Dear Sirs and Brothers: -

After investigating our records, we find that some local unions are delinquent in sending in their assessment, and at this time it is very important that this assessment be sent in to this office at the regular intervals.

We have at this time in District 14, One Thousand members who are working nearly steady time, and about Three Thousand members who are working from one to three days per week. So the members of our Organization can readily understand, when the assessment is all sent in, it is not such a great amount.

We have in District 14, about Three Thousand, two hundred and fifty (3250) members who are out of employment. Out of this number, we have four hundred and fifty members who are officially on strike.

The District Executive Board feels that it is the duty of each and every member of the Organization, to see that this money is sent in on time, so we may have the exact amount of income to base our disbursements upon.
