The complete list of principal speakers for the Brandenburg Silver Anniversary celebration here March 14-19, a list headed by Governor Walter A. Huxman, has been announced by the faculty committee in charge.

Besides the listed speakers numerous alumni, educational leaders, state notables, present and former regents and others will be called upon to speak briefly at the various affairs listed for the week.

Governor Huxman will be the principal speaker for the morning program of "visitors' day" on Friday. Jonathan M. Davis, Ben S. Paulen, and Clyde M. Reed, former governors of Kansas, will bring greetings on the same program. Greetings of other governors will be read.
