



THESE STACKS OF LITERATURE and books were removed from the public library here Tuesday by order of Russell Davis, chairman of the library board. Included were a number of copies of "Russia Today," which has been criticized as unsuitable reading for children. The "sequestered" material was stored at Civic Center under lock and key. Davis said the material would be kept for final disposition following the inquiry now under way. Miss Ruth Brown, city librarian, asked Wednesday night about the removal of controversial material from the library, said she had no comment, that all matters pertaining to the operation of the library are in the hands of the board.
