Title The Stanley R. Rosen Collection of Labor, Labor History, and Labor Education

Collection Size 140 linear feet of manuscript material and approximately 500 books

Scope and Content The Stanley R. Rosen Collection of Labor, Labor History, and Labor Education totals over 140 linear feet of papers (not including books), related to labor, labor history and education, unions, as well as Jewish culture, Chicago history, and Franklin Roosevelt and the New Deal. The bulk of the papers have been added over a span of several years, and are still being added, and currently are awaiting processing. Researchers wishing to access and view the manuscript collection are urged to make an appointment.

Biography Stanley Rosebud Rosen was born on March 2, 1934, in New York City. He was raised near New Brunswick, New Jersey at the Ferrer Colony, an anarchist community founded by supporters of Francisco Ferrer, a noted European anarchist. Rosen graduated from Rutgers University in 1956 with a degree in history. He took a position within the Rutgers University Labor Education department, to train union leaders. Rosen went on to earn a master's degree in economics from Rutgers and eventually took the position of education director for the Textile Workers Union of America. After that, Rosen taught at the University of Illinois, training labor leaders as a professor of labor and industrial relations. Rosen retired in 1995 and settled in Santa Fe, New Mexico.
