In regards to the old employes' list which was again referred to me to be taken up with Commissioner Harrigan.

I told the Committee that I would have them present at this hearing. Harrigan was supposed to notify me when Davidson could appear. I depended upon getting this notification in ample time for me to get the Committee. Mr. Harrigan, on Saturday the 14th, called up and told me that Davidson was in his office and waiting, and I didn't have time to get the mine committee.

However, I took the question up again, and Davidson again agreed to carry out our former agreement. The Operators' Commissioner gave me his word of honor and pledged himself to see that Mr. Davidson would do this. Davidson said he thought that all the men had been served on the old employes' list except two, namely, Maxwell and McKewon, and he promised to give these men new places immediately.
