

college makes visible progress . . .


Progress in higher education is not always as visible as it has been during the past year at Kansas State College of Pittsburg. With a large increase in enrollment, an increase in the size of the faculty, and the construction of two buildings and an addition to another, it has become apparent that the former "teachers college" is growing up.



The Education building, a three-story brick structure costing some \$475,000, is to contain fourteen class rooms, twenty double offices, one main department office, two conference rooms, one curriculum laboratory, one psychology laboratory, a research room, storage room, a faculty lounge, and a student lounge. The building, which is to be the location of the Education and Psychology department, will face south on Cleveland street, ninety-six feet north of the sidewalk, and will extend back for one hundred and twenty-five feet.

The three-story, \$700,000 addition to the Stu-

dent Center will enable the Grill to hold a capacity of four hundred persons in comparison with the present eighty-five person capacity. The addition will also house more student offices and meeting rooms, additional cafeteria conveniences, a small ballroom, additional game areas, more small lounges and dining rooms, a browsing library, a music listening room, more entrances, and the College Book Store. The structure will extend sixty-six feet east of the present building and will bring the size of the Student Center to two hundred and thirty-six feet in length.

The serious student housing problem of recent years will be somewhat reduced with the opening of Nation Hall. The four-story, \$450,000 dormitory will, upon completion, house one hundred and twenty-six women and is being constructed south of East Hall. The building is being named for Odella Nation, former College faculty member.






Opposite page: artist's drawing showing view from the Oval of the addition to the Student Center.

foreword . . .

It was felt that the absence of the faculty from recent KANZAS was unfortunate and that since they are very much a part of the life of the college, they should be represented in the college yearbook.

The "features" section was revived and enlarged in order to more accurately and more interestingly depict the progress of the year. It is our hope that this section will capture the events and the spirit of the past year.

Finally, this is an historic year for the state of

Kansas—her one hundredth birthday. We felt that we should in some way pay tribute to the state and it was this feeling that brought about the division pages in this KANZA. The pictures are as varied as is Kansas. They portray everything from buffalo, which still graze in some areas of the state, to the birthplace of Dwight D. Eisenhower, to an aerial view of the Kansas turnpike. We have combined these photographs in an attempt to depict the many aspects of Kansas' past and present.

We hope that in our efforts to produce a yearbook which will be meaningful to as many people as possible, we have included you.







A baccalaureate dinner was held for graduating seniors and their friends and relatives on June 5, in the Student Center.










new students take tests...




faculty slice watermelon .

The feed was preceded by a performance of the college band.












homecoming is wet but wonderful...





home-game season ends on military night . . .

Dewey Short reviewing troops






Dr. Robert Young



Wednesday afternoon, Rev. George Garrelts, Chaplain of the Catholic Deaf in Minneapolis, Minnesota, offered his definition of "Who Am I?". Rev. Garrelts was ordained in 1942 at St. Paul Seminary. He has served as chaplain at General Hospital in Minneapolis and has been Chaplain of the Catholic Physicians Guild of St. Luke. At present Rev. Garrelts is editor of the Newman Annual. These three days of religious emphasis were directed by two student co-chairmen: Miss Marlene Gmeiner and Miss Carolyn Schelin.


A variety of intramural co-ed sports were offered for Saturday afternoon. At this event many of the campus cuties were thrown into the mud at the college lake.

A mound of dirt, accumulated from diggings for the new Education building, was appropriately tagged by some student who felt the mound resembled an ant hill.





basketball comes to the campus...




TROPHIES GIVEN TO debaters

swimmers win trophies...




Swimming became an important sporting event in the spring semester. At their meets, record-breaking swimmers earned many trophies and awards for the college as well as honor and prestige.





"Life With Father" was first presented at Kansas State College of Pittsburg as the closing production of the Tent-By-The-Lake Summer Playhouse and was the biggest hit of the summer season. It was then repeated for fall audiences Homecoming night, October 29, and again on October 31, November 1, and November 2.

The three-act play is considered the finest comedy written during this century. It opened on November 8, 1939, with one of the authors, Howard Lindsay, playing the title role. It was such a hit that it made Broadway history and it still holds the record for the longest run in the American theatre.

Howard Lindsay and Russel Crouse, the authors of "Life With Father," are two collaborators who have kept the theatre laughing over the last twenty-five years. Together they have turned out more popular hits than any other writing team. In addition to "Life With Father," they are noted for "State of the Union," "Call Me Madam," "The Tall Story," and the current hit, "The Sound of Music."





audiences find “rashomon unusual and thought— provoking

"Rashomon," one of the most unusual plays ever to be produced by the College Theatre, was presented in Carney Hall December 6, 7, 8, and 9.

The drama has a wonderful heritage behind it. It was adapted from two short stories by one of Japan's most prolific writers, Ryunosuke Akutagawa. The movie version was produced in Japan several years ago and received outstanding acclaim in winning the Grand Prix at the International Film Festival in Venice in 1951. The first performance of the play was in New York on January 27, 1959.

The play proved to be an imaginative one. It incorporated a cinematic style of production and wove a magical mood. It transported the audience to ancient Japan and exposed them to an incident as seen through the eyes of four different people, while asking the ageless question, "What is Truth?"








westminster fellowship

Leonard Henry Axe, President of Kansas State College of Pittsburg, has lead an active life as an educator and administrator. He is a native of Kansas and holds four degrees: a bachelor of arts from Baker University; a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Kansas; a Doctor of Science of Law from the University of Michigan; and a Doctor of Laws from Baker University.

Dr. Axe began his career as an educator as a high school teacher in Council Grove, Kansas. He later became a Professor of Business Administration at the University of Kansas and, in 1947, became the Dean of the School of Business at the University. While on leave of absence from the University, he organized and was director of the State Department of Administration.

On July 1, 1957, Dr. Axe became President of Kansas State College of Pittsburg, and is now in

his fourth year in this position.

President Axe has served as a member of the Conference on Business Management in Turin, Italy; as Representative of the International Cooperation Administration; as Representative of the European Productivity Agency, Paris; as originator of Executive Development Program, School of Business, University of Kansas; and as Vice President of the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business.

Some of President Axe's non-professional activities include membership in Rotary; Phi Delta Phi; Kappa Sigma; Order of the Coif; Beta Gamma Sigma; and "Who's Who in America."

He is the author of "Business Law, Text and Case Book," "Aviation Insurance," which was prepared for the Insurance Institute of America; and he has had several articles in the Michigan Law Review.

David Donald Moore was born in Mazomanie, Wisconsin, on April 10, 1906. He received his Bachelor of Education degree from La Crosse State College in 1928, and his Master of Philosophy Degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1932. He married Arabelle Klein on August 26, 1936, at Cochrane, Wisconsin.

Before coming to the College in 1941, "Prof" was instructor of English and speech in several high schools, and he was also an assistant professor at State Teachers College, Weatherford, Oklahoma. Here at the College he taught oral interpretation, play production, stagecraft, phonetics, voice and diction, speech, and contemporary drama. In addition, he served as director of the College Theatre and it was in this position that he produced and directed such plays as "The Heiress," "Sabrina Fair," "Janus," "The Fourposter," "The Constant Wife,"

"The Circle," "Holiday," and "The Lady's Not For Burning."

Mr. Moore was a member of the First Methodist Church, the Methodist Men's Brotherhood, the Kansas State Speech Association, Theta Alpha Phi, Sinfonia, and National Collegiate Players.

The fifty-four year old assistant professor of language and literature died shortly after three o'clock on Saturday, December 9, in Carney Hall. He was stricken while on his way to view the play "Rashomon," a part of the Language in Action Conference at which he was a discussion leader. He had been ill in 1958, but had improved and had been feeling well since.

Surviving are his wife, two sons, Douglas Washburn Moore and Cameron David Moore, his mother, Mrs. Mina Moore, and a brother, Robert Moore.


All in all, the KANZA Staff has worked hard to produce a yearbook that is different and of a better quality than ever seen before on the Pittsburg campus.
