The Pittsburg State University Seal

The Pittsburg State University Seal, redesigned in 1994, reflects the mission of instruction, research and service and also symbolizes the history, traditions, and future of the University. The first circle from the outside represents the University's future. The second circle identifies the University's name; the wheat sheafs symbolize the State of Kansas. The third circle includes the initials and dates for the previous names of the institution and identifies the mission of Pittsburg State University. The fourth circle contains an etching of the front entrance to Russ Hall with its four columns, the symbolic image of the University.

Change and progress give evidence of the dynamic development of Pittsburg State University from the founding of the State Manual Training Normal School in 1903 to the recognition in 1923 of the transformation of SMTN to Kansas State Teachers College, a comprehensive college educating teachers for the nation's elementary and secondary schools. From the very beginning, some graduates pursued careers in professional areas allied to their teaching degree. In 1959, KSTC became Kansas State College at Pittsburg, which recognized the expanded mission to educate students in the arts and sciences and in business, education, and technical fields for various professions and careers. In 1977, KSCP became Pittsburg State University to mark the transition from a college to a university with a range of undergraduate majors, graduate programs, and four organized schools in arts and sciences, business, education, and technology. The University embraced a common bond with all universities to pursue instruction, research and service.

One constant in the ten decades of Pittsburg State University is Russ Hall. Constructed in 1907 and opened in January 1908, it became the landmark first building that anchored SMTN as a permanent presence in higher education in Pittsburg, the State of Kansas, and the Nation. The doors to Russ Hall have admitted thousands of students during the University's history. Russ Hall forever stands as a tribute to the bold vision of the founders.

Every one possessing a college degree is entitled to wear a black robe on appropriate occasions. Faculty members and candidates for graduate degrees wear hoods in addition to the gown. Hoods are generally black, trimmed with velvet in the color of the subject field, and are lined with the colors of the college or university conferring the degree.

The correct colors to denote various branches of learning have been established by the Intercollegiate Code: Arts and Letters: White; Commerce and Business Administration: Light Brown; Education: Light Blue; Family and Consumer Sciences: Maroon; Fine Arts: Brown; Justice Studies: Purple; Music: Pink; Nursing: Apricot; Philosophy: Blue; Physical Education: Sage Green; Psychology: Dark Crimson; Science: Gold-Yellow; Social Work: Citron; Technology: Gold; General Studies: Black. :

David Edward Pierce BA '74

David Edward Pierce is a professor of law at Washburn University School of Law where he also serves as director of Washburn's Business and Transactional Law Center. A nationally recognized expert in oil and gas law, he has been a professor at Washburn since 1989 teaching property law, contract law, oil and gas law, energy law, and transactional drafting.

Pierce began his legal career as a solo practitioner in Neodesha, Kansas and served as the city attorney for Cherryvale, Kansas before becoming an oil and gas attorney for Shell Oil Company in Houston, Texas. Before returning to his law school alma mater to teach. Pierce taught at Indiana University School of Law in Indianapolis. University of Tulsa College of Law, University of Houston Law Center, and the University of Texas School of Law in Austin. He also served as the visiting Chair of Natural Resources Law at the University of Calgary Faculty of

Law in Alberta, Canada.

He is a co-author of "Cases and Materials on Oil and Gas Law," which is used as a textbook by law schools across the country. He has also written, edited, or contributed to more than a dozen other books and more than 50 scholarly articles addressing legal topics.

This fall, Pierce was selected by Washburn Law School's 2006 senior class as their recipient of the William O. Douglas Outstanding Professor of the Year Award.

Pierce received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Pittsburg State University in 1974 with a major in political science and a minor in biology. He earned a Juris Doctor degree at Washburn University School of Law in 1977, and earned a Master of Laws degree from the University of Utah College of Law in 1983.

Pierce lives in Topeka, Kansas, with his wife Martha.



Samuel McDowell Steele, Jr. BS '61, MS '62

Dr. Samuel McDowell Steele, Jr. is a physician practicing urology in western North Carolina. Dividing his time between office visits and surgery, he offers treatment to patients at two community hospitals located 24 miles apart in two counties.

Steele has worked at Spruce Pine Community Hospital in Spruce Pine, North Carolina, since 1999, after leaving the private practice he operated in that area since 1993. After graduating from and teaching in the PSU Department of Mathematics in the early 1960s, he enrolled at the University of Kansas School of Medicine in 1964. He served in the U.S. Navy as a medical officer before eventually focusing on a medical career in the southeast United States.

In addition to numerous military awards including the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal, and the Joint Services Commendation Medal, Steele has also been honored for his work in medicine. He has received the Presidential Leadership Award by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians, the American Medical Association's Award of Appreciation through the Committee on Emergency Medical Services, and the Colonel John F. Patton Award.

Steele is a member of the American Medical Association, the American Association of Clinical Urologists, Phi Kappa Phi, and the Military Officers Association of America, as well as many other organizations.

He graduated from PSU with a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in mathematics in 1961, and a Master of Science degree with a major in mathematics in 1962. He earned a medical degree from the University of Kansas School of Medicine in 1968.

He and his wife, Olivia, live in Newland, North Carolina.



Richard W. Stilwell, BSBA '70

Richard W. Stilwell is the president and founding shareholder of Insight Management Consultants, a professional services firm focused on assisting clients in their pursuit of sustained competitive success. Before founding Insight in 1994, Stilwell served in senior leadership positions with two privately held

companies and was a partner and national practice director with Touche Ross & Co. (now Deloitte & Touché, LLP). Stilwell serves on the Board of Directors of the High Plains Division of the American Cancer Society and is a member of the American Cancer Society's Chairman's Circle in Kansas City. He is a 2005 recipient of the American

Cancer Society's Volunteer Lifetime Achievement Award. He has served with the Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce and the Folly Theater Performing Arts Foundation. He is a member of the PSU Kelce College of Business Accounting Advisory Board. As a member of Sigma Chi Fraternity, he currently serves as vice chair of the

national fraternity's audit committee and is a 2006 recipient of the Significant Sig Award. He has a long history of many other community activities and professional affiliations.

He has been the recipient of the Delta Mu Delta National Honorary in Business Administration and the Omicron Delta Kappa National Honorary in Leadership. He was named Outstanding Officer Candidate School Graduate as a member of the Kansas Army National Guard. He received the U.S. Army Leadership Award, and was awarded the Erickson Trophy for Distinguished Leadership and Academic Ability by the National Guard Bureau.

Stilwell received a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree with a major in Business Administration-Liberal Arts from PSU in 1970. He earned a Master of Business Administration from the University of Missouri-Kansas City in 1973.

He lives with his wife Constance, also a PSU graduate and Meritorious Achievement Award recipient, in Prairie Village, Kan.

University Scholastic Honors as listed in the Commencement Program are based on course work completed through the summer semester. Final determination of University Scholastic Honors graduates will be based on course work completed through graduation.

The Mace and Medallion

Two symbolic badges of authority, traditional in many European universities and at some of the oldest schools in this nation, are being used in the commencement ceremonies. The University Mace is carried by Dr. Stephen J. Teller, Professor, Department of English, Pittsburg State University. The honor of carrying the University Mace at commencement is given to a faculty member with extensive service at the University. The Presidential Medallion is worn by Dr. Tom W. Bryant, President of Pittsburg State University.

Both pieces were designed and handcrafted by Samuel Farmer, a student in art at Pittsburg State University. Mr. Farmer received a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Art from the University in 1981 and a Master of Science with a major in Art Education in 1984.

In the Middle Ages, maces were used as weapons for breaking the armor of enemies on the field of battle. The use of maces as symbols for academic institutions originated in England in the 1500's.

The University's Mace features metal sculpture of sterling silver, with a staff sectioned of lathe-turned cherry wood. The school colors are present in the gold-plating in the head and knurl elements and the bezel-set red garnet cabochons. Echoing the hexagonal shape of the head, six forged flange sections radiate outward from the center, which is tipped by a half-sphere. A photo-etched seal of the University is attached to the base of the head. The knurl segment, interrupting the flow of the staff, acts as a balance, repeating the contrast between the smooth, highly-polished sterling silver and the reticulated gold-plated areas.

The Presidential Medallion is fashioned in color, scheme and line to compliment the Mace, drawing on a closeup perspective of the seal of the University
