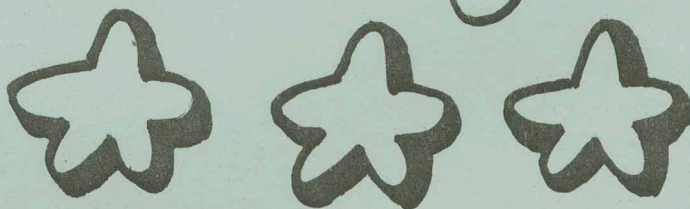

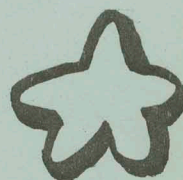

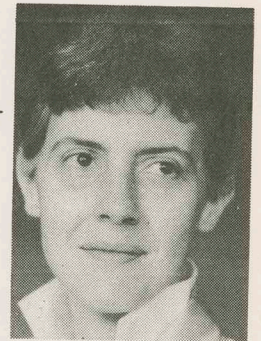
THE DIRECTORS:

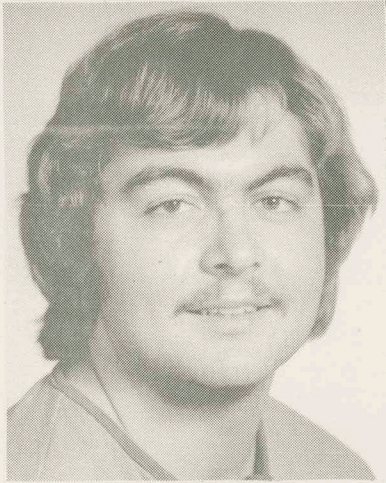
CHERI COLLINS

SALLYE COX

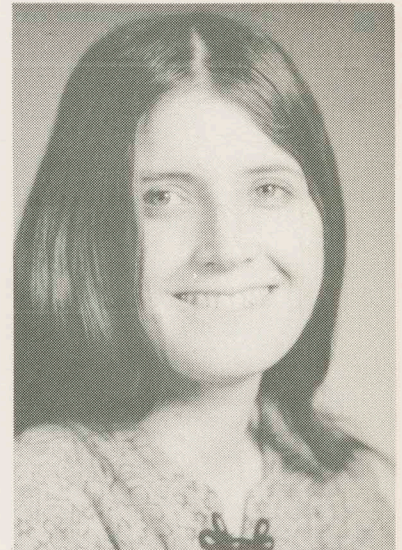

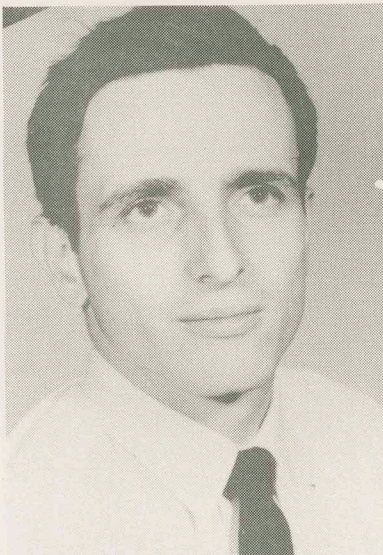
STEPHEN DAVIDSON

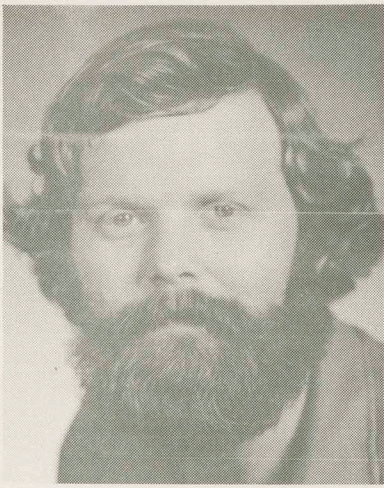
ROBERT ECKLES

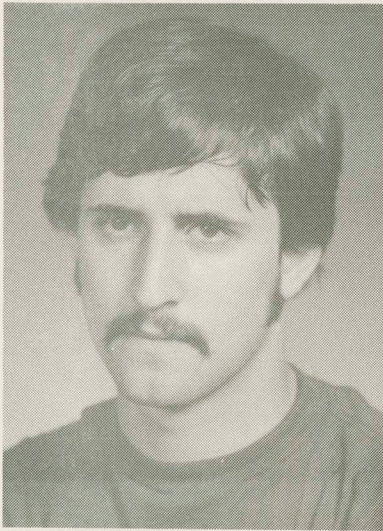
MIKE FARRIS

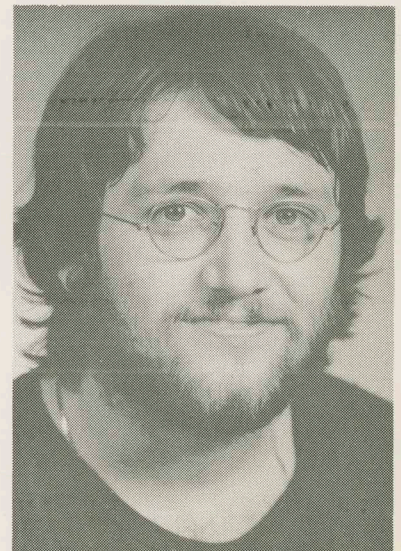
SARAH FOGLESONG

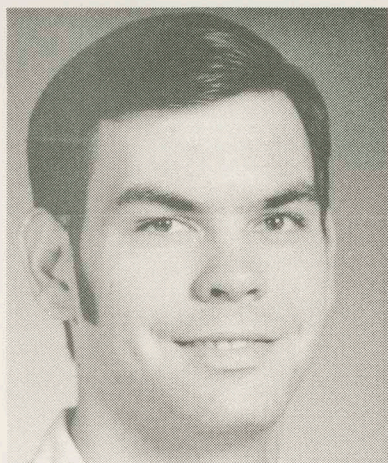
REX GARDNER

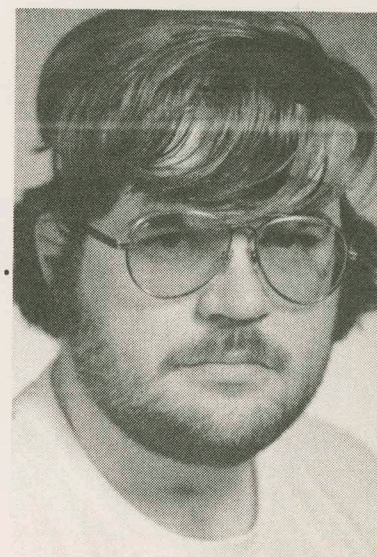

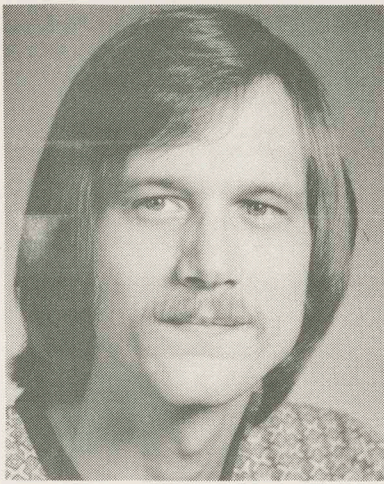
TAMMY HERVEY

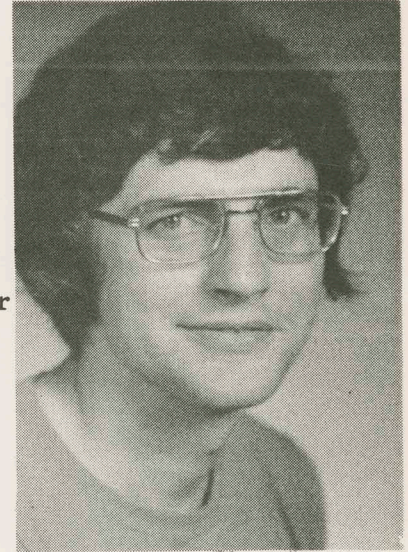
LARRY HUTCHISON

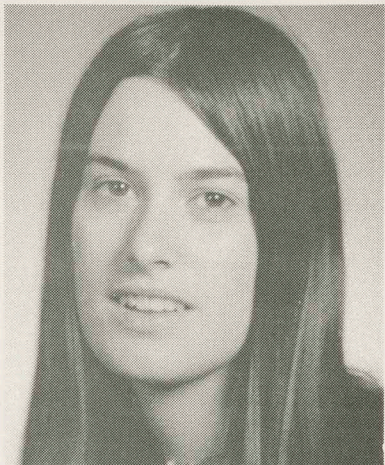


CHRIS JONES

BECKY LANGAN

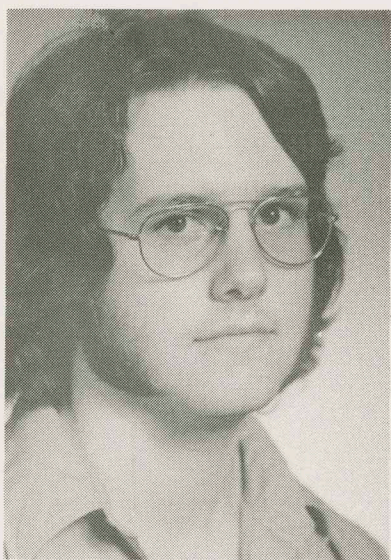

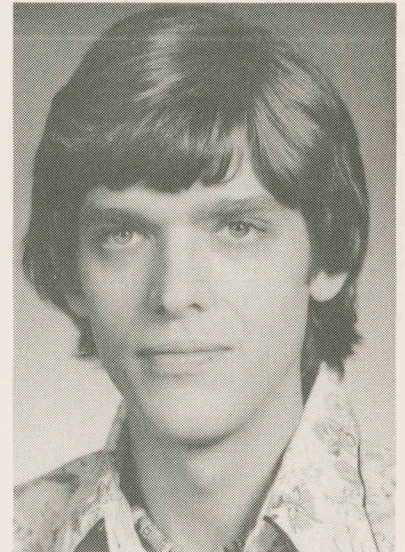
ROBERT MOORE

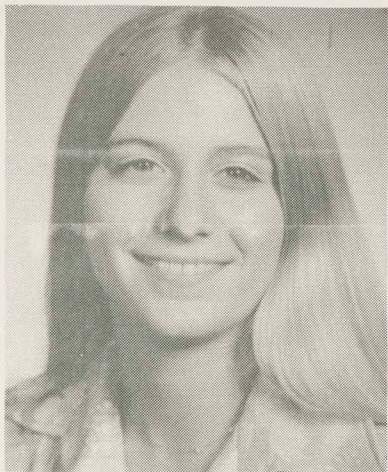
DAWN MURRELL

DENA NEVITT



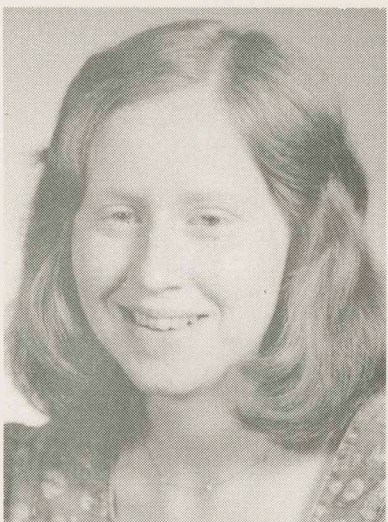
VERNA PAGE

SUE SCHIMMEL

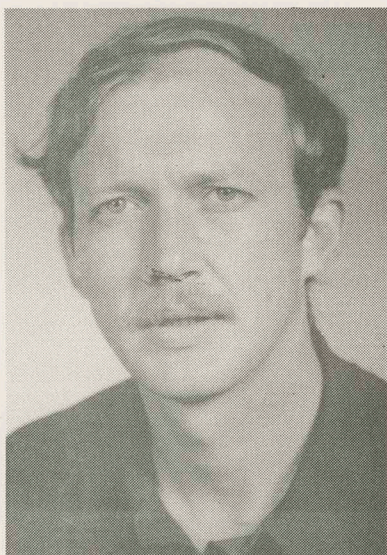

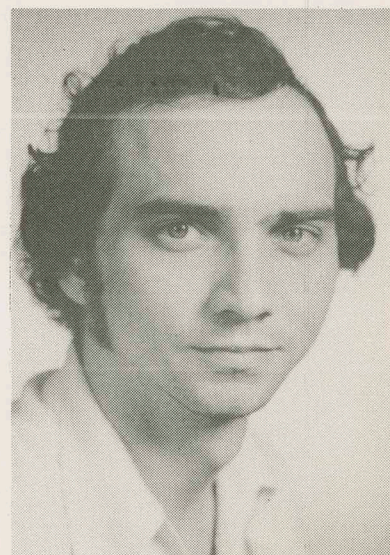
CATHY SMITH
