the office of a regular practicing attorney for three years antedating
the date of the application for admission, and as reasons for the
motion, it is represented:

First, that Mrs. Ida Callery has read law for fifty months but has not registered for the reason that she did not know that such a rule was necessary, and

Second, that she has not been a resident of this state for three years, but has read law in Arkansas.

And in further support of said motion, the following affidavit is hereto attached, and made a part hereof.
