My dear Sir:

I am enclosing you a resolution passed by the Board of Directors of this organization on February 5th, 1923. I hope that if your organization has not passed a similar resolution that it will do so at once and send to your Representative at the Legislature and others, such resolution. Also that you get as many other organizations as possible in your city to adopt similar resolutions.
