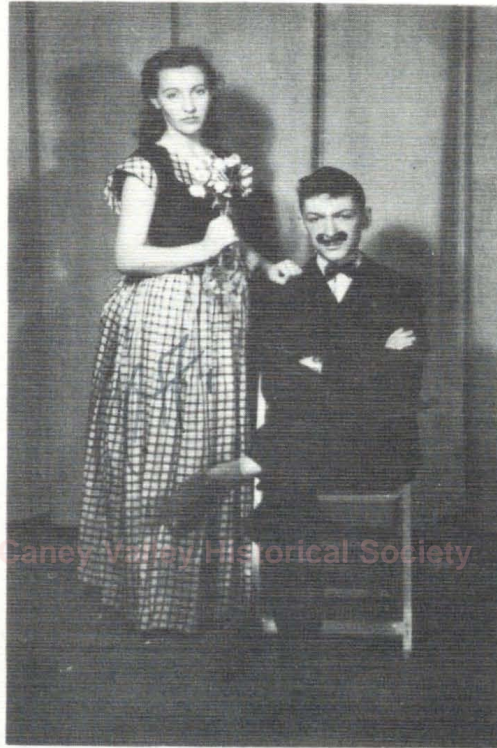

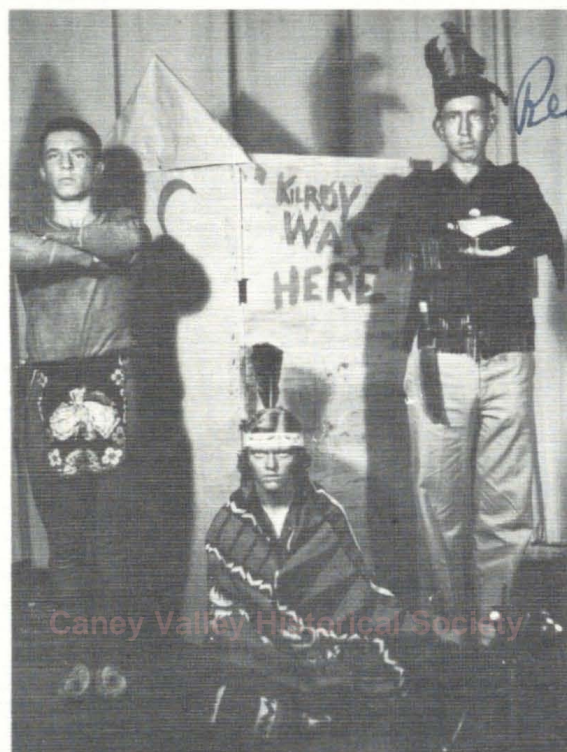

SENIOR CLASS HISTORY

The sophomore year began with forty-two students enrolled. Miss June Steeper and Miss Clemma Ross, together with officers chosen — Elaine Sawyer, La Donna Graves, Charles Dancer, John Foote and Joan George — guided them through the year.

Upon reaching the height of juniors Joan George was elected president. Other officers were John Foote, Faye Newby, Peggy Wilson and Melvin Branch. The class was well represented in the junior-senior play. Their banquet theme was "Stardust." The juniors treated the seniors to a very lovely and sumptuous banquet. The seniors returned the hospitality by inviting the juniors to the prom. Miss Estyl Olsen and Mr. Haddock were the sponsors.

The year of 1946 began with forty-eight seniors working eagerly for graduation. Charles Dancer, Jim Waggoner, Faye Newby, Bob Hudiburg and John Foote led the class.
