You asked for the most significant educational achievement in our school during 1930 and 1931.

The development of a Graduate School of which over 200 have enrolled since its beginning 18 months ago.

A more systematic and thorough organization of under-graduate work for all teaching levels.

The raising of standards until the institution is approved as an A. Teachers College without deficiencies or conditions by the American Association of Teachers Colleges, also approved by the North Central Association of Colleges as both a Liberal Arts College, and a Teachers College without deficiencies or conditions.

The rapid growth of our Senior College as evidenced by a degree class of 290 last year.
