#### GENERATION ONE

Jesse Eliezer Barrera (1996-) was born in John F. Kennedy Hospital in Edison New Jersey, in 1996 to Jesse Barrera (1973-) and Monica Eliza Barrera (1977-). The birth went through smoothly. Jesse first name was given to him by his father, who named him after himself. Jesse middle name was given to him by his mother, who named him after her father. Jesse was of Mexican descent from his father side, and Puerto Rican descent from his mother side.

After him, and his parents left the hospital they went to Perth Amboy. Jesse and his parents lived with his aunt Mayra Quiles-Perez. Jesse would be living back and forth from their place to his Godfather Shawn Vandeburg home. Perth Amboy and the surrounding towns weren't the safest places to live with high poverty. Perth Amboy was a Hispanic community with Puerto Ricans being the majority of the population<sup>1</sup>. Jesse and his parents would soon find their own apartment to live in.

Soon after moving Monica would give birth to another son **Joseph Barrera**. As Jesse got older his parents would notice him giving blank stares which can be sign of early epilepsy. The stares would only last for ten seconds, or so. His younger brother was suffering from asthma too at the time. As Jesse got older he and his brother would go to a child care center while their parents work.

After one year Jesse entered kindergarten at James J. Flynn School which was a K-4 school. He would go there all four years. He had to take a speech, and reading class since he couldn't speak, or read at the grade level well. After graduating elementary school he went to middle school which was a 5-8 school in New Jersey. The middle school had a bad reputation with students causing trouble. During recess time the outside looked like a prison yard with a fence all around, and multiple security guards. Stick bombs in classrooms, and fights were normal. With them happening at least once a month. One year someone brought a gun to school with the whole school being on lockdown, and students hiding. The next year someone called the police saying there was a bomb in the school because the student didn't want to take the state test.

His family ended up moving to Kansas. Jesse was twelve years old at the time. His parents wanted his brother and him to get a better education. The recession of 2008 also forced his family to move in order to make a living. The lifestyle in Kansas was a different experience for him. When he first moved to Kansas he saw how friendly people were compare to people in New Jersey, but for the first time in his life he experienced racism. Someone wrote an unpleasant note, and smashed the rear windshield of his parent's car. Compared with New Jersey something like this was rare since a large percentage of the community was minority's¹. With most being Puerto Rican. Also in Kansas people assumed if someone was Hispanic they were Mexican. People in New Jersey would also assume if someone was Hispanic they were Puerto Rican, or Dominican. It was a change in worlds for Jesse. It was a good experience with the change in lifestyles.

Jesse finished middle school in Kansas. His brother had to go back to elementary school since in Kansas elementary school is K-6. The education in Kansas was much different. The elementary, middle, high schools Jesse went to in Kansas were a year ahead of schools in New Jersey. During high school Jesse join the Naval Junior Reserve Officer Training Corp.

During that time Jesse became third in charge, and Commander of the Drill Team. He participated in multiple competitions with his unit. Participated in community services, parades, and fundraising events. Also during this time Jesse was diagnose with epilepsy. Jesse had to adapt his plans on what he wanted to achieve in life because of being diagnose with epilepsy. He worked on what he was strongest at which was history. He became the first person in his family to go to college. He decided to major in history.

Her mother ran in to trouble a lot trying to take care of her.

Monica ran into trouble with her grandmother, and her aunt and uncles. Her mother couldn't help at the time since she was locked up. Her Uncle **Luis Acevedo** helped take care of her since he had troubles with his mother, and siblings except for Myrna. Monica got in trouble a lot with school, and outside. She was constantly locked in her room as punishment. She now appreciates it since he was there when no one else was.

Her mother eventually took her back when she was cleaned up, and remarried. Her new Step-Father was **Raul Rivera**. Monica, and Raul grew close. Myrna was getting sicker as time went on. She gave birth to **Melanie Minerva Rivera**. Melanie also grew sick, and died during infancy.

Monica eventually rekindle the relationship with her grandmother, aunt, and uncles. Her and her aunt **Mayra** became best friends. Mayra dragged Monica everywhere especially scary movies. Monica would later meet Jesse, and marry him. Monica and Jesse lived with Mayra and her husband and daughter. Later moved out since Monica had a son.

She would later give birth to another son. She stilled spent a lot of time with her mother since she was sick, and Raul. Eliezer was in and out of the picture for Monica, and they continued to have a on and off again relation at the time. Raul would later past away with Myrna soon following. This hurt Monica since she didn't really have a parent since she and her father weren't close. All of her mother's friends helped take care of her, and babysat her kids. Monica became a stay at home mom for a while till she felt
