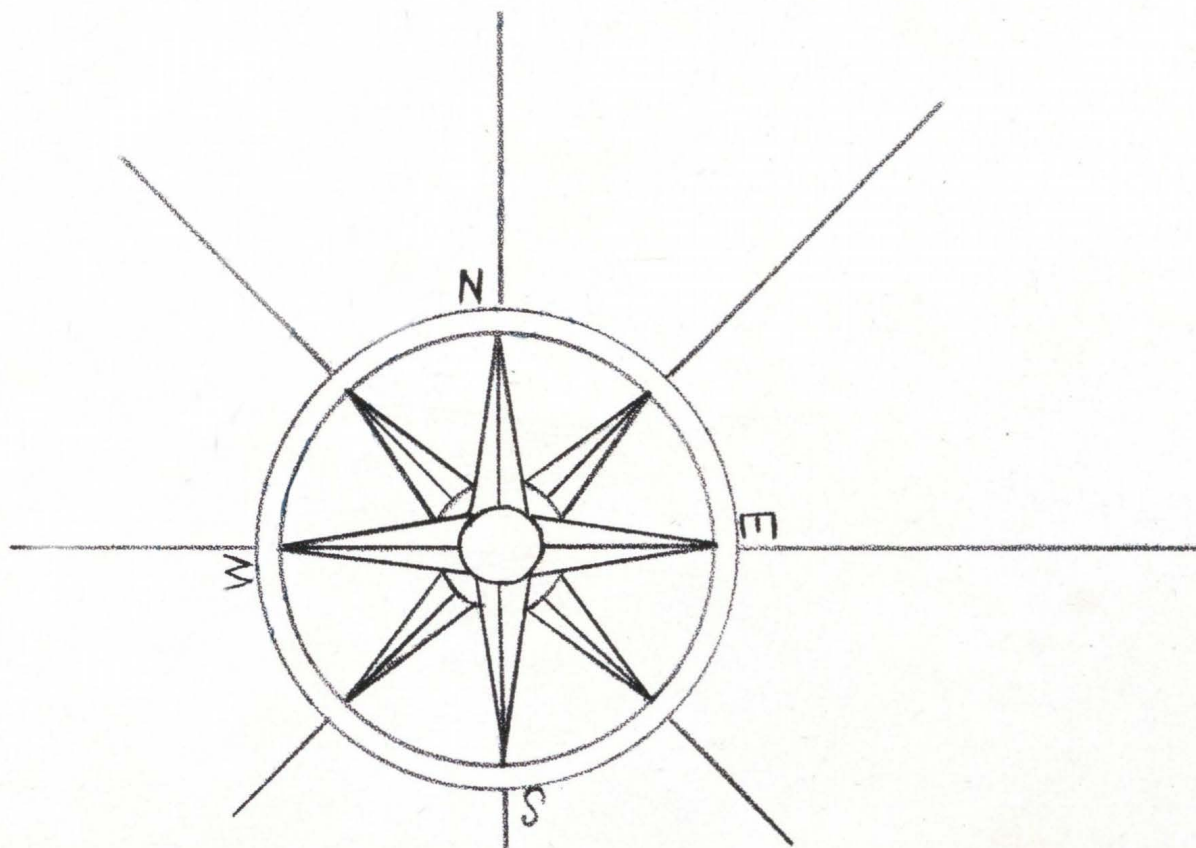
A constitution was adopted, and regular meetings were held throughout the year. It is hoped that the Student Council will always be an important feature of Caney High.

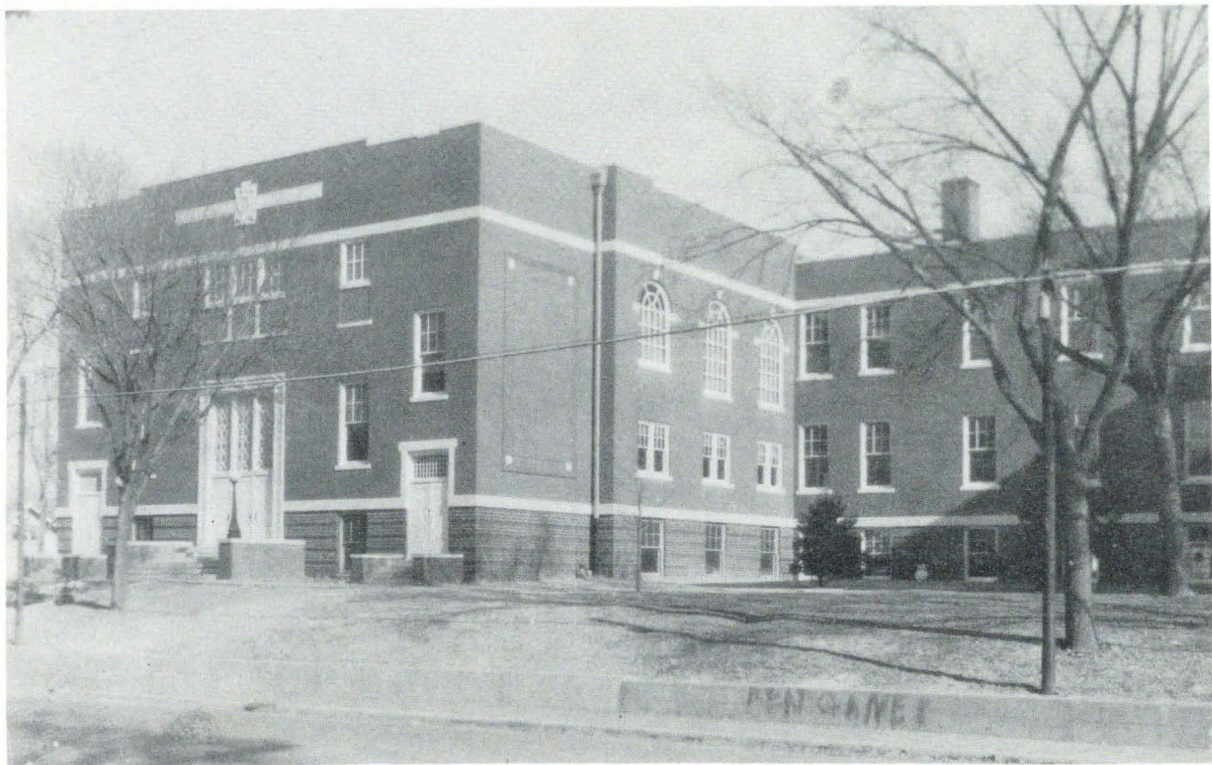

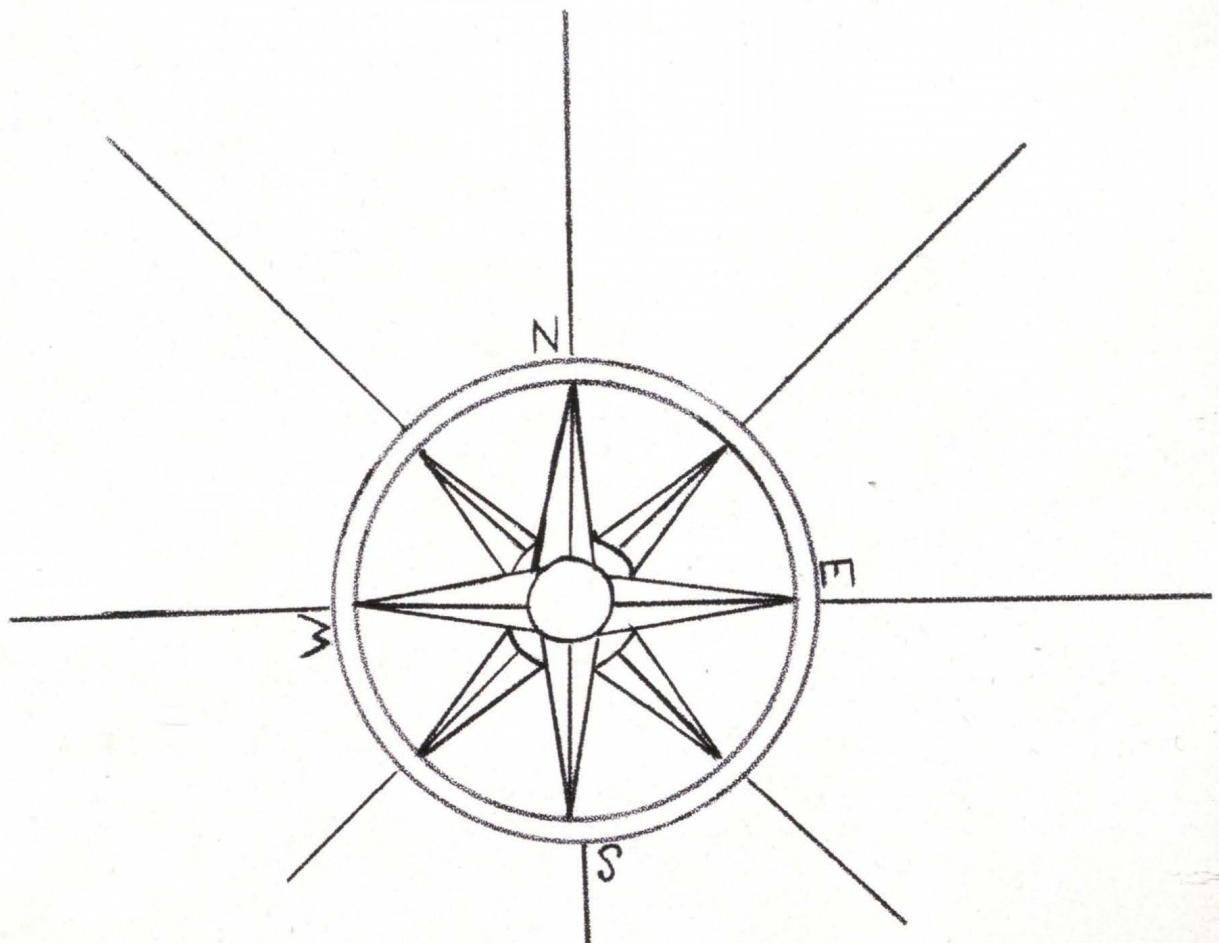

On October 12, 1921, the first issue of the Nakenak was published by the students of Caney High School.

In naming the newspaper no name suggested seemed equal to "Kane Kan" but they did not want two "KaneKans" so a happy thought from a member of the school, Lorenzo Lambillotte, suggested the reverse of the familiar and favorite "Kane Kan" forming the unique and usable title of "Nakenak".

The editor of the first paper was Arthur Mauricecourt and Kenneth McFarland was the associate editor.

The staff hoped to make the paper self-supporting and do this through the patronage of the business people. This idea has been carried out through the nineteen years of its publication.

Throughout the nineteen years the Nakenak has exceeded the expectations of the first staff.

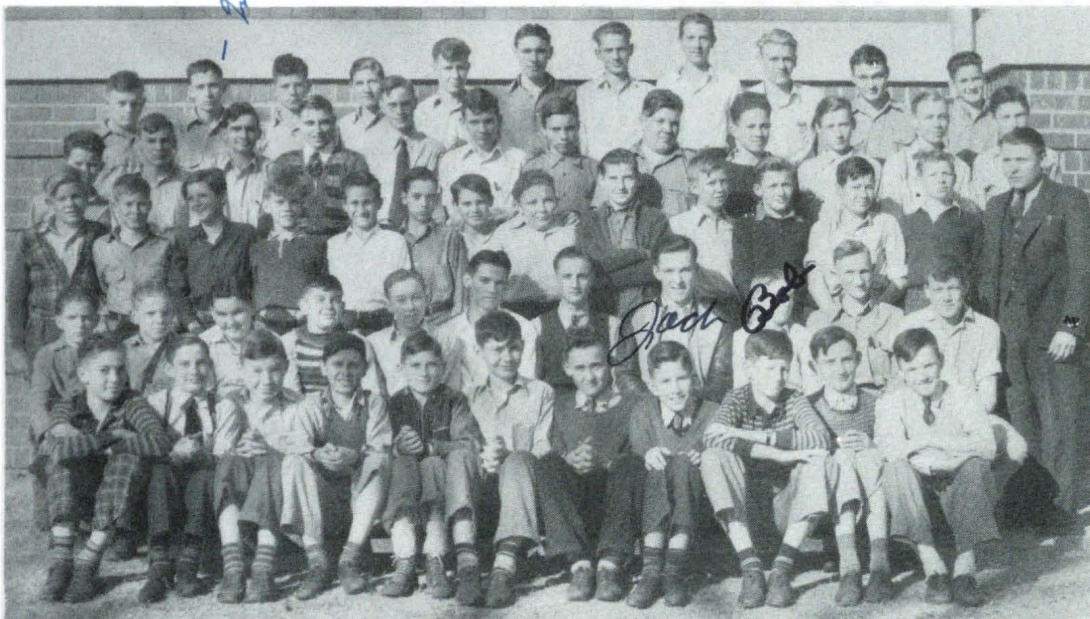

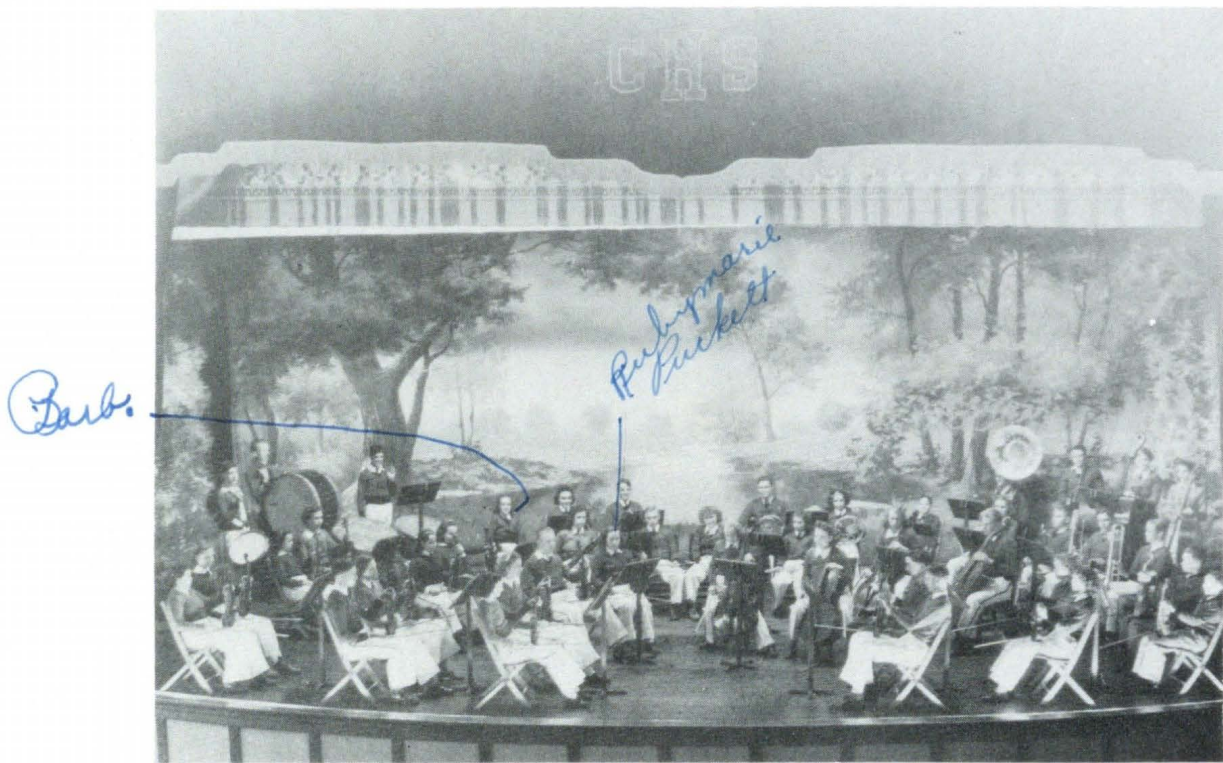

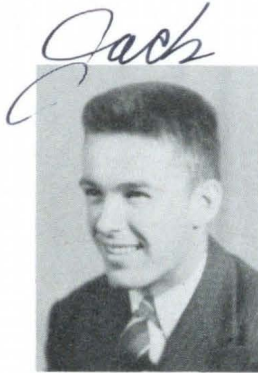

## SENIOR CLASS HISTORY

On September 6, 1937, fifty-six sophomore sailors started out in their first trans-high voyage. Their officers were Raymond McQuillen, Ray Smith, and Gilda Wilson. The admirals of this crew were Miss Gertrude Hunt and Mr. Dave Evans.

The class was well represented in all the various activities of the school. Mabel Chastain was chosen queen of this ship. The band and orchestra rated highly superior at the Tri-State Music Contest at Pittsburg in which many sophomores were members.



On September 5, 1938, the Juniors launched their new ship with fifty-nine members on board. The crew chose James Wilson as president; Robert Graves, vice-president; Mary Ellen Wemmer, secretary; and Shirley Carinder, treasurer. In January, one of the Junior admirals, Miss Hunt, advanced further toward success by obtaining a better position, but the class was fortunate in obtaining another very capable admiral, Miss Dorothy Coldwell.

The most important event of the year was on April 21, when the Juniors entertained the class of nineteen thirty-nine with the annual Junior-Senior banquet. The Pirate motif was carried out in the table decorations, favors and place cards. After the banquet, the tables were cleared away and dancing followed to the music of Bob Slater and his orchestra.

The editors of the school paper, the Nakenak, were Gilda Wilson and Bob Webber.

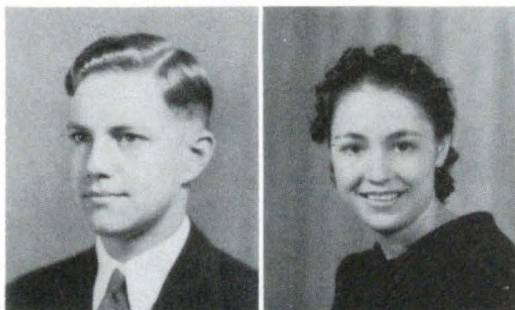
