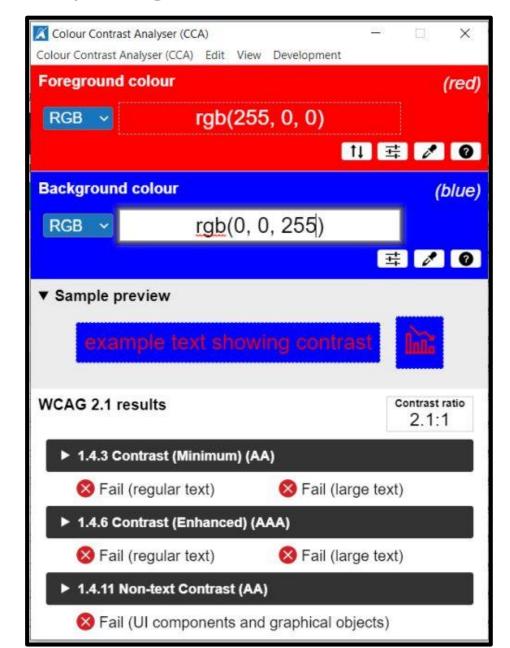



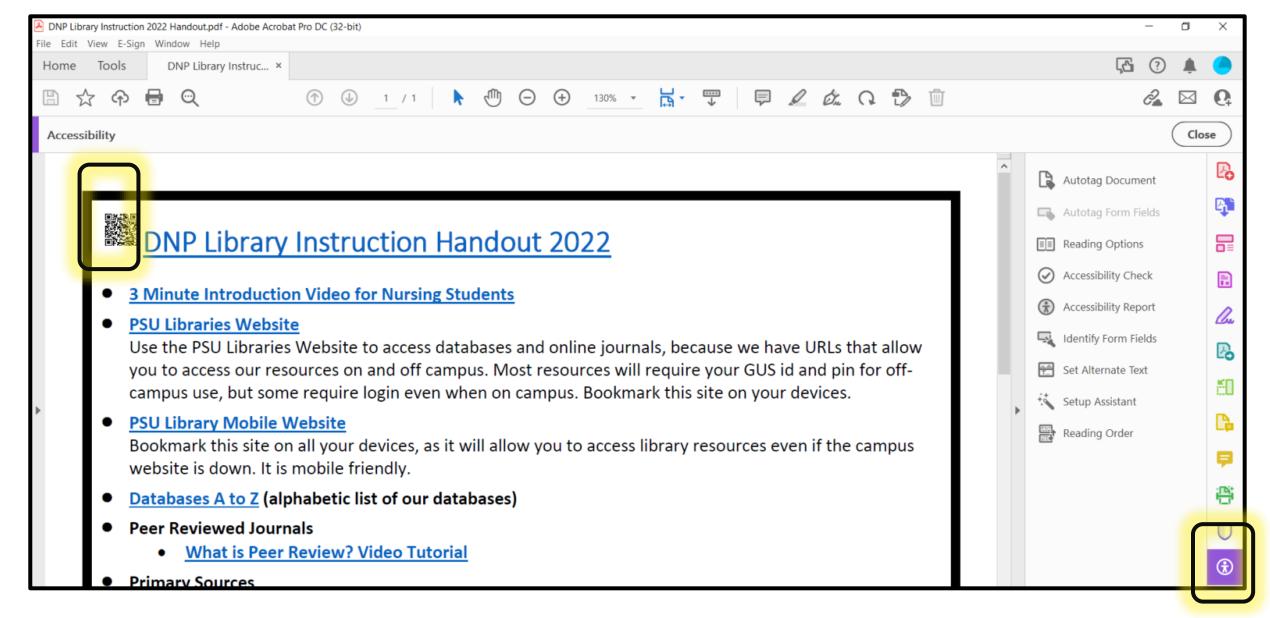




#### Example of a Website With Lack of Contrast

- Closed Captioning and Transcript Reflects What is Actually Said / Done in Video (<u>Link to WCAG 2.1 – Guideline 1.2</u>)
- Ability to Control Video With Keyboard Alone without specific timing of keystrokes "except where the underlying function requires input that depends on the path of the user's movement and not just the endpoints" (<u>Link to</u> <u>WCAG 2.1 – Keyboard Accessible</u>)
