

TO THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS, ALL LOCAL UNIONS, DISTRICT NO. 14, U. M. W. OF A.

Dear Sirs and Brothers: -

You will find enclosed herewith, tabulation of the vote cast on the question of moving District Headquarters. This gives Pittsburg a majority of 241.

We also wish to advise you that the following recommendation was submitted to the Board by officers or representatives of the following Local Unions -- Local Union 46, 2603, 2689, 3015, 3930, 597, 2454, 3985, 2354 and 5610. The recommendation is:

## Report of Sub Committee

Motion: That this committee recommend that a Two per cent per member assessment be placed on all members of District 14, and that the District Board be directed to refer this question back to all Local Unions in the district for vote of rank and file.

Adopted.

Motion: That all men employed pay Two per cent on their net earnings.

Adopted.

Motion: That all men who are on strike or men who are idle by being locked out by the mines being shut down, that they be paid equally from this assessment. Adopted.

Motion: That the money from this assessment be paid out for relief only, and that no donations or committees be paid from this fund.

Adopted."

The above proposal will be considered by the District Executive Board at their next meeting, and some action along this line will be submitted to you.
