on the field, a few of them will shake hands and then the two teams will line up for a 60-minute attack on each other with the only objective being to get that little pigskin across the double white stripes at either end of the field.

This little game goes by the name of football game and traditionally falls somewhere between the "Bread" concert and the annual homecoming dance. However, today's meeting couldn't be called a typical contest as it is a game that must be won by both teams.

KSC was unbeaten in 12 games, ranked number nine in the nation's small colleges and champion of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. That all ended last week when the University of Northern Colorado defeated the Gorillas 28-6 at Greeley. Pittsburg is now 4-1-1 for the '71 season and both bad marks came as a result of conference clashes.

Southern Colorado comes to southeast Kansas with a 3-3 overall mark and a 1-1 league slate. The Indians were whipped 34-9 by Pittsburg last year and there's no way that they can't be looking for a piece of the Gorillas' scalp.

KSC holds a 3-1 all-time series advantage over the visitors and has traditionally played a tough tilt for its homecoming fans. But tradition won't play much of a role in '71 and if Pittsburg is to have further festivities for this year's homecoming, they'll have to be won on that 100 yards of turf.

KSC Annual Football Awards

THE STRATTON AWARD

The Stratton Award was established just prior to the 1954 football season, in honor of Richard Stratton, a letterman in 1951 who was killed in the Korean conflict. He was the first KSC football player to lose his life after World War II.

Stratton was a native of Picher, Oklahoma, and characterized the American football player who played for fun, completely devoted to his team, without jealousy or envy, and was a genuine "member" of the team on the field, on the bench, or on the campus. It is to his team loyalty and complete dedication that a player on the team is named each year. The player need not be a letterman. The winners were:

HONORARY CAPTAINS
