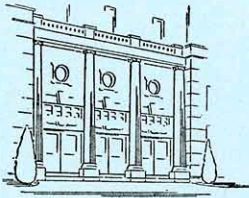

SIGNIFICANT DATES

- 1903** Kansas State Manual Training Normal established at Pittsburg.
- 1910** Music was added to normal-college courses.
- 1913** First degrees were issued—13 received A.B. degrees.
- 1913** Name changed to State Manual Training Normal.
- 1923** Name changed to Kansas State Teachers College of Pittsburg.
- 1929** College authorized to grant Master degrees.
- More than 21,000 teaching credentials have been issued by K. S. T. C.
- Over 5,000 bachelor degrees have been conferred.
- The Master's degree has been granted to more than 700 candidates.
