Pittsburg, Kansas, Friday Evening, March 18, 1938.

Twenty-five years ago, W. A. Brandenburg was chosen to head the institution that was an outpost in American education -a training school for teachers, emphasizing the manual arts. It was then known as an auxiliary to the state normal. It had a tiny faculty, a small student body and two buildings. Today, the institution is the Kansas State Teachers College of Pittsburg, an independent college featuring the preparation of teachers. Its graduates are at work throughout the nation. It has a large faculty, an annual enrollment of 3,500 different persons, thirteen campus structures, fine equipment and national prominence in

education.
