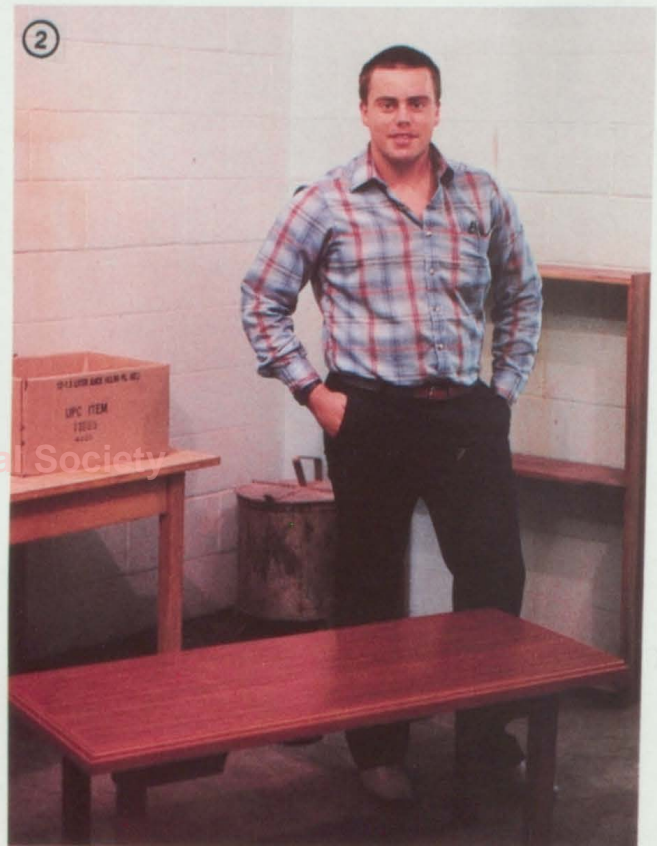

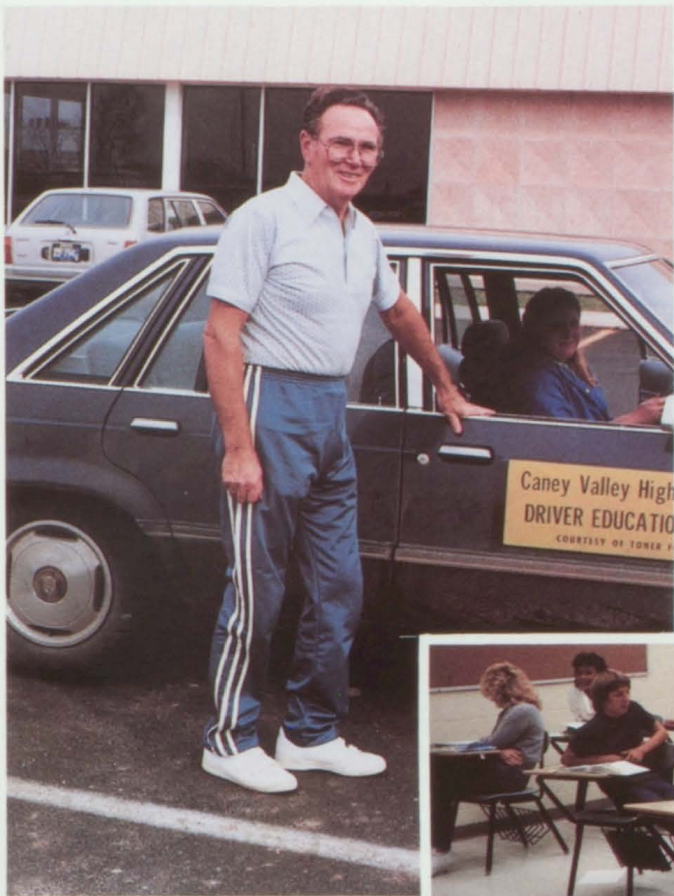

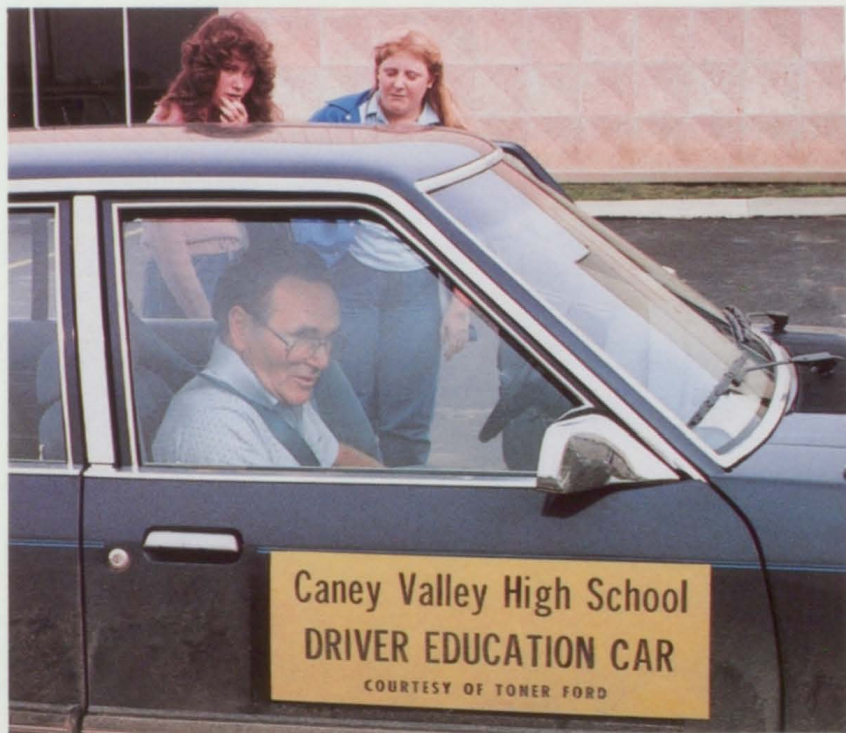

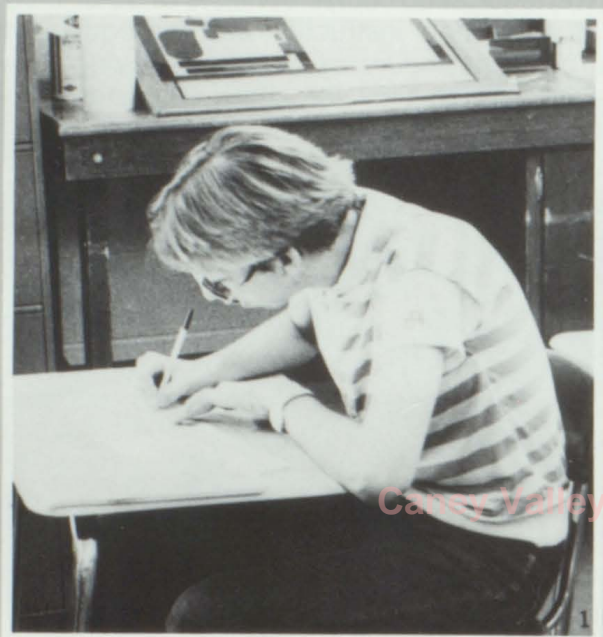

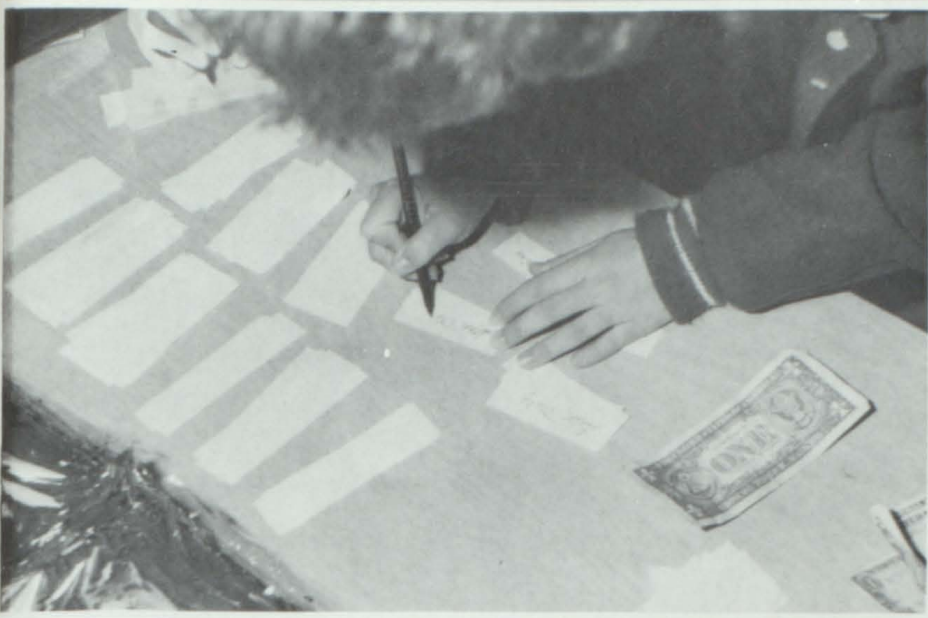
FUTURE BUSINESS LEADERS OF AMERICA (FBLA)

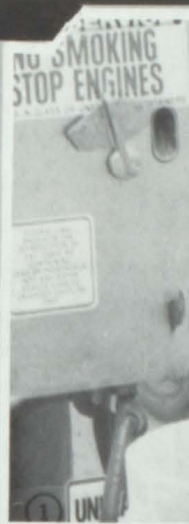

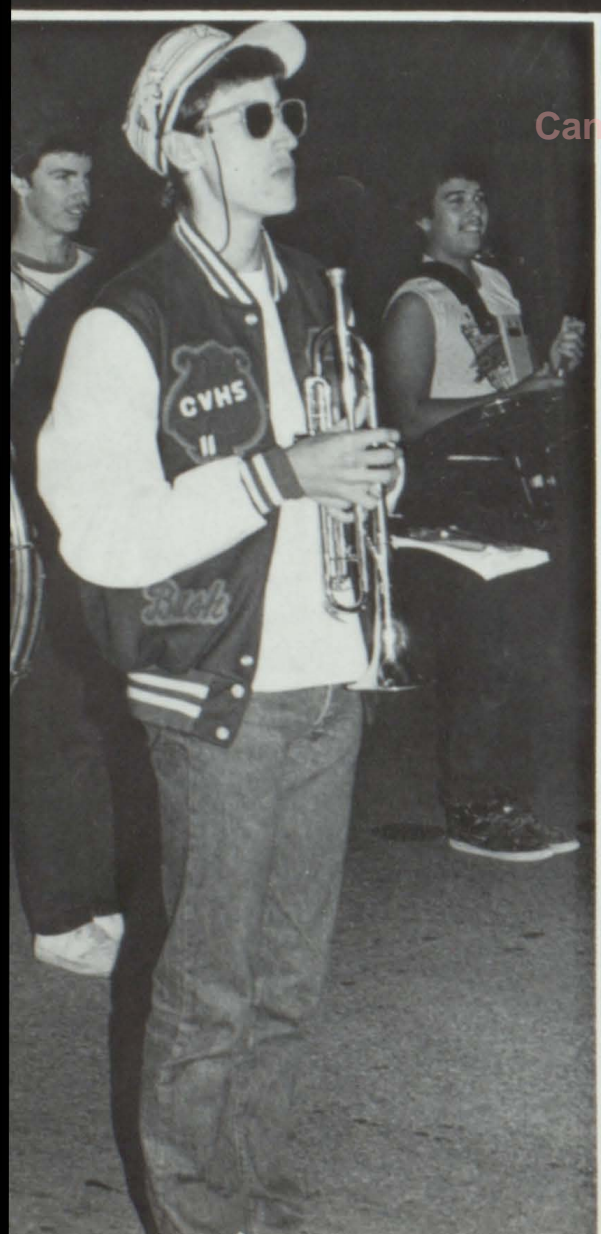

The 1985 marching season for the CVHS band, "The Pride of Caney," was busy, tiring, exciting and rewarding.

Under the first-year direction of CVHS and KU graduate Steve Gordon and the field direction of Junior Cheryle Sanders, the 40 band students and eight flag girls marched at six home football games, performed pre-game entertainment at a Coffeyville Community College football game at Ise Field in Coffeyville, marched in the big Fredonia homecoming parade in October and ended the season in December with Christmas parades in Caney and Coffeyville.

The highlight of the marching season had to be on the first Saturday in November at the Neewollah parade and field competition in Independence. On that day the every-morning, two-hour practice sessions paid off as "The Pride of Caney" received a 1 rating in parade marching. 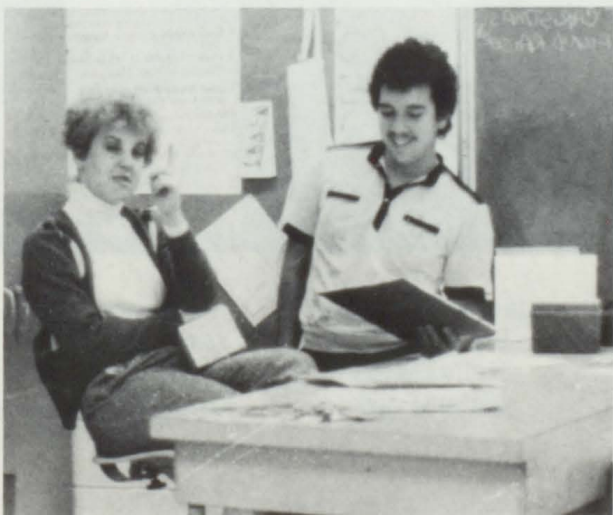

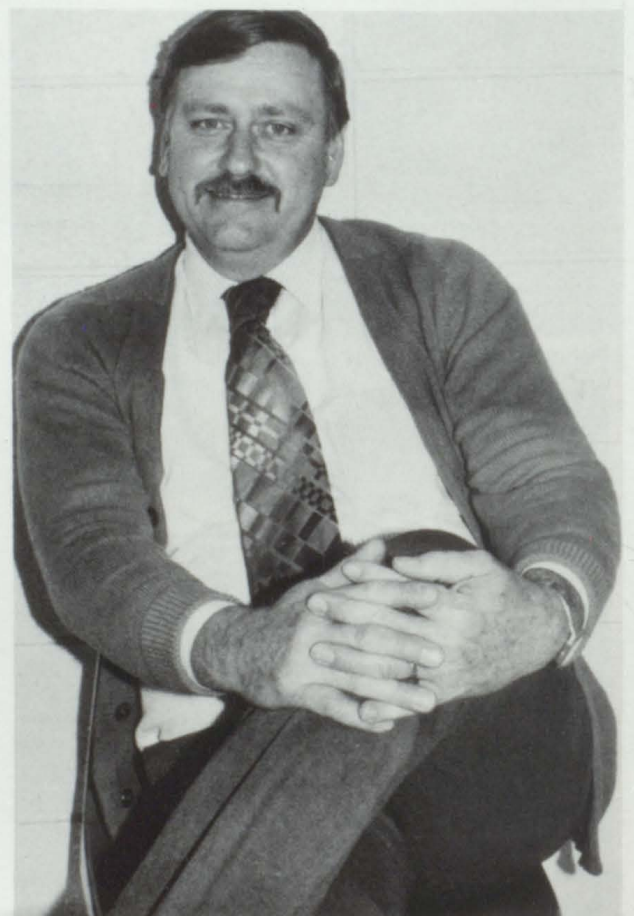

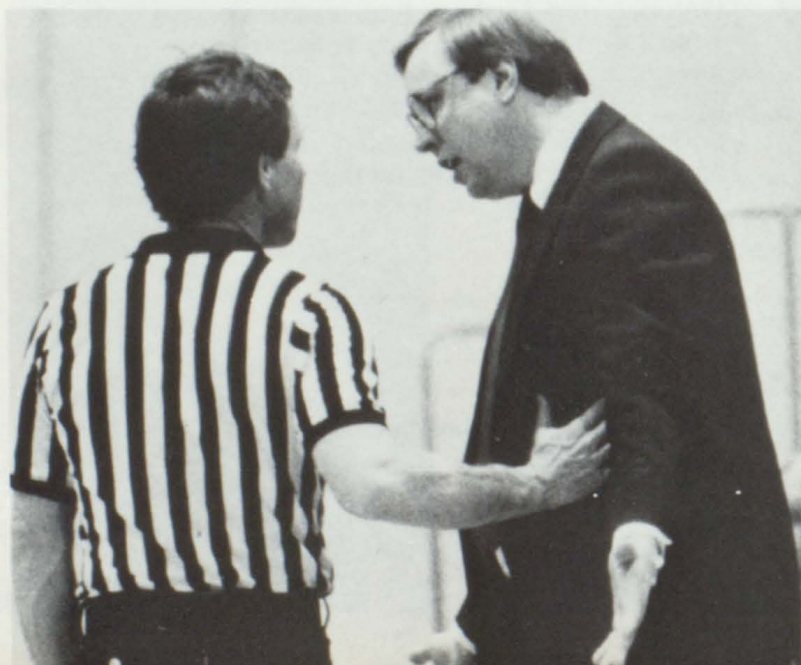

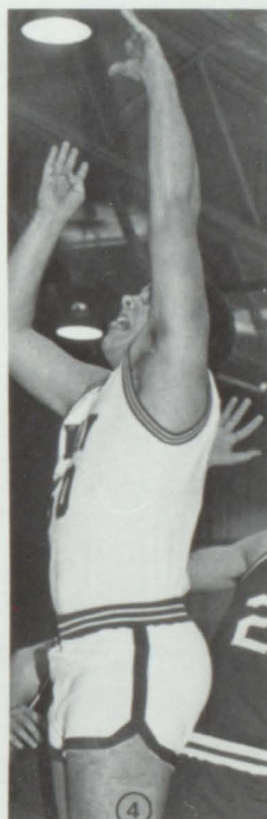

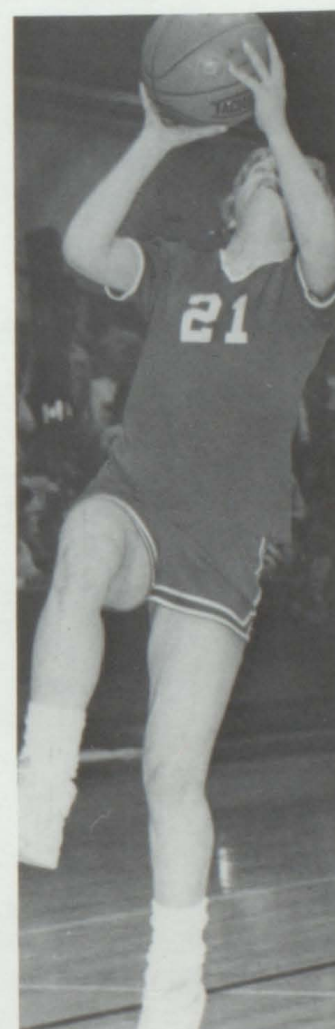

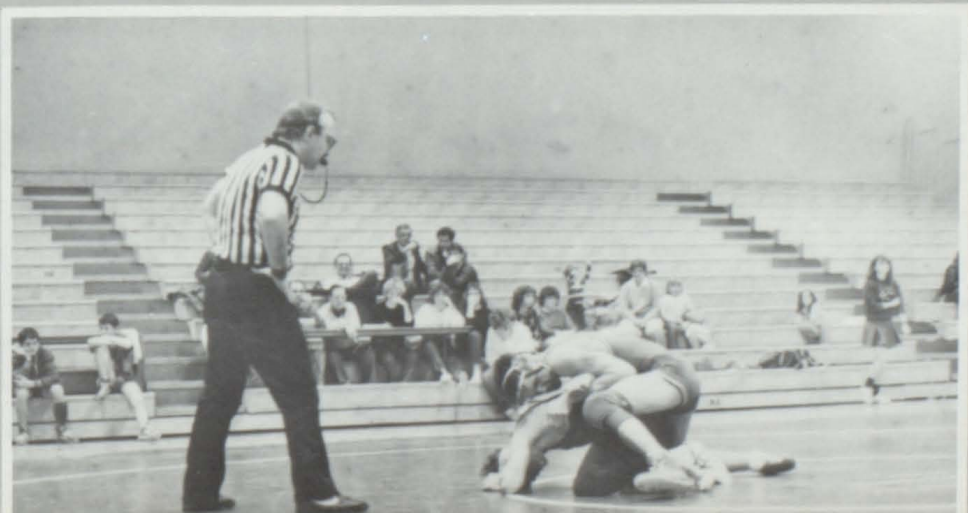

Team establishes some records

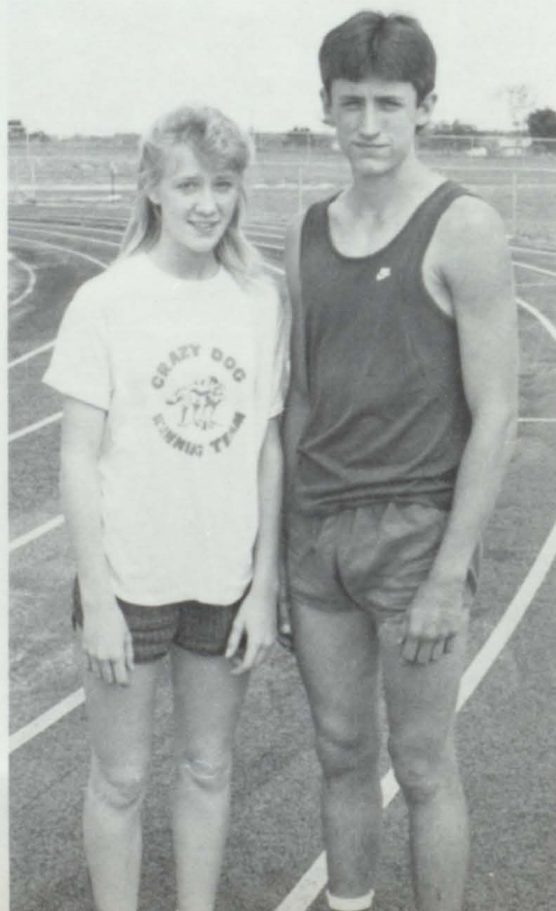

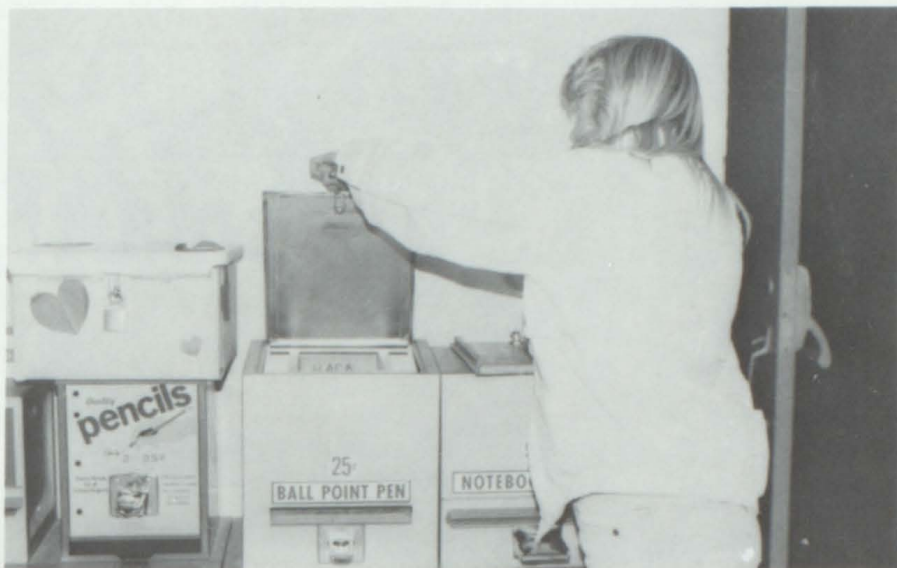

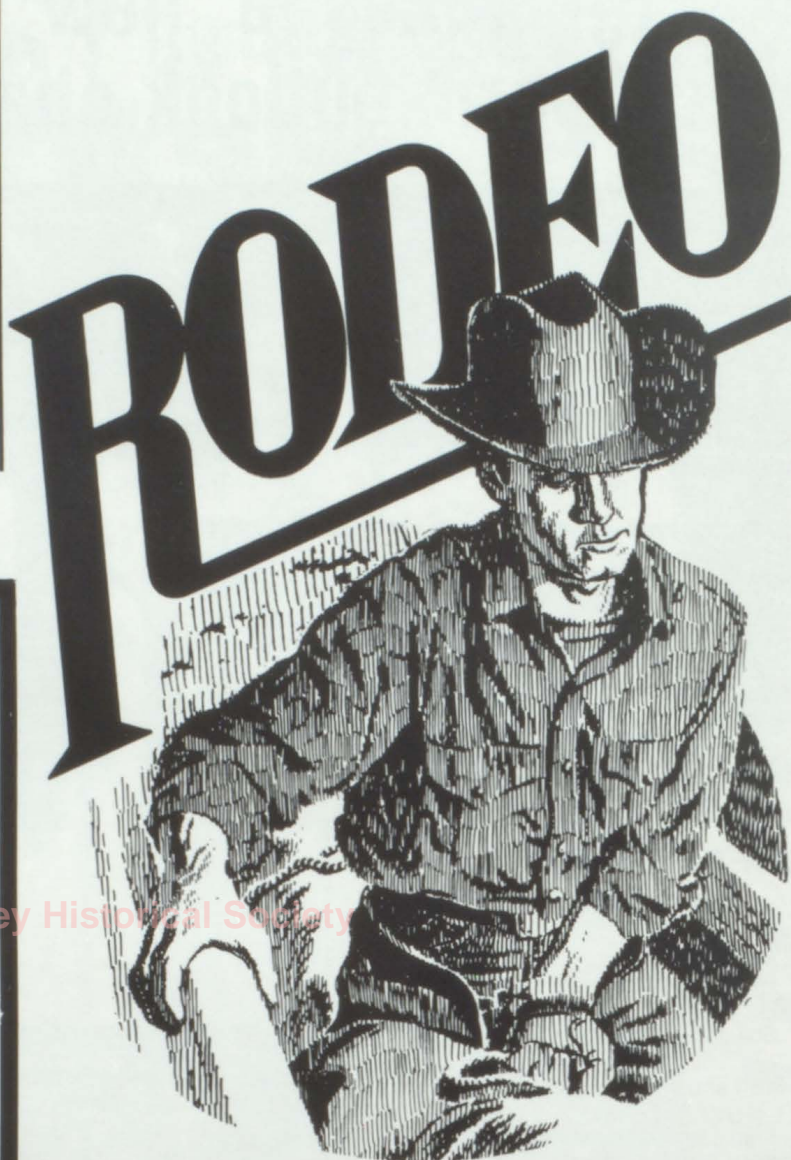

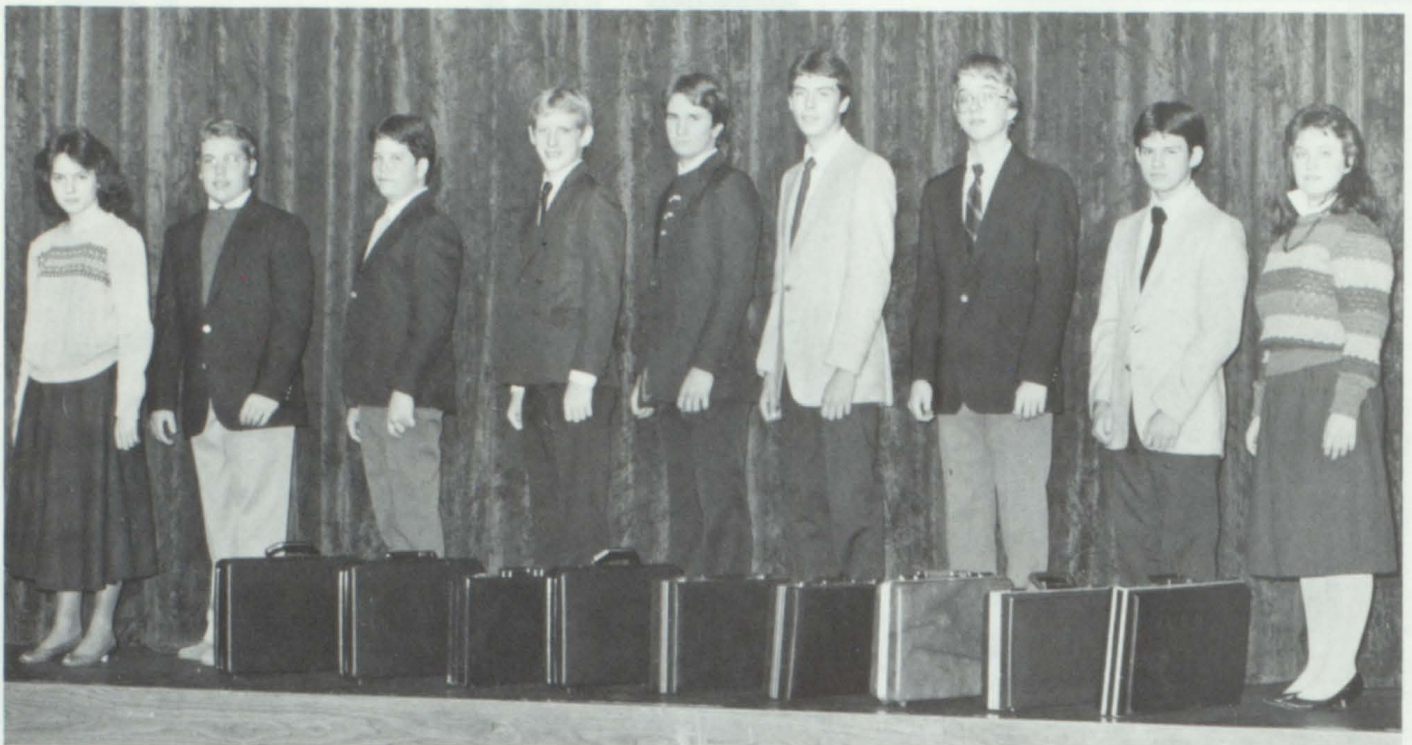

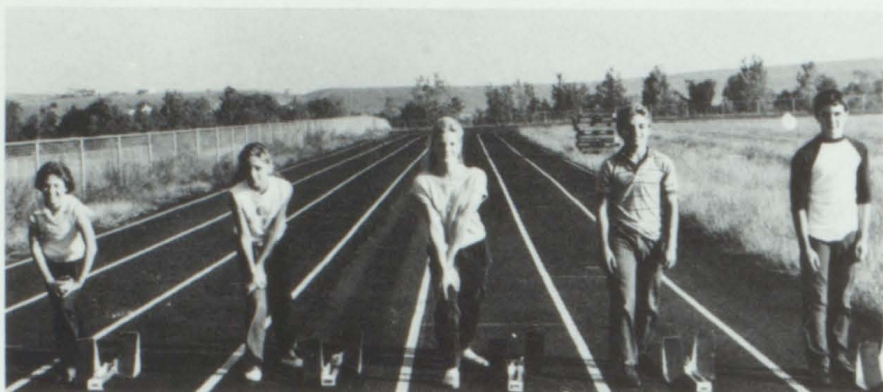

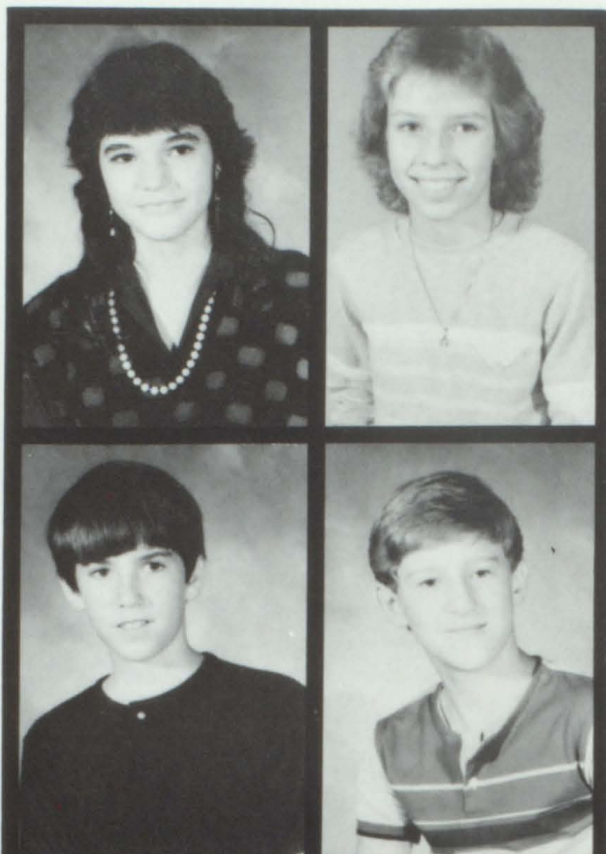

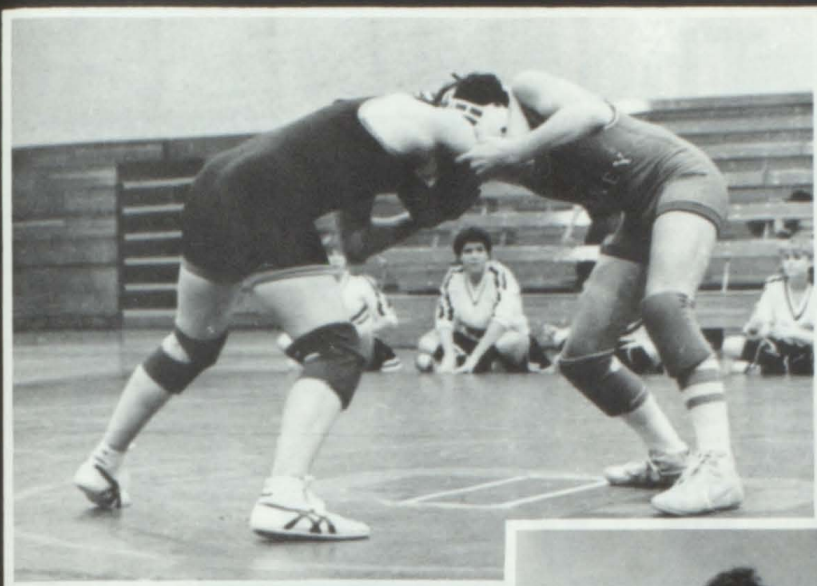

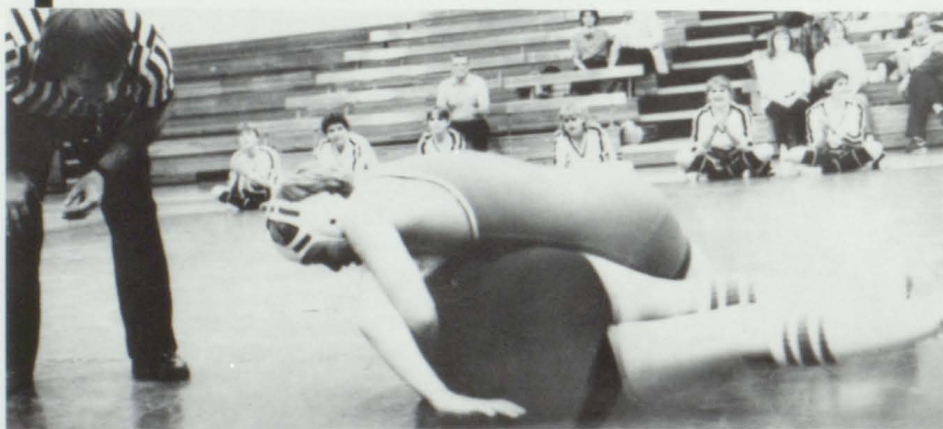
Junior High Wrestling Wrap-Up

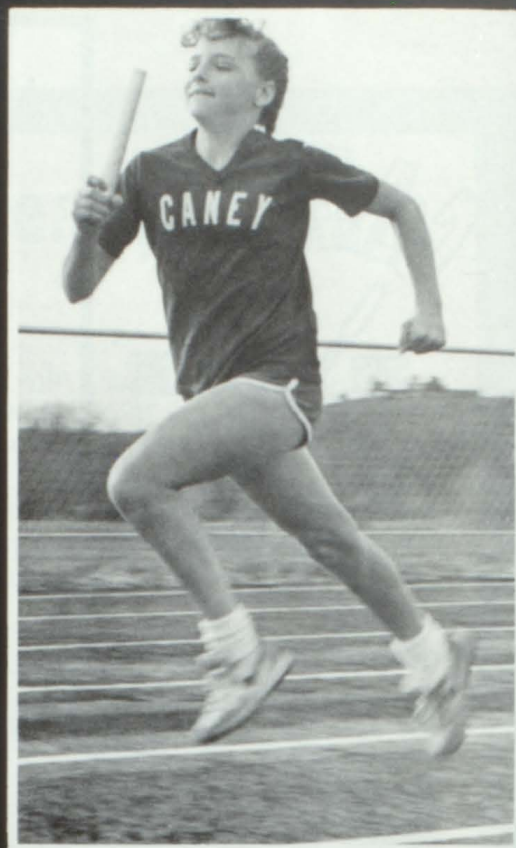


Junior high track team breaks records

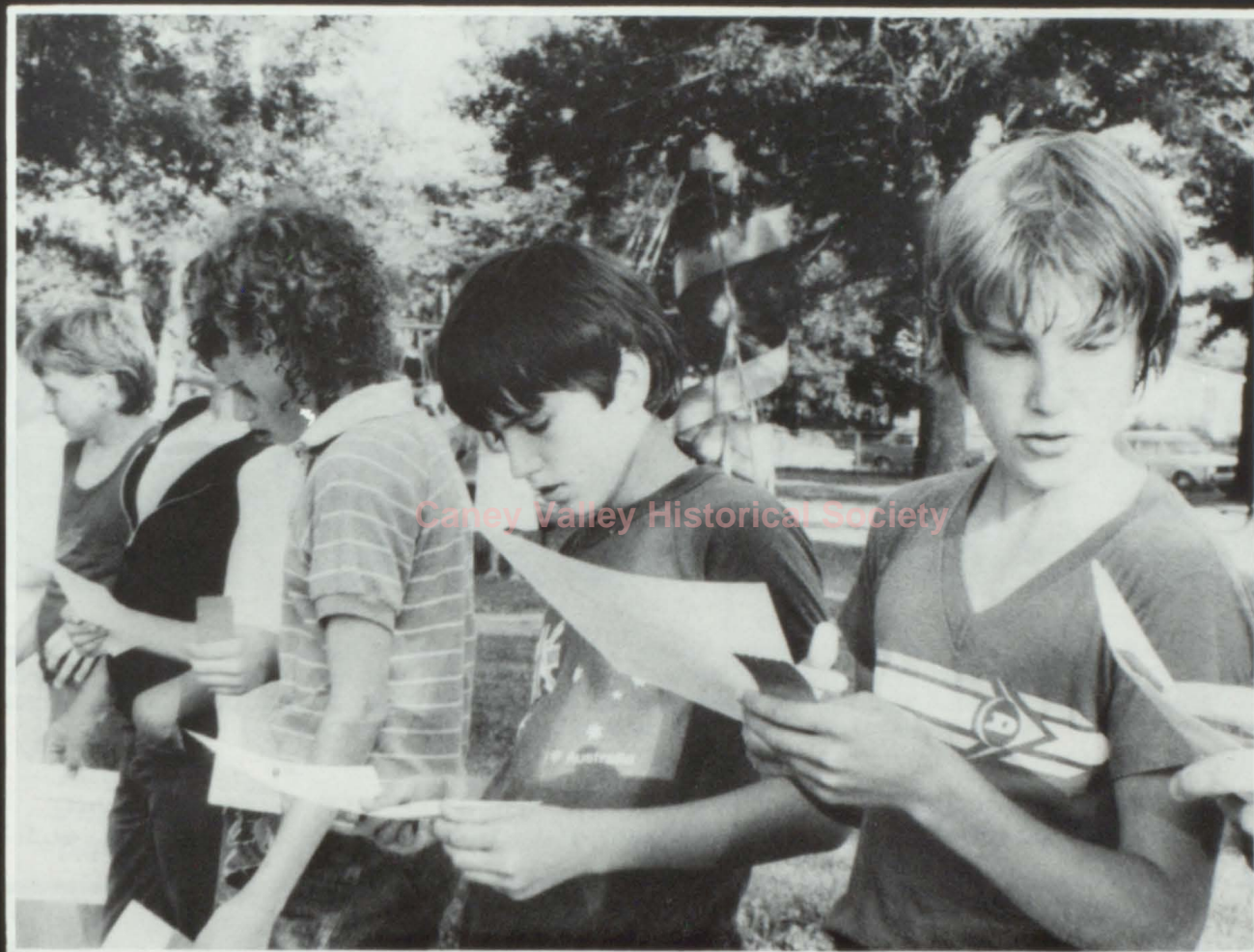
