

Kansas State College, ranked number eight in last week's National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Division I poll, places an 11-game unbeaten string on the line tonight when it meets Missouri Southern College. Pittsburg welcomes Gorilla parents and special distinguished guests of the college.

The Crimson and Gold suffered a minor setback last week with a 14-14 tie at Fort Hays State College. Up to that time, Pittsburg had won 10 straight contests including the 1970 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference championship game. The Gorillas remain undefeated for the '71 season with a 3-0-1 record.

Missouri Southern comes to Pittsburg with a 1-3 mark. KSC edged the Lions 33-26 in Joplin, last season. The Gorillas have never been beaten by the Missourians since the rivalry began in 1968.

Southern got off to a bad start this season under new head coach Jim Frazier, losing its first three encounters solidly. However the Lions apparently got things together last

The visitors enjoy the passing game and senior quarterback Mike Sexton has been the team's leader. Sexton nursed a knee injury last week and junior OB Ray Harding came in to lead the Lions to their first victory. Pittsburg fans should remember Harding as he led Southern's come-from-behind effort in '70 throwing for three touchdowns and running one across late in the game.

KSC hopes for starting another victory string will rely on the offense's ability to move the ball on the ground. The Gorillas were the fourth-leading rusher in the nation

last year and have already rated high this season.

Sophomore Chuck Smith calls the signals and receives assistance from Steve Howard, Albert Schmidt and Rick Lewis. Howard, a 6-0, 190 FB from Kansas City, was the nation's tenth leading rusher and received unprecidented NAIA All-America honorable mention as a freshman in '70. Schmidt, 6-1, 200 HB from Caldwell, was cited as an exceptional blocker and also held the team's highest per-carry average. For his efforts, he was named "Mr. Football".

Leading the way on the offensive line will be ends Michael Powell and Alan Spencer. Powell, a Kansas City Jr., led the squad in receiving last season, however Spencer holds a slight nod in '71. Holding down the interior positions are: tackles Ron Capoccia and Richard Hedrick, guards Ralph Ramsey and Jim Manley and center Jim Atwell.

Pittsburg's defense has also been honored this season and in addition to being the

conference leader, has ranked number 11 in the nation's small colleges.

John Pettis, Don Barcus, Gail Arnett and Larry Colley, all-RMAC end, hold down the front wall positions. An experienced linebacking crew features, Bob Homer, all-RMAC LB, Merle Clark, Ken Manley, and Frank Bean. The backfield includes: Ron Commons, Mike McGraw and Leon Lowe.

In addition to defensive duties, Commons, a Lawrence senior, specializes in punt returns and leads the nation's Division I schools with a 18.0 average. Steve Bari and Mike Matthews handle kicking duties for the Gorillas and Albert Hughes, Oklahoma City senior and one of the few men ever to beat New York Jet's Mel Gray in the 100, does KSC's kick returns.



ALL-PRO ELDON DANENHAUER

Former All-Pro offensive tackle Eldon Danenhauer is honored at this special college recognition night. This game also has been designated as KSC's annual

"Parents' Night" contest.

Danenhauer is the only All-America football player at Pittsburg who also made it big in professional football. The honor will be the first ever bestowed upon a football player in the post world War II period at KSC, the home of many All-Americans and two national championship teams. Eldon Danenhauer was named to the Williamson Rating All-American football team in 1959, his senior year at Pittsburg. He received All-Pro honors with the Denver Broncos in the American Football League five times, twice as first team AFL offensive tackle. During this period the Denver Broncos did not have a winning season.

Danenhauer came to Pittsburg in the fall of 1955, after transferring from the College of Emporia. He played tackle in 1956 and '57, then spent two years in the U.S. Army. When he returned in 1959 he was fully-matured at six feet four inches and 235 pounds. It was at the conclusion of this season that he won All-American honors. In addition to being co-captain of the team, and Central Conference lineman of the year, Danenhauer earned the most coveted honor to be bestowed upon a Pittsburg football player when he was chosen by his fellow lettermen for the Stratton Award. The recipient of this award exemplifies ideal habits and attitudes, inspirational leadership, team loyalty, and sportsmanship to the highest degree.

Danenhauer was the biggest man on campus in every respect and he is still spoken of warmly by Pittsburg fans although a dozen years have passed since his last performance on Brandenburg Field. He was most appreciated however, by his own teammates who properly assessed his easy-going, self-effacing personality; a player who always gave praise else-

where. His credentials were of the non-headline type that win football games. There were no "I's" in Eldon

Danenhauer.

Carnie Smith, KSC head football coach for eighteen years, points out that Danenhauer "was an ideal young man in every way, on and off the field. No one was jealous of him. He was probably our most outstanding leader during the years I coached. He was destined for greatness. He had EVERYTHING."

Likewise, Joe Murphy, in his twenty third season as line coach at Pittsburg, was high in his praise. Joe has developed a dozen or more "All American" linemen, and he says: "Eldon Danenhauer was the greatest interior lineman to play during the years I have coached at Pittsburg. His record as a man and a football player in college

and professional football is evidence enough; he proved what he could do in the big time."

Eldon's older brother Bill was a year ahead of him in school. Bill graduated from College of Emporia, and preceded Eldon as a professional football player. He spent two years with the Baltimore Colts, two years with the Broncos in Denver where the two brothers were teammates for a short time, and finished his pro career with the Boston Patriots. He is now in his third year as line coach at the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

Eldon was a member of the first Bronco team in the AFL, in 1960. He played through the 1965 season, retired briefly, and then signed for two years 1966 and 1967. He suffered a fracture in his upper arm the second day of practice under his new contract and finished out the year as a scout for the Broncos covering the Southwest

Conference.

At the end of the first year, he returned his two year contract to the Club because he felt he could not play again. Legally, he could have retained the contract and collected for another year on the most lucrative contract he had signed in professional football.

Today Eldon Danenhauer is president of Lapeka, Inc., in Topeka, Kansas. His distributorship covers eight countries. The original distributorship was set up in December, 1967, and licensed in March of 1968. Mr. and Mrs.

Eldon Danenhauer and their two children reside at 3224 College in Topeka.

Mrs. Danenhauer is the former Linda Phipps, of Parsons, Kansas. Linda and Eldon met at KSC in 1957 and she quickly became a genuine football fan, of course. Danenhauer's charming wife and their two children, Kurt, 9, and Kristie, 6, undoubtedly count among his greatest prizes in life.
