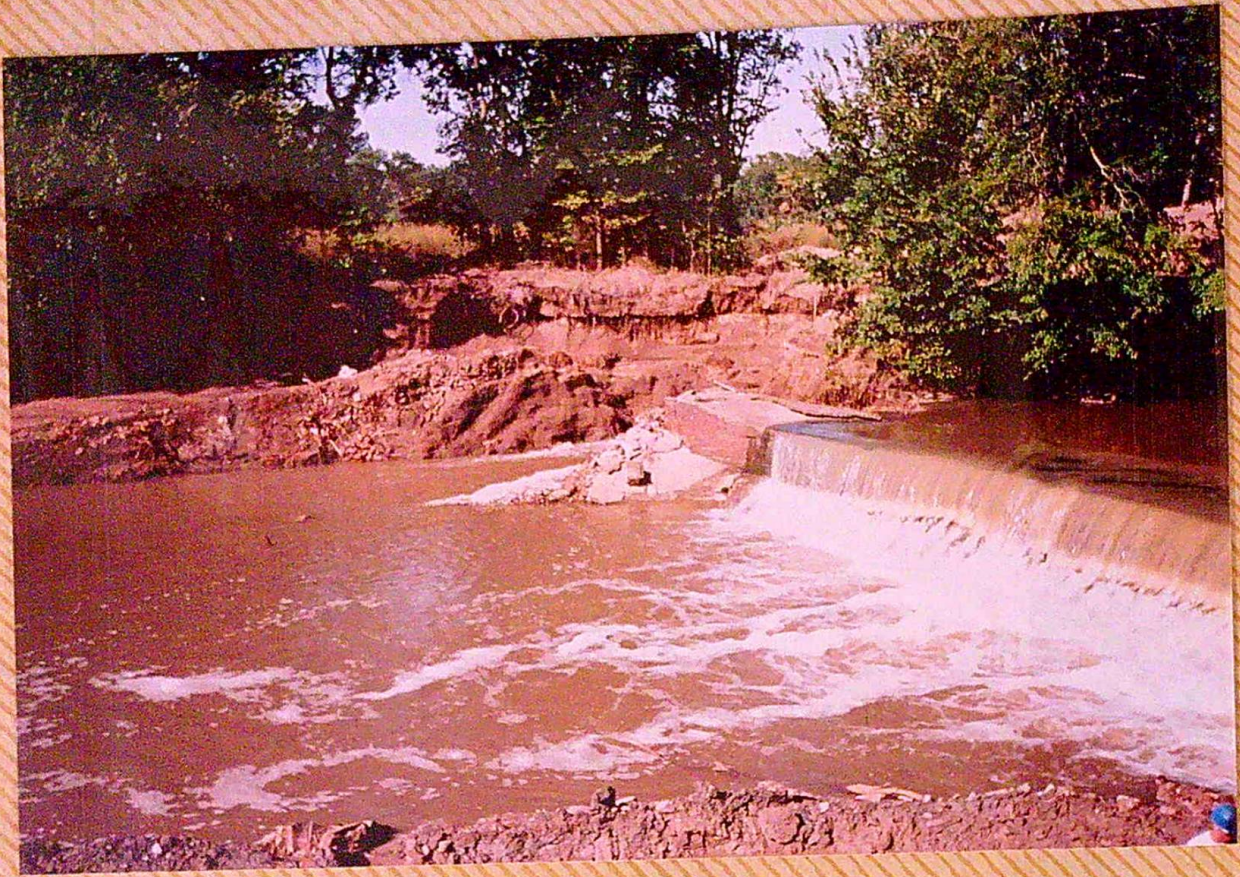




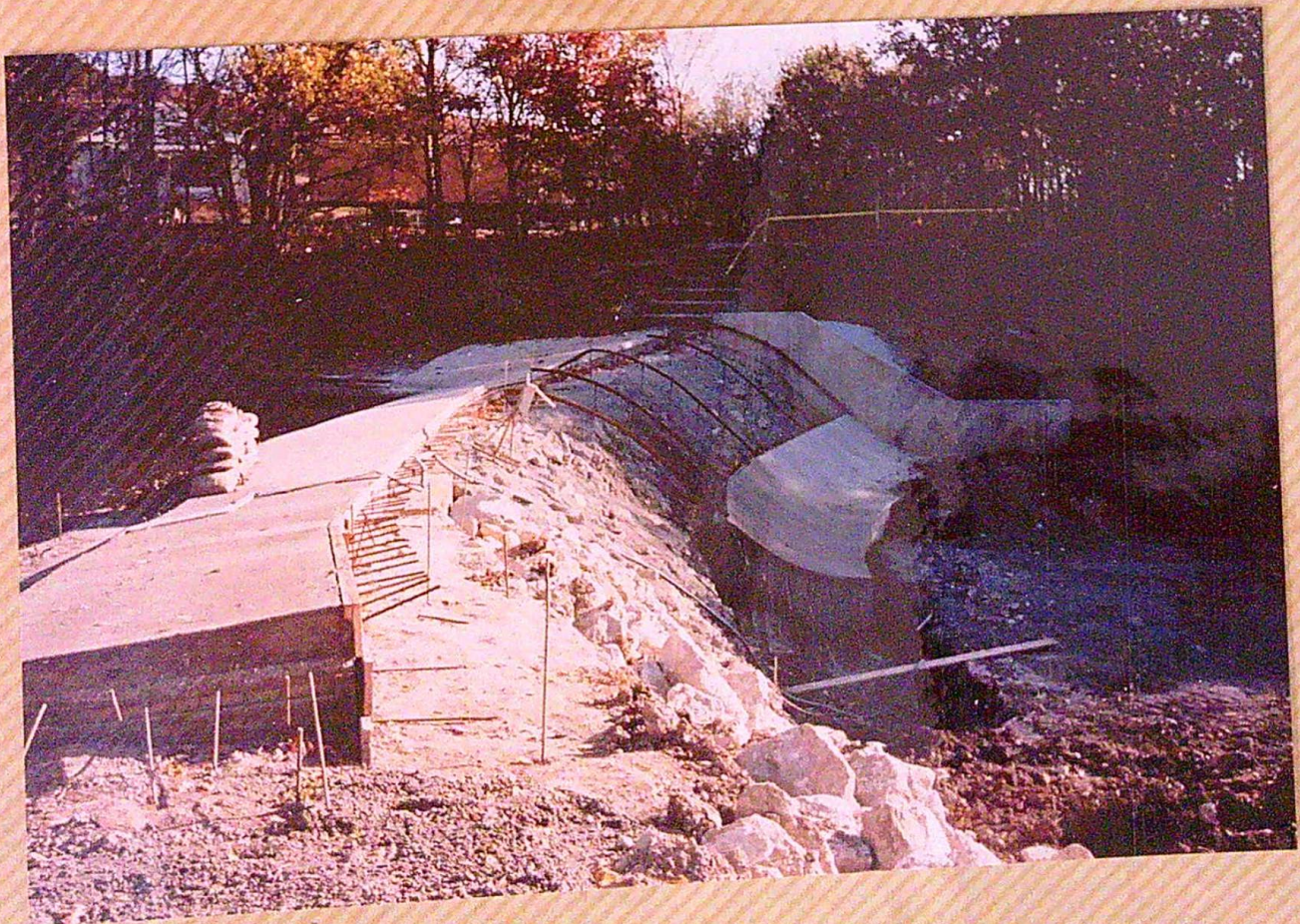
Old Caney City Dam Built In 1911







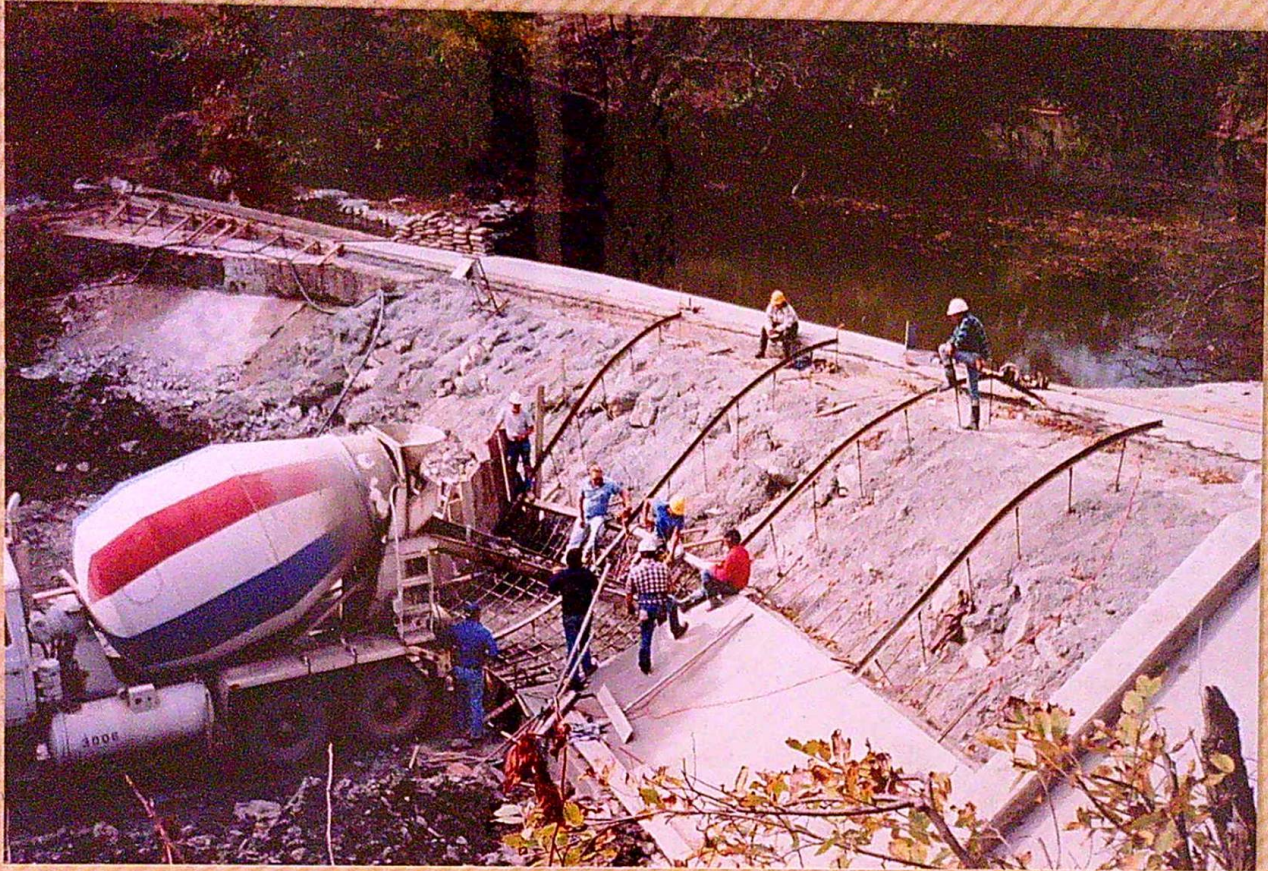
















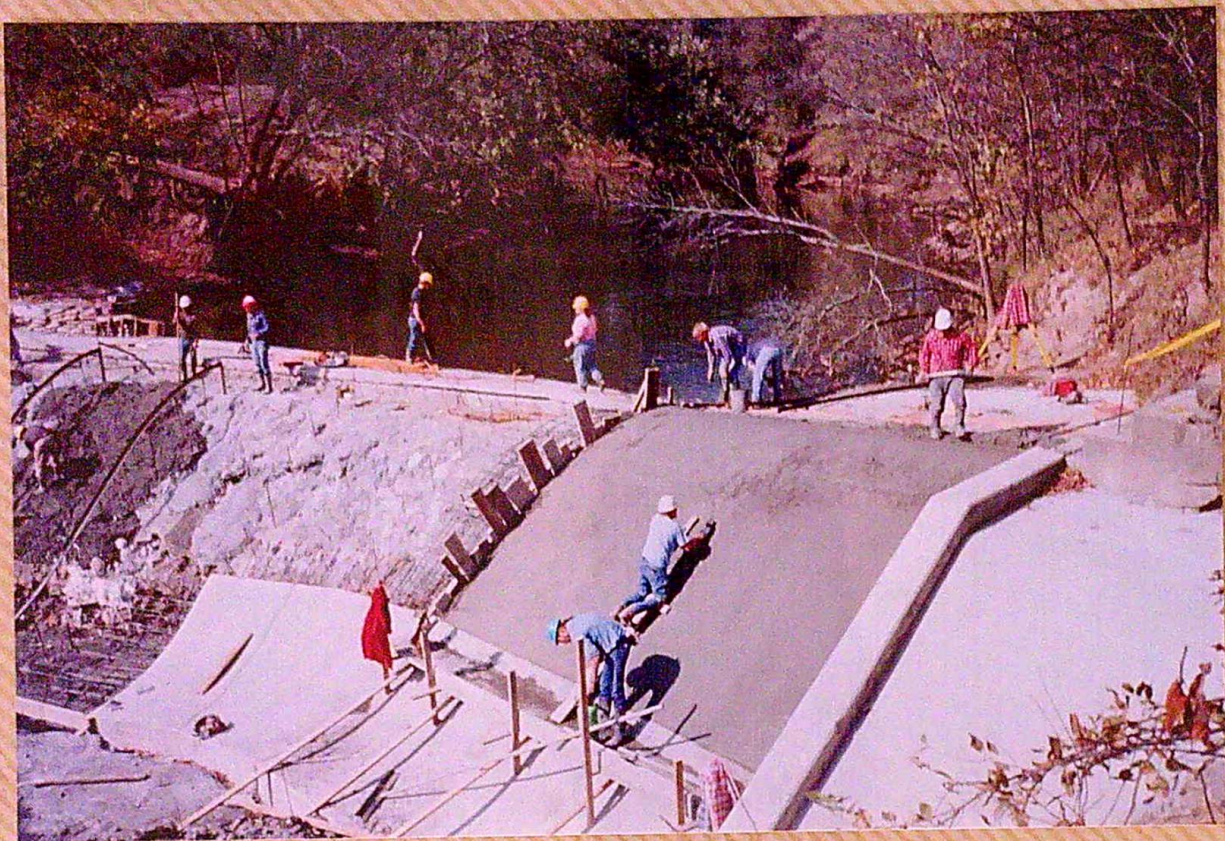
