

This 1969 Homecoming game will be the sixth contest of the season for the Gorillas as KSC hosts the Ichabods of Washburn University. This will be the 39th contest between the two schools since the series began in 1921. During that time KSC has won 24, lost 13, and tied 1.

Calling the signals for the Ichabods this year is Dale Bennet, who was last year's back-up quarterback. During the first four games of their season, he completed 13 of 42 passes and had four intercepted. He totaled 264 yards for two touchdowns. Washburn seems to have great depth at the end position with 7 of their receivers on the books with yardage. Steve Alston, WU halfback, is one of the leading ground gainers for the Ichabods, with a 4 game total of 154 yards.

This will be the third conference game for the Gorillas as they now stand 1-1 in the Plains Division after the defeat last week-end by the Indians of Omaha. Overall, the Gorillas stand with a 3-2 record. During that game with Omaha, Bob Howard, KSC fullback, broke the KSC career rushing yardage record by gaining a total of 1683 net yards, 11 yards better than the old record of 1672 net yards set by Gary Snadon in 1961.

TOM LESTER HEAD COACH

Tom Lester, in his third year as head coach, is only the eighth man in the 61-year history of the College athletic program to hold the position of head football coach. Lester succeeded Carnie Smith who moved up to the position of athletic director in 1967. Coach Lester is a former Gorilla star and a 6-year veteran of former head coach Carnie Smith's staff. An NAIA all-American honorable mention and all-CIC first-team end at KSC in 1951, Lester earned a B.S. degree in physical education in 1951 and an M.S. degree in education in 1955, both at Pittsburg. As KSC's eighth head coach, Lester in only the third mentor to have graduated from the College.

A high school football coach for nine years before coming to KSC, Lester posted a 22-2-2 mark at Caldwell, and a 28-19-1 record at Atchinson, 1955-60. An all-State center in basketball as well as all-State end in football during his senior year at Drumright, Okla., high school in 1945, he also coached high school basketball at Caldwell with a 4th place finish in the state tournament.

Lester, 42, joined the faculty of the department of health, physical education and recreation in 1961. He has coached the freshman football squad and the varsity ends as well as fulfilling other athletic assignments including scouting.

Coach Lester originally came to KSC on a basketball scholarship but a knee injury hampered his playing, so, using a knee brace, he went out for football. Lettering his freshman year under Charlie Morgan and the next three years under Smith, he won all-CIC first team end honors as a junior and again as a senior, along with NAIA all-American recognition.

Married to the former Margaret Melka of Medford, Okla., the Lesters have two sons, Randy, 19, and Rusty, 14, and a daughter. Sydney, 10.

KSC Annual Football Awards

THE STRATTON AWARD

The Stratton Award was established just prior to the 1954 football season, in honor of Richard Stratton, a letterman in 1951 who was killed in the Korean conflict. He was the first KSC football player to lose his life after World War II.

Stratton was a native of Picher, Oklahoma, and characterized the American football player who played for fun, completely devoted to his team, without jealousy or envy, and was a genuine "member" of the team on the field, on the bench, or on the campus. It is to his team loyalty and complete dedication that a player on the team is named each year. The player need not be a letterman. The winners were:

W. G. PARROTT AWARD

HONORARY CAPTAINS



Bob Howard Breaks Record



Bob Howard, KSC starting fullback from Kansas City, has set a new KSC record this season. In last week's game with the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Howard became the holder of the career rushing yardage record. When he surpassed the old record of 1672 yards set by Gary Snadon in 1961 by 22 yards.

In 1967 Howard gained 360 yards for 90 carries, losing only 3 yards the entire season. He then came back in 1968 to take another rushing mark at KSC by gaining 876 yards for the most yards rushing in one season. This set up his chance to grab the career record this season. He started the 1969 season with a total of 1236 yards, just 436 yards away from the old record.

In the first game of the season against Morningside College, Howard gained 109 yards narrowing the total needed to 327 yards. He then came back with 125 net yards against Southern Colorado in KSC's first RMAC game. When it came time to play NE Missouri State in the third game of the season, Howard sustained an injury and was only able to gain 12 yards that night.

With only 190 yards to go, the Gorillas took to the road for the first time of the season to meet SW Missouri State. But the injury was still with Howard and he was only able to play the first half of the game. During that first half he managed to pick up another 76 yards. He now had only 115 more yards to go to break the career record as the Gorillas prepared for the second conference game of the 1969 campaign.

On October 11, in Omaha, Nebraska, Howard reached his goal. By gaining 136 net yards against the Indians of UNO, Howard surpassed the old record by 22 yards. With half of the season still left to play, Bob Howard is likely to set a record that will stand for years to come.

- OFFSIDE by either team; Violation of scrimmage or free kick formation; Encroachment on neutral zone—Loss of Five Yards.
- 2. ILLEGAL PROCEDURE, POSITION OR SUBSTITUTION—Putting ball in play before Referee signals "Ready-for-Play"; Failure to complete substitution before play starts; Player out-of-bounds when scrimmage begins, or on free kick formation; Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team when ball is snapped; False start or simulating start of a play; Taking more than two steps after Fair Catch is made; Player on line receiving snap; Free kick out-of-bounds—Loss of Five Yards.
- 3. ILLEGAL MOTION Offensive player illegally in motion when ball is snapped —Loss of Five Yards.
- ILLEGAL SHIFT—Failure to pause one full second in shift play—Loss of Five Yards.
- 5. ILLEGAL RETURN—Infraction of substitution rule—Loss of Five Yards.
- 6. DELAY OF GAME—Consuming more than 25 seconds in putting the ball in play after it is declared ready-for-play; Failure to remove injured player for whom excess timeout was granted; Crawling—Loss of Five Yards. Team not ready to

- play at start of either half-Loss of 15 Yards.
- 7. PERSONAL FOUL—Tackling or blocking defensive player who has made fair catch; Piling on; Hurdling; Tripping; Grasping face mask of opponent; Tackling player out-of-bounds, or running into player obviously out of play; Loss of 15 Yards. (Flagrant offenders will be disqualified.)
- 8. CLIPPING-Loss of 15 Yards.

PENALTIES

- 9. ROUGHING THE KICKER or holder
 —Loss of 15 Yards.
- 10. UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT Striking an opponent with fist, forearm, elbow or locked hands; Kicking or kneeing—Loss of 15 Yards (offenders will be disqualified); Violation of rules during intermission; Illegal return of disqualified player; Coaching from side lines; Invalid signal for Fair Catch; Persons illegally on field—Loss of 15 Yards. (Flagrant offenders will be disqualified.)
- 11. ILLEGAL USE OF HANDS AND ARMS by offensive or defensive player—Loss of 15 Yards.
- 12. INTENTIONAL GROUNDING of forward pass—Loss of Five Yards from spot of pass Plus Loss of Down.

- 13. ILLEGAL FORWARD PASS OR ILLEGALLY HANDING BALL FORWARD—Loss of Five Yards from spot of foul Plus Loss of Down.
- 14. FORWARD PASS OR KICK CATCH-ING INTERFERENCE—Interference with opportunity of player of receiving team to catch a kick—Loss of 15 yards. Interference by member of offensive team on forward pass—Loss of 15 Yards Plus Loss of Down. Interference by defensive team on forward pass—Passing Team's Ball at Spot of Foul and First Down.
- 15. INELIGIBLE RECEIVER DOWNFIELD ON PASS—Loss of 15 Yards.
- 16. BALL ILLEGALLY TOUCHED, KICKED OR BATTED—Forward pass being touched by ineligible receiver beyond the line of scrimmage—Loss of 15 Yards from Spot of Preceding Down and Loss of a Down. Eligible pass receiver going out-of-bounds and later touching a forward pass—Loss of Down; Illegally kicking the ball—Loss of 15 Yards; Illegally kicking or batting a free ball—Offended team's ball at Spot of Foul.
- 17. INCOMPLETE FORWARD PASS Penalty declined; No play or no score.
- 18. HELPING THE RUNNER, or interlocked interference—Loss of 15 Yards.
