

## **Distinguished Service Award Recipients**

## Edward T. (posthumously) and Edythe McNally

Edward and Edythe McNally have been well known in Pittsburg for many years for their support of numerous community initiatives and Pittsburg State University. Just one example of their support for the university was a leadership gift for the construction of the Kansas Technology Center.

Through the years, Edward and Edythe served as major influences on others who would then support the university. They encouraged Gladys Kelce to support the university. She would eventually provide major gifts to Pittsburg State of more than \$1,000,000 for the PSU College of Business and the Kelce Planetarium. At the encouragement of the McNallys, Ed's sister, Mary Adele McNally Gould, and his nephew, Thomas Gould (neither being PSU graduates) established a major endowed scholarship to benefit the PSU technology and nursing departments.

Edward T. McNally, who died April 4, 1998, purchased land adjacent to Pittsburg State in the 1960's to hold for later development and expansion of the university. Holding that property for the university allowed the institution to expand in critical areas. McNally also served as a featured speaker at many College of Business events.

Ed McNally was active in many Pittsburg initiatives. While serving as the Pittsburg Centennial Celebration Committee Chair in 1976, he dedicated more than a year of work to the successful celebration. He also funded a full-time position to assist in the centennial preparations. He co-chaired the fundraising campaign in 1966 to build the present Mt. Carmel Medical Center and was on the Mt. Carmel Board of Directors.

Edythe Claire Williams McNally is currently a member of the PSU Foundation Board of Trustees. She has served on the Pitt State Foundation Development Committee twice (1985-86 and 1999-2000). She provided significant encouragement and support for the renovation of the west side of Carnie Smith Stadium. She is a member of the PSU 2003 Centennial Celebration Planning Committee. She is a 1951 graduate of Pittsburg State University with a bachelor's degree in English.


Edythe McNally has been active in the community. She is on the Pittsburg Beautiful Committee and is a Mt. Carmel Gala Co-Founder with Charles Chenoweth. She initiated the idea and provided funding for the renovation/expansion of Mt. Carmel Medical Center dining area into the Skylight Café. She served as co-chairperson of the campaign for the Mt. Carmel Cancer Center. She serves as a mentor at Lakeside School.



#### A.J. Menghini

A.J. Menghini is the general manager and secretary/treasurer for Menghini Brothers Distributors. For many years, he has been an annual scholarship and fund drive volunteer for Pittsburg State. He is on the PSU Foundation Board of Trustees and the Foundation's finance committee. He is a member of the College of Business Board of Advisors and a member of the Pitt State Athletics Advisory Council. For six years, Menghini has helped fund scholarships for the PSU Pride of the Plains Marching Band. He was a member of Champions Circle, the Intercollegiate Athletics Capital Campaign of 1987. Menghini is a donor to the University's Annual Scholarship and Fund Drive (University level) and is one of the PSU Intercollegiate Athletics major corporate partners.

Menghini is a 1963 graduate of PSU with a major in biology. He is a member of the board of directors for Miner's State Bank. He is involved in service to his church, the Pittsburg and Frontenac communities, and civic groups. He and his wife, Shirley, have two children, Stacy and Anthony John. His mother, Irene Menghini, and his sister, Patricia Terlip, also live in southeast Kansas.
