Traps of Wrath.

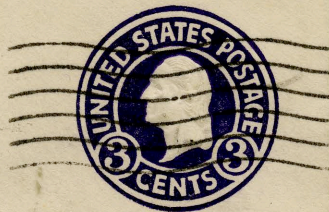
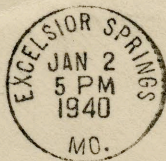
As to our plans, since we will
