## Football

The Caney High Football team finished a very successful season, starting off by holding the strong Bartlesville Wildcats to a 12-0 score.

The first league contest was with Grenola, resulting in a 6-6 tie. The Bullpups finished the league schedule undefeated, and won the championship. The critical game was with Moline, which the Bullpups won by a score of 12-7.

The Bullpups placed Roberds, Irick, Price, and Cushenberry on the first All League team. Cushenberry was elected All League captain by receiving the unanimous vote of all the coaches of the League. W. F. Jack was given left-tackle position on the second team. Coltharp and Mattix, fighting Bullpup guard and half-back, respectively, were awarded honorable mention.

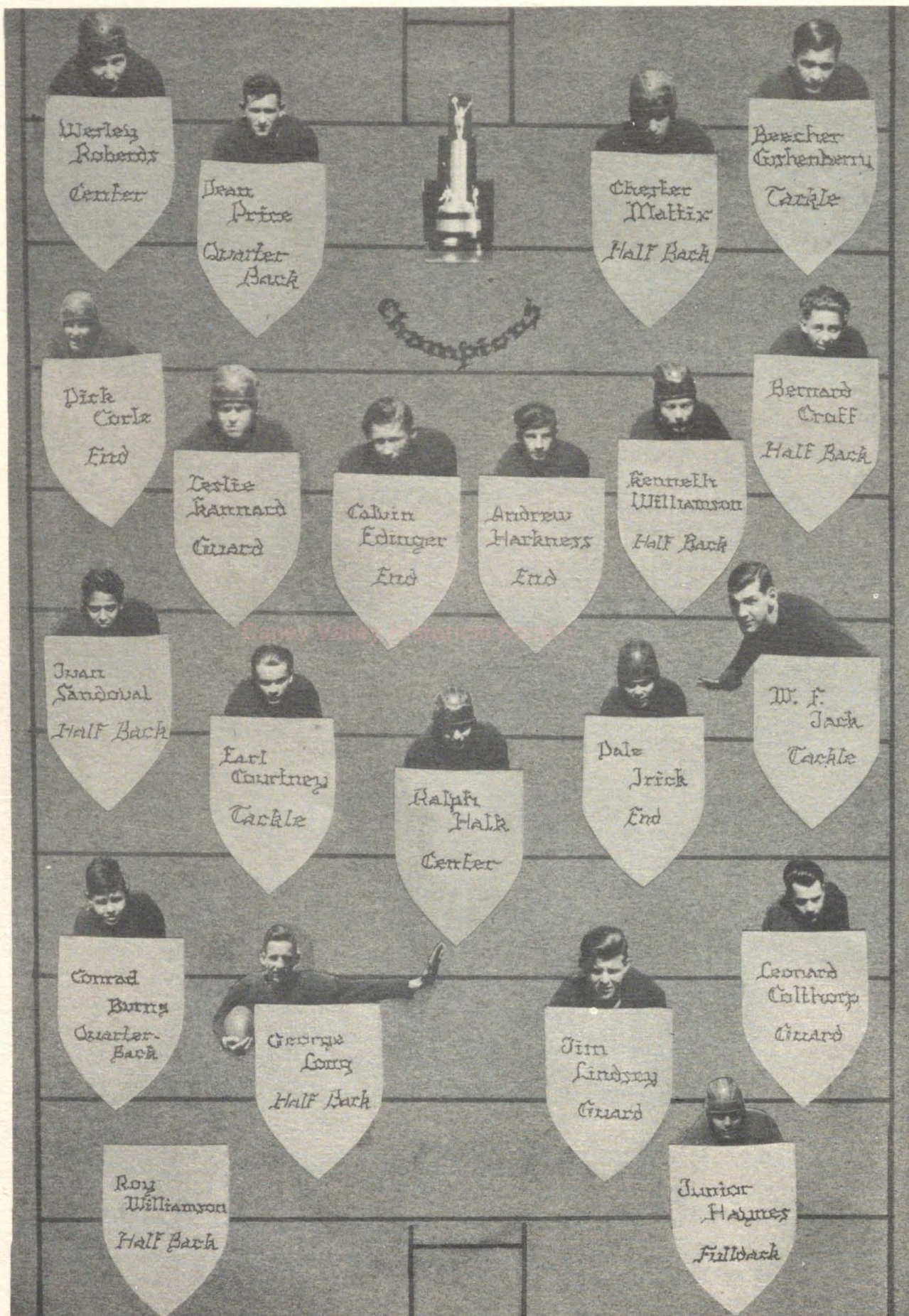

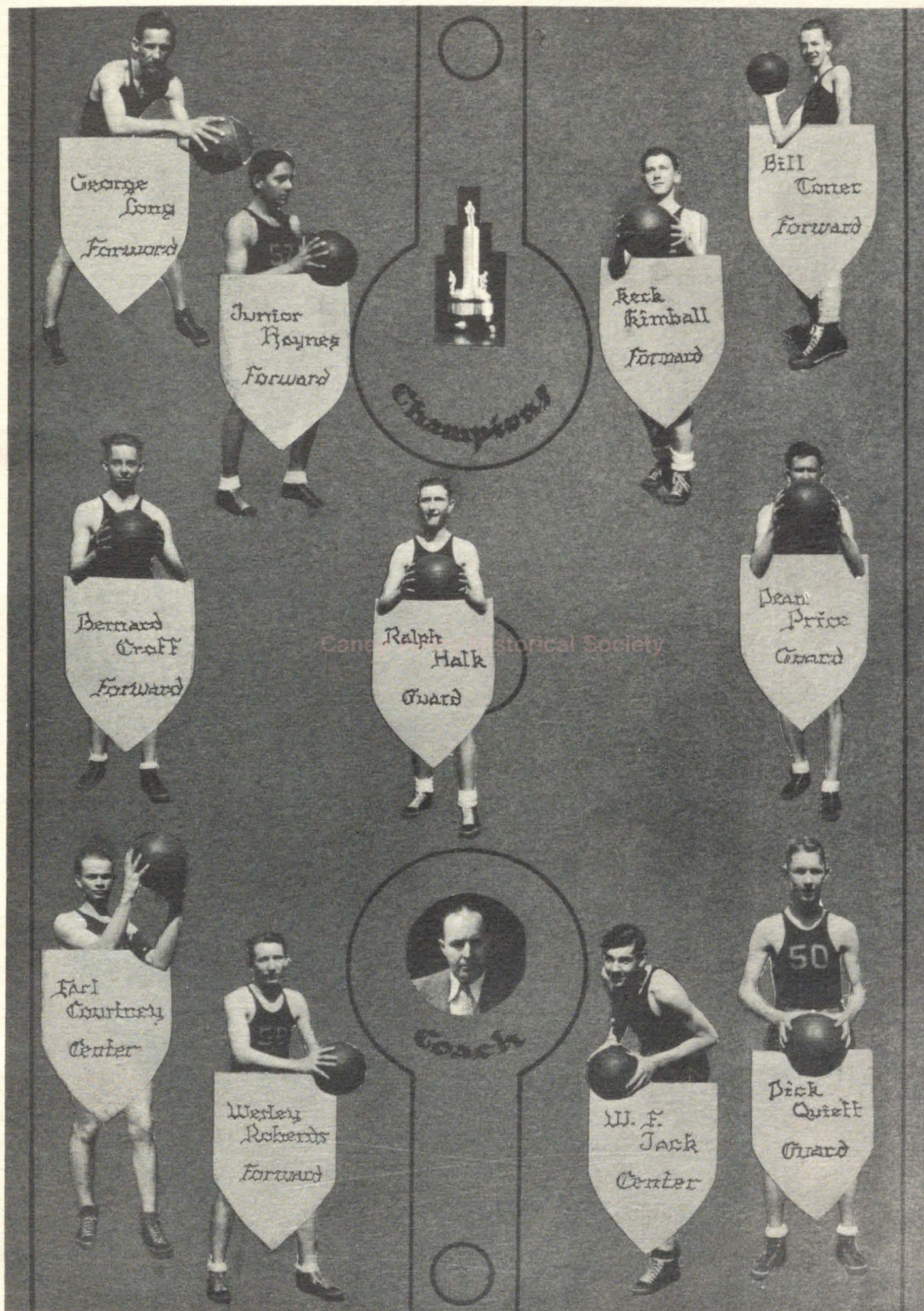

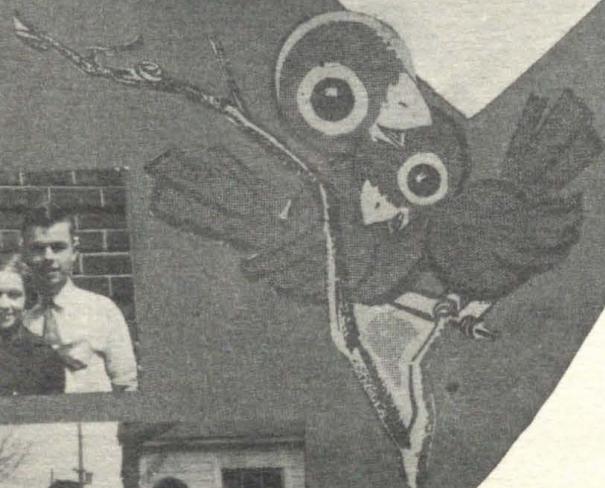
