## STATEMENTS REGARDING THE INSTITUTION

The Kansas State Teachers College of Pittsburg was created by the act of the legislature in 1903. It was not until 1909 that the institution had its first permanent building. That building burned in 1914, hence the institution has been builded new since 1913. At the present time the institution has 14 splendid buildings, representing a total valuation of approximately two million dollars.

The college at Pittsburg enjoys the distinction of being the third largest State institution in Kansas. Total enrollment of different individuals for the past year 4300. A faculty of 130 full-time instructors is employed. Dr. W. A. Brandenburg is president of the College. His popularity with the student body and alumni is evidenced by the fact, that he is frequently called, and spoken of, as "Prexy."

The institution offers the following bachelor degrees:

Bachelor of Arts;  
Bachelor of Science in Music;  
Bachelor of Science in Commerce;  
Bachelor of Science in Education.

275 Bachelor of Science degrees were conferred last year.

In the spring of 1929 a year of graduate study was offered, culminating in the Master of Science degree. Last year 20 Master of Science degrees were conferred. A total of 376 have been enrolled in the graduate division.
