Pittsburg, Kansas

Kansas State College of Pittsburg is a progressive multi-purpose educational institution located in the heart of southeast Kansas. It offers a wide variety of opportunities from short-term technical courses to the Specialist in Education degree program.

The College is surrounded by Junior colleges which feed its program with the result that it is one of the few colleges in the country which offer as many hours to juniors and seniors as to freshman and sophomores.

KSC was originally organized as the Auxiliary Manual Training Normal School in 1903. It became a 4-year institution and was renamed Kansas State Teachers College of Pittsburg in 1913. It was authorized to grant the Master of Science degree in 1929 and the Specialist in Education degree in 1958. It was renamed Kansas State College of Pittsburg in 1959 and was authorized that same year to grant the Master of Arts degree in the fields of History, English and Mathematics.

Many programs are available in these fields at Pittsburg State: Art, Biological Science, Business Administration, Education and Psychology, Health and Physical Education, Home Economics, Industrial Education and Art, Language and Literature, Library Science, Mathematics, Military Science and Tactics, Music, Physical Science and Social Science.

One and two-year Industrial Arts Technical programs include work in architectural drafting, auto mechanics, industrial illustration, mechanical drafting, metal-working and printing. Short term business programs include 1-year clerical, 1 and 2-year secretarial and 2-year accounting courses. Pre-professional curricula are offered in these fields: Engineering, Agriculture, Dental, Medical, Nursing, Laboratory Technician, Veterinary, Law and Social Work.

The far-reaching aspects of the institution are demonstrated by the fact that more Kansas school administrators have earned their degrees at Pittsburg State than at any other school, on both the baccalaureate and masters level, according to a survey published recently by "Kansas Schools."

Pittsburg State offers a broad program of study and, through its dormitories, fraternities and sororities, athletic programs, religious organizations and other phases of its environment, a well-rounded program of living. Both are shaped for a maximum of benefit to the student with a minimum of social and financial pressure.

Northern State Teachers College

Aberdeen, South Dakota

The school now known as Northern State Teachers College was started at the turn of the century as Northern Normal and Industrial School. The South Dakota state legislature of 1899 appropriated \$33,000 for this purpose. Northern opened its doors in September of 1902.

During the first years nearly all the students were on the high school level. Soon two years of college work was offered. In 1920 the school was offering four years of college work and in 1921 Northern had its first degree graduating class. It was not until the World War II years that students could earn a degree in fields other than education. Eight years ago Northern embarked upon a program of offering a Master of Science degree in Education.

Charles F. Kohler was Northern's first president. Since July 1, 1956, Dr. J. Howard Kramer has been president of Northern State Teachers College.

Football: Football at Northern was started during the first year. In 1902 and succeeding years most of the games were played against high schools. In the early days the athletic programs were coached, operated, and financed by the students without assistance (officially) from faculty members. Northern's first faculty coach was Fred Smith, who coached football as an extra-curricular activity.

In 1920, Northern entered upon a new career. Having become a four-year teachers college, Northern became a member of the SDIC (South Dakota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference). Jake Speelman was an extremely successful coach for the next six years. In 1923 Northern teams adopted the mascot name "Wolves." Since 1946 Clark Swisher has been the head coach. Since then Northern has won the conference championship 9 times.

Other Sports: Basketball, girls' basketball, track, baseball, tennis, golf, boxing, and swimming were on Northern's sport programs in the early years, however, only football, basketball, and track were maintained on a continuous basis. Wrestling was introduced in 1959.

In the 1946-61 period Wolf teams have been conference champions 12 times in track, 9 times in football, 10 times in basketball, 7 times in golf and twice in tennis.

The two contestants selected by N.A.I.A. officials for this afternoon's game are the Pitt State Gorillas under the leadership of Head Coach Carnie Smith and the South Dakota State Wolves coached by Clark L. Swisher. The winner will automatically receive the invitation to play in the Camellia Bowl on Dec. 9, 1961 at Sacramento, Calif.

Both teams go into the game with the same seasonal record. The Pittsburg Gorillas have played and won nine games amassing a total of 299 points to their opponent's 25. The Wolves have played and won nine games with a record of 363 points to 82 for their opponents.

In 16 years of coaching at NSTC, Coach Swisher's teams have been conference champions nine times—four times undefeated and untied—1947, 1953, 1955 and 1961.

In Coach Smith's thirteen years he has turned in four conference titles—1951 (tie), 1955, 1957, and 1961. The 1957 team went on to win the NAIA title at St. Petersburg, Fla.

The Wolves are from Aberdeen, South Dakota, population 24,000. Their school is officially the Northern State Teachers College of Aberdeen, South Dakota, founded in 1901.

The Gorillas are of the Kansas State College of Pittsburg, Pittsburg, Kansas, population 20,000, founded in 1904.

SYSTEM OF BREAKING TIES AT NAIA FOOTBALL GAMES

The Football Advisory Committee of NAIA has selected the following play for breaking a tie in NAIA football playoff games:

The plan is called the PFIT (fight) plan. In case of tie games, the **first** consideration is the number of penetrations of the opponents' 20-yard line, **second**, the total number of first downs, **third**, total yardage, and **fourth**, toss of a coin.

Concerning penetrations: the ball must be in legal possession inside the opponents' 20-yard line when it is declared dead. Only one penetration will be counted during one continuous possession of the ball. A play from outside the 20-yard line which results in a touch-down is counted as one penetration.

A scoring play of 10 or more yards in length shall be counted as one first down.

This plan applies only to playoff games. Should the Camellia Bowl championship game at Sacramento end in a tie, then the two teams shall be declared "co-champions."

The game shall be stopped with three minutes remaining to play (i.e. at the first dead ball applicable), and the sideline statistician shall notify each team captain and coach regarding the number of penetrations, first downs, and accumulative total yardage at that moment.
