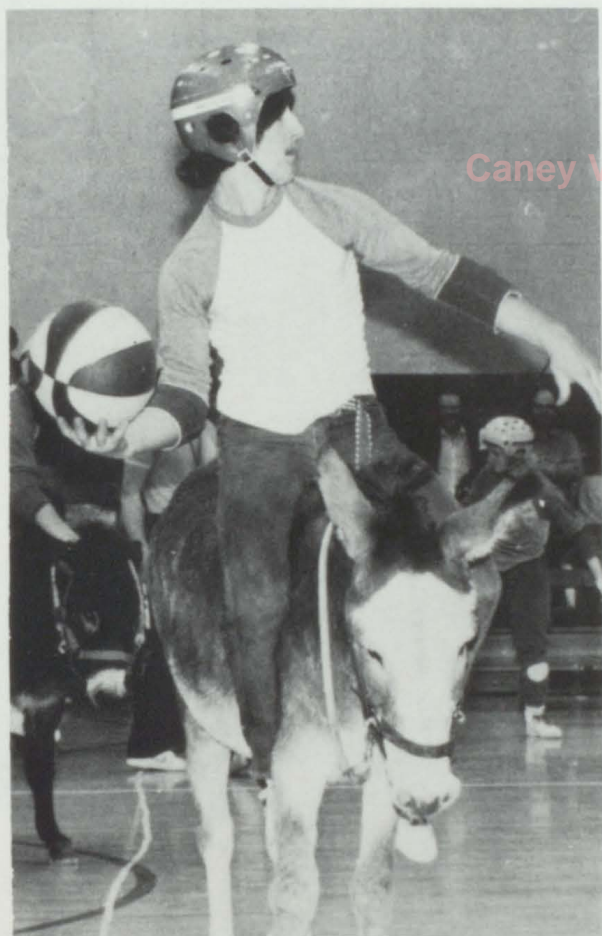

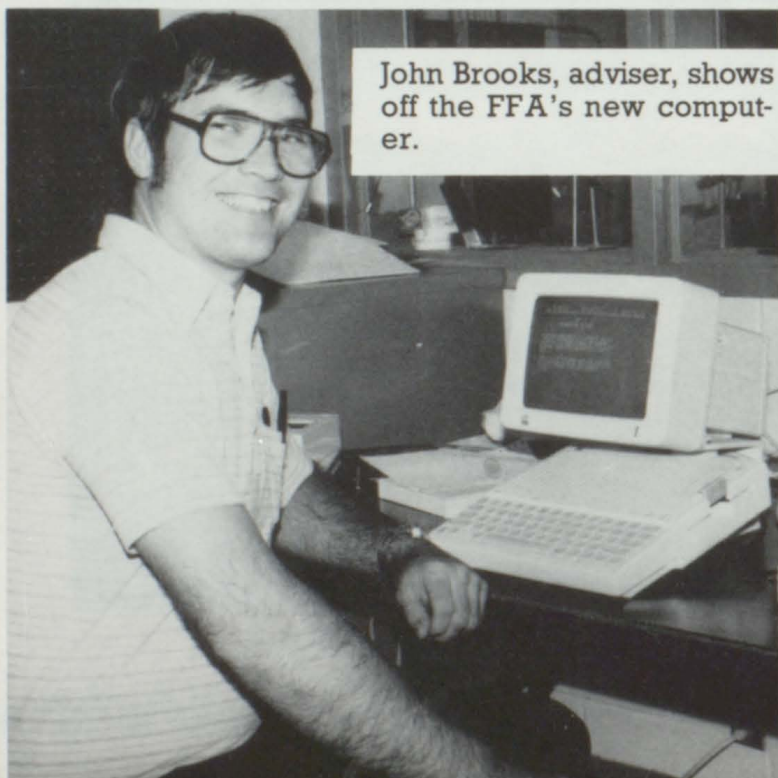

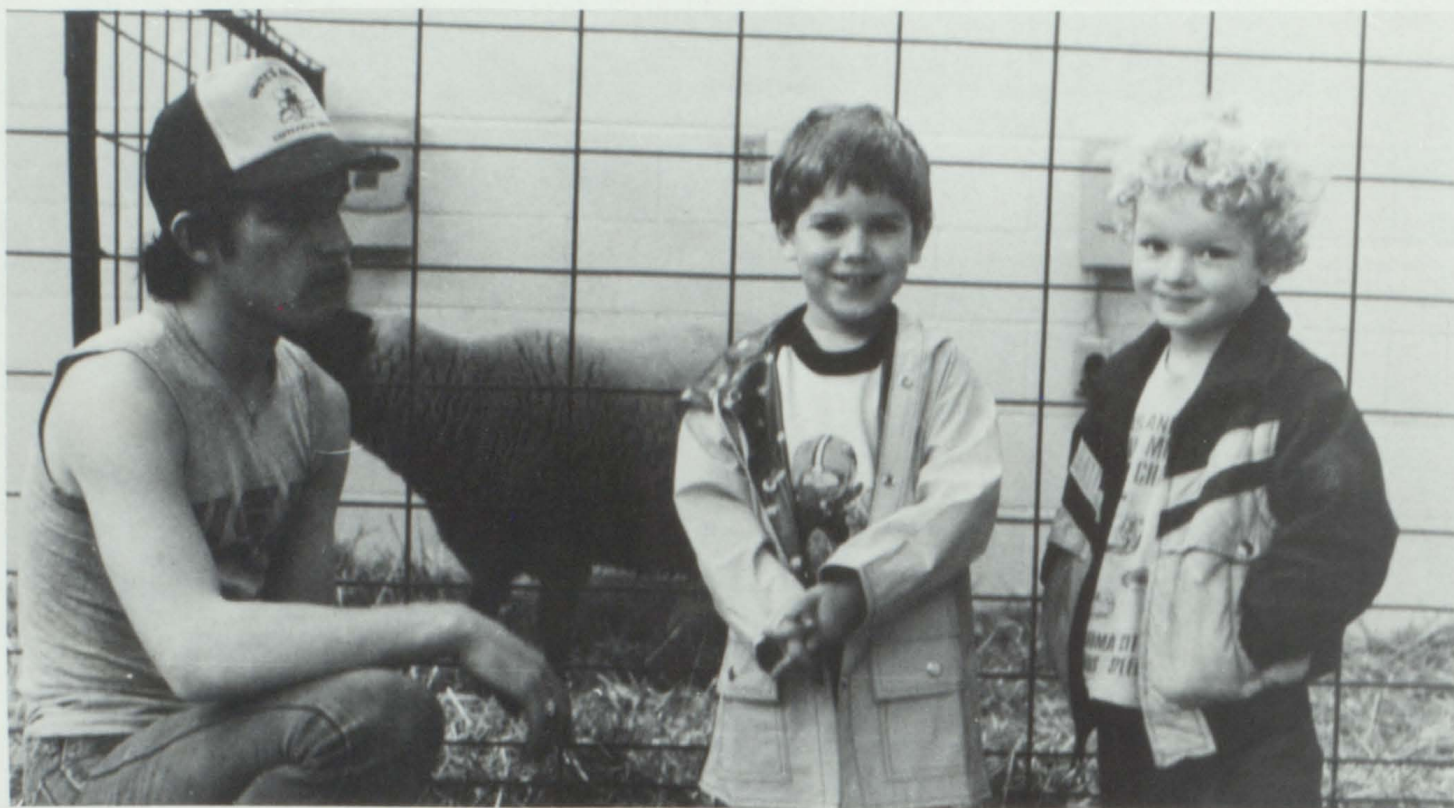

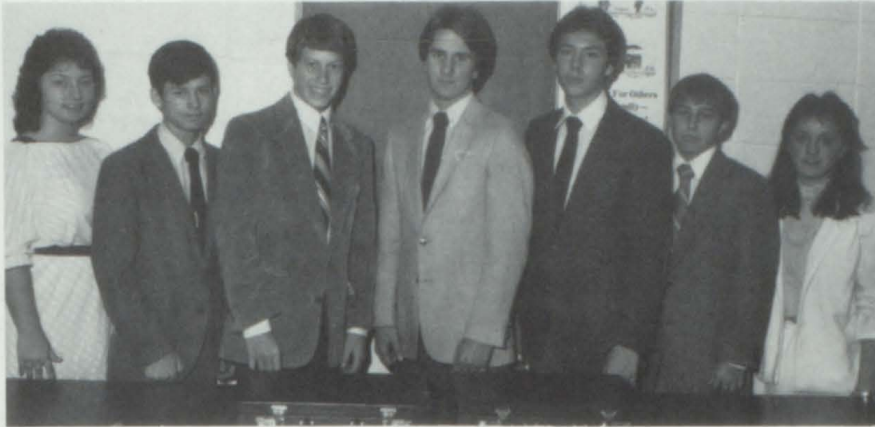

Cheerleaders promote purchase of mascot uniform

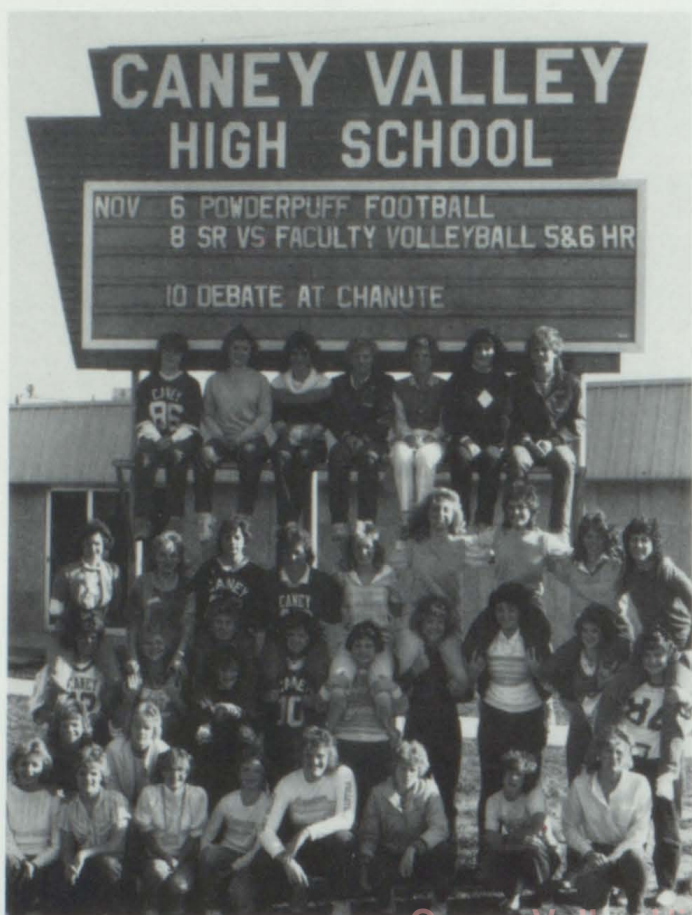
The Senior High Cheerleaders started out the year right by winning first place at cheerleading camp during the summer. They also brought home many ribbons.

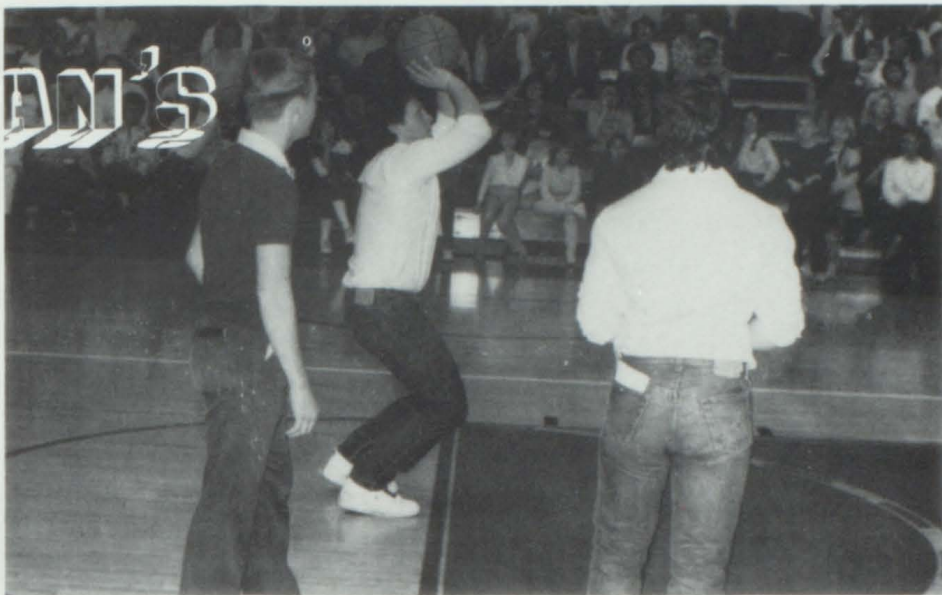

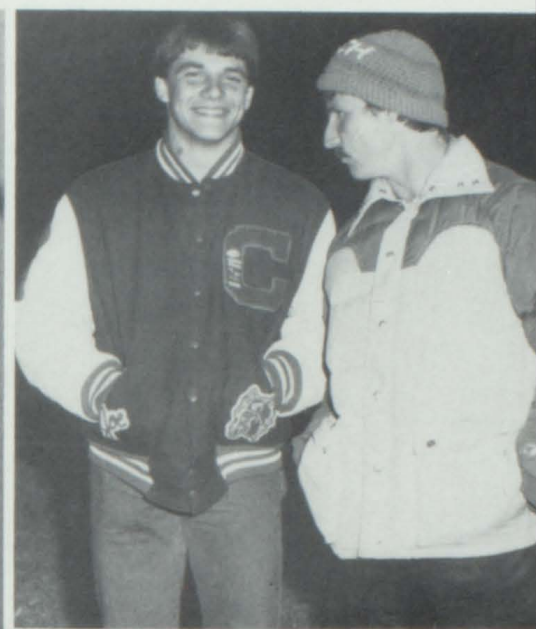
JEWELRY SALE IS SUCCESSFUL

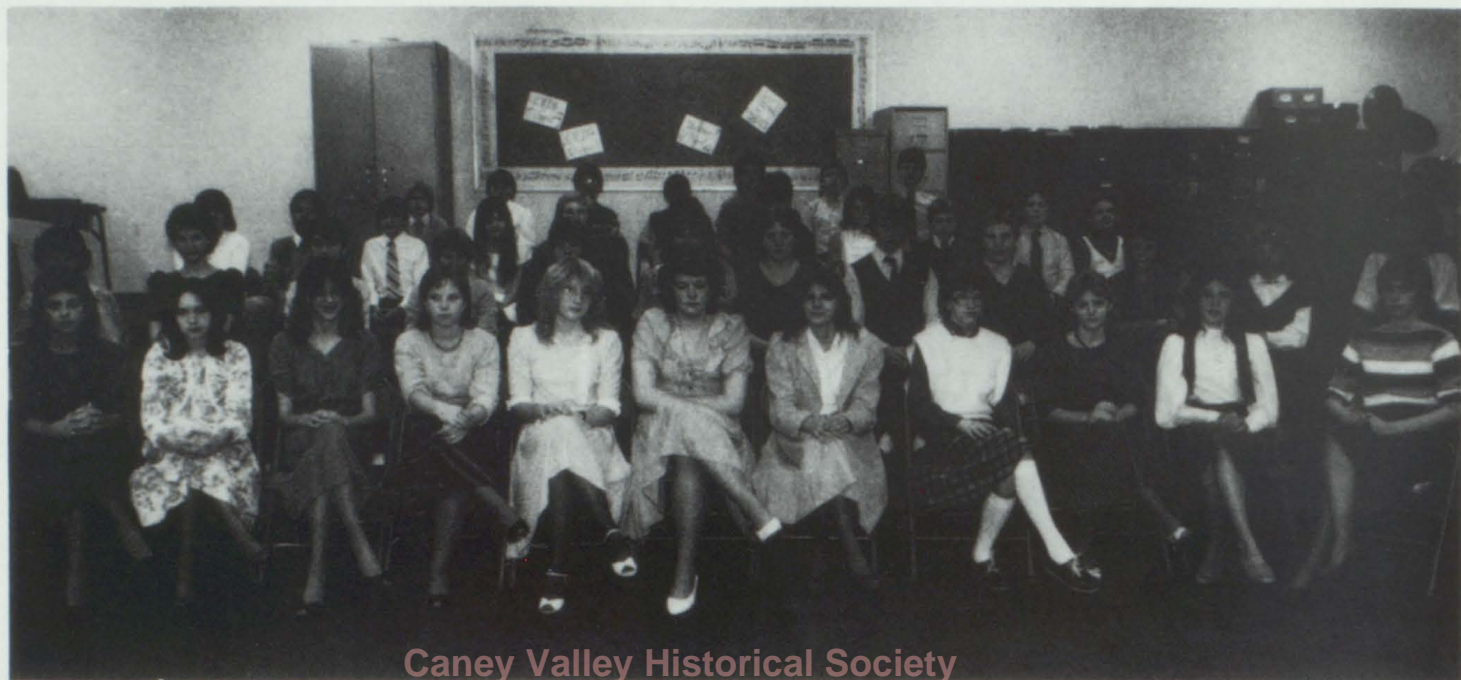
Soloists from Junior High Chorus do well at

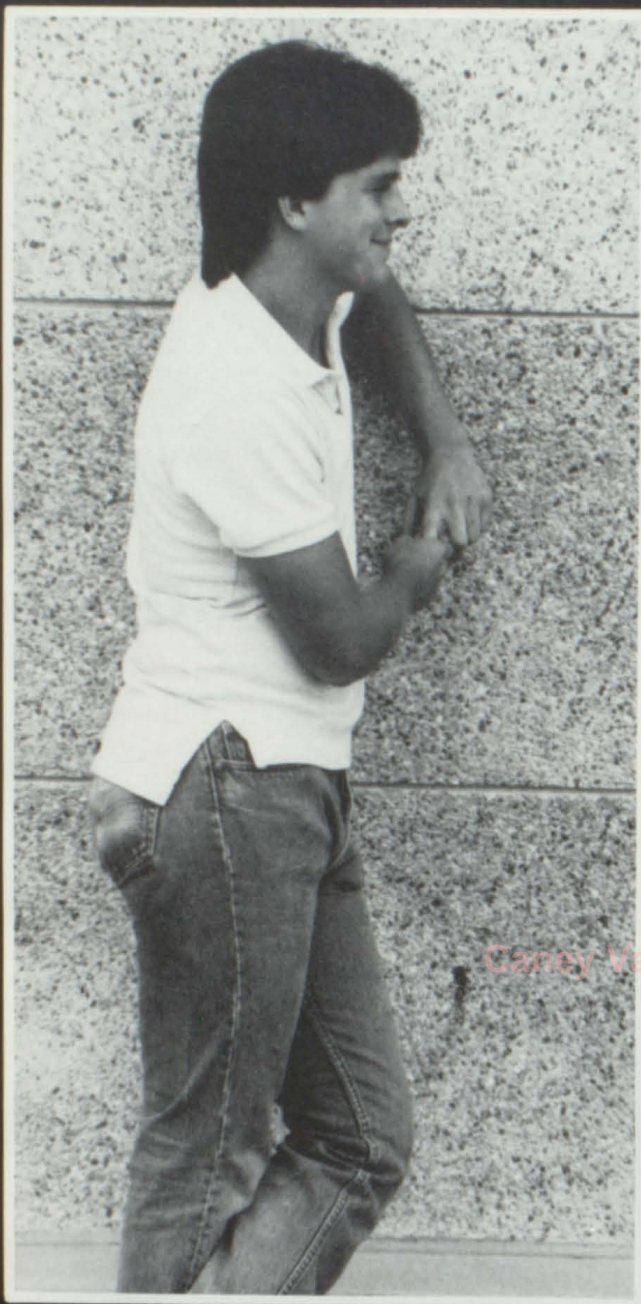

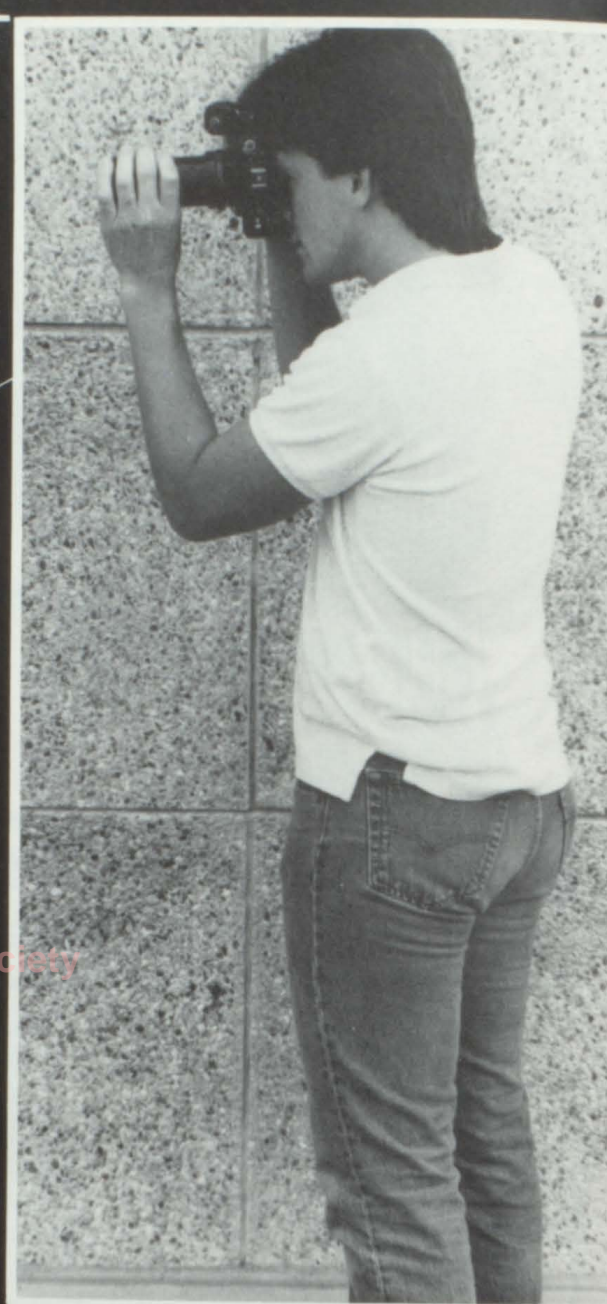
