Another Kind of Jubilee in 1938 Graduate Class

Rodman St. Clair of Baxter Springs will graduate at the College this summer on the 25th anniversarv of his mother's graduation from the school. Mrs. St. Clair, whose maiden name was Ruth A. Rodman, was a member of the graduating class of 1913, first degree class in the college's history.

Mrs. St. Clair had attended the University of Oklahoma before sne entered K. S. T. C., then known as State Manual Training Normal, from which she graduated with a degree of bachelor of science in

education.

Shortly after graduation she taught for a while in the English department at the College.

The spirit of adventure called Miss Rodman, and she went to the Philippines, where she taught for a short time. There she met A. T. St. Clair, a provincial treasurer, and they were married at Manila.

Mr. and Mrs. St. Clair returned to the United States for a brief

period and then sailed back to the Orient. While they were again at Manila, Rodman St. Clair was born,

In 1917 the St. Clairs returned to America. They have made their home at Baxter Springs for a num-

ber of years,
