BRANDENBURG JUBILEE PLANS PROGRESSING

HUXMAN AND THREE FORMER GOVERNORS ARE LISTED AS SPEAKERS.

Others Prominent in Education Field
to Be Here During Week of
March 14 to 19 to Honor Local
College President.

Four men who have won the toga of Kansas governorship and men ranking to the top of the list as educators are expected to be here the week of March 14-19 to attend activities during the silver anniversary celebration for President W. A. Brandenburg at the College. During the week the 25th anniversary of President Brandenburg's service as head of the school will be celebrated.

Plans for the week are quickly taking shape as the time nears and programs are now planned for each day's activities. With Dr. O. P. Dellinger as chairman, the general committee in charge of celebrations met yesterday and reported that Governor Huxman, C. M. Harger, chairman of the board of regents, and State Superintendent W. T. Markham have consented to speak in addition to Jonathan Davis, Ben S. Paulen, and Clyde Reed, all former governors of Kansas under whose administration President Brandenburg was served.

Former Governor George H. Hodges, during whose term the state board of administration brought President Brandenburg to Pittsburg, has written from California of his regret at being unable to attend the celebration. Word also has been received from Senator Arthur Capper that he will be unable to leave Washington for the ceremonies. Both expressed felicitations to President Brandenburg and the school.

Banquet on Friday.

The week will climax with speeches by the governors on "visitors day," Friday, at which time the Chamber of Commerce will entertain noted guests with a banquet and sight-seeing tour of Pittsburg and vicinity.

The College orchestra under the direction of Walter McCray will furnish a large part of the music which will be featured throughout the week. The choruses of the College will sing and as a feature will give a number, "If All Those Fond Memories of K. S. T. C.," composed by Miss Belle Provorse, secretary to the president.

Guests Expected.

Presidents of Kansas colleges and other noted educators who will be present are: President C. E. Rarick of Kansas State College at Hays; Professor George Gimmell of Manhattan; President L. A. Pittenger of Ball State Teachers College, Muncie, Ind. Students will honor "Prexy" on Thursday with an assembly program at 10 a. m. at which Lewis Corporon will be in charge and Kenneth McFarland, superintendent of schools at Coffeyville and graduate of the College will speak.

Small printed programs are available which contain a statement of the purpose of the celebration and the highlights of each day's program. The program committee is composed of Dr. Paul Murphy, George Weeks, Dr. J. R. Hutchman, Josephine Massey, Lewis Corporon, M. M. Rose, Don Gray and Lulu McPherson.

The complete list of principal speakers for the Brandenburg Silver anniversary at Pittsburg State Teachers College, a list headed by Governor Walter A. Huxman, was announced Thursday by the faculty committee in charge. The anniversary, March 14 to 19, will celebrate the 25 year of Dr. W. A. Brandenburg's presidency at college.

Superintendent Kenneth McFarland of the Coffeyville schools, an alumnus of the college, will be the speaker for "student day" Thursday morning, March 17.

HUXMAN SPEAKS FRIDAY

Governor Huxman will be the principal speaker for the morning program of "visitors' day" Friday, and Dr. L. A. Pittenger, president of the Ball State Teachers college, Muncie, Ind., will speak at the banquet that night.

For "alumni day" Saturday Dr. Brandenburg will address the old grads in the afternoon, and C. M. Harger, chairman of the board of regents, will be the speaker at the alumni dinner.

Three former governors of Kansas will also bring greeting in the same program with Governor Huxman. They will be Jonathan Davis, Ben S. Paulen and Clyde Reed.

ADDRESS OVER RADIO

The week will open on Monday with a radio address by Dr. O. P. Dellinger, chairman of the graduate division, at 4:30 over KOAM, Pittsburg. Dr. Melli-cent McNeil, head of the English department, will speak briefly at 4:30 Wednesday at the interlude of an orchestra concert broadcast by the same station. President Brandenburg and Miss Eulalia Roseberry, professor of geography, will speak at 7:30 Wednesday night from KGGF, Coffeyville.
