

## SIGNIFICANT DATES

1903	Kansas State Manual Training Normal established at Pittsburg.
1910	Music was added to normal-college courses.
<b>1913</b> <sup>.</sup>	First degrees were issued-13 received A.B. degrees.
1913	Name changed to State Manual Training Normal.
1923	Name changed to Kansas State Teachers College of Pittsburg.
1929	College authorized to grant Master degrees.

More than 21,000 teaching credentials have been issued by K. S. T. C.

Over 5,000 bachelor degrees have been conferred.

The Master's degree has been granted to more than 700 candidates.
