


BIOLOGY

The Biology department receives many research grants for graduate students and professors. This year, the department is working with six \$400.00 stipends for undergraduate research.

The Kansas State College Biology department offers a series of pre-professional degrees, ranging from pre-medical to pre-forestry. Most of these are two year courses. They also offer a Master of Science in Biology or Natural Science.

This department is staffed with eleven professors and operates in ten lab rooms. In addition to the lab rooms, which are well equipped for a smaller college, they have a seventy-acre field lab.

Business Administration is the most rapidly growing field in the midwest. Degrees are offered in the various phases of business—such as accounting, marketing, office administration, and business administration-liberal arts.


Chapters of various national professional business organizations are available for majors and minors in the KSC business department. They include: Alpha Kappa Psi, professional business fraternity for men; Pi Omega Pi, national honorary business education fraternity; Phi Beta Lambda, international future business leaders of America; Society for the Advancement of Management; and the National Collegiate Secretaries Association.

As a service to the area, the department sponsors short-term seminars and conferences for business, industrial and teacher organizations. Members of the teaching staff frequently serve as discussion leaders for these events.

The "trial and error" method isn't always the best way to research a project, as any chemistry student will testify. All experiments are calculated and theorized before they are ever tried.



The departmental organization is the Student Affiliate of the American Chemical Society which is associated with the National Chemistry Society.



EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

For all students preparing to teach at the elementary or secondary level, the department provides a sequence of courses in psychology and professional education. Included is an entire semester devoted to professional training, related laboratory experiences, and off-campus student teaching. The experiences provided in the laboratory schools include observation and participation by individuals and small groups and demonstration teaching for larger groups.

The elementary and secondary laboratory schools are organized in two buildings: the Horace Mann School, housing the kindergarten and grades one through six; the College High School, a six-year high school, spanning grades seven through twelve.

The professional semester is an entire semester devoted to professional education, consisting of intensive course work and related professional laboratory experiences, including supervised teaching. During the off-campus period, the student is expected to devote full time throughout each week in school and community to the same extent as does the teacher on the job.

The semester's work is divided into three periods. The first consists of approximately seven weeks of intensive course work and pre-student teaching laboratory experiences. The second period of about seven weeks is devoted to experiencing the full-time job of the teacher in school and community.

The Home Economics Department offers the degrees of Bachelor of Science in Education in Home Economics and Bachelor of Science in Home Economics. Under the education degree, students are enabled to meet the requirements for several vocations other than teaching, such as extension services, business, research, and homemaking.

Scholarships are offered by Phi Upsilon Omicron, the professional honorary fraternity, and the Home Economics chapter, a branch of the American Home Economics Association.

The Home Economics department controls the Home Management House, which provides unique opportunities in that it offers the students "real life" living conditions.

HOME ECONOMICS

The objective of the Home Economics department is to prepare women to enter careers devoted to improving the lives of families and individuals. A large majority of the students of this department prepare to teach home economics in secondary school.

Professional activities carried on by the students include: aiding with the recruitment of new students by talking with groups in hometown high schools during vacation; participation in the activities of the State Home Economics Chapter; and by initiating freshmen into the department by means of a "Big Sister" plan which begins with letters of welcome written to incoming students during the summer previous to their enrollment.

The KSC printing department is one of the best-equipped in the United States. With the use of the new automatic bindery, printing is done much faster and easier. Most of the college publications and printed materials, such as the Collegio and the Grill menus are printed by the college department. The department has both the hot type and the linotype printing machines.

In the undergraduate division, the department offers the degrees of Bachelor of Science in Education, Bachelor of Science in Trade and Industrial Education, Bachelor of Science in Industrial Technology, two-year Technical curriculum, Industrial Arts Education teaching minor, and Industrial Technology minor. For graduates, they offer degrees in Specialist in Education, Master of Science with a Major in Industrial Education, and Master of Science with a Major in Trade and Industrial Education.

ART

The Industrial Arts department offers degrees in art education, specialized art, commercial art, and a minor in art education. Both the education and specialized degrees require a senior exhibit. This exhibit may be located in any faculty approved location. The exhibit must be in the major field of the student, such as painting or sculpturing. The student usually exhibits his paintings or articles for at least one week.

Mr. Wooster, of the KSC art department, created our contemporary "Gus," which is located in front of the Student Center. "Gus" is now made of fiberglass, but will later be cast of bronze. "Gus" was a gift to the college from the Senior Class of 1965.

Kappa Pi, the honorary art organization, is sponsored by the art department. This organization is open to all art majors and minors.



LANGUAGE & LITERATURE

The Language and Literature department provides both liberal arts instruction for the Bachelor of Arts degrees and teacher preparation for the Bachelor of Science degree in English, foreign languages, journalism, and speech. The department also provides minors in English, journalism, literature, French, German, Russian, Spanish, and speech.

The Language and Literature department sponsors the weekly edition of the Collegio, the Kanza, college plays, studio productions, and the college radio station.

Studio productions provide training to better enable the student to perform in a teaching situation. Student actors receive additional training in a different type of production.

SPONSORS DEBATE



The KSC Forensic Squad participated in an exciting and profitable season. Debaters traveled to Washington, D.C. and Los Angeles, California, as well as within the surrounding five states. The proposition for this year was, RESOLVED: THAT LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE UNITED STATES SHOULD BE GIVEN GREATER FREEDOM IN THE INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF CRIME. Terry Beck presided over Pi Kappa Delta, the honorary speech fraternity on campus. Professor H. Francis Short, director of forensics, sponsored the Pi Kappa Delta organization and coached the squad in forensic activities.

Theta Alpha Phi is the national fraternity of the theatre arts. Membership is attained through participation in college theatre productions either as an actor or technician. The operation of college theatre requires every conceivable talent and ability and is open to all regularly enrolled students to KSC. 
Xeroxing has become so popular that students now have to be placed in a waiting line to have their materials xeroxed. This is the second year for the service provided by the library at a minimal fee.


A library science minor may be chosen with any subject major to complete requirements for graduation. This library science minor applies to the Bachelor of Arts degree or the Bachelor of Science in Education degree. This minor is pre-professional at the undergraduate level and will generally be accepted by accredited library schools throughout the United States.

Students wishing to prepare themselves for school librarianship in Kansas may take the library science courses without declaring a minor in a department. However, the student must qualify for the field in which he plans to teach—an elementary school librarian must have elementary education, while a student wishing to become a secondary or junior college librarian must have secondary education.





The Department of Mathematics offers courses leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Science in Education for the undergraduates. For the graduates, the department offers courses leading to the degrees of Master of Arts and Master of Science.

The Kansas Alpha chapter of Kappa Mu Epsilon, a national honorary society in mathematics with sixty-six chapters, is sponsored by the department. Three members of the department have held national offices in this organization.



Army Reserve Officer Training Corps is required for male students during their freshman and sophomore years. Men are trained in leadership abilities and field maneuvers and tactics. An advanced course in Military Science is offered to all juniors and seniors. If a student participates in the advanced course, he attends summer camp for two weeks where he learns more about the Army administration, Military law, and the role of the United States in world affairs.

The Reserve Officer Training Corps Band has participated in the "Mardi Gras" parades for the last four years in New Orleans. They have received trophies the last three years for being among the most outstanding groups attending.

A number of various senior and graduate recitals were presented throughout the year, as well as the usual choir, orchestra, and band concerts.



HEALTH, PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND RECREATION



Intramural sports are sponsored by the department.

The Physical Education department supervises athletics, intramural and physical education activities, and offers courses in the theory and practice of physical education for the preparation of teachers and athletic coaches. The department offers courses and majors in the field of recreation for majors and non-majors. Majors can prepare for supervisors' and directors' positions in the expanding field of recreation. In cooperation with the Biology department, courses in health and health education are required of physical education majors, preparing them to teach health in the public schools.

In addition to enrollment in gymnasium classes in physical training, all students are encouraged to develop physical skill by playing on intramural teams in various athletic lines. The more proficient of the men have an opportunity to try for college teams and participate in intercollegiate contests. The college encourages participation in athletic sports as a means of developing desirable physical, mental, and social qualities.

The gymnasium provides standard facilities for basketball, swimming, and other indoor sports, and physical education. Brandenburg Stadium is one of the best for football, track, and outdoor sports. In addition, there are excellent playing and practice fields for all outdoor sports.

PHYSICS



The physics department offers course work leading to a major or minor in physics with degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Education, Master of Science and Specialist in Education. The department co-operates with the departments of Biology, Chemistry, and Education and Psychology to offer course work leading to the degrees of Master of Science in Natural Science (Physics emphasis), Specialist in Education (Physics), and Specialist in Education (Physical Science).

The physics department was formed in June of 1962. The department is located in Yates Hall, where it operates the college planetarium. The observatory on top of Russ Hall is also operated by the physics department.

The department trains students for industrial physicists, and graduate research as well as for teaching. All research at present is in solid state physics.


The grant is sponsored jointly by the National Science Foundation and Eagle-Picher Research Laboratories. The research deals with the analysis of Boron Tribromide relative to trace carbon

contamination at the part-per-million-level. The method takes advantage of the high sensitivity and selectivity of gas chromatography—one of Dr. Walker's primary research interests. The ultimate object of the research is single crystal, elemental Boron, a major component of semiconductor materials.





Kansas State College is committed to a policy of encouraging and recognizing superior scholarship. This classification is available to undergraduates having academic records indicating high achievement, ordinarily in the upper five percent for previous academic work, or standings on entrance tests usually consistent with such high achievement. Any individual desiring the classification "Superior Student" and its privileges must apply in writing to the Superior Student Committee for consideration at least six weeks prior to the next enrollment period.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

The department of social science includes the fields of history, economics, geography, political science, and sociology. Degrees offered include Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science in Education, and Bachelor of Science with a major in social work. Pre-professional degrees are offered in the fields of law and theology.

The department sponsors many seminars for college and junior college teachers and students each year. The department also assists in sponsoring a number of lectures by KSC staff members and off-campus personalities.

Vocational Technical Training is available at Kansas State College for those students who do not wish to pursue a college degree program and desire specialized pre-employment training for a particular trade. Trade preparatory courses offered in the Vocational Technical Training consist of two years of pre-employment training designed to prepare young men and women for employment in their selected trades and technical occupations. Students enrolled for these courses attend classes six hours per day, five days per week, with four hours per day devoted to shop practice to develop skill in manipulative operations of the occupation and two hours per day to related subjects to expand the student's technical knowledge in the particular field for which he is enrolled.


Gamma Chi Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha










