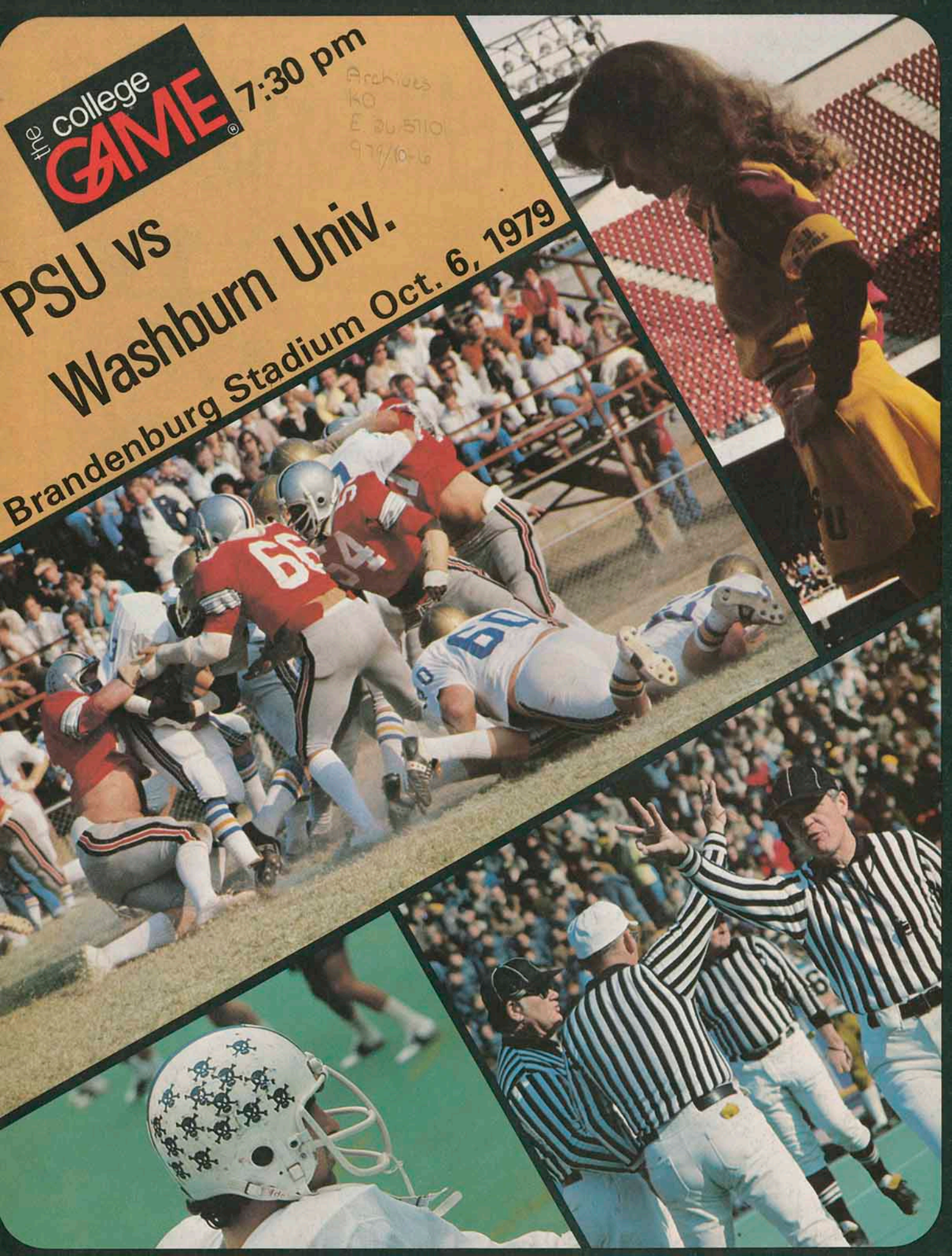

The Pittsburg State University Gorillas bring a 2-2 record into tonight's "Parents Day" Contest against Washburn University.

The Gorillas will be going for their second win in a row coming off of a 23-3 conference victory against the Missouri Southern Lions last week. The Ichabods are also taking a 2-2 record into the game, dropping their conference opener last week to Emporia State 17-11.

Last week's victory leaves the Gorillas 1-0 in the CSIC. Washburn, 0-1 in the conference, will be looking to win. Ichabod Head Coach Garland (Gary) Hampton, in his first year, will be bringing down a strong offensive team which uses the Wing-T and is directed by junior quarterback Mike Atkins. Atkins utilizes no huddle, calling out the play at the line of scrimmage. Senior Mark Samich will lead the Washburn running threat. Against Missouri Valley earlier this year, Samich set a new school record with 31 carries and made 123 yards. The Washburn defense has also been tough this year.

The Gorillas lead in the series record 30-16-1. Last year PSU prevailed 27-14.

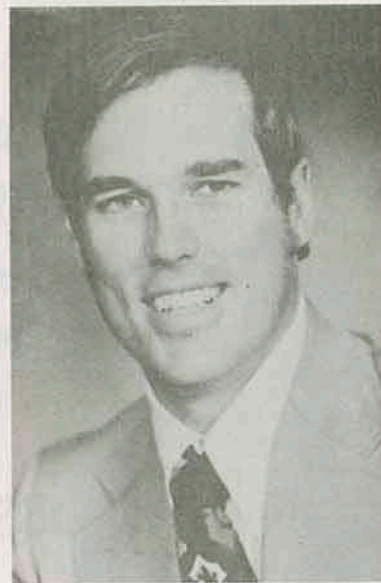

1979 Athletic Scholarship Drive

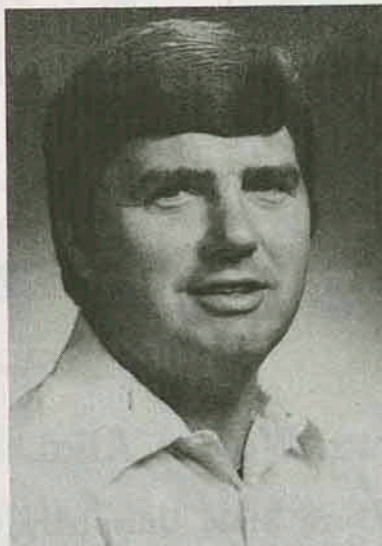

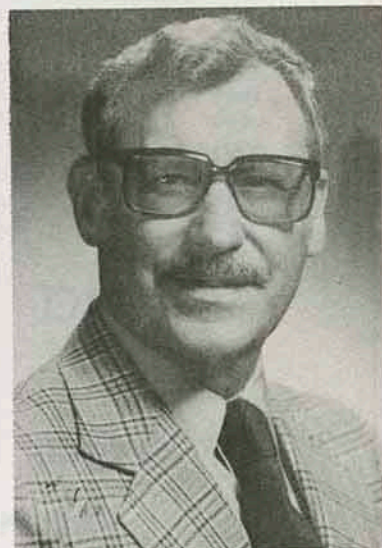

Central States Intercollegiate Conference

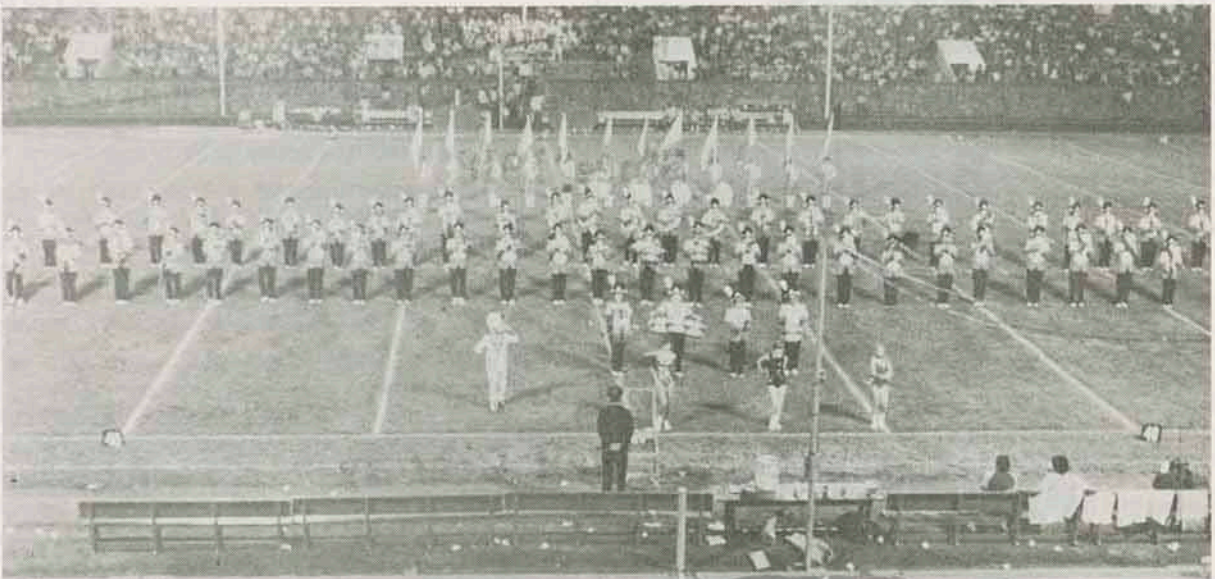
The CSIC was formed in the school year 1976-77 after the break-up of the Great Plains Athletic Conference. Ft. Hays, Pittsburg, Emporia, Washburn, and Kearney were members of the GPAC. Wayne State, Missouri Western, and Missouri Southern were added to form the new conference. All members have a national affiliation with the NAIA.

In the two years of its existence the CSIC has proven to be one of the strongest athletic conferences within the NAIA structure. During the 1977-78 school year seven athletic teams from CSIC schools finished among the top ten in NAIA national competition. The 1978-79 school year promises to be another outstanding year for conference schools at the national level.

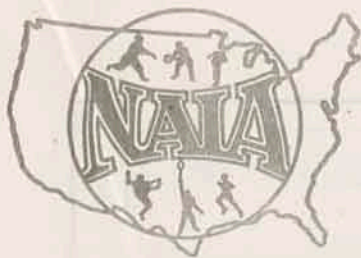

THE NAIA

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association which administers programs leading to national championships in 15 events for more than 500 fully-accredited four-year colleges and universities in all 50 states and Canada.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball the NAIB evolved from the institution of a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" which was inaugurated in 1937. In 1952, the NAIB expanded to include tennis, outdoor track and golf, and that year the organization was renamed the NAIA.

Since that time the NAIA has further enlarged to encompass football (two divisions were formed in 1970), cross country, baseball and swimming, which were added to the NAIA championship program in 1956, wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), gymnastics (1964), indoor track (1966), ice hockey (1968) and volleyball (1969).

With its national headquarters and staff located in Kansas City, MO., the NAIA is organized into 31 districts. The District Executive Committee is the governing body in each District with the District Chairman serving as the chief officer. Within the district an eligibility chairman and publicity chairman are appointed to handle various duties.

A major factor in the success of the NAIA program is the importance placed on "grass roots" organization, in which each district administers and organizes the programs of the schools within their own district. The districts are usually small enough in the number of schools involved that each individual institution has a major voice in the policy and decision-making process within that district. This procedure carries forward to the national level, where each of the 31 districts have an equal voice in national matters.

The NAIA clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletic program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the college or university. The NAIA encourages a broad program of athletic pursuits in its member institutions and aims at uniformity and equity in policies and practices through its district and national championship events.

Eligibility rules in the NAIA govern all competition in sports recognized by the NAIA, not just post-season competition. These rules must be adhered to by all NAIA member institutions, including those members holding dual affiliations with other associations. NAIA member institutions must pay the annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the Association.

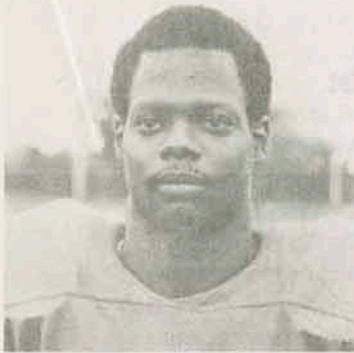

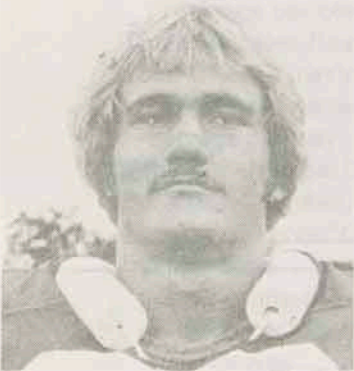
Gorilla Spotlight
