The 1978 football season is about to draw to an exciting close as the Pitt State Gorillas take on their rivals from Joplin, Mo., the Missouri Southern Lions in a crucial "Mid-America Day" game.

The Pitt State season has come down to the final game, and it promises to be a battle as the conference title hinges on the final game.

It has been a storybook year for the young Gorilla ballclub that has surprised preseason skeptics who picked Pitt State to finish near the bottom of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference. Today they will be battling for the conference title, and have several big victories to their credit.

Currently, the Gorillas are 12th in the nation in total offense with a 400.4 yards-per-game average and quarterback Mark Hittner is only one-tenth of a yard out of the top 15 in individual total offense.

The game today will be decided in the trenches as both defenses will be under extreme pressure trying to stop the attack of their opponents. Southern runs an exceptional veer offense, and will pose a problem for the Pitt State defense. The option is hard to defend, and the Lions are probably the most dangerous offensive ballclub the Gorillas have faced this season.

From the other end zone, Pitt State boasts a conference leading offense, directed by Boonville junior Mark Hittner, as they display a multiple offense, capable of throwing, and running with equal success.

1978 Athletic Scholarship Drive







The CSIC was formed in the school year 1976-77 after the break-up of the Great Plains Athletic Conference. Ft. Hays, Pittsburg, Emporia, Washburn, and Kearney were members of the GPAC. Wayne State, Missouri Western, and Missouri Southern were added to form the new conference. All members have a national affiliation with the NAIA.

In the two years of its existence the CSIC has proven to be one of the strongest athletic conferences within the NAIA structure. During the 1977-78 school year seven athletic teams from CSIC schools finished among the top ten in NAIA national competition. The 1978-79 school year promises to be another outstanding year for conference schools at the national level.






Bob Stringer
