death very sensibly.

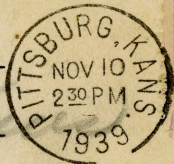
Wed after our fine

Love as ever - Dad & Jim.

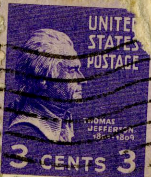
