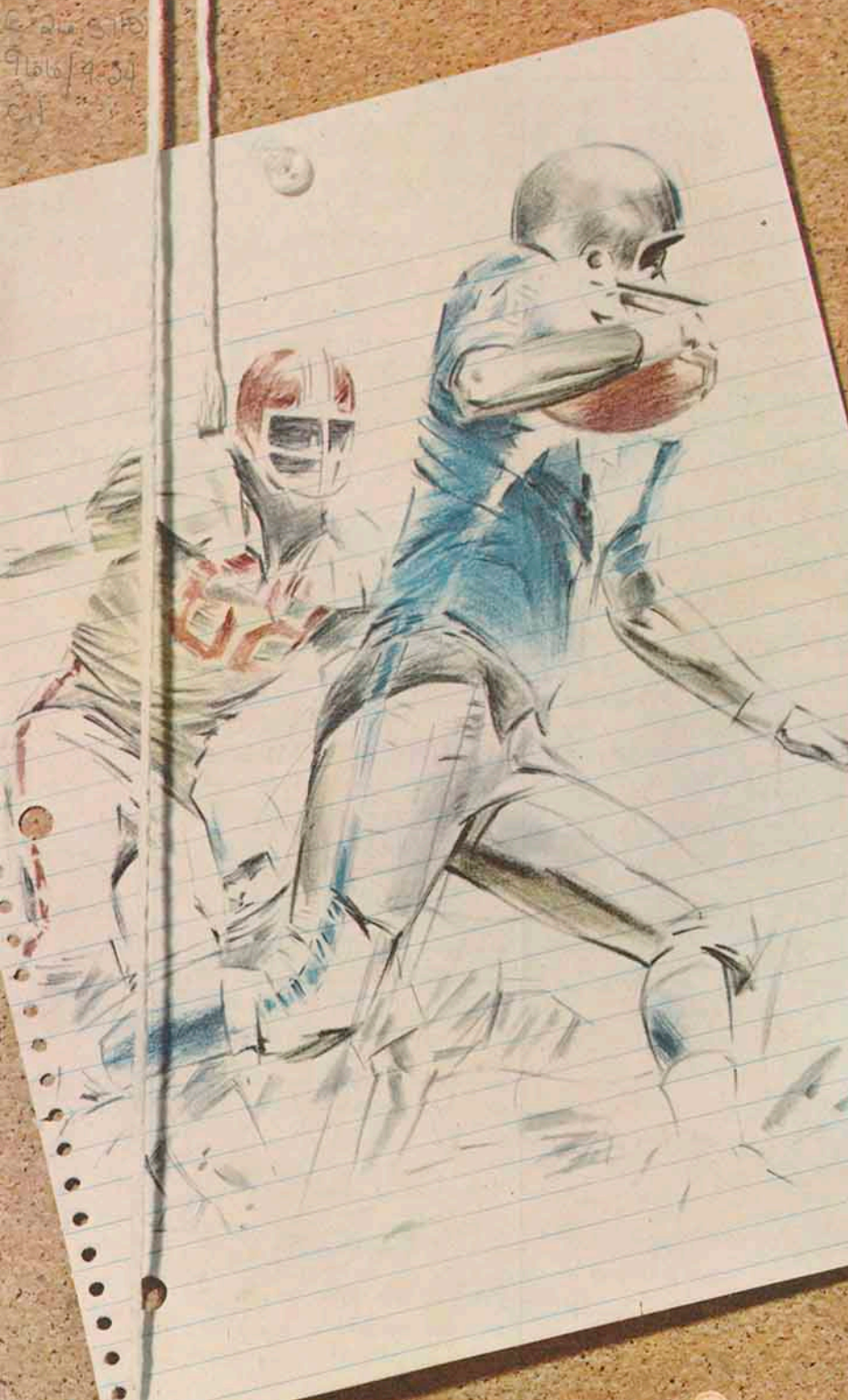

The KSC Gorillas bring a 1-0 mark into this opening game of the home season. Last weekend they beat the Central Missouri State Mules from Warrensburg 20 to 18. Tonight's Recognition Night contest is the Miners from the University of Missouri at Rolla, a second straight rival from the strong Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association. The Miners lost 31-13 to Harding last weekend. Last year Pittsburg fell 19-7 at Rolla so this could be a revenge game for the Gorillas. The KSC-Rolla series consists of 24 games in 52 years with Pittsburg winning sixteen, losing seven and tying one. The first three games in 1914, 1915, and 1931 were 104-0, 41-0, and 19-7 defeats for the Gorillas but the overall point totals now stand at 448-330 in Pittsburg's favor.

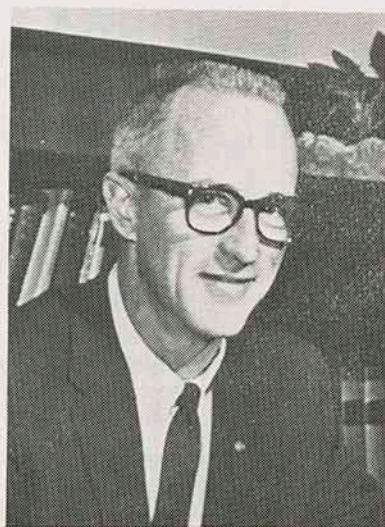

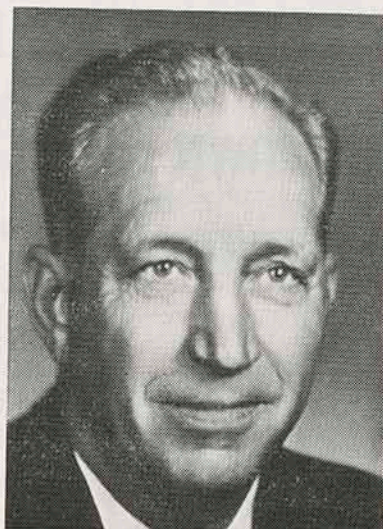

## Carnie Smith Head Football Coach

Carnie Smith, recognized by many as one of Pittsburg's foremost ambassadors of goodwill, goes into his eighteenth season as KSC head football coach with a record of 109 wins, 50 losses and 6 ties including two 11-0 seasons that brought Pittsburg two national championships within five years. In 1957 the Gorillas won the Holiday Bowl National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Championship at St. Petersburg, Florida and in 1961 won the Camellia Bowl at Sacramento, California for the second NAIA championship. His 1961 squad was rated the No. 1 small college football team in the nation by AP, UPI and NAIA.

NAIA All-American honors have been awarded to fourteen of Carnie's football players, twelve of whom were linemen. In 1962, a former Pittsburg griddier was named to the AFL All-Star first team. KSC's pro All-Star is Eldon Danenhauer, Denver Bronco tackle. With characteristic modesty and pride in his staff, Carnie calls the successful linemen "Joe's boys" in recognition of Joe Murphy, head line coach who came to Pittsburg with Carnie in 1949.

Smith's 17 year CIC record is 57-20-2. Last season his players rated five spots in All-CIC honors, four on the first teams and one on the second team.

In Carnie's seventeen years at Pittsburg, his teams have shut out 41 opponents and held 47 others to one touchdown or less while playing 165 games. In other words, Pittsburg teams under Smith have held opponents to one touchdown or less in 53 per cent of the games played.

Many honors have been bestowed upon Carnie including NAIA Hall of Fame membership, the presidency of the NAIA Coaches Association in 1961-63, and the NAIA Coach of the Year award and Greater Kansas City area Byline Club's first annual Sports Page Award, both in 1961. He has received numerous citations for his activities in the NAIA and he has been cited for outstanding service at Alliance Football Rules Meetings in Chicago. In 1957 he was the mid-west's most honored coach. He was named "CIC Coach of the Year," received the Kansas City, Mo., Knute Rockne Club "Coach of the Year" award, the "Missouri Valley Outstanding Sportsman of the Year" award, the "Thirteenth Annual Night of Sports Award" in Kansas City. He was featured in national publications and was guest on a national TV show.

Carnie attended Arma high school lettering four years in football, basketball and track. He earned All-Big Six honors quarterbacking the 1930 University of Kansas Jayhawk titlewinners and lettered in baseball. After graduating in 1933, he coached at Cockerill, Mineral, Arma and Paola where he rolled up a record of 59 wins (including 22 straight while at Paola, 1937-39), and 26 losses. He won five consecutive Eastern Kansas League titles. In 1946 Carnie coached at Parsons junior college. In 1947 he was assistant to Lynn Waldorf at the University of California and in 1948 he became head coach at Santa Rosa, Calif., junior college. Since coming to KSC in 1949 he has won three undisputed CIC titles and tied for first twice.

**1. OFFSIDE** (INFRACTION OF SCRIMMAGE OR FREE KICK FORMATION)—En-croachment on neutral zone—Loss of Five Yards.

**2. ILLEGAL PROCEDURE, POSITION OR SUBSTITUTION**—Putting ball in play before Referee signals "Ready-for-Play"; Failure to complete substitution before play starts; Player out-of-bounds when scrimmage begins, or on free kick formation; Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team when ball is snapped; False start or simulating start of a play; Taking more than two steps after Fair Catch is made; Player on line receiving snap; Free kick out-of-bounds—Loss of Five Yards.

**3. ILLEGAL MOTION**—Offensive player illegally in motion when ball is snapped—Loss of Five Yards.

**4. ILLEGAL SHIFT**—Failure to pause one full second in shift play—Loss of Five Yards.

**5. ILLEGAL RETURN**—Infraction of substitution rule—Loss of Five Yards.

**6. DELAY OF GAME**—Consuming more than 25 seconds in putting the ball in play after it is declared ready-for-play; Failure to remove injured player for whom excess timeout was granted; Crawling—Loss of Five Yards. Team not ready to

play at start of either half—Loss of 15 Yards.

**7. PERSONAL FOUL**—Tackling or blocking defensive player who has made fair catch; Piling on; Hurdling; Tripping; Grasping face mask of opponent; Tackling player out-of-bounds, or running into player obviously out of play; Loss of 15 Yards. (Flagrant offenders will be disqualified.)

**8. CLIPPING**—Loss of 15 Yards.

## PENALTIES

**9. ROUGHING THE KICKER** or holder—Loss of 15 Yards.

**10. UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT**—Striking an opponent with fist, forearm, elbow or locked hands; Kicking or kneeling—Loss of 15 Yards (offenders will be disqualified); Violation of rules during intermission; Illegal return of disqualified player; Coaching from side lines; Invalid signal for Fair Catch; Persons illegally on field—Loss of 15 Yards. (Flagrant offenders will be disqualified.)

**11. ILLEGAL USE OF HANDS AND ARMS** by offensive or defensive player—Loss of 15 Yards.

**12. INTENTIONAL GROUNDING** of forward pass—Loss of Five Yards from spot of pass Plus Loss of Down.

**13. ILLEGAL FORWARD PASS OR ILLEGALLY HANDING BALL FORWARD**—Loss of Five Yards from spot of foul Plus Loss of Down.

**14. FORWARD PASS OR KICK CATCHING INTERFERENCE**—Interference with opportunity of player of receiving team to catch a kick—Loss of 15 yards. Interference by member of offensive team on forward pass—Loss of 15 Yards Plus Loss of Down. Interference by defensive team on forward pass—Passing Team's Ball at Spot of Foul and First Down.

**15. INELIGIBLE RECEIVER DOWNFIELD ON PASS**—Loss of 15 Yards.

**16. BALL ILLEGALLY TOUCHED, KICKED OR BATTED**—Forward pass being touched by ineligible receiver beyond the line of scrimmage—Loss of 15 Yards from Spot of Preceding Down and Loss of a Down. Eligible pass receiver going out-of-bounds and later touching a forward pass—Loss of Down; Illegally kicking the ball—Loss of 15 Yards; Illegally kicking or batting a free ball—Offended team's ball at Spot of Foul.

**17. INCOMPLETE FORWARD PASS**—Penalty declined; No play or no score.

**18. HELPING THE RUNNER, or interlocked interference**—Loss of 15 Yards.

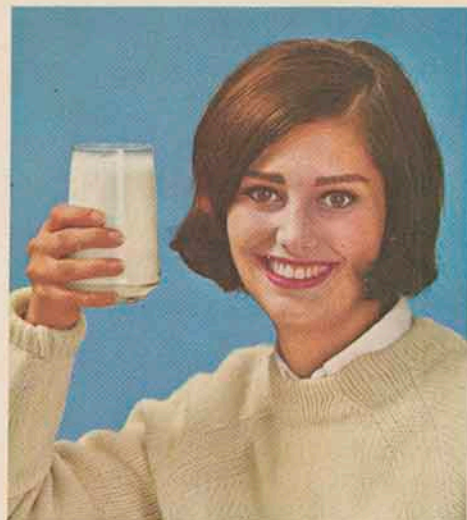
